North Division

Leaders Bury Town host our match of the day in the North Division, as third place Coggeshall Town travel to Ram Meadow. The hosts have an injury crisis, six members of the first team squad missing, and the Seed Growers know that victory will take them to the top of the table- but it's so tight that any one of three sides could be top tonight. The only one of the top four who can't take over at the summit are Maldon & Tiptree, and that's only because they aren't playing after their cup heroics last night.

A win for Bury could take them four points clear, but that will depend on how Heybridge Swifts do at home to seventh placed Great Wakering Rovers. Swifts lost to AFC Sudbury last time out, whilst Rovers have only three defeats from their last ten but have only won four of those. If Bury and the Seed Growers draw and Swifts win they'll take over at the summit, and if Rovers could pull off a victory they could overtake their hosts and jump back into the top five.

Grays Athletic, in fifth, hadn't managed a win in four matches until they overcame Histon by a single goal last weekend. They host Hullbridge Sports, the visitors with only one win in their last seven.

Sixth placed Aveley have only two defeats in their last ten league matches, and have been magnificent away from the league, making FA Trophy giantkilling look almost ordinary in recent weeks. They walloped Step Three Biggleswade Town four-one last weekend and will be full of confidence as they travel to Cambridge City. Their hosts lost last time out, and are still searching for consistency, winning four and losing two of their last six.

Dereham Town, who have been scoring goals for fun recently, travel to Felixstowe and Walton United. The Magpies are unbeaten in six, and scored thirteen goals in their last three, whilst the Seasiders have only two wins from ten but have become more difficult to beat of late, with only one defeat from their last four.

Tilbury, in ninth, travel to Romford- and who knows what to expect? Romford may be bottom, but they have an entirely new squad; however the Dockers have only two defeats from ten and also now have former Bowers goal machine David Knight, who already has seven goals since making his debut on November 2nd.

Canvey Island, who strengthened with the signing of Sam Bantick on Thursday, are likely to give the forward his debut as they entertain Histon today. Canvey always seem to be

searching for a good run of form and have seven points from their last twelve, but have only one defeat at home all season; whilst Histon are similarly inconsistent with only one win from their last four and only two away victories.

Basildon United host Brentwood Town, the Bees undefeated in three matches in all competitions since parting company with their latest manager whilst Town have lost their last two in the league after a four match undefeated run.

Finally for the North, Soham Town Rangers entertain Witham Town. Rangers promising early-season form has shuddered to a halt of late, as they are without a win in five, whilst their visitors have won only one of their last eight. Perhaps one of them will get back to winning ways today?

Rovers then pushed for the equaliser and looked the better side for long periods, however the hosts strength up front showed when Teniola bagged his 2nd and Swifts 3rd with a good finish to beat the on rushing Bobby Mason in goal, but Rovers were not finished, Daniel Walker netting his first goal for Rovers on the 88th minute.

Any dreams of a equaliser from the visitors were immediately squashed, when straight from the restart Teniola raced clear and finished superbly to grab his 3rd and Swifts 4th to take all three points and move up to second in the league.

Did you see the video of the Arsenal FC 'superstars' captured at Norwich City last Sunday?

If not, let me enlighten you. In it was a young mascot, about nine or ten years old, leaning against the wall opposite to Arsenal's dressing room entrance.

There he stood, in awe, as the likes of Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang, Mesut Ozil, Alexandre Lacazette, Callum Chambers and Shkodran Mustafi walked right past him in a line without any recognition or so much as a second glance. Not a smile, gentle ruffle of the hair, fist pump, nothing!

While social media went into meltdown, neither the players mentioned nor Arsenal FC – a club so proud of its community links – remained tight-lipped, seemingly unaware of the damage that such an apathetic act of human disparity can do – especially when you're being paid a handsome £350,000-a-week!

In fairness, it's not just the players at Arsenal, similar complaints have been levied at top-level players, which I why I loved the twitter response to the furore from Chris Ottaway.

Chris is the chairman of the newly-reformed Epping Town FC, who ply their trade in the Essex Olympian Football League – the 11th tier of English football and, although just 18 miles away as the crow flies, light years away from the bolted confines of the Emirates Stadium

Mr Ottaway tweeted: "Absolute disgrace. I am the Chairman of Epping Town FC. You are most welcome to be our match day mascot at a game of your choice. Bring you parents, family and friends with you and be in the presence of great footballers who are nice men at the same time. DM me if interest."

Isn't that what Non-League football is about? Isn't that the sole reason why you are reading this column right now, presumably at your local club having paid a mere few quid for the privilege?

Of course, the argument to counteract ours will consist of quips like "but we're watching world class players and you've following the butcher, baker and candlestick maker. True, we might well be, but, personally, I'd much rather enjoy watching a wholeheartedly-competitive, pure game of football played in the right sprit — and then meet the players and managers for a Coca-Cola afterwards! And with no VAR to boot! It's why there will always be a place for Non-League football and long may it continue. The poor young Norwich fan may have missed out of his big opportunity to get a glance of a

'superstar', but he has inadvertently highlighted the overriding notion of what makes our game great. Good on you, young man!

MILLERS HISTORY

AVELEY FOOTBALL CLUB was formed in 1927 and played in local leagues until 1939. Club activities were then suspended during the war years 1939/45. In 1946 the club was reformed and joined the Thurrock Combination. Aveley twice won the Essex Junior Cup, firstly in 1948, then retaining it the following year.

Aveley gained Senior League status in season 1949/50 and were elected into the London League, Division One. They were Division Champions in the 1951/52 season. In the same season they moved from Lodge Meadow to their present ground, Mill Field, and were promptly nicknamed The Millers. In season 1954/55 they were Division Champions once again which was followed by election to The Delphian League in 1955/56. They competed in this league until 1962/63 with little success.

1963/64 saw Millers join the Athenian League. Full membership of the Football Association was granted in 1964/65. Season 1970/71 was probably the clubs most successful one. The first-round proper of the FA Cup was reached along with the FA Amateur Cup quarter-finals, they were also Champions of the Athenian League.

Aveley were elected to the Isthmian League in season 1973/74. Here they competed without success in Division One until they were relegated to Division Two North at the end of the 1985/86 season. Millers did however achieve two cup successes during this time. The Essex Thames-Side Challenge Trophy was won in 1979/80 and the Hornchurch Charity Cup in 1982/83.

The 1989/90 campaign was a memorable one for The Millers. Promotion back to Division One was gained with a tremendous end of season run-in to finish second to Heybridge Swifts by two points. This was followed by a 3-0 victory over Premier Division St. Albans in the final of the AC Delco (League) Cup. This made Aveley the first team from the lowest division to win this competition. After this the club slipped down to Division Three and cup successes were limited to appearances in the finals of both the East Anglian Cup and the The Essex Thames-Side Challenge Trophy in 1997/98.

The 1999 / 2000 season started well with Aveley being un-beaten in the League at Christmas. However, a turn in fortunes saw them slip and eventually finish 9th. This was followed by 6th place in season 2000/01.

A roller-coaster season 2001/02 saw the club finish third behind Hornchurch and champions Croydon Athletic and gain promotion to Division 1 North.

An excellent season for the Millers in 2002/03. Good runs in the FA Cup and Bryco Cup were capped by an appearance in the Essex Senior Cup Final. This did not go Millers way

however with Chelmsford City winning 5-0. The Third Qualifying Round of the FA Cup was reached, eventually losing out to Canvey Island 2-0. A good run-in saw Millers finish in sixth place in the League.

The 2003/04 campaign saw the club eventually finish in 14th place. Millers matched the previous season's performance and reached the final of the Essex Senior Cup. This time a much-improved display saw them go down 3-1 to local rivals Thurrock. The final game of the season was another cup final. This time in the East Anglian Cup, and a visit to Spalding United. This also finished in a 3-1 defeat for the Millers.

2004/05 was a disappointing one for Millers first season in the Southern League, the club finishing in 15th place. Compensation, however, came in the form of the Essex Thames-Side Challenge Trophy. Romford were beaten 1-0 in the final at The Mill Field. Simon Thomas scoring the only goal of the game. Another difficult season followed, on and off the pitch. Millers ended the season with their third manager, Steve Browne, steering them just clear of the relegation places.

A poor League season in 2006/07 was again compensated for by winning the Essex Thames-Side Challenge Trophy for the second time in three seasons.

After a disappointing start to the 2007 / 08 campaign, November saw the arrival of Rod Stringer as Manager, and fortunes turned with the Millers putting a string of impressive results together to finish the season in Mid-Table. 2008 / 09 saw the foundations that were laid the previous season, bare its fruit as the Ryman League Division One North Championship was won on the last day of the season in dramatic fashion at East Thurrock United. In a tense finish to the season, Millers created a club record of 11 straight away league wins, and Rod Stringer was duly judged as the Manager of the Season for the Division.

2009 / 10 our first in the Isthmian Premier Division saw a great finish to the season, with 12 wins from the last 14 games, taking us into 3rd position and a home semi-final play-off against Boreham Wood. Unfortunately, it was one step too far, and a 1-0 defeat saw the end of a fantastic season.

During the close season Rod Stringer departed for Braintree Town, taking with him his management team, and the whole playing squad. A difficult season was endured with a last day 3-2 win at Hastings being significant as the club survived relegation by virtue of a reprieve despite finishing 4th from bottom of the table.

2011 / 12 was much of the same, and relegation was confirmed after a poor season. Justin Gardner took over the reins in February of 2012, and has this season assembled a strong playing squad that is currently challenging for an immediate return to the Premier Division.

History Contined

2012 / 13 was a successful season with the team occupying a play off positions all season. Unfortunately, we lost out in the semi-final at Maldon & Tiptree.

The most significant result of the 2013 / 14 season was the news in March that after many years of trying, the Club has finally achieved planning for new state of the art facilities. After a protracted period of negotiations. work commenced on the new stadium build in July 2016, and it is hoped that the new premises will be occupational for the start of the 2017 / 18 campaign.

After a solid start to the 2016/17 campaign, Justin Gardner resigned from his role of team manager after a 4 1/2-year term. Terry Spillane was subsequently appointed in October.

August the 1st 2017 is a truly remarkable day in the Millers 90-year history. The day finally arrives with the opening of Parkside, the new home of the Millers. Dulwich Hamlet are the first visitors to open the stadium.

With the new stadium came the exciting appointment of James Webster as the Millers Boss, who joined in October from Brightlingsea Regent where he had led them from Step 7 to Step 3 in 7 seasons.

Danny Dafter took over the reigns in March 2019, leading the team into the play-offs where unfortunately we lost out to Heybridge Swifts. Season 19/20 hasn't seen the best of starts as Dafter resigned after 2 league draws, with ex Miller Keith Rowland (2008-2010) taking over the reins before the end of August.

Meet Some Millers

Goalkeeper:

David Hughes: David was signed at the beginning of September 2018 and is a proven shot stopper after spending three years at Harlow Town. In the 2018/19 season, he made 31 appearances, winning 20 of those games with seven clean sheets.

Defenders:

George Allen: Commanding central defender who joins us from Coggeshall Town for the 2019/20 season. He has previously played for Bishop's Stortford, Canvey Island, Welling United, East Thurrock United and Stevenage.

Perry Dunn: Towering centre half re-joined the Millers after captaining promoted side Hullbridge Sports from the Essex Senior League title last season. Perry is now in his 3rd spell at the club, having made his senior debut back in 2014.

Joe Elliott: A member of our Under 18 squad who featured for our U23/Reserve side in the previous 2 seasons. Previously of Barking Youth system, he along with the team he was moved to the Millers and he has featured a handful of times at the age of just 16 for the First Team throughout 2018/19.

Connor Martin: Left sided defender, who signed for the Millers in November from tenants Grays Athletic. Connor has previous experience of this level having spent a few seasons with Brnetwood Town.

Jack Mochalski: Jack joined the Millers after an impressive pre-season in July 2019. Mochalski has previously played for Great Shelford, Great Wakering, Romford and Barkingside. The defender has been a key cog at Soham Town Rangers featuring heavily for the Greens over the past three seasons.

Sam Mvemba: 19, made 40 appearances for Romford, mainly at left back where he helped the club climb out of the relegation place and into safety at the expense of Norwich United back in 2017/18. Sam joined Romford from Barking Abbey where he was named coaches player of the year in the 2016/17 season. He made over 40 appearances for the Millers last season.

Midfielders:

Darnell Bromfield: Darnell is a young prospect who can play through the middle of the park, made a brilliant impact for the Reserves Double Winning season in 2018/19, and will be looking to be more involved with the first team throughout the 2019/20 campaign.

Shad Ngandu: Shad joined the Millers from Waltham Abbey after a stellar season scoring 20 goals in 47 appearances in 2017/18. A quick pacey attacking midfielder with an eye for a pass and a few goals.

Jason Raad: Joined the Millers in the 2018/19 season in October from Harlow Town. A creative midfielder with an eye for a goal too. The South African has also played for Cape Town City and Supersport United.

Wyan Reid: Young Player who made an amazing impact for the Reserves last season in their double trophy winning season, being made Reserve's Managers Player of the Season. Wyan made 11 appearances for the First Team and will be looking to play a bigger part this coming season.

Connor Witherspoon: Connor is Aveley FC's club captain and joined the Millers in the middle of the 2017/18 season. Withers joined on an undisclosed fee from Brightlingsea Regent after making 68 appearances for the R's. He helped Brentwood Town to promotion via the playoffs and Regent be Champions of the Isthmian North in 2016/17.

Forwards:

Alex Akrofi: Alex joined the Millers after leaving Tonbridge Angels at the beginning of the 2018/19 season where he featured for the last two seasons prior and scored 34 goals in 68 games in the Isthmian Premier. He helped Maidstone United To promotion from the Conference South to the National League and Brentwood Town to the Isthmian Premier scoring a hat-trick against Thurrock in the play-Off final to get them there.

Kane Hearn: Kane has made the step up from our Reserves this season to the first team squad. Has recently been playing for Redbridge to gain some valuable game time. Also, a prominent figure in our Under 23's





