Peckham Town FC was established in 1982 by the then 13-year-old Bryan Hall. A successful journey through youth football, Sunday league and Saturday football followed over the next thirty years, with multiple league and cup wins.

The Menace secured the Bromley District League Premier division championship for a final time in 2012, as the club joined the Kent County League and the National League System.

Town won division 2 at the first attempt in 2013, and this was followed by three runners-up finishes in a row from 2014 to 16.

Promotion to the premier division (Step 7) was achieved at the 3rd time of asking, and the club has since achieved a second, fourth and third place finish respectively from 2017 to 19.

The 2019/20 league season was cancelled due to COVID, but the London FA Senior Trophy was secured for the first time in the club's history. Sadly, the 20/21 league season was annulled too.



Ide Hill FC officially became an affiliated member of the FA in the season 1923-24. However it is widely rumored that football has been played in Ide Hill from 1901. The football club's home pitch has remained the same since and is located behind The Cock Inn pub in the picturesque village of Ide Hill.

The ground has the distinction of being the highest in Kent and certainly one with the best views and hosts several of their teams. However, the first team is currently playing their home games at Wrotham school near Sevenoaks, as the players prefer the 3G surface!

Ide Hill FC is now a chartered standard club with a new clubhouse (2014) and an adult team currently competing in The Kent County Premier for the first time in its history. They have moved up to Step 7 with a series of promotions in recent years, culminating in the 2019 Division One league win which has given them their first shot at non-league football in a century.



Report by Adam Carrick (Our CB!)

A slightly different angle on this week's match report, as Duncan Hart celebrated isolation freedom in the Dulwich Beer Dispensary and other match reporters were not available! It was therefore left to the reluctant centre back Adam Carrick to fulfil this week's reporting duties!

After last week's postponement the Peckham players and staff were keen to kick 2022 off properly with 90 minutes of Menace action. Mary Phillip was forced into several changes and a formation switch, with a sparse squad due to three suspensions and other absences. However good things were expected from the 13 available players, and a fixture postponement was never on the cards, unlike many teams in the other Premier League.

Egleton, Thomas and Meta (all regular starters) were all missing due to ill discipline in previous matches. Phillip introduced new signing Hamid Bangura on the bench alongside the experienced and returning Marcus Black. Legg regained the Number 1 shirt despite recent valiant performances from the stand in Romaku, who slotted into a slightly more familiar right back position. Romaku was alongside the usual Boakye, Carrick and Hashemi in the back 4. The midfield consisted of Hong in a holding position behind Barry, Dowding, Dance (Captain) Gabor and the inform Montella.

Unfortunately there isn't much I can tell you about the Stansfeld squad except from their exuberant warm up and recent positive results the young fit side were definitely not at the Menace Arena to make up the numbers. The match kicked off in front of a bumper league crowd of 205 all equally excited to finally see some live football.

Stansfeld set the early pace, as they moved the ball neatly across the park trying to expose holes in the usually tight Menace defence while worrying looks spread across the Peckham back 4 as they tried desperately to control the pace of the game. It took just ten minutes for

Stansfeld's positive work to pay dividends. Neat work brought the ball down on the edge of the box, swiftly nutmegging Boakye and with little left to do the Peckham defender stuck out a flailing leg. It was soft, he knew what he was doing, but fair play Peckham strikers would have done the same. 1-0, usual penalty expert Legg had no chance as it was booted high into the net from 12 yards, cue the first scenes of premature jubilation from the away side.

The rest of the first half was non-eventful, Gabor had a decent chance on his weaker foot, only managing to hit the Mike Smith stand. Half time saw no changes from Peckham, but a stern talking to was in order and duly supplied by Phillip and Meta who expressed his frustrations at not donning the kit in such a big game. No idea about Stansfeld possible changes - they had about fifteen subs!

2ND HALF

The second half Peckham came out fighting, the New Year's hangovers shaken off by the brilliant support of the Menace faithful who were in full voice behind the goal, led by the shrill Northern tones of stalwart supporter Pete Cooper. One of a number of supporters who have realised non-league football is the heart of the English game. Who wants to watch Southampton lose every week anyway? (Ed - well, now you mention it, that sounds quite fun - Play up Pompey!).

The break came on 56 minutes when a ball over the top found **Josh Montella**, he jinxed past one, cut inside and thrashed the ball past the helpless keeper - a fantastic finish once again for the hard-working striker. Peckham now had the upper hand, moving the ball well and creating several chances. Stansfeld were trying to break up the play wherever possible with even their management receiving bookings for dissent in an attempt to slow the play. I mean you can't call the referee a "F***** C****" and get away with it - trust me!

The joy however was short lived. Dance brought down the Stansfeld skipper 25 yards out and in keeping with his excellent performance struck the resulting free kick top bins, leaving Legg helpless. Cue the second scenes of premature jubilation from the away side, with even the stand-in club lineman joining the bundle before a ticking off from the referee sent him back, tail between legs.

Writing this while being forced to watch Dancing on Ice, the celebrations reminded me of Bez (Happy Mondays) first dance - pretty embarrassing, if you don't believe me YouTube it! Phillip brought on Black and Bangura, the latter for his debut and what a debut it was. 10 minutes from time, a corner from Romaku was swung into the danger zone, the keeper failed to clear and **Hamid Bangura** powered the header in from all of 3 yards. The Stansfeld players protested, but no one really cared. The Menace players wheeled away in celebration with still time for a winner.

Sadly, no goal came, each team had half chances but the tiredness was evident after a hard slog on heavy ground. The 2-2 full time score was a fair result with each team having favourable spells throughout the game. (Ed - also a fitting scoreline for the first match since the great Desmond Tutu sadly passed away on Boxing Day).

Personally, MOM would be Stansfeld skipper, Red Jenkins, who controlled the game well, but Hong and Dance coped well against him and deserve credit. The Menace face Tudor Sports away next week, as Peckham continue with the fight to be crowned league champions. We hope to see you all there!

Finally, a note to the support and staff at Peckham Town. Over 200 there yesterday which is a fantastic achievement for a club at this level. It is truly appreciated on the pitch by us, the players who look forward to entertaining everyone who sacrifices their Saturday to come and watch - long may it continue. Also, a big thank you to the staff, like Mary and Bryan, who straight after the game were out maintaining the pitch for future matches - their efforts off the pitch are not overlooked. So, this is my first attempt at writing a match report, so please bear with me as I'm no Adam Carrick!! It was the first away game of 2022 for The Menace and they welcomed back several players into the match day squad. The skipper, Nicky Meta returned to his favoured right wing position, along with Charlie Egleton and Joe Thomas. The former partnering Carrick in central defence for the absent Samuel Boakye, and the latter reclaiming his place back in midfield. Kevin Dance moved back to take the right back position in place of Romaku, who was also unavailable.

The game started brightly, both teams coming out of the blocks fighting, really end to end stuff as the saying goes. Montella came close after 5 minutes flashing a shot wide of the post. In the opening minutes both teams continued to attack, both defences doing their jobs and cancelling each other out. The warning signs were there for the hosts as Meta came close on 9 minutes. He struck the ball sweetly from the edge of the 18 yard line which saw it flash the wrong side of the keepers right hand post!!

The breakthrough came for the Menace on 14 minutes from a corner. Quick thinking from Montella allowed Meta to take it short, Montella returning the ball to the captain who whipped in a cross to the far post. Egleton rose to meet it, nodding it down to **Adam Carrick** who tapped home from 6 yards. One from the training ground possibly? The Menace faithful erupted in cheers and applause.

Peckham began to take control and perhaps should've been two up five minutes later. A cross from the left from Dowding found Montella who controlled well, turned his marker only to shoot straight at the Tudor goalkeeper. However, **Josh Montella** made amends on 33 minutes, latching on to a through ball, beating the Tudor defence. He rounded the keeper and smashed the ball into the roof of the empty net, much to the delight of the away support.

On 35 minutes was one of the most bizarre bookings I've witnessed. Peckham were awarded a free kick over near the far corner flag, Legg placed the ball ready to launch. Suddenly panic set in from the Menace skipper, as he had lost sight of his son who was watching from the stands. Unbeknownst to him, Jackie (club secretary) had taken said son to the toilet, but the message reached Meta and he began running back into his position on the right wing. All the while Legg was waiting for the panic to disperse, the ref blew his whistle and promptly gave the Menace stopper a yellow card for time wasting!! The pleas from the keeper, his captain, team mates and the bench were ignored by the official.

Play continued and both teams kept searching for goals, and Peckham nearly got their third on 42 minutes. Meta again bringing a decent save low to his left from the Tudor keeper. Half time came, and the Menace went in deservedly on top.

2ND HALF

The only changes for the second half saw Meta and Dowding switch wings, and the second half carried on where the first half had finished. Tudor attacking believing they could get back into the game, the Menace attacking to try and put the game out of reach, but neither defence was giving anything away. Gabor will be disappointed that he didn't hit the target on 51 minutes. Montella headed down to Gabor on the edge of the D but his shot would've made any rugby player proud as it sailed high over the Tudor goal.

The game came to an abrupt halt on 55 minutes when Carrick went down with a nasty facial injury. It happened after a Peckham corner, Carrick chasing down the cleared ball only to run toward a stationary Tudor man shielding the ball. Said players elbow caught Carrick full on in his right eye. The referee blew and waved on the Peckham physio, this week, Mary, deputising for the absent Rohan. It became apparent that the injury was serious and Tricia was called away from filming duties to help. Eventually, after 5 minutes of treatment, Carrick was able to walk off, dazed, with blurred vision and a black eye that any boxer would be proud of.

The game resumed on 60 minutes, Hong replacing Carrick but slotting into midfield, and Thomas deputising in central defence. Bangura came on replacing Gabor 3 minutes later as a straight swap up front. Hong hit the Tudor cross bar on 65 with a speculative effort, and the final change saw Black replace Meta on 73 minutes, with Thomas donning the captains armband.

The game was finally put to bed on 75 minutes when Marcus Black sent over a sublime cross from the left. **Josh Montella** rose and powerfully headed home high into the top left hand corner, with the Tudor goalkeeper rooted to the spot.

Dowding continued to cause the host problems on the right wing, as he had done on the left wing in the first half. He will be disappointed

that he didn't get on the score sheet on 81 minutes. A corner from the left beat everyone in the 6 yard box and found Dowding unmarked at the back. His resulting shot sent high and wide! The hosts could quite have easy capitulated but credit to them, they continued to try and deny Legg a clean sheet.

Egleton went into the referees book for a late challenge on 88 minutes, and was warned by the ref that if he continued to protest he would find himself sin binned! After a few more stoppages for injuries, the game entered into added time, and there would be at least 6 minutes! It was then that Egleton received his second yellow, rising to head the ball clear, his elbow caught the face of his opponent. The referee had no hesitation in brandishing the cards, and to be fair it was a harsh booking, Egleton never took his eyes off the ball. One can only think his early shenanigans protesting had already swayed the referees decision, more than the challenge itself.

Eventually after what seemed like about 10 minutes the referee finally blew for full time. The Menace worthy winners in the end and the result keeps them firmly in touch with the league leaders. Any one of them could've been crowd King of the Match, but Dowding just edged it. The Menace left the pitch to rapturous applause from the 20 or so Menace faithful. Another great all round performance on the road!!

AWAY DAYS

We make the long journey to Hawkinge Town near Folkestone for our first match in February.

Kick off times return to 2.45pm for this match and for the rest of the season. Hawkinge is mostly known for its Kent Battle of Britain Museum, which has artefacts of over 700 crashed aircraft on display. If this tickles your fancy, then only the shop is open at this time of year, but you will have to return in April for the museum. Apparently, DJ and London-based radio personality Owen Thomas James (formerly Owdaug) grew up at his family home in Hawkinge and attended the Harvey Grammar School in Folkestone. Personally, I've never heard of him, and I'm sure he probably just edited his hometown Wikipedia page!

If you would like to extend your visit to the area, then you are better off spending more time in Folkestone, where you can stroll the cobbled streets of Folkestone's Creative Quarter and take in the many great pubs. Top of the list has to be Lee and Lauren's new Beer Shop in Folkestone. They have had a micropub in Nunhead since 2013, and they have now moved to the seaside and opened up a second establishment (CT20 1EZ). Kipps' Ale House (CT20 1RL) and The Firkin Ale House (CT20 2AZ) are also worth visiting.

If time is on your side and you have a car, then you could explore the eerie wilderness of Dungeness and admire Derek Jarman's house (Prospect Cottage, TN29 9NE). I was there in the summer, and I can definitely highly recommend the Dungeness Snack Shack (also TN29 9NE) for their fresh seafood as a lunch stop.

Public Transport: Hawkinge via Folkestone train station - [Option 1](#) (slower but cheaper): train at .01 and .31 past hour (20 mins) from Peckham Rye to Bromley South and then change for Folkestone (80 mins). [Option 2](#) (Quicker and dearer): train .34 / .41 past hour from St Pancras International (52 mins) or Stratford Int'l (45 mins). It's then 15 mins on bus 16, which departs every 20 mins from the train station at .10, .30 and .50 past the hour. Alternatively, it's around £9 in a taxi (tel: 01303 244442).

Pubs: Beer Shop (CT20 1EZ) and others as above in Folkestone. There is also a bar with snacks at Hawkinge's ground.
