

Bootle Football Club



The original Bootle F.C. were formed in 1880 and played at Hawthorne Road. In 1889–90 Bootle became founder members of the Football Alliance. That season was the most successful as we finished league runners-up, reached the quarter-finals of the FA Cup,

where we lost to Blackburn Rovers (0-7). When the Alliance merged with the Football League in 1892, Bootle became founder members of the new Second Division. However, despite a respectable 8th place final position, the club dropped out after one season (and were replaced by neighbours Liverpool) and seemingly disappeared due to financial problems. Football returned to Hawthorne Road when a new club, Bootle Athletic. was later formed with the new team initially playing in the Liverpool Leagues. In 1948 when the club were elected to the Lancashire Combination 2, which was won at the first attempt. However, Bootle struggled in the top-flight and after several tough seasons withdrew and folded during the 1953–54 campaian.

In 1953, the current club was formed as Langton and played in the local leagues. After a very successful spell in the Liverpool County Combination (which we won on numerous occasions) the club reverted back to it's



It's better known identity of Bootle F.C. in 1973; and a year later joined the Lancashire Combination, which we won in 1976 and 1977. Bootle then joined the Second Division of the Cheshire County League, which was won in our first season, and we were promoted to the First Division. In 1982 the Cheshire County League was one of the leagues that merged to form the North West Counties League, which Bootle duly joined, becoming a member of the First Division. The club spent most of their time in the First Division until 2000 when we unfortunately dropped into the Second Division. However, despite finishing 6th in 2002, the club dropped into the Liverpool County Combination. In 2006 the club, with a new ground, were elected back into Division 2 of the North West Counties League. In 2009 Bootle won promotion to the NWCL Premier Division and also won the Championship. In 2009/10, our first season back in the Vodkat Premier League Bootle finished a NWCFL highest placing of 3rd. In 2010/11 despite a shaky start Bootle finished a respectable 6th place.

With the club continuing to grow off the field, all eyes are on what can be produced on the field this season, with the NWCFL Premier Division a firm goal in what could be another success for this fast growing club looking to progress again.







Tales From The Northwest Counties

Lost (and won) in the snow at Bootle

The year was 1886 and Merseyside had been affected by a heavy snowfall when Everton arrived at Hawthorne Road to play Bootle. The visiting players, along with their Bootle counterparts, rolled up their sleeves and helped to clear the snow from the playing surface. The gates of the ground were thrown open the moment the pitch was deemed "playable" and around 4,000 people paid for admission. Everton won the game with a single goal that was scored by their recent signing from Wrexham, "Job Wilding". A sports reporter, from The Football Field, witnessed the events of the day...

"What means this eager anxious throng? Thus said a clerical-looking individual in Hawthorne Road, Why its Bootle and Everton to-day, man". And with a look of supreme contempt the weight passed on. How meaningless to the one, of what to the moment of another, the information so pithily expressed. Yes, it is in Liverpool as elsewhere. No doubt each of the numerous readers of the Field could supply this pair of neighbourly rivals, for there is scarcely a district where our noble game has penetrated, where the followers of the game, are not broken up in to two rival camps, "So was our field last Saturday, Once more the elements were unkind. The field of battle was covered in snow, and a drizzling rain kept threatening. Still the real enthusiasts are not easily wet and some four thousand of these idiots (?) braved the terrors of the tic and rheumatic to indulge in a very healthy form of excitement. All sorts and conditions of men where here, City and town councilors, M. Ps in prospect and fair sprinkling of the fair sex. Side by side on stand were to be seen. But while we are taking in the situation, the champions have entered the arena. And that burly figure is the celebrated Sam Ormerod. There will be no fighting today, for here is a referee who understands his business. And now the spin of the coin, the men are in their places. "Like greyhounds of the leash, they await the signal. They are off, the nimble Evertonians take a quick spurt to their opponent's goal, A mere spasm; for now the Bootle men begin their clever combined play, and a few brilliant efforts cause the hearts to beat high with hope and apprehension. But no, Dobson is in form today, He is not to be begten and soon gives his own men a chance. Eggerly seizing the opportunity, with great speed they rush to the other end. A guick pass and the goal is at the mercy of Wilding "Goal" Well played and a grand piece of play be Bootle custodian averts imminent disaster.

And now the pace grows furious. Here is training. The Tories are like cats in their movements. Bang again at the Bootle goal, and the discordant cries of the throng as the ball is fisted out and again returned a moment later, betoken no ordinary excitement. "Everton will win" mentally ejaculate the onlookers, Elation on one hand and gloom on the other. But what is this? The solely pressed home team is away. This is combination, look you, and the game veers completely round. How the home players swarm to the assault? But the Everton backs are impassable. Gibson the Bootle back forges his way through the opposing ranks and shots iust as Dobson tackles him "Through"! But no, Marriott, floundering from a heavy charge touches the ball, which just rolls around the post. Up to half time, from this point the game was very even, and a splendid save from Galbraith immediately preceded the interval. There was a slackening of the pace to commence this half but when Wilding with a beautiful shot scored, the excitement was at fever heat. And now the leaders execute "a strategic move" to the rear, whilst Bootle crowd to the attack. With strengthened defence Everton are determined to keep ahead. Tis leaitimate - that's all. Many narrow escapes had the Everton goal, but Dobson played with the power of three men, and when the final whistle blew, Everton bounded off to the pavilion amidst the enthusiastic plaudits of their loving followers, whilst Bootle more quietly wended their way, beaten but not disgraced." 



football first with the Moffat Switz, and then in the town club, of which he was a member when they wen the Churchill and Southern Counties (Scotland) Charity Cup. In 1887, on account Bootle and played as a wing forward. He has her represented the District on several occasions, and as an amateur he has won several pedestrian svents. commenced playing football when only fifteen years of age with Preston Wanderers, when that club was in a promising position. Some ittle difference, however, arose with the North End Executive, and Kitter, along with several other players, who have since done good services in the football field, Bob similar, of Evertible, for instance, left that club Ramblers. Eventually, however, we find this promising young player loasted at Haydock, with the colliery club. His builtant play last year for Haydock in the Lancavire Cup Tie against Accrington, at Bootle, took the tancy of some of the Bootle committee, and Kilner being approached succumbed to the infuser eats of these gentlemen and came to Bootle-a hard working and very judicious player, can play in any position in the field ; born at Preston height 5ft. Sin., weight 10st, 61b., aged twenty-one years.



W. R. HASTINGS

another Caledonian child, began his football life in his native village Plains, where he frolicked at right wing for the Plains Bluebells, afterwards joining the Glengowan club, playing two seasons as inside right. The following year the Airdronians raked him in, and he was in the team which won the Airdrie Charity Cup. The year after that they won the Lanark County Cup, and maintained their right to the charity trophy also. He played with Everton Reserve, and joined the Bootle soon after, having several friends in the team. This is, therefore, Wattie's third season with the Bootle club, for whom he has done right rooman service.



D. JARDINE

began playing football when a schoolboy in Scotland, and had also much valuable practice in attending sports where five-aside football contests were organised. In 1885 he joined the Mid-Annaudale club, played as goalkeeper till 1888, when he crossed the Cheviota for salubrious Bootle, where his play is too well known to need comment. Daring the last few years he has won many medals and badges for sidecompetitions and place-kicking. Jardine is twenty-one years of age, weighs 10 st. 5 lbs., and is 5 ft. 8 in, high.



HUGHIE GALBRAITH.
ye ken, wis brocht up in t' Laud o' Cakes, but its
afther being born in Gireland be was, in county Waterford, during the auspicious year of 1868. But he only stopped there till he was three months old. and the people were just beginning to like him. It was in Dundee he first played, for the Taybank, a capital junior clab, and, after aiding them for three seasons, he joined the Dunder East End. one of the best clubs in Forfarshire, with whom he played a couple of sensons at half. He was elected captain, but had to leave for Edinburgh on business engagements. Returning to Dundee he joined the Our Boys, and remained with them till requisitioned by Bootle for the post of inside right, which he has held ever since. Galbraith has represented the Liverpool District team on several occa-



THOMAS MORRIS. Twenty-four years ago the Weish town of Denbigh saw an important event. Thomas Morris being then ushered into this valu of tears and woe, or perhaps wears and too would better fit the oceasion. Tommy has grown a good deal since then, and now weighs 10 stone prompt, his height being 5 feet 5 in. The Denbigh Church choristors was his first football club, and soon afterwards he played in the second team of the town club in 1879, and was promoted to the first team the following season. At the end of 1881 Morris came to Liverpool, and threw in his lot with the Stanley Rovers, as right outside, and later on he joined the Cambrians. At the end of 1882 he played several games with the Bootle, and next year he joined, the club, playing for the district team in 1883. His general position is right wing, which he prefers to any other, and says. "Please write I'm all right at outside right." He has played longer than any other member of the team for Bootle, and at the end of this season his services are to be rewarded with a benefit match. Good old Tom. May I be there to see.



ALBERT ALLSOP.

Ha ha! Albert Allsop is a genuine native boy, having been born in beauteous Bootle during the year 1869. His first football experience was gained with the Linacre Club, and the Bootle was his next field of fame. In 1885, whon sixteen years of age, Allsop played for the District team, which he has frequently done since. He got the sack several times-that is to say, he got into the sack and won a few sack races during his time. As the poet puts it, "Sack est vita," or so Albert thought it was for he went in for it strongly. His height is 5 feet 6 inches, and he weighs 115 some. In spite of all temptations to belong to associations of other towns, Alison prefers to stay at home, and do battle for his native heath, so to speak, as it were, in a manner.
