#### **Junior section**

The club recognises that there needs to be better communication, an issue that we are actively tackling, in addition we still need someone to take over the chairmanship of the lunior section.

#### **Club Selection**

We are aware of the issue with club selection with regards the 2nds, 3rds and 4ths and some players not wanting to move away from the teams that they normally play in. In most cases I think that this is no more than a communication problem. Could I suggest a few simple solutions;

Players give an indication after a game if they are available the following week. If a players tells their captain that they are available and for what ever reason that changes, would the player please take the responsibility themselves to let their previous weeks captain know and not wait for the captain to contact them!

Players not to rely solely on expecting someone to contact them regarding the weeks games and in which team they may be playing in make an effort to find out for yourselves.

Please help the club out, if at the last minute you are asked to play for a team other than the one that you were originally selected for, this should not happen on a regular basis! If it does come and see me!

Overall the club is a vibrant and enjoyable place to be part of lets keep it that way and above all enjoy your rugby.
