De la Salle gained promotion from North Lancs/Cumbria as 2017/18 league champions to North One West for the first time. They found life in this league difficult and unfortunately were relegated to North Two West.

## KESWICK 19 WARRINGTON 14

With a number of regulars unavailable, it was an opportunity for two more of the products of Warrington's well-established training regime to make their first team debut. Tyra Hamblett, the third generation of the family to play for Warrington following Terry and Gideon, added his heft to the front row and Jack Whittaker added elusiveness and terrier determination to the back division.

An early half break from stand-off Matt Beeley on the Keswick 22 nearly gave Warrington their first score but, with the line beckoning, back rower Will Morgan could not secure the off-load. Keswick cleared the danger and with good use of a following wind and the new law on lined-outs gained a line-out deep in Warrington's 22. 10 minutes of fierce defence on the try line gained Warrington a yellow but kept the scoresheet blank. Ever prepared to run the ball, when Warrington secured a turnover they zipped the ball wide to the left through centres Jack Stride and JP Hudson to winger Luke Turner. Stride took the return pass and galloped the last 30 metres for a try converted by Hudson. 0-7. Astute use of the boot by the Keswick stand-off kept Warrington on the back foot and with 10 minutes of the half remaining, Keswick barged over from a line-out deep in Warrington's 22. 5-7

With a minute remaining, Warrington were awarded a penalty when Keswick illegally delayed the recycle from a Beeley, Caldwell break but Hudson's attempt was just wide. Warrington lost the services of centre Stride with a leg injury for the second half with Whittaker coming on as his replacement.

Now Warrington had the benefit of the wind and gained an early line-out on the Keswick 5 metre line from the Beeley boot. Unfortunately, Warrington's line out performance, which had been erratic in the game so far, continued in this vein and a scoring opportunity went a begging. Keswick responded with more intelligent kicking to force a line-out back in the Warrington half but an unnecessary dispute with the touch judge gave Keswick a penalty which was the catalyst for Keswick's second try. 12-7. Midway through the half a typical strong run from second rower Jim Brazendale opened up the Keswick defence, resulting in space for winger Luke Turner to squeeze over in the corner. A magnificent Hudson conversion from wide, across a stiff breeze eased Warrington back into the lead. 12-14. This was short lived, however, as Keswick struck back with some determined running from the back of a line out 20 metres out, compounded by some uncharacteristically weak Warrington tackling, to gain a third try. 19-14 Warrington pressed hard for a winning score but fell short so had to be content with a losing bonus point.

## WARRINGTON 49 SOUTHPORT 11

The contrast between Warrington's seven try demolition of Southport and the previous week's draw with bottom of the league De La Salle simply emphasised the overwhelming influence of the elements on performance. This was a pacy, slick performance where the visitors had no answer to Warrington's enthusiasm for open rugby.

It was the visitors, however, who opened the score within minutes with a penalty in front of the sticks when Warrington were off-side. 0-3. Two minutes later Warrington struck back with some champagne rugby where the ball went down the line going left then came back going right for winger Jack Rigby to dot down in the corner. 5-3. From the restart Southport again went ahead when Warrington were penalised for sealing off 5-6 but JP Hudson responded in kind after Southport were marched back 10 metres for unwanted advice. 8-6

With 30 minutes gone, Warrington's open rugby again paid dividends starting with quick line out ball off the top from Will Morgan. The ball went effortlessly down the line to Jack Stride entering at pace. With winger Rigby in support putting doubt in the defence's mind, the fullback darted over for the first try of his hat trick. Conversion by JP Hudson. 15-6. Prop Chris White then earned a 10-minute rest for some nefarious business, the first of four yellow cards in a game which did not appear to deserve such draconian measures.

Southport took advantage of their extra man to drive over from a line out to pull 5 points back 15-11 but they, in turn, were reduced to 14, apparently for one penalty too many. Just before the interval centre Jamie Abram added his name to the score sheet when a grubber kick for his winger ricocheted off the defence into his welcoming arms. Conversion by Hudson. 22-11

Hudson opened the scoring in the second half with a penalty 25-11 and a minute later added a try. Rumbustious second rower James Brazendale started the move with a half break. A good off load to Harry Stevens whose dummy wrong footed the defence and opened up space for Hudson to gallop 30 metres for the touchdown which he also converted. 32-11

In the next 10 minutes Stride added his second and third tries, the former finishing off some elusive running by veteran Matt Rockey now filling the full back slot, the latter on the end of some simple but well-timed passing along the back division. Back rower Will Morgan completed Warrington's tally in the last minute, Hudson converted. On a sour note Warrington lost Andy Kellett to a suspected broken ankle mid-way through the first half.
