WELCOME RUNCORN TOWN

Runcorn Town were formed in 1967 under the name of Mond Rangers FC. They played for the first few years in the Runcorn Sunday league, and in 1973 they made the decision to try Saturday football in the impressive Warrington and District League (WDL).

In their first season they finished as runners up, and after amalgamating with ICI Weston for the 1974/75 season, they became one of the strongest sides in the league. They remained in the WDL until 1984 when they were elected to join the West Cheshire League (WCL) Division Two.

Mond established themselves as a good, solid mid-table team until the 1991/92 season when they won their first silverware in the West Cheshire Bowl as well as a respectable sixth place finish. The following season they finished third in the league and reached the Bowl final, with another third place finish the following season in which they scored 100 goals and regaining the Bowl. Promotion finally came in 1994/95 when they finished second in the league scoring 118 goals. They also reached the Final of the Cheshire Amateur Cup but lost to Poulton Victoria in a match played at Prenton Park, Tranmere.

Despite sharing the Bill Weight Memorial Trophy in that first season, Division One proved a struggle and they were relegated for the first time in the clubs history in 2001/02. Success returned in 2004/05 with the team finishing as

The Bucks came into the game on the back of a solid point against Runcorn Linnets. Despite a bright start, which saw Tom Peterson and James McShane both fire over.

It was the leagues bottom side who took the lead on the 17th minute mark when Ben Singletons shot went under Bootle goalkeeper Richie Cowderoy.

However Bootle, responded well, and soon leveled before the half hour mark. Shaun Harris' corner found Tom Peterson, who found the roof of the net with a superb lobbed shot.

Four minutes before half time and the Bucks took the lead. James McShane collected a Billy Smart through ball, before teeing up Peterson who found the bottom corner, of the Dodge Kop net.

Peterson collected his hat trick 10 minutes into the second half. Shaun Harris did superbly ghosting down the left side, before crossing for Peterson to finish first time. Last seasons top scorer Peterson now has two hat ticks to his name already this season as he goes in pursuit of the golden boot. The Bucks had further chances to extend their lead with Daniel O'Connor heading over from a Shaun Harris corner. Before Sean Coulton saw one effort cleared off the line and his diving header coming back of the post.

There was one sour note for the Bucks as goalkeeper Richie Cowderoy suffered a suspected broken nose after clashing with team mate Sean Coulton.

However, Manager Joe Doran, will hoping his side can slowly create a fear factor to their home ground after collecting their first win at the Delta Taxis Stadium this season.

runners up in Division Two, winning the Runcorn Senior Cup and reaching the final of the Bowl.

Ahead of the 2005/06 season, the club changed their name to Runcorn Town in order to try and bring a more professional look to the club in general, and hopefully increase support from both businesses and individuals in the local community. A decision was also made to try and improve facilities at the club with a view to joining the North West Counties League.

The season got off to a good start with the Bill Weight Memorial Cup won early on and the Runcorn Cup added, but on the final day of the season, they slipped into the relegation places for the first time to suffer a heart-breaking relegation. Town quickly regrouped and bounced back the next season by winning Division Two for the first time.

The following three seasons saw top four finishes, although the main progression was off the field as the ground was transformed. Hard standing, seating and floodlights were installed for the first time, with the dressing rooms also upgraded. This enabled the club to be elected to the North West Counties League at the start of the 2010/11 season, with the club also entering the FA Vase and the Cheshire Senior Cup for the first time in their history.

It is fair to say that the first season in the league exceeded all expectations, with the team losing just two league matches as they secured promotion to the Premier Division as runners-up, with James McShane finishing as the league's overall leading scorer with 43 goals. The Quarter Final of the

Division One Trophy was also reached as well as the Semi Final of the Challenge Cup, whilst Warrington Town were held in the Cheshire Senior Cup before losing on penalties.

In the clubs' FA Vase debut season, the club also wrote headlines as they progressed through four successive away ties before bowing out in the in the Last 32 stage against Dunston UTS, the last remaining North West Counties League side in the competition.

The first season in the Premier Division saw Town continue in the same vein that they left Division One, with the team losing out on the title on the last day of the season to Ramsbottom United. James McShane once again topped the scoring charts with Town scoring over 120 goals in all competitions.

The club were also once again the last remaining NWCL side in the FA Vase, this time reaching a replay in the Last 32 before bowing out. We also made our debut in the FA Cup, winning two games before bowing out in the 1st Qualifying Round to Evo-Stik League side Ashton United.

Last season was another good season for the club, finishing in fourth place in the Premier Division just four points off top spot. Progress was made in the FA Vase with the Last 16 reached for the first time, with the 1st Qualifying Round of the FA Vase made once more. Another good scalp came in the Cheshire Senior Cup with a 5-0 away win at Warrington which earned the "Team of the Round" award.

Before half time, Bootle made it 6-0 after Emily Swindells was unlucky not to get a first half hat-trick when her shot was diverted into the goal by the Chester defender.

The second half carried on as the first finished, plenty of attacks from Merseyrail Bootle causing problems for the Chester defence. The lead was increased in the 50th minute when Alicia Hardacre dribbled past two defenders and found Rachel Atherton in space in the area to calmly place it in the back of the net.

Tessa Littler then got her second assist of the game when she crossed for Siobhan Cliff to grab her second goal of the game. Alice Brown then made it 9-0 with 15 minutes to go when she cut inside from the left wing and blasted it past the helpless Chester keeper.

The game was rounded off in the final minutes when Alicia Hardacre sent the ball into the bottom left hand corner from 20 yards out to get Bootle into double figures.

It was a brilliant day for all involved at Merseyrail Bootle and they will now carry on in the Women's FA Cup with an away fixture to Blackpool Wren Rovers to be played on 12th October 2014.

However, the Bucks got off to the worst start possible when they fell behind after 3 minutes. Joel Melia's cross lobbed over stranded Bucks keeper Dean Porter and found the far corner of the net, to give his side the lead. Town soon came close to extending their lead, when Chris Simpson latched onto Paul Walker's long ball, but Simpson could only fire past the far post.

The Bucks soon began to grow into the game and had a chance to level just after the 20 minute mark. **Tom Peterson** picked up a long ball by Shaun Harris; However, Peterson's shot was superbly tipped over the bar by Town goalkeeper Chris Taylor. From the resulting corner **Sean Coulton** headed over.
