Our physio and strength and conditioning coach Aileen KILSHAW is stepping back from the front line this season having just had a baby girl. Aileen's efforts keeping the players fit during lockdown cannot be under estimated and I'm sure the players will feel the benefit when the season finally begins. Elsewhere one of the main focus's this season will be working on a pathway into senior rugby from the juniors and hopefully ensuring many successful seasons ahead.

For the more mature rugby player the FAT STAGs will continue their successful collaboration with our great friends from OLD ISLEWORTHIANS RFC to form a combined VETS side. On the subject of Udney Park Road now is a good time to update everyone on the current situation. As you will remember Quantum (the land owners) notified the council earlier this year of their intention to sell the site. As a result, they triggered an 'Asset of Community Value' disposal process, which started a six-month window during which Community groups could bid for the site. That window is now coming to a close and I can confirm that Teddington RFC are part of a community bid, led by Jonathan DUNN (Thamesians RFC Chairman) which has now been submitted. We await feedback from the landowners on the community bid and we are keeping our fingers crossed that a solution can be found which will secure our long-term use of the site. As mentioned in a previous update, this will require a significant financial commitment from Teddington RFC, so please be aware of this as we move forward and support the clubs fundraising efforts in any way you can. Until any sale is agreed we still have a lease on the rugby pitch at Udney Park Road and so for now we continue to use the site as we have been doing. A big thanks goes to Simon CARTMELL who has done

a fantastic job firstly by liaising with the landowners to secure our current lease and for more recently working with the Community Bid to ensure Teddington RFC are well represented.

Hopefully this season will be packed with good rugby and a chance for the club to really reconnect again after the pandemic. There are already some notable dates for your diary, the first being the rearranged Family BBQ which has now been rescheduled to coincide with the Annual Welcome BBQ on Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> September. The women are also hosting their Inner Warrior day on the 19<sup>th</sup> September. This event is an ideal opportunity for new or returning players to get involved with some safe and fun filled rugby activities. Lots of other stuff going on that day as well, so please try and stay on after training and enjoy the refreshments. The day beforehand on Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> September we have the Annual Vice Presidents lunch at the club, before the 1<sup>st</sup> XV opening home league game of the season against Old Amplefordians. And after we missed last year, the 2022 Teddington RFC City Lunch is returning and has been pencilled in for Friday January 28<sup>th</sup>. For those who have been before, you'll know this is a hugely enjoyable afternoon and a big fund raiser for the club. Rob ALLEN is doing another sterling effort co-ordinating this event. We'll again have a big name from the world of rugby as our guest speaker, so watch this space and don't miss out on your chance to attend.
