We would also like to extend a warm welcome to our Match Officials visiting us this today. In the middle we are pleased to have Kirsty Dowle alongside Lukas Wood & Paul Sturton. we hope you enjoy your short stay with us.

The last few head to heads have gone the way of Basildon United, scoring 13 goals in the last 5 meetings and only conceding 5 lets hope that can all change and rovers can start to find the net against our local rivals.

Rovers have had a mixed bag of results winner in The FA Cup at home to Heybridge Swifts 3-1 and moving on to the next round Away to Felixstowe & Walton (On Saturday 4th Sept) a coach has been arranged so if you would like a place please talk to the Chairman (David) or myself (Dan) for more details.

Hope you Enjoy the game. Dan Ellis Club Secretary THE FA's restructure at Steps 4-6 this summer solved some problems but not all.

Clubs who had performed consistently over the curtailed seasons of 2019-20 and 2020-21 were awarded promotion on points-per-game.

In total, 110 clubs were upwardly moved as a new Northern Premier League Midlands division was formed at Step 4, two new Step 5 divisions administered by the Combined Counties League and the United Counties League and the Step 6 structure reduced to 17 divisions.

But vacancies across Steps 1-4, due to the resignations of clubs over the past two years, still remained although it was never the FA's intention to fill them as part of the restructure.

Instead, the vacancies will be filled ahead of the 2022-23 season via reprieves as laid down in the FA rules.

Providing no club goes under or fails its ground grading during this season, this is what should happen:

At Step 2, each champion and play-off winner is promoted (four clubs in total). The bottom clubs in National League North and South will be relegated (two clubs in total). Step 2 is increasing to 24 teams in each league from the 2022-23 season.

At Step 3, each champion and play-off winner is promoted (eight clubs in total). Of the 16 clubs finishing in relegation positions, seven will be reprieved, comprising the clubs finishing 4th bottom in each Step 3 division plus three of the four clubs that finish 3rd bottom with the best unweighted points-per-game record. The 3rd bottom club with the worst PPG record across the Step, plus all 2nd bottom and bottom placed clubs will be relegated.

At Step 4, each champion and play-off winner is promoted (16 clubs in total). Sixteen Step 5 champion clubs are automatically promoted and replace the bottom and 2nd bottom clubs at Step 4. Nine clubs with the best points-per-game are reprieved due to the vacancies at Steps 1-4 and the number of clubs at Step 2 increasing. This will leave seven Step 4 clubs playing off against seven Step 5 runners-up with the remaining eligible Step 5 clubs promoted.

Although reprieves are usually awarded to clubs with the best PPG records, the FA Alliance Committee has the power to vary that model.



BASILDON UNITED CLUB HISTORY

BASILDON UNITED

Nicknamed 'The Bees', Basildon United came into being in 1967, having previously been known as Armada Sports; a junior club who were formed four years earlier.

In 1967/68 the renamed club joined the Grays and Thurrock League, moving into the Greater London League the following season.



The Bees successfully applied for promotion to the Athenian League in 1980, but membership only lasted one season, as they finished runners up to Windsor and Eton and earned promotion to the Isthmian League Division 2. In this season, Basildon also progressed to the quarter finals of the FA Vase, before Irthlingborough Diamonds brought an end to progress in the competition with a 6-4 victory in a sixth-round replay.

After three seasons in the Isthmian League Division 2, Basildon achieved promotion as champions in 1984, pipping St Albans City by one point on the last day of the season. This season additionally saw the club reach the finals of both the Essex Senior Trophy and the Eastern Floodlight Competition.

Basildon found life a lot harder in the first division and eventually lost the struggle against relegation in 1989, dropping into the Isthmian League Division 2 North. This was the first time that the club had suffered relegation in their history.

Two further seasons were spent in Division 2 North before the decision to de-regionalise the division led to the club resigning from the league, the club considering that an excess of travelling in the Isthmian League was not viable at that point.

The Bees re-joined the Essex Senior League in 1991/92 and quickly regrouped both on and off the pitch. It was not long before the successes of the late seventies were emulated, as The Bees finished in the top six in both 1991/92 and 1992/93 and made a League Cup final appearance in 1992.

A superb 1993/94 season saw Basildon again win the Essex Senior League double, with the championship being won for a record fifth time. The following season,1994/95, the club battled through to the FA Vase quarter final for the second time in its history, before losing out to Raunds Town.

During 1997/98, The Bees equalled Brentwood's record of three Essex Senior League Cup wins by beating Burnham Ramblers 1-0 in the final. It was the club's sixth appearance in the final of this competition, which also remains a record. In the league, Basildon finished runners up to Concord Rangers.

1999/2000 saw Basildon finish 13th, which was the club's worst league finish at the time and although a reasonable 8th position was achieved in 2000/01, two bottom half finishes followed for the next two seasons.

The club finished 7th in both 2003/04 and 2004/05.

John Higley was The Bees manager at the start of the 2007/08 season, but he was replaced by Jason Emery in October. The club struggled for form all season and used 72 players, only to finish in 16th position, just one place off the bottom.

A new management team of Colin Cook and Gary Morris was announced for the 2008/09 season and the club won its first six matches, whilst reaching the second-round proper of the FA Vase.

However, by December the management team had left the club and ex reserve coach, Jody Prevwell, was appointed manager, with Basildon eventually finishing the season in 8th place.

Prevwell left the club by mutual consent in April 2010 and was replaced by Sean Merchant as caretaker manager. The Bees suffered the heaviest defeat to date on 24 April, losing 10-0 at Witham Town. The club eventually finished the season in 12th place. In May 2010, John Doyle returned to the club as manager, bringing in former Romford

boss, Mark Reed as his assistant and Paul Rogan as coach.

After a 12th place finish, John Doyle decided to step down at the end of the 2010/11 season. The club advertised for a new manager and in excess of 30 hopefuls applied, with Paul Larke being appointed manager in June 2011.

After a poor start to the season, Larke resigned following a 9-1 defeat at Witham Town, with John Doyle returning to oversee the forthcoming FA Vase match against Ampthill Town.

The following week, Chris Wood was appointed permanent manager, but unfortunately no improvement was seen in results and The Bees finished bottom of the Essex Senior League for the first time in the club's history.

Former Ramsden boss, Bobby Barnes, was appointed manager in May 2012 and at just 27 was one of the youngest managers in non-league football. After Barnes decided to resign due to work commitments, John Higley returned to the club and was assisted by Steve Brown senior.

After a number of managerial changes, the club ended the 2012/13 season with Bertie Brayley as player/manager and the club finished the season in 13th position. Laurie Carter was appointed manager for the 2013/14 season and the club finished in 8th position.

In May 2014 Colin Cook returned to the club for a second spell as manager and he was assisted by Craig Gillam. Cook left during September being replaced by his assistant, who guided The Bees to a creditable 12th place finish.

Ahead of the 2015/16 season, Lee Connor was appointed as assistant to Gillam and the club enjoyed its best season for many years winning the League Challenge Cup and finishing runners up in the league. Additionally, Brad Warner won the league's Golden Boot award.

With Gillam opting not to remain with the club for the 2016/17 season, the club appointed Aaron Bloxham as manager, who had previously enjoyed success with White Ensign in the Essex Olympian League. A mid-table finish was achieved in the league as well as notable success in the Essex Senior Cup where the club reached the last eight before bowing out against Heybridge Swifts in the quarter finals.

In May 2017 the club parted ways with Bloxham and Marc Harrison joined the club as manager, with Liam Wallace also joining as his assistant. Harrison and Wallace both joined the club from neighbours Basildon Town, where they had achieved considerable success winning Essex Olympian League Division One the previous season.

In their first season in charge, Harrison and Wallace enjoyed tremendous success leading the club to the runners-up spot in the league and with it promotion back to the Isthmian League for the first time in 27 years.

Following a club reorganisation, Harrison and Wallace left the club in November 2018 and after a brief spell as Joint Manager with former Barkingside manager, Michael Walther, Lee Connor took temporary charge of team affairs. Subsequently, former Enfield 1893 and Laindon Orient manager, Neil Blackburn, took on the role as first team manager.

Blackburn stepped down as manager before the end of the 2018/19 season to be replaced by John Sussex who re-joined the club from Witham Town, having previously been a coach at the club. Sussex departed the club in November 2019 and after two short term caretaker appointments, Burnham Ramblers manager Alex Salmon was brought into the role with a view to building a new side focussed on much needed stability.

However, Salmon's tenure was to be short lived as he resigned after the first game of the 2020/21 season and former Bowers & Pitsea U23 manager John Guyton has now been appointed to the position to continue the work that had begun under his predecessor.

Saturday's Roundup From The North

Favourites Maldon and Tiptree were looking to go back to the summit, but they had what looked a difficult match with Stowmarket Town coming to call. It looked even more difficult when Evan Collard put Town ahead with his third in three matches- one in each- put they were ahead for a matter of moments before Scott Kemp drew the Jammers level with his second in three. The hosts were ahead before the break, Brian Ifeanyi with his fourth of the season following his opening day hat trick, but the visitors weren't going to lie down and Anthony Spyrou drew them level with seventeen minutes remaining. Ten minutes later, however, and we were surely able to tick off a home win as Kemp got his second of the game- and that's how it proved. Our picture of a celebrating Scott comes from the club.

Barking suffered a disappointing cup defeat last weekend, but they hosted a mouth-watering clash with Heybridge Swifts and took an early lead, Elliot Omozusi putting them ahead after twelve minutes. The advantage was doubled on sixty seven minutes, Osaretin Otete with goal number two for the Blues, and it was a result that left them in third- one of five sides with a one hundred percent record.

In between Maldon and Barking sit Grays Athletic. Athletic certainly didn't impress boss Jim Cooper when bowing out of the cup on Sunday, and the manager would have been looking for a reaction- and he got one after seven minutes when David Knight gave them the lead at Basildon United. The lead was doubled on the quarter hour mark, Anointed Chukwu with number two, and when Danny Gould made it three nine minutes later the away fans might have relaxed a little. They'd have been properly chilled out when David Knight- with a goal that was initially credited to Freddy Moncur- made it four seven minutes before the break.

The second half saw Chukwu get his second of the game for number five, then his hat trick for number six, before Knight also grabbed a hat trick to make it a rather incredible seven-nil.

Dereham Town hosted Hashtag United, and it was our social media darlings who struck first, Jake Lindsey putting them ahead after only four minutes. The Magpies have been in good form, and equalised just before the break through Robbie Linford, then went ahead soon after it, Rhys Logan scoring for the second game in succession. Shaun Bammant made sure of the points for the hosts nine minutes from time, and the Magpies are fourth.

Tilbury scored seven goals in the cup last weekend, but the highly-regarded Dockers went behind at Witham Town, Jack Nolde opening the scoring after fifty minutes- and Town held on to claim their second win from two and end the day in fifth place. Their fabulous Soccability squad also had a very good time, as you can see from our image!

Brentwood Town and AFC Sudbury started the day unbeaten- could they end it the same way? Joe Grimwood put the Yellows ahead just before the break, and that turned out to be the only goal of the game, which left the visitors in eighth place.

Canvey Island hosted Felixstowe and Walton United with both unbeaten so far, but the only thing contested in the first half was who had the biggest container ships- a discussion on Twitter involving their social media teams. After the break, however, Elliott Ronto quickly put the Gulls ahead, and that goal secured all the points and left the home side seventh.

Coggeshall Town hosted Romford. The two had contrasting results in the cup last weekend, the Boro picking up a morale-boosting win after that opening day thrashing, but both were searching for a first league win, and Romford took the first step towards that when Steve Carvell scored after eighteen minutes. Sam Bantick, playing against his former club, got the equaliser for the Seed Growers seven minutes before the break, but if Town relaxed then they were made to pay as Jesse Olukolu restored the Boro advantage just before the break.

Jermain Francis drew the hosts level twelve minutes after the restart, but once more the visitors struck, this time Aundre Spencer finding the back of the Seed Growers net. That turned out to be the winner, and Romford climb to eleventh.

Bury Town welcomed a Hullbridge Sports side who had shipped six goals in their two matches so far, but it was the visitors who opened the scoring, Brad Russell getting the opener six minutes after half time. Ollie Hughes will have drawn both cheers and sighs of relief from most of the four hundred and seventeen watching when he got an equaliser just after the hour, but it would have been exclusively cheers four minutes later when Cemal Ramadan put the hosts ahead from the spot. Sports lost their keeper to a red card, Lewis Greene taking that long walk, and it wasn't then too surprising when Will Gardner made it three-one, but Sports made a fist of it, Russell's second reducing the arrears for the ten men with ten minutes remaining. Town held out, and climbed to ninth.

Born On This Day In Sport



Paul Kevin Allen (born 28 August 1962) is an English former footballer who played as a midfielder in the Football League for West Ham United,

Tottenham Hotspur, Southampton, Luton Town, Stoke City, Swindon Town, Bristol City and Millwall in the 1980s and 1990s. He won three caps for England at under-21 level.

At 17 years and 256 days old, Allen's appearance for West Ham United against Arsenal in the 1980 FA Cup Final made him the youngest player to appear in an FA Cup final at Wembley Stadium, though James Prinsep played at a younger age at Kennington Oval in 1879.

Both records have since been broken. His debut for West Ham had come on 29 September 1979 when 32 days after his 17th birthday he had appeared for the club in their 2–1 home win over Burnley in the Second Division. He collected a Second Division title medal for the Hammers in 1980–81 and helped re-establish them as a First Division side. He made 152 league appearances for the Hammers, scoring six goals, before a £400,000 fee took him to their London rivals Tottenham Hotspur on 19 June 1985.

He scored on his debut in an emphatic 4-0 win at White Hart Lane versus Watford. Allen went on to play in two FA Cup finals for Tottenham Hotspur, on the losing side in 1987 alongside his cousin Clive Allen. However, Allen was victorious in the 1991 FA Cup defeating Nottingham Forest 2-1. In eight years with Tottenham, he played 292 league games and scored 23 goals. He was voted player of the year for the 1992–93 season, his final full season at White Hart Lane.

He remained at White Hart Lane until 16 September 1993, when a £550,000 deal took him to Southampton. He played 33 FA Premier League games in 1993–94, scoring once, but played just 10 league games without scoring in 1994–95 and was loaned out for 17 games to Stoke City, scoring once in a 4–2 defeat away at Southend United in March 1995. He then signed for Swindon Town on a free transfer and helped them win the Division Two title (and promotion to Division One) in 1995–96.

After retiring from playing football at the end of the 1997–98, which he spent in Division One with Millwall, he worked for the Professional Footballers' Association.



Pavel Nedvěd; born 30 August 1972) is a Czech retired footballer who played as a midfielder. Described as one of the best footballers of his generation, he is also regarded as one of the most successful players to emerge from the Czech Republic, winning domestic and European accolades with Italian clubs Lazio, including the last Cup Winners' Cup, and Juventus, whom he led to the 2003 UEFA Champions League Final.

Nedvěd was a key member of the Czech team which reached the final of Euro 1996, during which he attracted international attention. He also captained the national team at UEFA Euro 2004, where they were defeated in the semi-final by eventual champions Greece, and Nedvěd was named as part of the Team of the Tournament. Furthermore, Nedvěd helped his team qualify for the 2006 FIFA World Cup for the first time since the breakup of Czechoslovakia. Due to his performances, as well as his quick and energetic runs during matches, Nedvěd was nicknamed "Furia Ceca" ("Czech Fury") by Italian fans and "The Czech cannon" in English-language media. His nickname in Czech is Méďa ("Little Bear"), stemming from the similarity between his surname and the Czech word for bear, Medvěd.

Winning the Ballon d'Or as European Footballer of the Year in 2003, Nedvěd was the second Czech player to receive the honour and the first since the breakup of Czechoslovakia. During his career Nedvěd received a number of other individual awards, including the second Golden Foot award in 2004, Czech Footballer of the Year (four times) and the Golden Ball (six times). He was also named by Pelé as one of the FIFA 100, and was placed in the UEFA Team of the Year in 2003, 2004, and 2005. He retired following the 2008–09 season, after a 19-year professional career. Nedvěd played 501 league matches at club level (scoring 110 goals), and was capped 91 times for the Czech Republic (scoring 18 times).


