Welcome to Burnage RUFC

Burnage Rugby Club was founded as an old boys' club for ex-pupils of Burnage High School. In the 1970s they moved from one pitch site on Queensway in Burnage, Manchester, to a new site in Heaton Mersey, Stockport where they are today. They have had a fair share of difficulties, including two fires which destroyed the club house and its temporary replacement respectively. Like the best Burnage teams though, the membership clubbed together to work their way out of trouble. Hard work on and off the field paid dividends: they now have a comfortable and spacious club house, an artificial rugby pitch a 3G floodlit 5 a side football pitch, and 2 large, well-tended grass rugby pitches. The 2011/12 season marked the 75th anniversary of the founding of Burnage RUFC.

Playing in North One West for the last couple of seasons Burnage have had mixed success and last season finished 6th one point ahead of Warrington who were 8th. After a good win last time out over Northwich before Christmas and New Year Warrington will want to keep the momentum going and avenge a defeat against today's visitors Burnage in the middle of September at Battersea Road.

Warrington Defy Conditions to Achieve Double Over Local Rivals Northwich

Excellent second half display brings second consecutive five point win

In weather more typical of Murmansk than NW England, Warrington ended Northwich's run of seven consecutive victories with one of their best displays of the season. This was a victory of pragmatism. No champagne rugby but clinical execution of the tactics, dictated by the conditions. The five point win takes them to sixth place in North 1 West, just five points behind second placed Stockport.

Northwich opened the scoring in the first minutes of the game taking advantage of a string of penalties to gain a line out 5 metres from the Warrington line. The predictable catch and drive met surprising little Warrington resistance and the conversion put the visitors 7 points up.

Warrington responded with gusto, however, and patience and perseverance with crunching forward drives earning yards the hard way. With 20 minutes gone, a break from elusive centre Kieran Hughes on the half way line took Warrington deep into the Northwich 22 but the chance to put winger Max Caldwell over was declined. Fortunately, Warrington were still able to capitalise on the break when a few forward drives later skipper Downes crashed over from short range. Full back Darren Norman added the extras to equalise the scores.

A few minutes later Northwich conceded a penalty and were marched back a further 10 metres for dissent. Not content with this, further debate earned them a yellow and, 5 minutes later, a further yellow for persistent fouling. Warrington took advantage of Northwich's depleted state to put winger Max Caldwell over in the corner following a succession of well-controlled forward drives.

On the verge of half time, again on the end of patient forward driving, skipper Downes added his second try to give his team a 17-7 lead at the interval.

HT 17-7

Almost immediately from the restart Northwich were penalised for a high tackle and with the strong wind now at his back full back Norman stretched the lead to 20-7. 10 minutes later Norman was marginally wide with another penalty attempt but the subsequent 22 drop-out proved disastrous for Northwich. The ball, kicked high into the gale, was blown backwards over the Northwich try line and pounced upon by the ever-alert Josh Riley. Norman again added the extras. 27-7.

Midway through the half, taking more advantage of the strong wind, stand-off Tom Wood showed his expanded repertoire by dropping a superb goal from 35 metres out.

With 10 minutes to go a bit of fractiousness crept into proceedings after exception was taken to a tackle by winger Caldwell. The referee was unperturbed by this initial incident but did take exception to a retaliatory punch by Jack Hannon (red) and a high tackle by Sean Callander (yellow) which followed shortly afterwards.

Warrington's thirteen men defended stoutly for the rest of the game to deny Northwich any further score.

Coach Andy Roberts was impressed by the victory. "These were extremely difficult conditions for the lads today and dictated that we play more of a forward game than we usually do. We are fortunate to have had our front row squad strengthened by the arrival of new recruit Nick Povey and the return of Tom Green from Guatemala, where he has been getting the local youth involved in Rugby League.

Warrington 2nd XV 17 – 14 Liverpool Uni. Vets. Sch.

Warrington brave the conditions to edge the students in a tough fought defensive thriller

In conditions as bad as you could possibly hope for, Warrington and the Liverpool Uni Vets served up a game where passion and defensive resilience were in far more supply than attractive running rugby. With the tally between the sides this season standing at won one - lost one, it was the Vets who started the game in flying fashion, scoring in the first minutes. As is proving to be the case more often than not this season, it takes Warrington listening to captain Craig Byrne under the posts before they start playing and they replied almost straight after. Strong work through the middle from the Warrington pack set Byrne off on a trademark run 45 yards out. Byrne powered through the first two defenders before a swerving run and a swivel of the hips did for the full back as he dotted down to level the scores.

As conditions worsened Byrne bundled the home side ahead when excellent support play mauled him over the line to give Warrington a 14-7 lead. Byrne then had to leave the field with a leg injury, Dan Griffiths stepping into skipper the side and also take on the kicking duties with Ben Dixon also being forced off. The Vets leveled up the score when their stand off collected a loose pass in front of a Warrington defence who stopped playing as the ball hit the ground allowing the Vet's 10 to walk through and score by the posts and take the game into half time level at 14 all.

The 2nd half started in freezing rain but with a massively lifted tempo from both sides. Both packs were running hard at each other and after several phases of quickly recycled ball, Warrington were awarded a penalty to the left of the sticks on the Vets 22. Stand in skipper Griffiths took the responsibility and nudged Warrington ahead with a sweetly struck shot at goal and what was to be the last score of the game with more than 25 minutes left. The rest of the game saw Warrington's green wall giving every drop of energy that they could muster up as the Vets continually hammered at the Warrington line with a lot of pick and go work from the rucks. As time wore down the Vets got closer and closer to the Warrington line when a combination of excellent tackling and strong scrummaging saw Warrington taking one against the head and able to clear their lines to hang on for a memorable 17-14 victory.

Special mentions go to; the whole of the Warrington front row who all put in a full shift and didn't give an inch all day in the scrums which set a platform for the joint MoMs Tom Heaps and Andy Buck to tackle and tackle everything that came their way.

Captain Byrne commented that "This was a truly team performance with every single player giving their absolute all. This now takes us into the new year 3rd in the table (which having made all of the big away trips) gives us an excellent platform for the 2nd half of the season".

Warrington 3rd XV 22 - 12 Moore 2nd XV

On the bleakest of winter days the brutal weather couldn't deter players and spectators alike from arriving on mass to witness a festive feast of rugby.

The Gentlemen of Moore stepped in at the eleventh hour to ensure a game would be played so a huge thank you to them, with the late notice they arrived needing a few and in true rugby spirit lads stepped up to even the sides, messers Turner, Morgan, Yeadon & Stevenson all pulled on the Moore jersey and gave a decent account of themselves, Turner in particular was a thorn in the side all game.

So to the kick off, with a sideways gale, that was regularly accompanied with ice cold rain, Matty Drinkwater sent the ball skyward and we were off. It was apparent from the start that the conditions were going to play a huge part as cold fingers and a slippery ball meant there were one or two knock ons. After the first 10 minutes of play things started to tidy up, some probing darts from the Warrington scrum half Dave Nichols, former captain Neil Sullivan showing he still has a 1 yard of pace from the base of the scrum all showed that the game was there to be won. It wasn't till the 23rd minute when a defensive line out on the Warrington 22, with Wheatley chucking in the ball sailed into the hands of Harry Kellett, the ball was then dispatched to the back line where some intricate, convoluted tomfoolery from Drinky and Millo, released Josh Little from the unfamiliar position of full back, Josh scythed through the gap to stretch his legs to scorch home from 50 yards. We won't talk about dinky conversion attempt. 5-0 The next score was all about the old adage forwards do all the work, the backs get all the glory, after some terrific drives and ball retention, Warrington were in the centre of the park 10 metres off the line, then in a flash the ball found its way the scrum hat sporting Millo, who powered over on the corner, this conversion was attempted by Josh Little, a spectator commented "he looked like he'd get that, up until he kicked it!" 10-0

Moore struck back almost instantly it's a great breakaway try in the corner the conversion was made albeit with the help of the crossbar 10-7 HT

The second half started very much as the first ended some strong play from Moore kept Warrington in their 22, some resolute defence & some strong carries from Peter "37 degrees on Cambodia" Holce, pressure relieving kicks from the educated boot of Drinky. After the initial onslaughts from Moore, Warrington found themselves inside the Moore 22, where from the line out Harry Kellett popped up on the short side to outpace the defence and stride over untouched, kick missed 15-7.

With the light and bodies fading rapidly, Warrington started to lose players firstly Chris Sterling knee, then Stu Beeley limped off holding his hamstring. All this made the last quarter of the game a little disjointed but despite that there were more tries from this game, the first for Moore after a speculative kick down field the foot race was won by the Moore stand off, kick missed 15-12.
