Welcome to Southport

Warrington RUFC extends a very warm welcome to our friends from Southport RUFC on their league visit to Stockton Lane and we look forward to an enjoyable game

Brief History: - Southport Rugby Club was founded in 1872 and by 1878 had become known as Southport Olympic but it wasn't until April 1913 that the club once more became Southport Rugby Union Football Club. The club originally played at Manchester Road (1872-1880s), Scarisbrick New Road (1880s-1906), Victoria Park (1906-1926) and moved to their present home Waterloo Road, Hillside in 1926.In 1937 Southport had the honour to host the county championship match Lancashire v Cumberland with Lancashire winning 26-3. Like many clubs Southport have had their ups and downs over the years producing some of their best performances in the late 1950s and early1960s. Southport have played Warrington many times over the years both in friendlies and within the leagues structure and have had many tussles over that time.

Southport's last visit to Warrington was back in season 2010/11 but today sees their visit for this seasons return fixture when back in October Southport ran out winners 30-21 so Warrington will be out for revenge. Last time Southport suffered a home defeat to Cockermouth and Warrington were held to a draw, in awful conditions, at De La Salle.

Prospects for today's game, it is hoped for a dry day, an entertaining game, Warrington will again have to repeat the efforts since the start of the year to get a result so may the best team win.

WARRINGTON 25 ANSELMIANS 31

Although Warrington earned only a bonus point from this encounter with the league leaders, this was a good performance from a maturing side in a contest which Warrington could well have won.



Anselmians opened the scoring in the fifth minute when their right winger touched down a neat chip kick which had exposed Warrington's flat defence. 0-7. For the next 20 minutes, however, Warrington dominated play, retaining possession with quick ball from rucks due to ferocious support from a committed pack. Props Bennett and White were inches short as Warrington attempted to barge over from close range but it was left to stand off Matt Beeley in the twelfth minute to score with a neat dummy and step inside. 3 minutes later JP Hudson put Warrington ahead with a penalty from the Anselmian 22. 8-7. Anselmians regained the lead with a driving maul from a line out deep in the Warrington 22 and went further ahead as half time loomed when continuous forward pressure brought its rewards. JP Hudson pulled 3 points back for Warrington with a penalty to close the half 11-17

HT 11-17

Anselmians opened the second half scoring when their chunky centre found a gap in Warrington's back line.11-24 Warrington responded taking the ball deep into Anselmian territory but as the pressure on the Anselmian line increased things got tetchy, resulting in two yellow cards to the visitors. As this resulted in uncontested scrums, it was not clear that this was really to Warrington's advantage, as the home side was unable to benefit from their numerical advantage. Indeed, it was Anselmians who scored as a result of another chip kick which eluded the Warrington defence. 11-31. No sooner had the Anselmians offenders been reinstated than another two yellows were issued, one apiece, to the front rows, although this time competitive scrums were retained. This seemed to reinvigorate Warrington and with 10 minutes to go a clean break from centre Jamie Abram in the Anselmian 22 was the catalyst for a try by winger Max Caldwell converted by Matt Beeley. 18-31

5 minutes later captain Josh Downes took a short penalty from 5 metres out and pirouetted away from his tacklers for a try under the posts. Beeley added the extras. 25-31. With time running out Warrington attempted to keep the ball moving but could not regain the fluency shown in the first half and last gasp attempts to snatch victory came to naught as passes went astray.

Coach Beeley said "This is a big improvement on our previous encounter with Anselmians and we are beginning to see the benefits of a more settled and cohesive side "

ST BENEDICTS 3 WARRINGTON 20

Despite a stiff breeze down the pitch, conditions were perfect for an entertaining game of rugby and this was what was served. A break at centre by St Benedicts in the first 5 minutes nearly earned them points but winger Luke Turner intercepted the last pass to keep a clean sheet for Warrington.

It was now Warrington's turn to press, but from a scrum just 10 metres out from St Bens line and their scrum under pressure and wheeling, St Bens back row picked up, found no one in front of him and scampered deep into the Warrington half. The attack was eventually snuffed out on the Warrington 5 metre line. 10 minutes later St Benedicts were just wide with a penalty from the middle of the pitch when Warrington were caught off-side, but a minute later made no mistake when Warrington were again penalised in their 22 for handling in the ruck. 3-0. Warrington now

began to get into their stride. A good individual counter from full back Jack Stride took the ball 50 metres into St Bens half. A succession of powerful drives up the centre from Messrs Downes, Brazendale and Lynch had St Bens on the back foot but a penalty for crossing as stand-off Matt Beeley jinked his way toward the line relieved the pressure on the home team. With 5 minutes of the half remaining and Warrington camped on the St Bens 22, captain Downes opted for a scrum when awarded a penalty under the posts. Although Warrington's scrum had been the superior outfit throughout the half, St Bens prevented a push over scrum but could not stem the subsequent drives and No 8 Josh Downes was vindicated when he finished off. touching down beneath the posts. JP Hudson converted and the whistle went for half-time.

Minutes into the second half a storming run from Brazendale in St Bens 22 earned a penalty for the defence not releasing and Hudson added a further 3 points.3-10 With the wind at their backs Warrington now began to dominate territory and possession. Winger Max Caldwell popping up as an extra man in centre, took the ball deep into St Bens 22 and earned another penalty from St Bens being too slow to roll away. Hudson extended Warrington's lead with an easy 3 points. 3-13. Although St Bens were not totally deprived of possession, Warrington's tackling and the speed of back row jackal J Evans meant they did not keep it long as they were often penalised for holding on even if they had not surrendered the ball to Evans's predations.

With 15 minutes left, a good break from Beeley and skilful offload to Stride put the full back in for a try in the corner. Hudson converted the difficult kick. It was all over bar the shouting, except for those that went up when St Bens earned a second yellow card for high tackling.

De La Salle 7 WARRINGTON 7

Warrington again travelled to De La Salle after their match back in November was abandoned due to an injury to Danny Fleming and it was good to see him fully recovered and watching.

It was one of those days when you think that rugby should be a summer sport. In a dour, dour match played in atrocious conditions the result was just about right. Warrington dominated early and made good ground up the middle with short passes and quick recycle. Prop Chris White was particularly effective taking the ball deep into De La Salle's 22 in the early minutes. However, De La Salle retrieved possession and with the aid of the following wind kicked deep into Warrington territory. Full back Jack Stride, faultless under the high ball all afternoon despite the conditions, collected the ball and launched a counter. Such was the pattern with play oscillating between the 22s until De La Salle were awarded a penalty on the Warrington 22. Although this attempt went wide,



Warrington did not clear their lines on the restart and De La Salle we're awarded another penalty. A short one, this time from close range had the desired effect despite the heroic efforts of Evans in holding out the initial surge. 7-0. When De La Salle managed to evade Stride and find touch, line-out possession was almost guaranteed, notably by Will Morgan. Thus, Warrington had the majority of possession for the rest of the half and with their short passing game, with very few handling errors considering the conditions, were knocking on the De La Salle line for long periods. Although there was scarce a white line to be

seen, white line fever seemed to take over and extra men out wide were ignored. The home team's defence was resolute, however, and Warrington turned round 7 points adrift.

HT 7-0

In the second half Warrington persevered with their up the middle, up the jumper technique and were disinclined to use the elements in their favour. This, combined with some indiscipline nearly cost them dear as on one occasion they were marched back an extra 10m into goal kicking range. Fortunately, this was not converted. With time running out Warrington were again camped on their opponents try line but after waves of forward scrambling it was standoff Matt Beeley who finally ghosted over. Beeley secured the draw with his conversion and the whistle went.

Young and old combine to wrestle out a well earned win

With a storm force wind blowing straight down the pitch it was always going to be a game of 2 different half's. Warrington started with the wind at their backs and looked to try and use the wind to their advantage. However it was so strong that on several occasions the ball traveled almost the full length to run dead. Kev Jones hitting one from our own goal line and running dead. Something Didsbury would also fall foul to in the second half. Despite the wind against them Didsbury were driving the ball on hard and making progress up field and some timely and strong tackling from Matty Hennessy, Matty Bullock and Tyra Hamblett stopped them crossing the white wash. Warrington had their moments in the first half where the ball was spun through the backs only for a stray final pass meant the teams turned around 0-0 at the break.

A few injuries meant some shuffling around and the introduction of Rorio Zheng making his senior rugby debut in the back row, along side Jack Whittaker who played a pivotal roll at scrum half. This game also saw the return to the field after 3 years of Luke Johnston who's command and control was evident as the wire went about the second half. Now into the strong wind Warrington went about second half manfully working their way up the field, while Didsbury tried to use the wind to gain territory. As Warrington found in the first half the wind made kicking a lottery at times and they kicked the ball dead several times. However on one occasion their fly half put boot to ball and despite Mark Tickles efforts to stop it the ball travelled out and Didsbury profited from the 50/22 rule to gain a line out inside our 22. From the line out they trundled the ball over despite Warrington pack efforts to stop the drive. The kick was made effortlessly from the wide channel 0-7.

Warrington reacted brilliantly to this by upping the tempo and forcing error after error in the Didsbury side. They created the first try with the simplest of straight hard lines through the middle by Rorio Zheng who made the try look easy. Converted by Andy Almond 7-7 This seemed the spark something of the dog in the Warrington players and everyone to a man started to put their bodies on the line with some brutal and ferocious defence. This then provided Warrington's second try after some hard hits in the middle a counter ruck provided Scrum Half Whittaker some quick ball which he flashed to Andy Almond who shipped it onto Rorio Zheng, who hit the burners and powered through the Didsbury centres and then rounded the fullback for Warrington's second try. Converted by Luke Johnston. 14-7

All in all the balance of youth, experience and grit showed why Warrington 2s are a team that will continue to improve and develop as the colts conveyor belt keeps producing but also the more mature of players get that feeling back in their veins and it all adds to the mixing pot of success.






