Welcome to Anselmians

Warrington RUFC extends a very warm welcome to our friends from Anselmians RUFC on their league visit to Stockton Lane and we look forward to an enjoyable game

Brief History: - Old Anselmians' RUFC was formed in 1947 by a group of former pupils of St. Anselm's College to whom all current members owe a great debt.

Early fixtures were played against traditional old boys' teams in the Wirral and on Merseyside by a small but dedicated band of travelling players. Playing facilities and amenities were primitive and it wasn't until the mid-1950s that the club relocated to its present home in Eastham village. Malone Field

By the 1960s Old Anselmians was a well-established and thriving club running three sides. At this stage, it was a "closed" club, in RFU language, meaning its players were drawn from "The School" but it was recruiting soccer players from the town presumably attracted by the promise of a more active social life than the football clubs could offer.

Further expansion in the 1970s meant that by the end of the decade Old Anselmians could field six teams playing "friendly" fixtures all over the north-west of England and north Wales.

In the 1990s, the club's profile was greatly enhanced by the success of several alumni on the international stage. Austin Healey, England toured with the British and Irish Lions in 1997 and 2001. With the advent of, first, merit tables and, now, league rugby, many of our traditional fixtures have lapsed. The "Old" was dropped from the name and "Anselmians" 1st XV competed in the South Lancashire/Cheshire Division One for several years, before spending two seasons in North One West in 2011-2013. Saints were promoted to North One West after a six year absence after a memorable play-off game, 65-14 victory against Aspatria in May 2018. . In 'The Saints' 70th birthday season in 2018, the "old" clubhouse was razed for the ambitious development of a new "pavilion" and grounds during which time the senior teams moved to temporary accommodation at Vauxhall's Sports Club with the juniors being dispersed throughout the Wirral. The club returned to Malone Field during the rugby-free Pandemic of 2020-2021 and they started a new chapter in season 2021-2022 in their magnificent new facilities where Anselmians will continue to be a friendly and forward thinking club true to the vision of those young men who began it with the simple wish -." To play rugby with a smile"

Our last meetings with Anselmians were in season 2018/19 when Warrington who both games but since then both clubs have been rebuilding. Warrington are a young side whereas Anselmians have gained a few experienced players and that has proved a major factor in which see them unbeaten this season. Today sees the return fixture with Anselmians and after Warrington's fine win at Leigh last Saturday they will want to produce a similar performance against the league leaders. Prospects for today's game, it is hoped for a dry day, an entertaining game, Warrington will again have to be at their best if they are to get a result so may the best team win.

Footnote

The Warrington club would remind supporters to refrain from the use language that today is considered defamatory, offensive or that could be seen as abuse or harassment to other spectators, players or officials, whether anything you may consider right or wrong in the game you are watching.

Leigh 14 - 39 Warrington

In a game which Warrington produced their best all-round performance of the season the score line reflected their true dominance by scoring seven fine tries and completing the double over Leigh.

Leigh kicked off and for the first 10 minutes saw little of the ball, eventually a controlled kick from Warrington took play into the Leigh 20 where they gained a penalty which then resulted in a Leigh yellow card, a quick play the ball resulted in captain Josh Downes going over for the first try, JP Hudson was successful with the conversion, 0-7.

On 20 minutes the Warrington pack pushed Leigh off their scrum put in, quick ball saw centre Jack Stride kick and following up score a fine try. 0-12

Leigh gained more position but handling and poor tactical kicking let them down and on 27 minutes from a set scrum a blind side break opened up for winger Ryan Eastwood to score wide out 0-17

Just before half time Warrington received a yellow card after a quickly taken Leigh penalty saw a tackle made on the player who had played the ball.

Leigh started the second half with more intensity, a fine break saw them take play down near to the Warrington try line and quick ball along the line created an overlap, a try and conversion resulted.7-17.

On 46mins Warrington looked like getting their try bonus point after good break by Phil Lynch, JP Hudson then took play to five meters out, following up Ben Dixon was tackled on the line and the ball lost. However, on 56 minutes the try bonus point came, a Leigh scrum in their twenty, saw Warrington gain possession and forward pressure saw Christian White power over JP Hudson converted. 7-24.

On 60 minutes' good forward play saw a turn over, along pass out to the centre and winger Luke Turner went in for try number five. 7-29

5 minutes later following a ruck near the half way the ball went out to Matt Beeley who saw a gap evaded would-be tacklers and ran in near the corner.7-34

Leigh then played some of their best rugby of the game moving the ball about but the Warrington defence held firm. On 72 minutes with Leigh on the attack Andy Kellett intercepted broke up field, on to Max Caldwell who was tackled near the line but managed to get the ball away to Beeley following up who crossed for his second try.7-39

Leigh kept going to the end, throwing the ball about Warrington gained possession near their own line but were held up and from the resulting Leigh scrum quick ball saw the ball go out and they scored under the posts with an easy conversion and the final whistle went. 14-39

Coach Stuart Beeley was well satisfied with the performance given the team had not played since 11th December 2021.

The ease with which Eccles pushed Warrington off their own ball in the first minutes of the first game of the New Year looked ominous for a Warrington side playing without a regular front row. 10 minutes into the game, however, the not inconsiderable Ty Hamblett, debuting at prop, had adjusted to the position sufficiently quickly to slow Warrington's backward movement at the set piece. This allowed scrum half Pat

Reardon to snatch the ball from a set scrum just in the Eccles half and set off for the line. A well-timed pass to left winger Nathan Bass in support secured the first of Warrington's seven tries. 5-0



Two minutes later, with standoff Matt Rockey orchestrating events, a simple down the line attack with a timely intervention from full back Kev Jones, gave ample space for mercurial right winger Dave Murphy to touch down unopposed. 10-0

Senior colt, Christian Johnson playing at centre, was next on the board with a nice step inside to flummox the Eccles defence. 15-0

On twenty minutes, a counter attack from Warrington, instigated by full back Jones abetted by centre Johnson and winger Bass, should have borne fruit but, with the line open, the last pass went astray and Warrington's fourth try had to wait until the second half.

10 minutes into the second half, back rower Joe Craven, another senior colt having an outing at open age, took a brilliant line for a short pass from stand-off Rockey in mid-field. Crossing half way at full tilt, the youngster touched down between the posts leaving the defence trailing in his wake. Rockey converted. 22-0



5 minutes later yet another colt, second rower Dermott Fagan-Hall, picked up a loose ball at the back of a line-out in the Eccles 22 sidestepped his way through the traffic, despatched the lasts of the defence with a strong hand-off and touched down for Warrington's fifth try. 27-0
Standoff Rockey added Warrington's sixth finishing some hard work by prop Tom Mullally. 32-0

The seventh try went to the evergreen Mark Tickle, who, with uncanny anticipation, plucked a would-be quick line-out ball from Eccles from mid-air and scampered, unopposed, from the half way line under the posts. Tickle also converted. 39-0

This convincing victory, the product of an excellent blend of youth and experience, keeps Warrington second in the league behind unbeaten Broughton Park and bodes well for the future as the club develops its playing abilities and its material assets at Stockton Lane.

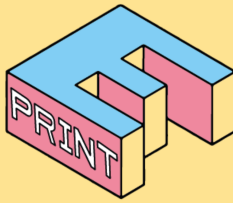

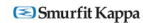
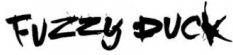
