weekend Round up in the Isthmian North

After a three point deduction for playing an ineligible player, Maldon & Tiptree started the day ahead of second place Aveley only on goal difference- which added some spice to the meeting of the two at Park Drive. The Jammers got the breakthrough through Jerome Slew in the twenty third minute, apparently against the run of play, but the same player got the next goal too, doubling the lead two minutes after the break. Wyan Reid quickly halved the Jammers advantage, but the hosts got the crucial fourth goal eight minutes from time, Ryan Charles making sure of the points.

If our top match had ended in a draw then Bury Town knew they might be on top of the table by 5PM. They hosted Canvey Island, but it was the visitors who took the lead, Sam Bantick getting the opening goal nine minutes into the second half- and it turned out to be the only goal, as the Gulls went tenth.

Heybridge Swifts travelled to Grays Athletic, and it was Jim Cooper's side who got the breakthrough, Manny Ogunrinde scoring on the half hour. Within ten minutes the match had turned on its head, however, Evans Kouassi equalising before Odei Martin-Sorondo put Swifts ahead in the fortieth minute. Swifts were three-one up by the break, Harrison Chatting with the third just before the half time whistle, but Grays reduced the arrears with twenty three minutes to go as Ogunrinde got his second. The equaliser wouldn't come, however, and Swifts closed to within four points of the leaders.

Great Wakering Rovers, who started the day in fifth place, travelled to tenth place Dereham Town. The Magpies had seen a fabulous run come to a shuddering stop, picking up only one point from their last twelve, whilst Rovers were unbeaten in three matches which have seen them pick up seven points- and continued in a similar manner by taking the lead after seventeen minutes, Martin Tuohy with the opening goal of the afternoon. Dereham were level three minutes after the restart with a goal from Toby Hilliard, but with eighteen minutes remaining Billy Johnson restored the Rovers lead and soon afterwards Jake Gordon made it three. Nine minutes from time Jack Stevenson made it four, and Rovers had well and truly cemented their place in the top five.

Coggeshall Town, outside the playoff places on goals scored, needed to start turning draws into victories. The Seed Growers had drawn their last four, but visiting Brentwood Town had only one win in seven so surely the hosts were favourites? After a goalless first half, however, it was first blood to the visitors, Rene Batlokwa scoring in the first minute of the second period- and it got worse for the Coggeshall as George Cocklin saw red. The ten men couldn't find a way through and Brentwood held on for the points- putting seven between themselves and bottom side Romford.

Histon saw their good run come to an end as they were walloped five-nil at AFC Sudbury in midweek. They would have been hoping to get back to the form that saw them pick up three consecutive victories prior to that match, as they entertained Basildon United, and they made a good start, Danny Gould putting them ahead on twenty minutes. The Bees buzzed back, and Adam Vyse equalised fourteen minutes later, but parity lasted only a minute before Lee Smith restored the Histon lead. After the break Ed Rolph extended the home advantage, getting their third, but Basildon couldn't be shaken off and Jimmy Cox pulled it back to three-two seven minutes later. Six minutes from time the Bees were level, Vyse scoring his second goal of the game, but they then went down to ten men as Thomas Anderson saw red- however Histon couldn't take advantage and had to settle for a point.

Ninth place Tilbury entertained Witham Town. The Dockers had only one defeat in their last nine matches and victory could have seen them climb as high as fifth if other results went their way. Witham saw their three match unbeaten run come to an end as they were walloped by Maldon & Tiptree last time out, but would have hoped to restart their momentum- and got the breakthrough as Declan Nche opened the scoring four minutes before half time. Eljay Worrell drew the Dockers level shortly after the restart, and that was the end of the scoring.

Felixstowe hosted Soham Town Rangers. Rangers ended an eight match run without a win by defeating Dereham Town last time out, whilst the Seasiders won their last home match, defeating Basildon, and would have wanted to build on that- but it was the visitors who made the breakthrough, Luke Brown opening the scoring in the eleventh minute.

Soham were two up seventeen minutes from time, Sam Mulready putting daylight between them and their hosts, but a remarkable last two minutes saw Joseph Yaxley get a late goal back for the Seasiders and then Ollie Canfer grab an equaliser.

BEN MCNAMARA

An experienced Keeper now in his second season with the club and his leadership qualities have seen him take on the captain's arm band.

Australian born Ben joining Dagenham before spells at Braintree Town and Concord Rangers, also Bostik Premier Harlow Town, Thurrock, Northampton Town, Nuneaton Town and Hendon, for whom he gave a match-winning performance against Grays in the League Cup final at Whyteleafe in April 2015. To date Ben already has 6 clean sheets and only conceded 12 goals in 17 games.

LUKE O'REILLY

A young GK who joined the Jammers as competition to the number one jersey. Luke's journey in football has been a high profile one and after deals with Spurs and Cardiff he found himself training with Gareth Southgate's England squad in the build up to a World Cup Qualifier, alongside Joe Hart, Fraser Forster, Jack Butland and Tom Heaton. After leaving Spurs he signed for league two Carlisle and more recently has focused more on his coaching.

LANCE AKINS

A no nonsense Centre Half and strong leader on the pitch who after countless impressive performances against the Jammers in the past, we were pleased to capture his signature in the summer. Lance made his name at neighbours Witham Town under current M&T coach Adam Flint, before spells at Coggeshall Town, Tilbury, Aylesbury and Bishop Stortford.

BILLY CRACKNELL

Is one of Colchester United's bright young talents who has been exceptional for us this season. Signed on work experience forms the 17 year old has been a key part of a ruthless defense and has shown a maturity above his years. Comfortable with the ball and young man who loves to defend, a rare commodity these days and so definitely one with an exciting future ahead. Billy has also chipped in with a couple of goals.

AL-AMIN KAZEEM

A Colchester United scholar like his team mate Billy Cracknell has made the full back position his own. Both players have been integral to the teams incredible start to the season and he another 17 year old to keep an eye on. Al is the modern day full back, who can attack, defend and score goals, is very much a fans favourite who has taken the transition to men's senior football in his stride. This big game exposure will only support his football development further.

KOJO AWOTWI

A versatile and hugely exciting player who joined the Jammers from Cheshunt last season after starting the year with Concord Rangers. Kojo started his career in the youth system at Brentford, and has also played for Welling United, Billericay, VCD and Canvey Island. His match winning performances last year made him a priority to the management team in securing his signature for this season and after starting the season strongly he has been frustrated by injuries in recent weeks.

ROB GIRDLESTONE

Football educated in the West Ham Academy before moving into senior football with Chelmsford City. Rob joined the Jammers in the summer of 2018, making the step across the Essex waters from Concord Rangers where he won Players Player and Supporters player of the year. The oldest looking 23 year old, Rob has over 150 appearances in the Conference South and was Mr Consistent in his first season with the club. Recently appointed Vice Captain, he scored his very first goal ever in the home game against Grays and was promptly fined for his celebration, and rightly so. That said this was a finish that could be a goal of the season contender.

STEPHANE NGAMVOULOU

An experienced powerful, athletic midfielder signed from Hendon in November 2018 and his debut saw a strong performance and a win against high flying Coggeshall Town. Steph's footballing career starting in his homeland France where he played for US Torcy and SO Romorantin before moving to England and appearing for Wealdstone, Staines Town, Banbury United, Oxford City amongst others. This gentle giant has been outstanding this season and is a calming influence both on and off the pitch, the Grand-Papa of the team.

LASTE DOMBAXE

Midfielder signed in December 2018 from Hendon, previously East Grinstead Town. Laste began his career with Tottenham Hotspur before moving to Scandinavia to play for Osterlunds IFK in Sweden and joined Hayes & Yeading on his return. The all action midfielder is a bright ball player with a freekick or two up his sleeve, we are just yet to see that sleeve open. An ever present this season and instrumental in how we play. Keep him away from penalty spots.

QUBA GORDON

An academy defender at Borehamwood where he was rewarded with a First Team contract and squad number in 2016 following an impressive string of performances in Wood's Under 19's and reserve side. Quba was instrumental in their 18's reaching the first round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2015/16, a run which finally succumbed to near neighbours Barnet. Quba left the Wood's for regular senior football and starred at the heart of Brentwood Town's defence last season. Still only 21 he has a big future ahead and has started his Maldon career in style and forged an uncompromising partnership with Rob in the heart of our defence.

TARIQ ISSA

A born and bred Essex boy who has spend the majority of his playing career at Colchester United, from where he joins M&T on a long-term loan agreement. After a loan spell at Needham Market and the Jammers last year, Tariq looks again for regular senior football to impress the management team at his parent club and stake his claim but unfortunately he has had to sit much of his loan period on the side line after a knee injury.

SAM COOMBES

A Technically gifted midfielder who has been applying his trade in the US on the college scene. Playing for the Cowley Tigers he was named a first-team all-conference performer during the 2016 season. Coached by Brad Bobley he mastered the reverse meg-nuts and PKs.

CONOR HUBBLE

The latest addition to the squad who is unfortunately cup tied in all FA competitions. A hugely gifted midfielder, with an eye for the spectacular goal. Conor started his career with QPR before moving on to Colchester where he made his football league debut against Crawley Town. His non-league journey has seen him play for Leiston, Billericay Town and most recently Coggeshall.

TYRIQUE HYDE

After a successful trial period with Colchester United last year, Tyrique impressed enough to earn himself a deal with the club to take him through to June 2020 and joins the Jammers on loan. A former Dagenham & Redbridge midfielder, the 20-year-old had also enjoyed loan spells with Whitehawk and Bishop's Stortford during his time. An athletic midfielder who has dominated central areas for us this year and become a true favourite with the fans. Ty has one game left with us, Leyton Orient in the 1st Round Proper, lets hope he leaves with a bang.

CHARLEE HUGHES

A top signing for the Jammers in the summer and has already made his mark as one part of a prolific trio up front. An incredibly hard-working young man, Charlee naturally had a number of interested parties during the closed season and we were delighted to get his signature. After scoring 20 goals for Brentwood last season he is all but there already before November even showed up, which is outstanding. Started off at Burnham Ramblers, before Bowers came knocking and is a player who will just keep on getting better and better.

DANNY PARISH

A talented, cunning striker with huge potential. Danny started his career at Brentford before moving on for spells at Concord Rangers, Thamesmead and more recently Ashford Town, where he again finished top scorer with 24 goals and reached the play off final last season. Danny boasts that he once scored against Barcelona at La Masia (Barcelona's academy) and Inter Milan, maybe a first for a Jammer! The club are thrilled to have him with us and he has already chipped in with 18 goals as one third of flaming hot front three.

JAKE WIFFEN

A returning Jammer who represented the club at youth level before making the step in to the first team from the 18s and reserves. His performances earned him a scholarship over in the United States, where he continued his football alongside education. During his time overseas he played for Evergreen Valley college and West Texas University, as well as NPSL team Real San Jose before returning to the UK and back to where it all began.

JOROME SLEW

What a start to the season! This pacey, direct forward came through the academy at Sheffield United and in 2017 signed for Vanarama National League club Chester FC, with loan spells at Evo-Stik League Premier sides Mickleover Sports and Matlock Town as well as at Worksop Town, Harrogate Town and Goole AFC. Jorome joined the Jammers earlier in the year and scored some important goals in the promotion chase last season but no one could have envisaged his impact this season, with 20 goals already, he leads the scoring charts and like his two strike partners he won't be settling for anything less than 40+ goals this season.

HAMZA KAID

The 20-year old is another new arrive at Park Drive in the summer, signing from Mousehole AFC (yes you read that right) in the Peninsular Premier down in Cornwall where he impressed in the title winning side. Thier project is unique, offering full time football programs and since joining The Seagulls in late October 2018, Hamza has developed rapidly and after an impressive start to his Jammers career he has had to be patient, as he fights for a regular start while the forwards are setting the standard. Another young talented player who we hope to help on his footballing journey.

Maldon & Tiptree History

The re-establishment of normal life after the war saw the formation of Maldon Town FC in 1946, with their HQ at the Rose and Crown in the High Street and home venue was at Sadd's Ground on the causeway.

The Mid-Essex League Div 2 gave them their first league trophy in that season, when they gained the runners-up spot. Now transferring their home ground to the Promenade Park and joining the North-Essex League, they once again achieved runners-up spot in this league and were also runners-up in the Essex Junior Cup. Returning to the Mid-Essex Premier Division saw them lift the league title in consecutive seasons, as well as the league cup in 1949/50 Season. Success now followed them to their newly acquired Wallace Binder ground in Fambridge Road, joining the Essex and Suffolk Border League, that season the runners up spot was gained but the major trophy that year was lifting the Essex Intermediate Cup, beating a strong Leytonstone Reserve team 2-1.

Ex-Liverpool hero Kevin Baron took over the management reins continuing the success when his teams gained the runners up position in the Essex Intermediate Cup in 1964/65, 1965/66. The league winning team of 1965/66 gained them senior status, and they joined the Eastern Counties League in 1966. After six years in this league they joined the Essex Senior League, picking up the league title in 1984/85 and almost completing the double when beaten in the final of the league cup by Chelmsford City Reserves.

Moving to the new ground in Park Drive in 1994, and crossing the pyramid structure to return to the Eastern Counties League in 1996 under the continued management of Ben Embery and his assistant Steve Jackson, the pair were very unfortunate not to obtain promotion in their first season in the Jewson League (ECL). Our second year in the League proved to be a different story, with the team gaining promotion to the Premier Division, ending the 1997/98 season in the runners-up position.

In our first year in the Premier League we finished a creditable 13th position and improved that to eighth in the second year. We now entered a new era with a new manager Colin Wallington, in our third year in the Premier League we finished fourth and now looked good to progress further. In season 2002/03 we reached the semi final of the FA Vase losing to local rivals AFC Sudbury.

After 14 years as chairman Bob Large decided to stand down as he felt he had taken the Club as far as he could. The new chairman Mike Kirkham stated that he hoped to take the Club to the next step up the ladder in a few years.

Season 2005/06 after two promotion seasons we found ourselves in the Ryman Premier. This found us fighting relegation for the whole season, with our fate still being in our own hands right up to the last 3 games of the season. We did reach the final of the Thames Side Trophy losing 3-1 to Canvey Island and also the final of the Eastern Floodlit Competition losing on penalties 5-3 to Billericay Town.

Season 2006/07 saw us play in the Ryman North Division, where we finished fourth, and due to the Club not applying for promotion, the club were excluded from the play offs.

The 2007/08 season started with a new Manager Russell Tanner, after Colin Wallington left the club to join Tiptree Utd Russell brought in Dean Parrott as his assistant. The club made several major signings during the close season but these players moved on when Clubs from a higher level came in for them, this left Russell and Dean to bring in some fresh faces from Russell Tanner's former Club Witham Town plus some of the talented youngsters on the books who went on to win the Clubs Best Young Player Award that season, although the club never got to the play offs It was felt that the team had a good season.

In September 2008 former Tottenham and Millwall player Stuart Nethercott was promoted from his position of Assistant Manager to Caretaker Manager (and ultimately to permanent Manager) following the departure of Russell Tanner. Stuart's reign lasted a year, as he was replaced by former Manager Colin Wallington who hoped to bring back some of the good times to Maldon Town. Season 2009/10 saw mixed for-tunes on the pitch, due in part to the large turnover of players during the period it took the new management to put together their own team. Away from the pitch new Chairman, Alan Brockhouse and his Committee entered into a ground share arrangement with local Club Tiptree United, which, as the season progressed, saw the relationship between the two Clubs grow stronger giving obvious signs that further, more formal, amalgamation of the two Clubs seemed on the cards.

In 2009 Ed Garty took over as chairman/Owner at Maldon Town as well as running Tiptree United. In 2010 Ed Garty merged both clubs and formed Maldon & Tiptree FC

Following the retirement of Manager, Colin Wallington, assistants, Brad King and Glen Knight were promoted to Joint Managers and put in charge of the Club for the season under the new name of Maldon & Tiptree Football Club.

Season 2010/2011 saw the new club placed in or around the play-off positions for the majority of the season. Despite another high turnover of players, the good standard of football was maintained and it was frustrating for the club to fall away in the later stages of the season when suspensions and injuries eventually took their toll to leave the club frustratingly short of the play-off positions at the end of April. Following King and Knight’s departure during that season Mike Flanagan came in and took on the caretaker role and steered the club to a respectable mid-table position.

At the start of the 2012-13 campaign, Ex- Stansted & Redbridge boss Terry Spillane was appointed as Manager. After a fantastic start to the season, the club found them-selves at the top of the table but an incredible run by eventual Champions Grays Athletic meant Maldon had to settle for a place in the play-offs. Disappointment came in the Final when they lost a two goal lead to draw with Thamesmead Town, who then won through on penalties.

Kevin Horlock was the team manager from 2016 & 2017 seasons but unfortunately promotion did not come about through all his hard work.

Wayne Brown will continue as manager for season 2019 - 2020 and looks to improve on last season being runners up in the playoff final.
