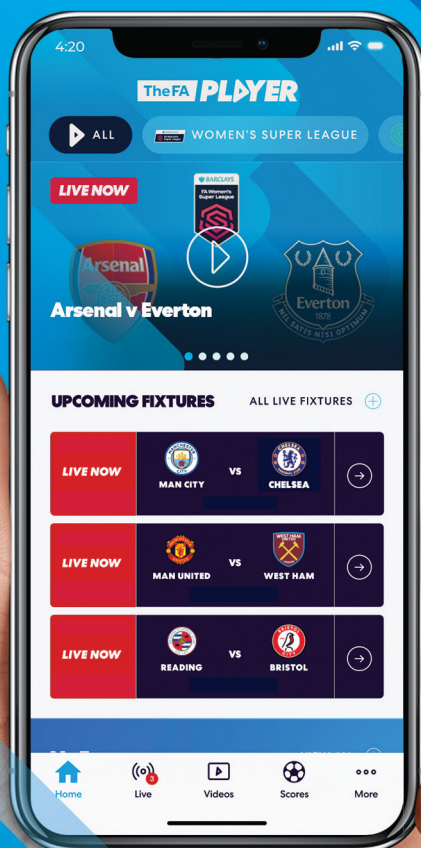

A brief history

AFC Sudbury was formed on Tuesday 1st June 1999 from the amalgamation of Sudbury Town (founded 1885) and Sudbury Wanderers (founded 1958) The club plays at The Wardale Williams Stadium, Sudbury, Suffolk with a capacity of 2500.

In their first season 1999/00, the club finished third in the Jewson Premier League and the Reserve side won the Premier League title in the Essex and Suffolk Border League.

In 2000/01 the club powered their way to the Jewson League Premier title, reached the First Round Proper of the FA Cup and the Reserves won the Essex and Suffolk Border League Cup.

In 2001/02 the club retained the Jewson League title and reached the Semi-Final of the FA Vase and won the Suffolk Premier Cup.

In 2002/03 AFC Sudbury retained the Jewson Premier League Premier and won the Suffolk Premier Cup. They also reached the final of the FA Vase being beaten 2-1 by Brigg Town. After this manager Keith Martin stepped down and was replaced by the Reserve Team Manager Gary Harvey.

2003/04 saw a fourth successive Ridgeons League title and the Suffolk Premier Cup retained. The FA Vase Final was reached, again it was lost 2-0 against Winchester City. Improvements were made to King's Marsh with it becoming fully enclosed, new turnstiles and a fully automated sprinkler system installed.

In 2004/05 the club were again successful, they won their fifth consecutive Ridgeons Premier League title (a record for the Eastern Counties League), and for third year in succession reached the final of the FA Vase another record, unfortunately they again lost 3-2 to Didcot Town. The semi-final of both the Suffolk Premier Cup and the Ridgeons League Cup were also reached.

In 2005/06 the club continued in the Ridgeons Premier League and finished third, the Ridgeons League Cup was won for the first time and the fifth round of the FA Vase reached.

The Reserve side played in the Ridgeons Reserve League Southern Division and won that. In the play-off between the North and South winners, they were runners up but won the Suffolk Junior Cup.

Season 2006/07 saw the club accept promotion to Step 4, and the new Ryman League Division One North. The club changed managers with Mark Morsley taking over. The play-off finals were reached where they lost in a penalty shoot out.

The 2007/08 season was a nearly season. The club was still managed by Morsley aided by assistant Nicky Smith and coach Paul Skingley. The club got to the final of the Ryman League Cup but lost on penalties. They again reached the play-off finals but lost in the semi-finals. The club's Reserve side led by Ian Manby finished runners up in the Ridgeons Reserve League South.

In May 2008 Morsley resigned and Nicky Smith was appointed manager with Chris Tracey as his assistant. A few days later the club were moved from the Ryman League and placed in the Southern League Midland Division for season 2008/09.

In the FA Trophy they reached the First Round, and finished the season in twelfth position. The Reserves continued in the Ridgeons Reserve League, and a mid-table finish ensued but they did win the Chell Trophy.

The 2009/10 season saw Smith and Chris Tracey still in charge, and still in the Southern League. AFC lost in the First Qualifying Round of both the FA Cup and FA Trophy. In the Southern League Cup it was a Second Round exit and it was the same round in the Suffolk Premier Cup. AFC finished the season in 14th position in the league. The club's Reserve team played in the Ridgeons Reserve League and had an average season.

During the season the King's Marsh new facilities were finished in May 2010 and were back in the Ryman Division One North. Jamie Redknapp performed the official opening of the new clubhouse in June 2010 and the ground was re-named The MEL Group Stadium.

Smith and Tracey remained in charge of the first team for 2010/11 and Ian Manby the second team, with a new A Team started and played in the Colchester and North Essex League under Phil Root.

The first team ended in seventh place. In the FA Trophy they lost in the First Round \Proper.

The Reserve side finished third in the league and lost in the final of the Suffolk Senior Reserve Cup. The A Team completed their first season satisfactorily.

Season 2011/12 saw Smith and Tracey start the season but Smith later resigned and Tracey was put in temporary charge and later appointed permanent manager. In the Ryman League North they finished in eighth place. The Reserves had a disappointing season the Ridgeons Reserve League while the A Team started completed their second season.

The start of season 2012/13 saw Chris Tracey in charge with Barry Lakin at his side, he departed in September and Ian Brown joined as his assistant. Tracey resigned in March 2013 and Michael Shinn and Ian Brown took charge until the end of the season. The Reserves continued in the Thurlow Nunn League under Ian Manby and Dave Walton and the A Team continued under the guidance of Phil Root.

History Continued

In May 2013 the club appointed David Batch along with Head Coach Steve Eastaugh as their new management team for 2013/14 and they quickly set about building not only a fresh squad but also the entire structure of the football club. The Reserve/Under 21 side was elected into the Thurlow Nunn First Division under the initial guidance of Head Coach Dave Walton and the A Team continued under John Baldwin. The season was one of improvement for the first team but the other sides lesser so.

The 2014/15 season saw Batch and Eastaugh start it but leave in December. A new management team of Jamie Godbold and Andy Reynolds took over and led the club to third place and to the play-offs but were unsuccessful in them.

The Res/U21's led by Danny Laws and Dave Cannon finished in fourteenth place and won the Thurlow Nunn First Division Knockout Cup.

The newly formed U18's side led by Craig Power performed well and ended third in the table.

The ground was renamed The Wardale Williams Stadium.

For 2015/16 Godbold and Reynolds continued in post with Danny Laws and Dave Cannon in charge of the Res/Academy. The club installed a 3G pitch and started the AFC Academy. The season was an undoubted success with AFC never being out of the top six in Ryman North and they won the Championship on 9th April 2016 ensuring promotion to the Ryman Premier Division. The Reserves finished mid-table while the Academy won their League.

2016/17 saw the club in the Ryman Premier League for the first time still with Godbold and Reynolds at the helm. It was a disappointing season as the club were relegated for the first time in their history. The Reserves/Academy continued under Laws and Cannon with teams in the Ryman Development League, The Essex Senior Reserve League as well as the Thurlow Nunn Youth League and the National Youth Alliance League. The Under 18's won their Division in the Thurlow Nunn Youth League and then the entire Youth League Championship. They won the Suffolk FA Midweek Under 18 Cup and also the Thurlow Nunn Youth League Cup.

On 13th May 2017 Godbold and Reynolds were announced as the first team management duo for the 2017/18 season and Danny Potter appointed as goalkeeping coach. The Academy/Reserves continued under the same leadership with another reserve

On 12th September 2017 Godbold and Reynolds were relieved of their duties with Danny Laws taking over as Caretaker Manager.

On 2nd October 2017 former manager Mark Morsley was re-appointed on a three and half year contract, he brought in former player Lee Norfolk as his assistant while Paul Skingley returned as head coach.

The club blooded many young Academy players and finished the season in twelfth place. The Reserves in the Thurlow Nunn side ended mid-table while the other side were lower down their league.

2018-19 League position : 8th

Season 21/22 after the two previous seasons had been declared null and void due to the Covid pandemic, saw Mark Morsley leave his role during the pre season along with a raft of other coaching staff and players and in his place came the management duo of Rick Andrews and Angelo Harrop.

Signed for the 2020-21 season. Started his career at Colchester United. Right sided full back / wing back

Right Back Ollie joined the club during the 2022-23 season from Stowmarket Town where he'd previously played under Rick Andrews.

Brad Byrne

A product of the AFC Academy. Centre back Brad Byrne has tasted success with the Academy and is now trying to force his way into the 1st team setup after playing for them pre season

Joe Carroll

Like Brad, Joe has come through the AFC Academy. Left sided defender Joe was a late starter in football, only really starting to take it seriously around 4 years ago but is now looking to force his way into the 1st team picture.

Harrison Chatting

Harrison joined the club during the summer of 22-23 from newly promoted Canvey island. A combative midfielder who links play well.

Some more players

George Cocklin

George joined the club fairly late in the 21-22 season from Coggeshall Town. A tenacious midfielder who breaks up play and wins the ball back for us.

Romario Dunne

Maz was signed during the 21-22 season from Braintree Town. An athletic forward, Romario has an eye for goal and is rapid! Unfortunately picked up a serious injury in October 21 and has yet to return.

Joe Grimwood

Young defender who is another product of the AFC Academy having started at Bury Town. Made his debut in the away match at Norwich United on the penultimate Saturday of the 2017/18 season and has become a regular squad member, captaining the side in 22.

Reece Harris

Utility midfielder who has played for a number of clubs Reece joined Sudbury from Heybridge Swifts in mid-September. Spent two season with Welling United in the National League at the highest level of non-league football making 62 appearances at that level. Has also played for Braintree Town, Thurrock, East Thurrock United and Concord Rangers.

Sak Hassan

Sak joined the club at the turn of the year the 21-22 season and scored off the bench on debut against Bury Town. Sak has been capped by Somalia and the attacking midfielder's potential is only matched by his beaming smile.

Ben Hunter

Ben is yet another product of the club's academy. Midfielder Ben left the club as Rick took over at the beginning of the 21-22 season but has returned now from Leiston and has slotted straight back into the side.

Dylan Kirk

An AFC Academy graduate who is a wide man / forward. Dylan scored important goals during 21-22 for the academy in their many cup runs and is now trying to force his way into the 1st team plans.

Nnamdi Nwachuku

SO, ULTIMATELY, Football Association chiefs finally made the only sensible call they could have made in granting an extension to the season for clubs at Steps 5 and 6.

But even though that affords the likes of Sandhurst Town, Brook House, Horndean and Bacup Borough a bit of breathing space from their ridiculous end-of-season fixture avalanche – Sandhurst having to play 11 games in 10 days at one point – there is a bigger picture to consider here.

Tackling congested fixture pile-ups come March and April is no new dilemma for clubs these days, and therein lies the problem.

On average, you can expect to lose at least two or three league fixtures over the course of the season, but on the odd year of extraordinary weather patterns such as this, contingency plans have to be put in place.

It's not necessarily the regulation league season which is causing the problem – there are enough Saturdays and Tuesdays in the calendar to comfortably take in a 46-game season – but the numerous cup competitions which clubs are often obliged, or felt pressured to, compete in.

Take my old friends down at Fleet Town, for example. These days, the Blues ply their trade in the Wessex League Premier but that just scratches the surface of a gruelling first-team campaign which also takes in FA Cup, FA Vase, Wessex League Cup, Hampshire Senior Cup, Southern Combination Cup, Russell Cotes Cup and Aldershot Senior Cup.

Eagle-eyed readers of The NLP's extensive fixtures page may have noticed that there are some regional or district cup competitions still trying to get through delayed second or third round matches. Indeed, for some, the backlog of fixtures is often so great that the competitions have, in the past, been carried over into the pre-season of the following campaign.

Sadly, though, one of Non-League football's great institutions is also implicated here – the County Cup.

This week, we saw two instances of National League clubs having to all but relinquish their challenge for honours at the semi-final stage due to fixture clashes.

Firstly, in Hampshire, we heard that Aldershot Town had been informed by the Hampshire Senior Cup sub-group that their semi-final tie against Basingstoke Town HAD to be played on Tuesday April 18.

But the Shots – proud six-time County Cup winners - had already rearranged their crucial National League game with Wealdstone for that date, meaning that despite their best efforts to arrange an alternative date, they had no choice but to fulfil their fixture but field their Under 21 academy side.

“The club wanted to move the fixture to give our supporters an opportunity to attend both our League fixture with Wealdstone and Cup fixture with Basingstoke but regret that unfortunately a choice between the two will have to be made,” a club statement confirmed.

“We’re incredibly proud of their achievements so far in this year’s Hampshire Senior Cup and will be supporting the youngsters from Wealdstone.”

And, it was the same story along the south coast at Worthing.

Following the postponement of their National League South game with Cheshunt to a waterlogged pitch last week, the match was put back to the only available date left available, Tuesday April 25.

This, however, had been listed just 24 hours before the Rebels’ already scheduled Sussex Senior Cup semi-final against Hastings United.

Despite constant dialogue with the National League and Sussex County FA to see if the congestion could be eased, a solution could not be found owing to “multiple factors”, again meaning Worthing will have to field an under-strength side for the Hastings game with play-offs still very much in the offing.

Club chairman Barry Hunter commented: “Naturally this creates a huge conflict as it schedules us to play four games in eight days, which is not possible without compromise.

“We would also plan to speak with the Sussex FA at the end of the season in the hope we could work with them and other clubs to find ways to avoid the congestion experienced this season.”

Barry is right, discussions do need to be had. Most supporters have some very fond memories from their club’s respective County Cup competitions and take great pride in claiming regional bragging rights should their club be lucky enough to lift the trophy.

But the fact remains that County FAs such as Hampshire and Sussex can’t expect the likes of Aldershot and Worthing to put their whole season on the line at this crucial stage when there is still so much to play for in the league. If anything, they should be supporting their member clubs in their quest to achieve a highest possible league position. I mean, it’s in their best interests, right?

The plight of Aldershot and Worthing – and no doubt other clubs up and down the country – will once again place the future of the County Cup into doubt.

Personally, I like to think they still have a part to play in the fabric of a Non-League season, but unless there is more understanding and flexibility in the fulfilling of priority fixtures, then the more difficulty I have in making an argument for it to remain on the modern-day fixture list.

Something, somewhere along the line surely has to give.
