Welcome to Orrell

Warrington RUFC extends a very warm welcome to the players, officials and spectators of Orrell RUFC on their league visit and we look forward to an enjoyable game

Brief History

Orrell RUFC was officially founded in 1927. During these first seasons Orrell played its home games on quite a few different pitches. However in 1937 the club obtained the lease of a ground and hut in Winstanley Rd Orrell as tenants of Orrell YMCA at a rental of four pound per annum. Orrell played here until in 1949 land was purchased off the Glover family of Edgewood Hall Farm, and Orrells long association with Edge Hall Road began. The club improved the facilities at Edge Hall Road, including levelling the First Team pitch and installing a drainage system, making it one of the best pitches in the North of England. It was at Edge Hall Rd that Orrell started to improve its fixture list, which in the days before league rugby was very hard to do. Floodlights on the 1st team pitch enabled Orrell to play teams midweek, whose fixture lists were full on Saturdays. Then in the early 70s the Lancashire Cup competition was re-introduced, success in this gave Orrell entry into the national cup competition, giving the opportunity to play the top teams in English rugby and over the years many a top side came and went away empty handed. League rugby came in with Orrell entrenched in the top tier of British rugby, and in 1991/92 season only the width of a goalpost at Wasps stopped Orrell being crowned English champions.

Professional rugby followed, but this resulted in the Club being put into Administration and Edge Hall Road being sold to Developers, who leased only the First Team pitch and the Club House back to the Club, before Dave Whelan and his JJB empire purchased the lease and invested heavily in the team. When he pulled out after three years, Orrell was always going to struggle to pay players. Three of the four pitches at Edge Hall Rd have now been built on and the clubhouse and 1st team pitch is the training base for Wigan Warriors RLFC. Sadly, in 2007 Orrell said goodbye to Edge Hall Rd, and is now playing at John Rigby College as amateurs, while we search for some land in the Orrell area to lease or buy.

The Anvils were formed in 1997 With fixtures becoming increasingly hard to get, it was decided to apply to the Rugby Football Union to enter the league system, this was initially turned down as they said you cannot have two sides from the same club playing in the leagues. Not taking no as an answer, Bertie Wilkinson worked tirelessly till the RFU finally agreed to our plans, as long as we had our own constitution and a different name. So Orrell 3rd team became Orrell Anvils, the start of season 2006/07 saw them in South Lancs and Cheshire Division 2, but because the professional side were struggling for players, five or six key players were re-registered for Orrell RU, resulting in the Anvils being unable to fulfil their fixtures and withdrawing from the league.

With the professional side struggling and facing another relegation battle A group decided that in their view the professional model wasn't working, and the only way to keep a rugby union side in the Orrell area viable, that wasn't haemorrhaging money, was to revert back to being an amateur Club. After failing to convince the Orrell RU committee of the merits of this, they decided to try and breathe new life back into the Anvils, and they applied and were re-instated back into the South Lancs/Cheshire Division 2 for the 2007/08 season The semi- professional side at Edge Hall Road ceased playing at the end of season 2006/2007. In March 2009 the Orrell (2007) Rugby Football Club Limited became an Industrial and Provident Society and a Community Amateur Sports Club. In the season 2011/12 they have played in the league structure as Orrell.

Today sees the first league game between the two side since 2012/13 season when both teams were in South Lancs/Cheshire Division One. This fixture is in North 2 West.

Prospects for today's game, it is hoped for a dry day, an entertaining game and may the best team win.

Footnote

Warrington Rugby Union club would remind supporters to refrain from the use language that today is considered defamatory, offensive or that could be seen as abuse or harassment to other spectators, players or officials, whether anything you may consider right or wrong in the game you are watching.

WARRINGTON 35 WINNINGTON PARK 20

A Strong start and an impressive last 10 minutes gave Warrington the edge but penalties giving Winnington field position could have cost them the match.

Warrington kicked off, playing against the wind towards the Lumb Brook end saw a real attacking intent forcing Park to defend in their own 20 metre line. Gaining possession Warrington were awarded a penalty but a shot at goal drifted wide from the restart Park were offside and Matt Beeley made no mistake this time. 3-0 five minutes in.

The restart saw Warrington take the ball, break up field, a well-judged kick from JP Hudson and favourable bounce saw winger Ryan Eastwood gather break through an attempted tackle and score under the posts, Beeley converted 10-0

Park came more into the game and forced Warrington to defend a penalty conceded and they took a successful kick at goal 10-3 after ten minutes, Park pressed but Warrington held firm, a bit of 'hand bags' saw a yellow card for each side. Park narrowed the gap with another penalty on 20 minutes 10-6. Warrington came strongly following a penalty, Beeley's kick took play up to Parks 5 metre line, a throw to the back of the lineout was knocked up saw Tom Green gather and with a powerful drive he went over despite some desperate defence just before half time.

HT 15-6

After a rousing team talk at half time from the coaching staff Warrington started the second half with a bang, a break down the left wing and a kick on had Park scrambling back but JP Hudson won the race to touch down for the try. 20-6 At this point Warrington looked to be well on top but Park had other ideas, within five minutes a forceful drive by their forwards followed by a good break down their right wing saw a try the conversion followed 20-13 The game swung back Warrington's way with a Hudson penalty on 50 minutes after excellent Warrington pressure who had lifted their game.23-13 Another kick went wide and then with 10 minutes left a scrum on the half way followed by a kick for the winger saw Park intercept and race away to score under the posts, easy conversion 23 -20. Warrington replied three minutes later with a fine individual try from Jamie Abram who took the ball at a ruck and went on an arching run, straightened broke through the Park defence to score. 28-20 With the clock ticking down Park resistance was broken and on stoke of full time a scrum 20 metres out saw captain Josh Downes pick up, burst through on the blindside, Phil Lynch was on his shoulder to take the pass and run through to score Hudson converted.

FT 35-20

Overall a pleasing performance with Warrington showing again the team spirit in the squad which has been evident all season, with rotation of players due to injury and unavailability, much credit goes to the coaching staff especially to head coach Stuart Beeley for his commit to training and on match days.

P.S. it was great to see Danny Fleming watching the game whilst still recovering from the serious injury he suffered in the abandoned game at De La Salle which will now be replayed on the 5th February 2022

MANCHESTER 2ND XV 30 WARRINGTON 2ND XV 36

On a bitterly cold afternoon, Warrington took the opportunity of this friendly fixture to give its crop of upcoming youngsters a taste of open age rugby. In the forwards Jamie Sterling added his not inconsiderable frame as hooker while the industrious Jack Hesketh completed the back row. Josh Kirby and Charlie Hughes were the wingers and Nathan Bass completed the quintet at centre.

Manchester opened the scoring in the twentieth minute, rumbling over from close range after a quickly taken penalty. 5-0 Ten minutes later, a half break and copy book back door off load from Bass to back rower Harry Stevens gave Warrington the lead when stand-off Luke Little converted the try. 5-7. From the restart the ubiquitous Stevens snapped up a fumbled Manchester pass and scampered 50 yards down the touch for his second try. 5-12.

With 2 minutes to the interval, Manchester scored their second try again from a rumble over from short range as Warrington incurred the referee's displeasure. However, Warrington struck back with their own driving maul with captain Dom Hastings finishing the move. 10-17 at the break.

Will Jones, filling an unaccustomed second row slot, continued Warrington's advance with a fine individual effort from half way in the thirteenth minute of the half. 10-22 Manchester reduced their deficit almost immediately, however, when Warrington were penalised 5 metres from their line for an elementary off side. 15-22

Unaccountably, Manchester, like Warrington in the first half, made little use of the strong wind at their back electing to run the ball from their own half. With the wind, cold and tenacious Warrington tackling all adding pressure, scrum half Pat Reardon was next on the scorecard for Warrington as he scooped up a spilled pass and jinked 30 metres to touch down under the posts. Manchester hit back with two more tries, again both from short range as the penalty count began to mount against a Warrington side too inclined to try to take over the referee's job. 25-29. From the restart, rangy centre Bass somehow got control of a beautifully weighted low kick from Little and scampered from the 10 metre line under the posts untouched. Little again added the extras. 25-36

The home team, however, had the final say when they were awarded a penalty for their own forward pass as Warrington made a claim too vociferously! Again a short penalty and determined forward drives brought reward as they had done all afternoon.

Warrington will return to Manchester next week for their league fixture and will make a second win much more likely if they can limit the penalty count and make better use of the elements to play the right areas of the field.

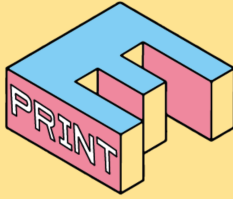

WRUFC Under 12s

After our brief season last May, the U12s were chomping at the bit to get a proper season started. The squad was boosted with the return of the couple of players who'd not been with us for a year or two, and a few brand new players to the club who have all strengthened the squad. With our rules staying the same until January the biggest change for the U12s was the introduction of the Lancs Cup Waterfall competition where the team would experience 'Scored' matches for the first time and all the boys were eager to see how we'd go in this.



We opened the season with a trip to Liverpool Collegiate in a match which showed just how much more physical the game will get as the boys all grow. We had a very hard fought and physical game, but our skills came through as we scored plenty more than we conceded. After this we were straight into our first Waterfall festival at Southport who hosted both us and Waterloo – in our first competitive game we beat Waterloo 5-0 and followed this up with an 8-3 win against the hosts and played some great rugby. We put a huge emphasis on basic skills and running rugby and all of these came to the fore. The boys not playing in the cup went to Waterloo and gave a brilliant account of themselves there. Next up we had a very aggressive Stockport who asked a lot of questions of us, it was great to see us go toe to toe with them whilst also playing our own rugby. A trip to Wirral and Southport once more was sandwiched with TMV and Leigh at home before we hosted one of our best rivals – Macclesfield who were very strong and gave us our sternest test yet. In the 2nd round of Waterfall games we hosted Ormskirk who we beat 5-0 and Collegiate who managed to score a debatable consolation in a 5-1 rout. We've now played 4, won 4 in the cup but are always mindful there will be bigger challenges as the rounds progress.

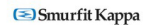
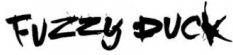
