

Bootle Football Club



The original Bootle F.C. were formed in 1880 and played at Hawthorne Road. In 1889–90 Bootle became founder members of the Football Alliance. That season was the most successful as we finished league runners-up, reached the quarter-finals of the FA Cup,

where we lost to Blackburn Rovers (0-7). When the Alliance merged with the Football League in 1892, Bootle became founder members of the new Second Division. However, despite a respectable 8th place final position, the club dropped out after one season (and were replaced by neighbours Liverpool) and seemingly disappeared due to financial problems. Football returned to Hawthorne Road when a new club, Bootle Athletic. was later formed with the new team initially playing in the Liverpool Leagues. In 1948 when the club were elected to the Lancashire Combination 2, which was won at the first attempt. However, Bootle struggled in the top-flight and after several tough seasons withdrew and folded during the 1953–54 campaign.

In 1953, the current club was formed as Langton and played in the local leagues. After a very successful spell in the Liverpool County Combination (which we won on numerous occasions) the club reverted back to it's



It's better known identity of Bootle F.C. in 1973; and a year later joined the Lancashire Combination, which we won in 1976 and 1977. Bootle then joined the Second Division of the Cheshire County League, which was won in our first season, and we were promoted to the First Division. In 1982 the Cheshire County League was one of the leagues that merged to form the North West Counties League, which Bootle duly joined, becoming a member of the First Division. The club spent most of their time in the First Division until 2000 when we unfortunately dropped into the Second Division. However, despite finishing 6th in 2002, the club dropped into the Liverpool County Combination. In 2006 the club, with a new ground, were elected back into Division 2 of the North West Counties League. In 2009 Bootle won promotion to the NWCL Premier Division and also won the Championship. In 2009/10, our first season back in the Vodkat Premier League Bootle finished a NWCFL highest placing of 3rd. In 2010/11 despite a shaky start Bootle finished a respectable 6th place.

With the club continuing to grow off the field, all eyes are on what can be produced on the field this season, with the NWCFL Premier Division a firm goal in what could be another success for this fast growing club looking to progress again.

Although we scored 5, including 3 excellent goals in Tuesday's game with Formby, I didn't think we played that well to be honest.



Tales From The Northwest Counties



Hit for a Double Six at Bolton By Tony Onslow

The future of Bootle Football Club was hanging in the balance when 1882/83 season got under way. The clubs mentor, the Reverend Keeley, had now left the area and his departure prompted the exodus of all the Public School Players who then formed Liverpool Ramblers. Robert Sloane had taken on the duties of club captain but experienced players were in short supply. The club was also in process of laying out a new pitch on Marsh Lane and the few home matches, that could be arranged, had taken place on the home of Bootle Wanderers at Sandfield Place. Cup matches however, had to honoured so it was a patched-up Bootle side that left home to fulfill a Lancashire Cup tie.

On the 21st of October the Bootle party arrived at the All Saints Ground in the Tonge area of Bolton where a small crowd waited to greet them. They were the supporters of Bolton Olympic. The visitors, after conceding an early goal, were level at break thanks to goal from Charles Allsop. Bootle, during the second half, collapsed and conceded five unopposed goals before a late consolation goal, scored by Albert Allsop, made the final score Bolton Olympic 6, Bootle 2. The defeat by did little for the visitor's moral because, in two weeks time, they had to return to the area and face Bolton Wanderers in the first round of the F.A. Cup.

ENGLISH CUP TIE.

WANDERERS' GROUND, PIRE'S-LANE.

Kick-off at 3 p.m. Admission 6d. and 4d, Stand 6d. extra.

The game took place on the 4th of November at the ground of Bolton Wanderers on Pikes Lane. Bootle Football Club, in the meantime, had engaged the services of Bob

Lythgoe, an experienced player who had learned his football in the North Wales coalfield, Mr. Lythaoe strenathened the Bootle team by bringing in Tom Marriott from Everton along with Joseph Jones, a forward from Wrexham, in time for the game. The Bootle party arrived by train and were transported to the Gladstone Hotel where they changed and made the short walk to the Wanderers enclosure. The spectators, who had paid to watch the game, numbered around 2,000. Bolton Wanderers won the toss and decided to kick with the gale force wind that was blowing straight down the middle of the ground. The home club had reinforced their side by signing three players from Scotland and they were all included in their line up when the play commenced. The Bootle defenders, from the outset, struggled to clear the ball against the bitterly cold wind and all the early play was confined to their end of the field. Struthers, formerly of Glasgow Rangers, helped himself to three of the four goals that were scored by Wanderers during the first half. In deed, the home goalkeeper had felt confident enough to leave his charge under the protection of the elements, and join in the outfield play. A second half goal scored by Roberts, briefly lifted the Bootle players but their first half endeavors had too proved too much. They tired and faded out of the game. Bolton Wanderers then added two further goals to win the tie by 6 goals to 1.

Our Visitors today: Atherton Laburnum Rovers

WHERE?

Atherton is a town within the Borough of Wigan, in Greater Manchester, historically a part of Lancashire. It is 6 miles (9.7 km) east of Wigan, 2 miles (3.2 km) northnortheast of Leigh, and 9 miles (14.5 km) northwest of Manchester.

WHEN?

The History of our guests:

The club were established as a junior club in 1956 as Laburnum Rovers, named after Laburnum Playing Fields. In 1961 they joined the Bolton Combination. Lack of facilities at Hagfold prevented promotion and in 1965 they applied to the local council for permission to move to their present home which was at the time a farmers field. They won the Bolton Combination Division Two and the Division Two Trophy in the 1965–66 season. Then in June 1966 they moved to their new

home, meaning they could be promoted to Division One for the 1966–67 season. New changing rooms were erected as well as a social club.

The club joined the Cheshire County League in 1980, and with the league stipulation that the town had to be in the club's name, they became Atherton Laburnum Rovers. They became founder members of the North West Counties Football League in 1982 and were placed in Division Two for the 1982-83 season. In the 1984-85 season they won the Bolton Hospital Cup, beating Scotts Park United 3-1. In 1987, with improved facilities at Crilly Park, With the erection of floodlights the club entered the FA Cup for the first time in the 1989-90 season. In 1992-93 they were crowned North West Counties Football League champions, losing just two games all season. The following season they were champions again

and also reached the semi-finals of the FA Vase where they lost in a replay to Diss Town. The quarter-final match against Aldershot Town saw a record crowd of 1,856 at Crilly Park.

They were promoted to the Northern Premier League First Division for the 1994–95 season, However, their stay in the league lasted just three seasons, although they were losing finalists in the Northern Premier League Division One Cup in 1995–96. In 1996–97 they finished bottom and were relegated back to the North West Counties Football League Division One, However, they did reach the third qualifying round of the FA Cup, their best performance to date in the competition. In 1998–99 they won the Goldline Trophy, beating Atherton Town 3-0 in the final on 23 March 1999 at Hilton Park, Leigh. A period of instability followed with the club in financial trouble and in 1999–2000 they suffered a second relegation to Division Two. However, after one season they were promoted again to Division One, winning promotion in the final game of the season. They also won the Bolton Hospital Cup for a second time, beating Ramsbottom United 2-1 in the final on 14 May 2002.

The following season they finished in 20th place, just above the relegation places. In 2003–04 the club won two trophies. They won the Goldline Trophy at Bolton Wanderers, beating Blackrod Town 4-1. They also won the Bolton Hospital Cup at the same venue, beating Eagley 3-1. The 2004–05 season saw a mid-table position in the league while they became the first club to win the Goldline Trophy two years in succession when they beat Eagley 5-3 in the final. In 2005–06 they again struggled in the league, finishing once more in 20th place. In 2006–07 they finished in 16th place and in the 2007–08 season they finished in 19th place in Division One







120 Years Ago This Week.....

The Bootle club was lying near the bottom of the Football Alliance when they began their November fixtures with an away against fellow strugglers Lincoln City. The match took place on the John O Gaunt ground and the attendance was described as "moderate".

The John O'Gaunt Ground Where Lincolns last match there was April 13th, 1895 5-2 y Crewe Alexandra



The visitors made bright start and, after having a goal disallowed, took the lead with goal from Rob Jamieson. The home side then drew level with goal that was hotly disputed by the Bootle players who claimed their goalkeeper had been fouled in the process. The referee, who had not seen the episode, interviewed a player from each side before awarding a goal to Lincoln. The Bootle officials then joined in the argument holding the game up for several minutes. The goal however, was allowed to stand. The incident seemed to inspire the visitors who, between now and the end of the game, outplayed their opponents. They scored another two goals to register what was to be their only away victory in the Football Alliance that season.

The visit of Small Heath drew a crowd of 2,000 when they arrived to fulfill their Alliance fixture at Hawthorne Road. The Birmingham based club was

lying second in Alliance table behind Nottingham Forest. The day went sadly wrong for the home side as Dame Fortune refused to bestow a single smile up on them. They had much the better of the play but were beaten by 1 goal to 0.

Next Monday afternoon, Preston North End accepted an invitation to play a friendly match at Hawthorne Road. The "Lilywhites" were not now the force they had once been and a crowd of 3,000 watched Bootle win the match by 3 goals to 1.

Bootle then brought the month of November to a close with a controversial Alliance fixture away at Crewe. The Bootle party, when they arrived, was dismayed to learn that the appointed referee would not be available and that a member of the home committee would take his place. The match went ahead under protest. Jack Findlayson, a new signing from Greenock Morton, was making his debut for Bootle. The home side controlled the game for the first hour and were leading 3-1 when the referee disallowed a goal by Rob Jamieson causing the Bootle players to "protest in earnest" The visitors troubles were the further compounded by an injury to their goalkeeper Dave Dunning. Crewe Alexandra went on to win the game by 4 goals to 3. The Bootle protest was later heard at the Royal Hotel in Manchester. The committee turned aside the objection and allowed the result to stand. They did however, admonish the referee because both sides had done some "hard swearing" and had not been cautioned.
