History of the Bucks



The original Bootle F.C. were formed in 1880 and played at Hawthorne Road. They were in fact Everton FC's biggest rivals. In 1889–90 Bootle became founder members of the Football Alliance, narrowly missing out on the football league to the blues. That season was the

most successful as we finished league runners-up, reached the quarter-finals of the FA Cup, where we lost to Blackburn Rovers (0-7). When the Alliance merged with the Football League in 1892, Bootle became founder members of the new Second Division. However, despite a respectable 8th place final position, the club dropped out after one season (and were replaced by neighbours Liverpool) and seemingly disappeared due to financial problems.

Football returned to Hawthorne Road when a new club, Bootle Athletic. was later formed with the new team initially playing in the Liverpool Leagues. In 1948 when the club were elected to the Lancashire Combination 2, which was won at the first attempt. However, Bootle struggled in the top-flight and

after several tough seasons withdrew and folded during the 1953–54 campaign. In 1953, the current club was formed as Langton and played in the local leagues. After a very successful spell in the Liverpool County Combination (which we



won on numerous occasions) the club reverted back to it's It's better known identity of Bootle F.C. in 1973; and a year later joined the Lancashire Combination, which we won in 1976 and 1977. Bootle then joined the Second Division of the Cheshire County League, which was won in our first season, and we were promoted to the First Division. In 1982 the Cheshire County League was one of the leagues that merged to form the North West Counties League, which Bootle duly joined, becoming a member of the First Division. The club spent most of their time in the First Division until 2000 when we unfortunately dropped into the Second Division. However, despite finishing 6th in 2002, the club

despite finishing oth in 2002, the club dropped into the Liverpool County Combination. In 2006 the club, with a new ground, were elected back into Division 2 of the North West Counties League. In 2009 Bootle won promotion to the NWCL Premier

Division and also won the Championship. In 2009/10, our first season back in the NWCFL Premier Division Bootle finished a NWCFL highest placing of 3rd. In 2010/11 finished 6th place. They equalled the 3rd place again in 2012. With the ground grading and charter standard status established in 2011/12 the club are looking to progress to the next level.


Our last 2 home games have seen us beat Stockport Sports and Runcorn Linnets. We dominated both games from start to finish and hopefully we can do do the same today.

Padiham – the Storks made a presentation before the game against AFC Blackpool to club captain Martin Parkes, to commemorate his 250th appearance for the club. Martin made his debut for the club on the final day of the 2004-5 season at New Mills in a 3-3 draw, after joining Padiham at the start of that season as an under 17s player.

Oldham Boro – the club will be arranging the presentation of a match ball to striker James Curley, who scored four goals last weekend in Boro's 7-0 win at Eccleshall. Secretary Billy O'Neill explained: "It's been just under 10 years since somebody scored 4 goals in a game for the club, and therefore we felt James's performance was worthy of recognition".

League Statistician Paul Cowburn reports that the last player to score four goals in a game for Oldham Town/Oldham Boro was Darren Higgins, who scored four in a 5-1 victory at home to Holker Old Boys in a Division Two game on 22nd November 2003.

Chadderton – goalkeeper Dale Latham, who has won two Division One "Goalkeeper of the Month" awards during 2012 has been rewarded for his consistent form with a move to Blue Square Bet North side Droylsden. Chadderton Secretary Dave Shepherd said: "Dale was in his second season with us, and as well as being in great form, he has a very good attitude on and off the football pitch.

"We played Droylsden in a Manchester Senior Cup tie a couple of weeks ago, and although we lost 2-1 Dale had an outstanding game. Straight afterwards, he was approached by Droylsden and has now signed for them. Obviously we are very happy for Dale that he has been given the opportunity to play at a club four divisions higher than us, although we are naturally disappointed to lose him. However, his departure gives a chance for someone else to stake a claim for our goalkeeper's jersey".

Our Visitors today....

Within the borough of Halton, and on the Southern bank of the River Mersey. Directly North across the Mersey is the town of Widnes; while 8 miles to the Northeast is Warrington; and downstream 16 miles to the West is the City of Liverpool.

Runcorn Town were formed in 1967 under the name of Mond Rangers FC. They played for the first few years in the Runcorn Sunday league, and in 1973 they made the decision to try Saturday football in the impressive Warrington and District League (WDL). In their first season they finished as runners up, and after amalgamating with ICI Weston for the 1974/75 season, they became one of the strongest sides in the league. They remained in the WDL until 1984 when they were elected to join the West Cheshire League (WCL) Division Two.



Mond established themselves as a good, solid mid-table team until the 1991/92 season when they won their first silverware in the West Cheshire Bowl as well as a respectable sixth place finish. The following season they finished third in the league and reached the Bowl final,

with another third place finish the following season in which they scored 100 goals and regaining the Bowl. Promotion finally came in 1994/95 when they finished second in the league scoring 118 goals. They also

reached the Final of the Cheshire Amateur Cup but lost to Poulton Victoria in a match played at Prenton Park, Tranmere.

Despite sharing the Bill Weight Memorial Trophy in that first season, Division One proved a struggle and they were relegated for the first time in the clubs history in 2001/02. Success returned in 2004/05 with the team finishing as runners up in Division Two, winning the Runcorn Senior Cup and reaching the final of the Bowl.

Ahead of the 2005/06 season, the club changed their name to Runcorn Town in order to try and bring a more professional look to the club in general, and hopefully





Bucks Run out of Steam on the Road

After a first half that showed so much promise, the Bucks reserves slumped to a dismal 4-1 defeat to a youthful and energetic Ashton Athletic side, dropping them one place to fifth in the league.

To use the old cliche, this was, "a game of 2 half's," one in which Bootle dominated and would have been no surprise to all those watching if they would have gone in at least 3 goals to the good at half time, some cracker goalkeeping and poor missed opportunities in front of goal, meant that the score was 1-1 at half time.

Ashton took the lead early on through a headed goal from a corner, due to some slack marking at the near post allowing a free header at goal that rocketed into the net like a bullet, indeed Bootle where very poor inviting numerous unchallenged headers at goal in the first half, still Bootle rallied quickly to equalized. They played some fantastic passing football and should have capitalized on the many chances that they created in the first half, still with the score 1-1 there was plenty to play for in the second half.

The second half seen Ashton come out of the blocks the quickest and battled on to take firstly and 2-1 lead and then a 3-1 lead, with some slick passing and movement that Bootle had no answer to, that left them chasing shadows at times.

Bootle tried to bolster up the team by bringing on 3 substitutes in a short space of time, only to have lady luck abandon them completely as they lost a player to injury reducing them to 10 men this was further compounded when a Bucks player was shown a second yellow card and ultimately a red card for dissent, further reducing them to 9 men, and shortly later followed the 4th goal for Ashton.

Strangely enough this all seemed to galvanise the Bootle team and they played some of their best football of the second half in which with some better finishing and a little more luck could have made the score a little more respectable. Final score Ashton Athletic Res 4-1 Bootle Res

increase support from both businesses and individuals in the local community. A decision was also made to try and improve facilities at the club with a view to joining the North West Counties League.


The season got off to a good start with the Bill Weight Memorial Cup won early on and the Runcorn Cup added, but on the final day of the season, they slipped into the relegation places for the first time to suffer a heart-breaking relegation.

Town quickly regrouped and bounced back the next season by winning Division Two for the first time.

The following three seasons saw top four finishes, although the main progression was off the field as the ground was transformed. Hard standing, seating and floodlights were installed for the first time, with the dressing rooms also upgraded. This enabled the club to be elected to the North West Counties League at the start of the 2010/11 season, with the club also entering the FA Vase and the Cheshire Senior Cup for the first time in their history.

It is fair to say that the first season in the league exceeded all expectations, with the team losing just two league matches as they secured promotion to the Premier Division as runners-up, with James McShane finishing as the league's overall leading scorer with 43 goals. The Quarter Final of the Division One Trophy was also reached as well as the Semi Final of the Challenge Cup, whilst Warrington were held in the Cheshire Senior Cup before losing on penalties.

In the clubs' FA Vase debut season, the club also wrote headlines as they progressed



Last season saw the club enter the Premier Division in the same vein that they left Division One, with the team losing out on the title on the last day of the season to Ramsbottom United. James McShane once again topped the scoring charts with Town scoring over 120 goals in all competitions.


The club were also once again the last remaining NWCL side in the FA Vase, this time reaching a replay in the Last 32 before bowing out. We also made our debut in the FA Cup, winning two games before bowing out in the 1st Qualifying

His over exuberance and desire to win sometimes lead him into trouble with match officials but if we can harness this positively, his obvious talent will I'm sure allow him to enjoy a long career in Semi-Professional football.

Dave Parry and myself have worked with Jack for the past 6 years during which time he was consistently top goalscorer, not only for the team but in the League. Always a centre forward, Jack regularly came to the attention of Club scouts and had spells at Liverpool, Blackburn, Wrexham and Everton but none were prepared to invest in his obvious talent. Last season Jack scored 35 goals as the Youth team won the Liverpool County FA Under 18 Division as under 17's. It was during this season that Jack's progression really started to



accelerate. He has always possessed lightening pace and an eye for goal but other areas of his game developed significantly, such as his movement off the ball, the timing of his runs and his physical strength. Jack will always score goals and I've no doubt that he will continue to develop, now he is playing at a higher level.

Joel Powell

Joel first came to my attention at Under 13 level as a Centre Forward when he scored twice against a team I was running. His pace and goalscoring ability where apparent but I'm sure Joel will agree that were some "rough edges" to his game. Nevertheless, Joel agreed to sign for a team I was running at the time called Fur & Feather and he took the very competitive South Liverpool League by storm, scoring 17 goals before Christmas that year, which inevitably brought him to the attention of League clubs and spells at Liverpool and Everton followed.
