Brief History

Waterloo Football Club is based at St Anthony's Road, Blundellsands, Crosby in the north of Liverpool. And was founded in 1882 by brothers Sidney and Harry Hall and George Abercrombie. all former pupils of Merchant Taylor's School. It was created to keep together a successful Merchant Taylors' School team. From 1882 until 1884 the club was known as Serpentine after the road near it's original ground. In 1884 a dispute prompted a relocation to Waterloo and so the club's name was changed. The club returned to the Blundellsands area in 1892 and has remained there ever since.

Formerly nicknamed 'The Drummers' they play in myrtle green, white and scarlet hooped shirts, green shorts and green socks. Their badge features a Lancastrian red rose with a black griffin in the centre.

Former players include Dick Greenwood, Ben Kay, Will Greenwood, Andy Titterrell, Watcyn Thomas, Kyran Bracken, Austin Healey, Paul Grayson & our very own current junior colts coach Stuart Beeley.

Perky's Paragraph Continuing history of WRUFC

Lancashire County connections:-

It should be noted that during the period of 39 to 49 J Bradley was the first President of Lancashire 1947 to 1949 to come from the Warrington club. Lancashire won the County Championship 47/48/49

Warrington are the only :Junior Club to have most Lancashire Presidents 5 in total the next being Reg Locker 1955/56 Lancashire held the Trophy but unfortunately under Reg's stewardship they did not make the final. Ces Burch a past treasurer of the county was President 1971/72,, Lancashire won the Championship in 1972, followed by another Treasurer Bryan England 1991/92 in 1992 Lancashire beat Cornwall 9-6 and to date in 2005/6 Mike Cornelia was elected President and as expected in 2006 Lancashire beat Devon 36-26.

The moral of the story is if you want to win the County Championship appoint a man from Warrington.

The 1950's

After such wonderful years it is not surprising to find that the 'Fifties' were years of hard toil and re-building. Many of the older players ended their playing days in a short period and younger inexperienced players had to be brought up. The lack of a local rugby playing school was severely felt and the records reflect this in no uncertain manner. If the playing ability was somewhat lacking, the interest and enthusiasm was not and in 1954 four teams were being fielded regularly. The Membership grew rapidly and five teams were raised on three occasions during the 1956-57 season. Club spirit was high and with the ebullient Secretary ship of Ken Miller a Bazaar was held on September 28th, 1957. Months of hard work saw the Club raise £238 in only three hours.

Around this time a revised set of Rules were introduced and are in operation at the present time. This re-organisation however was not achieved without the loss of interest by several very keen Club Members but fortunately for the Club, as is so often the case, others were found and came along to take their places. Alan James took over as Secretary from Ken Miller and with the assistance of Charles Warburton began the Ground Development Society in September, 1959, as a result of which over £1,400 has so far been raised towards the cost of the new ground scheme. Tastes change as time goes on but the basic structure of the Club is not very much different from that 37 years ago when the pioneers were laying the foundation of the Club and it is hoped that with the opening of the new ground, they will be able to see some rewards for their efforts so long ago.

Warrington 1st XV 20 - 37 Carlisle 1st XV

Ina classic game of two halves, Warrington came off second best to league leaders Carlisle. Although they edged the second period by fifteen points to five, a win never seemed on the cards after they had leaked 32 points to the visitors in the first half. However, the four-try bonus point ensured that they stay at seventh in the league – just!

Carlisle soon showed that they had suffered no ill effects from their long coach journey and attacked the Warrington line from the kick-off. Within five minutes, Warrington were reduced to 14 players when Nathan Beesley was sin-binned, having been controversially judged to have knocked on deliberately, as he tried to intercept a pass. Carlisle were quick to take advantage of their temporary numerical advantage by using their excellent backs to score and kick the conversion.

Two successful penalty kicks then increased the visitor's lead to 13 before their backs combined constructively to cross for their second try. Carlisle then started to use their heavier pack and after driving Warrington off their own ball at a set scrum a drive from a line-out saw them cross again under the posts for a try that was converted.

Warrington came back to the attack but to no avail and, against the run of play, Carlisle swooped on a Warrington mistake to dash 60 yards to touch down and the subsequent conversion saw them take what proved to be a 32-0 seemingly, unassailable lead. This was cut by five points on the stroke of half time, when Jonny Evans finished off a driving maul to crash over.

The second half saw Warrington improve their tackling and start to regain some of the form of the previous week. However, it was only a superb covering tackle by Kieran Hughes in the opening minutes which prevented Carlisle further increasing their lead. Ten minutes later, Warrington won the ball on the ground and Josh Riley handed onto Jonny Evans, who beat four defenders to score a dazzling try in the corner. It was now Warrington's turn to overwhelm their opponents and a quick tap penalty saw Kieran Hughes break through the defence before passing onto Nathan Beesley, who made ground before passing back to Hughes, who skipped over in the corner.

Carlisle exploited another Warrington mistake to score their only try of the second half but it was Warrington who were last to get the scoreboard moving when Steve Pilkington twisted over in the corner after taking a long pass from Tom Wood.

"We were simply overwhelmed in the first half by a very strong side," admitted coach Andy Roberts. "However we helped them with ineffective tackling but I was pleased at the way the side rediscovered their shape in the second half to earn the bonus point."

Fylde Saracens 3rd XV 41 - 5 Warrington 2nd XV

Although Warrington's second team suffered their second successive defeat, this time to Fylde's third team, they are still firmly placed in third position in Sale Sharks Division 1. On a wet and windy afternoon in Blackpool, they had no answer to the power of a Fylde side which offered too much strength at Number 8, the second row and the back line.

Although the set scrum, where Jon Bennett put in a cameo performance, competed throughout, Warrington struggled for possession from the lines and Fylde's plethora of ball saw then quickly score three converted tries. Warrington managed to get on the scoresheet just before half time when Tom Heaps hacked on and showed his speed to outpace the defence and score from 50 metres.

The second half saw Fylde turn the screw and although man-of-the-match Andy Almond continually led by example, supported by Kirk Drummond and debutante Harry Stevens, Warrington were unable to stem the tide, as Fylde coasted to a win with two more tries and two penalties.

Manchester 1st XV 32 - 0 Warrington 1st XV

The beauty of North 1 West is that, on the day, every team can beat every other. In their last game, Manchester were beaten by relegation contenders Anselmians but on Saturday they trounced Warrington by 32-0. The result moves Manchester above Warrington who now drop to 10th, - just above the relegation zone.

Manchester soon got points on the board, when they drove over after just five minutes and the conversion saw them seven points adrift. Warrington came close to replying following a scintillating break from Kieran Hughes but the centre was hauled down just short. However, Warrington were pinned back in their own half, thanks to excellent touch finding from Manchester's Samoan sevens player Jay Saena, who eventually extended the host's lead with a penalty from 35 yards.

The international centre then broke through the Warrington defence to set up a second try, which he converted and a second penalty took Manchester into a 20-0 half time lead.

Warrington started the second period well but the muscular and aggressive Manchester defence proved unbreachable and when Manchester were awarded a series of penalties close to the Warrington line, it was inevitable that they should eventually power over for an unconverted try.

Warrington's woes were compounded when they were reduced to 14 men when Tom Wood was dismissed after reacting over-enthusiastically to the hassling of the opposition scrum half and, although they continued to defend heroically, Manchester exploited their numerical superiority by scoring a final unconverted try in the corner.

"We were well beaten today," conceded coach Andy Roberts. "We beat Manchester by 48-22 earlier in the season but the side we faced today was totally different and we didn't play to our potential. Next week we face Waterloo at home, in a game we must win."

Warrington 2nd XV 19 - 15 Sedgley Park 3rd XV

Warrington's second string returned to winning ways with an excellent victory over Sedgley Park, aided by some welcome cross-code recruits from Woolston Rovers.

Warrington opened the scoring when Dan Griffiths powered over after ten phases. The conversion attempt by Theo Holt was controversially adjudged wide and Sedgley then reduced the deficit with a penalty. Kirk Drummond then crossed in the corner after a strong carry and Theo Holt then convinced the touch judges from the far out to kick the conversion and make the half time score 12-3.

With the Warrington front row of Nick Povey, Sam Bennett and Dom Hastings controlling the set piece, Warrington started to assume dominance and Theo Holt demonstrated his Rugby League nous with a delicate chip which was gratefully accepted by Nick Stevens, who touched down near the posts. Unfortunately, Holt pulled his hamstring in executing the chip and had to leave the field but Andy Almond stepped up to the plate and his conversion saw Warrington take a 19-3 lead.

Sedgley Park came back strongly and a converted try and then a try, which was not converted, saw Warrington's lead reduced to 19-15 but stalwart defence ensured that this was the final score.

"This was an excellent performance, with three classy tries," enthused coach Paul Thompson. Although Nick Stevens, Dan Griffiths and Kirk Drummond were outstanding, I cannot thank the lads from Woolston enough and hope that we can see them again."




