Castle Donington RUFC player behaviour policy applies to all rugby players under the age of 18. All club members are required to help the young players understand and abide by the club rules.

All players must respect and take care of club property and the property of other club members and players. When playing against non-club teams, touring or representing the club in any way a similar regard must be paid to the property of other clubs/teams, other premises and other people.

Players must wear suitable kit for training and match sessions (boots, gumshield; club shirt, shorts and socks) Including clothing for wintery conditions i.e. tracksuit / sweatshirt etc. Plus safety equipment i.e. shoulder pads, scrum caps and gloves.

Players should keep to agreed timings for training and competitions and inform their lead coach if they are going to be late or absent.

Players should always bring a bottle of drinking water with them to training and match sessions. They should also have with them any medication that they may need during training and match sessions (e.g. asthma inhaler).

All players are encouraged to have knowledge, respect and conduct within laws of the game of rugby.

Players are encouraged to remember that the coaches, volunteers and parents/guardians are all donating their time to enable the players to

participate in the sport, tour or activity and to adhere to the RFU core values with all interaction with them.

Players are also encouraged to use the core values within interactions with visiting teams, match officials and spectators.

All members are reminded that the good name of Castle Donington RUFC is vital to the club's wellbeing and are required not to bring the club into disrepute by words or actions.

Anyone who has a concern that a breach of the rules has taken place (or indeed any other concern or complaint is encouraged to share such concerns or complaints with the Safeguarding Officer or either the Junior or Senior chair.
