They came, they saw, and they were conquered! It's our round up of Saturday's cup and league action.

We had a magnificent day in the FA Cup yesterday, with a number of notable giant killings.

We start at Imperial Fields, home of Tooting & Mitcham United. It seems only yesterday that the Terrors and Dorking Wanderers were fighting it out for the South Division title, but these days Wanderers are sitting pretty in fourth place in National League South. They didn't look too pretty yesterday, however, as Tooting continued their unbeaten run by winning their ninth game of the season. Danny Bassett got the only goal, his sixth of the campaign.

Chelmsford City, mid table in National League South, travelled to King George's Field to face a Corinthian-Casuals side who were still looking for their first league victory of the season. Well they've had no such difficulties in the Cup, and yesterday City found them just too good, Nathaniel Pinney's first half spot kick and a goal from Shaun Okojie after the break giving them victory.

North Division

Bury Town closed to within a point of Maldon & Tiptree at the top of the table, coming from two goals down at Dereham Town to win by three goals to two. Adam Hipperson and Ryan Hawkins gave the Magpies that lead, but a goal either side of the half time break from Cemal Ramadan drew the visitors level, and then Ollie Hughes sent the points back to Ram Meadow with the winner twenty minutes from time. Our featured match saw Great Woking Rovers jump into the top five with victory over Witham Town- you can read all about it [HERE](#)- and they're now only a point behind Coggeshall Town, who went two goals up at Cambridge City only to lose three-two. Conor Hubble and Chris Regis gave the Seed Growers that lead, only for Jordan Gent, Adam Watkins and Arel Amu- in the last minute- to turn the match on its head.

Aveley are sixth, and not to buck a trend they also came from two goals down to win three-two. Danny Gould and an own goal put visitors Histon in the driving seat at Parkside, but Harry Gibbs got one back on the stroke of half time, and a double from Reggie Hubbard sealed the comeback.

We've had three matches with five goals, and our final one, at Tilbury, had six- but there was no winner, as the Dockers and Hullbridge Sports got three each. Ade Sotoyinbo gave the visitors the lead, but Tilbury hit back three times, Brian Moses, an own goal and Moses again making victory look certain- but it wasn't, as Yemi Ogunfunmilade and Joseph Wright struck to earn Sports a point.

Ware took their unbeaten record in all competitions to Biggleswade Town yesterday, their opponents sitting in tenth place in Southern Premier Central. Once again the Blues were imperious, and goals from Olu Akinsanya- his eleventh of the season- and Leigh Rose saw them into the draw for the next round.

Maldon & Tiptree, leaders of the North Division, hosted Premier Division Wingate & Finchley, and the Jammers made quite sure that they retained their 100% record by putting four goals- including a Jerome Slew hat trick, his second this week- past their visitors. Charlee Hughes got the other, whilst Ahmet Rifat and Marvin Morgan replied for Wingate. That's ten consecutive victories for Maldon in all competitions.

Enfield Town hosted Braintree Town, sixth in National League South and these days managed by former Leiston boss Glen Driver, who must have felt quite familiar with the away dugout at Donkey Lane. By full time he'd probably have been looking the other way, as the Towners Muhammadu Faal, who is in fabulous form at present, scored a goal in each half to send Enfield through. That's three consecutive matches that Faal has now scored in, and he has seven goals for the season.

Margate were another side to defeat National League South competition. They welcomed Concord Rangers to Hartsdown Park, fell behind on three minutes, were ahead by eight, and got a third goal a minute from the end to seal victory. Noel Leighton, Adem Ramadan and Jack Richards got their goals.

Haringey Borough brought their league form to the cup, walloping Staines Town by five goals to nil. We spent much of last season writing about goals for Chid Onokwai, then turning out for FC Romania (before a short spell with Hayes & Yeading United), and the step up to the Premier Division hasn't fazed him at all. He got three yesterday, all in the last fifteen minutes, to add to goals already scored by Rakim Richards and Dimitri Froxylias.

Carshalton Athletic travelled to Harrow Borough and despite spending almost the entire second half with ten men, after Daniel Pappoe was dismissed, held on to the advantage that Christie Pattison had given them in the first half.

We had an all-Isthmian Premier match at Lewes, and it's quite clear that Bowers & Pitsea fans are likely to join those who vote the Dripping Pan as their favourite away ground. They've travelled there twice this season, and won both times! Kayne Diedrick-Roberts gave the Rooks the lead early in the second half, but James Thomas and Brad Warner struck in the last twenty minutes to send Bowers into the next round.

Whyteleafe travelled to Moneyfields, and goals from Ronald Sobowale- one just before the break, one nine minutes after it- saw them leave Portsmouth with the plaudits.

We had another all-Isthmian Premier tie at the Pakex, and the Scholars despatched the Urchins two-nil. Both goals came just before the break, James Budden and Josh Hutchinson leaving Hornchurch to concentrate on the League.

Chichester City travelled to Step Three Hartley Wintney and came back with a creditable 0-0 draw, so will see whether they can go one better on Tuesday night.

Along the A27 Worthing will also be trying to knock out higher level opposition, as they got their customary last-gasp goal to earn a draw at National League South St Albans City. The Mackerel Men were twice behind, and even down to ten men for the last eleven minutes, but still managed to grab an equaliser, Reece Myles-Meekums scoring right at the death. Joel Colbran had got their first goal.

Canvey Island will replay after a great result- a goalless draw at Southern Premier Central St Ives Town.

Right, onto the miserable news.

Basildon United travelled to face National League South Billericay Town, who seem to having one of their regular periods of crisis. The Bees gave a good account of themselves, but fell by the game's only goal.

Horsham hosted National League South Dartford, and departed the competition after a two-nil defeat, and Folkestone Invicta, who have been magnificent in the League, came badly unstuck in the cup. The journey home from Kings Langley wouldn't have been a happy one after a four-nil defeat.

Ramsgate also had to travel back to Kent with nothing to show for their endeavours, having lost narrowly 1-0 at Hadley.

Peterborough Sports gained a second Isthmian Premier scalp in two weeks, with Bishop's Stortford following East Thurrock United out of the cup. Shomari Barnwell got the Blues goal in a 2-1 home defeat.

Bognor Regis Town travelled to Dulwich Hamlet, and the less we say about that match the better. James Crane got a goal for the Rocks, but sadly Hamlet got six.

Cheshunt travelled to Maidstone United for an Amber battle, and came away on the receiving end of a 4-1 defeat. Mo Camara brought the Ambers back into the game in the second half, reducing the arrears to 2-1, but that stung their hosts into action and within eleven more minutes all the goals were scored and the match was effectively over.

Chipstead travelled to National League South Welling United. We'd like to say no more, but we need to add that the trip home must have been rather miserable, as United scored seven goals without reply.

Today's Visitors



Nicknamed 'The Bees', Basildon United came into being in 1967, having previously been known as Armada Sports; a junior club who were formed four years earlier.

In 1967/68 the renamed club joined the Grays and Thurrock League, moving into the Greater London League the following season.

The first major step forward came in 1970 when the Essex County FA granted the club senior status and it became a founder member of the Essex Senior League.

It was not long before The Bees got amongst the honours recording four consecutive championships from 1977 until 1980, which stands as a league record to this day.

In addition, Basildon finished runners-up in 1973 and 1975, whilst the League Cup was won in 1978 to complete that season's double. The following season the club were winners of the Essex

Senior Trophy.

The Bees successfully applied for

promotion to the Athenian League in 1980, but membership only lasted one season, as they finished runners up to Windsor and Eton and earned promotion to the Isthmian League Division 2.

In this season, Basildon also progressed to the quarter finals of the FA Vase, before Irthlingborough Diamonds brought an end to progress in the competition with a 6-4 victory in a sixth-round replay.

After three seasons in the Isthmian League Division 2, Basildon achieved promotion as champions in 1984, pipping St Albans City by one point on the last day of the season. This season additionally saw the club reach the finals of both the Essex Senior Trophy and the Eastern Floodlight Competition.

Basildon found life a lot harder in the first division and eventually lost the struggle against relegation in 1989, dropping into the Isthmian League Division 2 North. This was the first time that the club had suffered relegation in their history.

Two further seasons were spent in Division 2 North before the decision to de-regionalise the division led to the club resigning from the league, the club considering that an excess of travelling in the Isthmian League was not viable at that point.

The Bees re-joined the Essex Senior League in 1991/92 and quickly regrouped both on and off the pitch. It was not long before the successes of the late seventies were emulated, as The Bees finished in the top six in both 1991/92 and 1992/93 and made a League Cup final appearance in 1992.

A superb 1993/94 season saw Basildon again win the Essex Senior League double, with the championship being won for a record fifth time. The following season, 1994/95, the club battled through to the FA Vase quarter final for the second time in its history, before losing out to Raunds Town. During 1997/98, The Bees equalled Brentwood's record of three Essex Senior League Cup wins by beating Burnham Ramblers 1-0 in the final. It was the club's sixth appearance in the final of this competition, which also remains a record. In the league, Basildon finished runners up to Concord Rangers. 1999/2000 saw Basildon finish 13th, which was the club's worst league finish at the time and although a reasonable 8th position was achieved in 2000/01, two bottom half finishes followed for the next two seasons. The club finished 7th in both 2003/04 and 2004/05.

John Higley was The Bees manager at the start of the 2007/08 season, but he was replaced by Jason Emery in October. The club struggled for form all season and used 72 players, only to finish in 16th position, just one place off the bottom.

A new management team of Colin Cook and Gary Morris was announced for the 2008/09 season and the club won its first six matches, whilst reaching the second-round proper of the FA Vase. However, by December the management team had left the club and ex reserve coach, Jody Prewwell, was appointed manager, with Basildon eventually finishing the season in 8th place.

Prevwell left the club by mutual consent in April 2010 and was replaced by Sean Merchant as caretaker manager. The Bees suffered the heaviest defeat to date on 24 April, losing 10-0 at Witham Town. The club eventually finished the season in 12th place.

In May 2010, John Doyle returned to the club as manager, bringing in former Romford boss, Mark Reed as his assistant and Paul Rogan as coach.

After a 12th place finish, John Doyle decided to step down at the end of the 2010/11 season. The club advertised for a new manager and in excess of 30 hopefuls applied, with Paul Larke being appointed manager in June 2011. After a poor start to the season, Larke resigned following a 9-1 defeat at Witham Town, with John Doyle returning to oversee the forthcoming FA Vase match against Ampthill Town. The following week, Chris Wood was appointed permanent manager, but unfortunately no improvement was seen in results and The Bees finished bottom of the Essex Senior League for the first time in the club's history.

Former Ramsden boss, Bobby Barnes, was appointed manager in May 2012 and at just 27 was one of the youngest managers in non-league football. After Barnes decided to resign due to work commitments, John Higley returned to the club and was assisted by Steve Brown senior. The club finished 7th in both 2003/04 and 2004/05.

John Higley was The Bees manager at the start of the 2007/08 season, but

After Barnes decided to resign due to work commitments, John Higley returned to the club and was assisted by Steve Brown senior.

After a number of managerial changes, the club ended the 2012/13 season with Bertie Brayley as player/manager and the club finished the season in 13th position. Laurie Carter was appointed manager for the 2013/14 season and the club finished in 8th position.

In May 2014 Colin Cook returned to the club for a second spell as manager and he was assisted by Craig Gillam. Cook left during September being replaced by his assistant, who guided The Bees to a creditable 12th place finish. Ahead of the 2015/16 season, Lee Connor was appointed as assistant to Gillam and the club enjoyed its best season for many years winning the League Challenge Cup and finishing runners up in the league. Additionally, Brad Warner won the league's Golden Boot award.

With Gillam opting not to remain with the club for the 2016/17 season, the club appointed Aaron Bloxham as manager, who had previously enjoyed success with White Ensign in the Essex Olympian League.

A mid-table finish was achieved in the league as well as notable success in the Essex Senior Cup where the club reached the last eight before bowing out against Heybridge Swifts in the quarter finals.

In May 2017 the club parted ways with Bloxham and Marc Harrison joined the club as manager, with Liam Wallace also joining as his assistant. Harrison and Wallace both joined the club from neighbours Basildon Town, where they had achieved considerable success winning Essex Olympian League Division One the previous season. In their first season in charge, Harrison and Wallace enjoyed tremendous success leading the club to the runners-up spot in the league and with it promotion back to the Isthmian League for the first time in 27 years.

Following a club reorganisation, Harrison and Wallace left the club in November 2018 and after a brief spell as Joint Manager with former Barkingside manager, Michael Walther, Lee Connor took temporary charge of team affairs. Subsequently, former Enfield 1893 and Laindon Orient manager, Neil Blackburn, took on the role as first team manager.

Blackburn stepped down as manager before the end of the 2018/19 season to be replaced by John Sussex who re-joined the club from Witham Town, having previously been a coach at the club. After steering the club to safety, Sussex is now looking forward to taking charge of the club for his first full season.

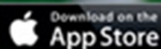

Michael Christopher Phelan



(born 24 September 1962) is an English professional football coach and former player who is currently assistant manager of Manchester United.

Born in Nelson, Lancashire, he spent most of his playing career at Burnley, Norwich City and Manchester United, with a short spell at West Bromwich Albion before retirement. While he was with Manchester United he also earned a single cap for

England. In 2002, Norwich fans voted Phelan into the club's Hall of Fame. Following the end of his playing career, Phelan moved into management. He first took a position as Gary Megson's assistant at his former club, Norwich City, before following Megson to Blackpool and then Stockport County. After Megson left Stockport, Phelan was hired by another former club, Manchester United, taking over as the assistant manager of the club's reserve team. Two years later, he was promoted to become Alex Ferguson's chief first-team coach, and in 2008 he replaced Carlos Queiroz as Ferguson's assistant manager. He remained in the position until Ferguson's retirement in 2013, when Ferguson's successor David Moyes replaced the entire coaching staff.

After a year out of football, Phelan was appointed as first-team coach back at Norwich City in November 2014 and took temporary charge of the club when manager Neil Adams resigned in January 2015, only to be relieved of his duties by Adams' permanent replacement, Alex Neil. A month later, he was appointed as assistant manager at Hull City under former Manchester United teammate Steve Bruce. He was promoted to first team management following the departure of Bruce on a temporary basis before the 2016-17 season. This was made permanent on 13 October. He was sacked from his position with Hull on 3 January 2017 with the club 20th in the Premier League.



John Arne Semundseth Riise

(born 24 September 1980) is a Norwegian former professional football player who played as a left back and a left midfielder.

With 110 caps, he is the most capped player for the Norway national team. He was named in the Norway squad for UEFA Euro 2000 but did not play in the tournament. Riise scored 16 goals before his retirement from international duty in 2013. He spent seven years playing for Premier League side Liverpool, in which he won many honours, including the 2004–05 UEFA

Champions League, before moving to Roma in 2008.

Early career

Riise began his career in his homeland with Aalesund. After a single season as a senior player for the club, he moved abroad in 1998, playing the formative years of his professional career with French club Monaco. When Aalesund opened their new stadium in April 2005, businessman Olav Nils Sunde donated a statue to the club, which was erected in front of the stadium. While Sunde denied it, the statue bore a very strong resemblance to Riise. In 2007, when Riise played in the Champions League Final, a Norwegian commentator demanded the statue officially carry his name. Riise himself has said, “[The name change] is not for me to decide. Everyone sees who it is, and I know that it was made for me.”

Riise was a regular member of the 1999–2000 Ligue 1 championship-winning side, however, he fell out of favour with coach Claude Puel after admitting his desire to leave. Riise was a subject of interest from Premier League clubs, especially Fulham and Leeds United that both offered £4 million bids in 2000, though both came to nothing as Monaco wanted £6 million for him.

He was then sold to Liverpool for £4 million the following summer.

He made his debut for Liverpool in 24 August 2001 2001 UEFA Super Cup game against Bayern Munich played at the Stade Louis II. He scored as Liverpool went on to win the game 3–2. He also scored important goals throughout the Premier League season against teams such as Arsenal, Everton, Newcastle United and Manchester United. Riise initially wore the number 18 shirt but changed to the number 6 shirt in 2004–05 season, which had been vacated by defender Markus Babel. He scored 10 goals in his first season with Liverpool.

Riise endured what were considered below-average seasons by most in the 2002–03 and 2003–04 seasons, but he rediscovered his form in 2004–05 following the appointment of Rafael Benítez as manager.
