WARRINGTON 20 ST BENEDICTS 19

Stockton Lane was not the place for Warrington supporters of a nervous disposition as their team allowed a 15-point lead to crumble to a 4-point deficit before earning a redemption with less than 5 minutes remaining.

Although the game was played predominantly between the 22s, it was the visitors who came closest to the first try with a succession of forward drives which a resolute Warrington defence managed to repel. Warrington then came close with a long penalty attempt from Matt Beeley which just drifted wide. The visitors' tendency to kick for territory played into Warrington's hands as they were usually able to take possession and counter attack through their more elusive "backs. From just such a counter, a half break by stand-off Beeley followed by a good combination of hard-to-stop props Green and White took Warrington deep into St Benedict's territory. A penalty for a high tackle then provided the platform for a powerful drive from captain White. Followed by quick recycle and an equally robust charge from Green, Warrington's first try with 20 minutes gone was well merited. - 5-0. 10 minutes later Beeley stretched the lead to 8-0 with a penalty from the visitor's twenty-two. Just before the interval centre Jack Stride intercepted on his own 22 and with winger Rigby in support just in case went the length of the pitch for a try under the posts. Beeley converted to give Warrington a comfortable 15-point lead.

HT 15-0

From the restart, St Benedict's made ground through good interpassing between their forwards, abetted by some uncharacteristically poor tackling from Warrington, to gain a line out 5 metres from the Warrington line. Although Will Morgan initially saved the day with a line-out steal, Warrington could not clear their line and consistent pressure from the visitors through their burly forwards brought the dividends of a try just 10 minutes into the half. 15-5. Unforced errors and some tactical naïveté now began to cost Warrington dearly. An attempted attack from deep in their own 22 which got the ball to winger Bruckshaw with a some room to move came to naught as the last pass was judged forward. This left St Benedict's still in the danger zone with an attacking scrum. Although Warrington was now beginning to shift the heftier visitors pack backwards which helped them turn over possession, poor passing and kicking out on the full meant that they did not capitalise territorially. With 25 minutes gone St Benedict's chalked up a converted try from their right winger who grounded under the posts. 15-12.

A minute later prop White seemed to have redressed the balance crashing over from short range as the referee appeared to be playing advantage from an earlier infringement. However, judgement was that the ball was held up over the line and the earlier infringement was forgotten. St Benedicts had by now learned not to kick to Warrington and to concentrate on a handling game. This change in emphasis proved fruitful when they took advantage of a missed tackle in the centre of the field and won a kick and chase for a try under Warrington's posts. With only 8 minutes left Warrington were now 4 points adrift. 15-19. Warrington, however, rose to the occasion, forcing a line-out just 15 metres from the visitor's line. In contrast to previous weeks, Warrington's line-out now looked secure and, with great control, the pack trundled solidly over all resistance despite a number of attempts to pull them down. Second rower Danny Fleming was on the end of the excellent copy book move.

Sighs of relief all round when the whistle blew 2 minutes later. Warrington had once again come out on top in an unnecessarily close contest.

ECCLES 2ND XV 21 WARRINGTON 2ND XV 37

The result of Warrington's second visit to Gorton Rd in 3 weeks for Round 1 of the NOWIRUL Trophy Competition was much more gratifying this time for the visitors. In a highly entertaining game which at times became somewhat feisty, Warrington ran in 5 tries to 2 from Eccles.

With only 5 minutes on the clock a turnover of maul ball by back rower George Percival was taken deep into Eccles territory by fellow back rower Harry Stevens and hooker Matt Bullock. Warrington's momentum was briefly slowed 10 yards out but successive drives saw veteran second rower Rocky Turner crash over for an early lead. 0-5. Eccles stormed back and aided by 2 consecutive penalties gained a line-out on the Warrington 5-meter line. However, spring-heeled Stevens demonstrated his pilfering ability in the first of many such transactions during the game and the powerful boot of stand-off Kevin Jones put Warrington on the attack in the Eccles 22 when the ball was knocked on by the Eccles defence. From the resultant scrum Jones and centre Joe Bruckshaw combined well to split the Eccles defence. Winger Will Jones added some hard yards and Stevens completed the move with a try wide on the left. 0-10. Eccles replied immediately simply moving the ball down their back division to their right winger, the fastest man on the park, who crossed wide almost unopposed and touched down under the posts. 7-10

2 minutes later, another line out steal by Stevens initiated some good forward drives with second rower Sean Yoxall much to the fore and a final inside pass from Stevens acting at scrum half to Ollie Hudson earned Warrington's third try converted by Bruckshaw. 7-17. With 5 minutes of the half remaining, Warrington foolishly declined 3 points from a penalty in front of the posts opting instead for a short penalty. Eccles forced a turnover with the ball ending up in their speedster's hands. Despite the valiant attempts of centre Maudesley to cover back the Eccles winger touched down under the posts. 14-17. On the stroke of half time, Warrington were awarded another penalty in a similar position but this time took 3 points from the boot of Brookshaw. 14-20.

HT 14-20

The Warrington back division, despite more changes, were now beginning to look a lot more fluid. A skilful interchange involving Hudson, now at stand-off, and centres Bruckshaw and Maudesley earned a fourth Warrington try under the posts for Bruckshaw which the centre also converted 14-27. With 20 minutes to go Warrington's superior fitness began to tell as, despite an injury to the Eccles tight-head prop which necessitated uncontested scrums and evened up possession, Warrington attacked aggressively through the pack. With Eccles on the back foot Stevens made his second try from 20 metres out, look simple as he glided under the posts untouched. Bruckshaw converted. 14-34. Eccles pulled a try back when Warrington were penalised for off side in their 22 and were slow to react when Eccles took a short penalty 21-34. However, Warrington had the final say with a further 3 points from the Bruckshaw boot.

Junior Colts 2021/22

The Junior Colts like most teams throughout the land are glad to be back to playing rugby after missing more than a season to Covid.

At the time of the lockdown they were the U15's, enjoying one of their strongest seasons, finishing top of the Lancashire Cup Pool A group stage (unbeaten), progressing to the semi-final stage of the knockout rounds. It felt like it was our year to lift the trophy, but sadly, we'll never know. That concluded what has been a very successful and enjoyable Mini & Junior stage for the team, during which time they netted a good haul of tournament wins at Vale of Lune, Preston and Manchester, although landing the big prize of the Lancs Cup always seemed to elude us.



Transitioning to the colts means competitive league games throughout the season, as opposed to a season mainly comprising friendly, and some not-so-friendly fixtures; a challenge the boys were really looking forward to. In the Halbro Colts league, we were seeded into the Junior Colts A Division for the preliminary league, which pitted us against what are expected to be the top junior colts teams across Lancashire, Cheshire, Staffordshire and Cumbria – no easy job! In the five rounds of the league we secured good wins against Preston Grasshoppers (41-12), Liverpool St Helens (43-10) and Leigh (34-15), but came up short against very strong Stockport (26-48) and Chester (0-31) sides, giants of the Cheshire M&J scene for many years.

This achievement is a real testament to the spirit within the squad, as we only have 18 players, whereas Chester & Stockport have in over 35 players in their squads. Unfortunately we have not managed to get 15 players for 3 of the 5 group fixtures, which left us playing an incomplete 15 against sides who were able to refresh their line up with a strong group on the subs bench. This lack of numbers proved to be a significant factor in our defeat at the quarter final stage of the Lancs Cup, when we faced a determined Rochdale side on a heavy pitch with just 12 players, while they the luxury of 8 subs to call on.



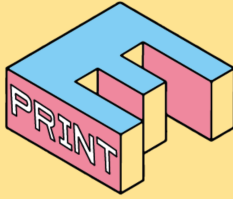
As you might expect, player recruitment is a major focus right now!

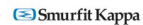
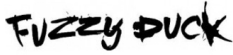
