Welcome to Bolton RUFC

Warrington RUFC extends a very warm welcome to players and spectators from Bolton RUFC on their league visit to Stockton Lane and we look forward to an enjoyable game.

Bolton RUFC... was first formed in 1872 (ie 7 years before Bolton Wanderers) and was first listed in the "Football Annual" of 1874. It reads : "Bolton formed 1872, has 100 members, ground at Burnden. Which is 1 mile from Bolton station. The dressing rooms are on the ground and it plays Rugby Football. The Secretary or Manager is F H Kevan of 12 Acresfield, Bolton. The colours are Blue jerseys, socks and cap, white knickerbockers. Result of matches last season :- Won 3, Lost 3, Drew 1. Result of goals Won 5, Lost 7." Bolton Rugby Union Football Club. Looking back at the history of Bolton R.U.F.C it could be covered by the old saying 'All life is there' as the efforts of a dedicated band of enthusiasts fought to give the game of Rugby to a sometimes unwilling Bolton. World War Two finally saw the demise of the game in Bolton. The start of the modern era was due to the enterprise of some former pupils of Hayward School, who, as ex-scouts, formed a team to play on Saturdays, calling themselves 'Old Haywardians'. This was now the late 60s, with one team, against usually lower sides of any club that would play them, and using the Morris Dancers pub as a home. The lack of a player base brought lots of people with a wide variety of skills and abilities to the fledgling club, and results, while not spectacular were encouraging. The move to the Bolton Wyresdale sports club in 1971 was another sound venture for the growing club, taking it to shared premises, with a well-used bar, and close to the council rented pitches at New House Farm. Here under the leadership of the uncompromising, but skilful Pat Murphy the club began to flourish, with sometimes 4 sides being put out, and good results, against a steadily improving fixture list. Many of the present day club stalwarts joined at this time, giving another impetus to rugby in Bolton. The move away from Bolton Wyresdale was not taken lightly. Bolton Council were helpful in indicating a possible new site for a ground, coupled with the 'interesting' state of the New House Farm pitches, caused lots of debate. None of the people who gathered upstairs at the Queen Anne at Little Lever in June 1974 will forget the almost Churchillian remarks of Chairman Pete Kenyon urging the club forward, to its own facilities. The unanimous decision to form Bolton R.U.F.C. did not get progress in motion immediately, but the club set about doing the spade-work of planning, fund raising, and most of all playing rugby. The move to the Volunteer at Darcy Lever was another base to build from. The state of the pitches at Newhouse were never far away in conversation, as the club fought their way into the fixture lists of existing clubs, with open exciting rugby, hard but fair, and a good after match atmosphere. By the early 80s the new ground site at Avenue St was coming into consideration, and Chairman Dave Pepper led the small group that drew up the plans, and looked at the costs for the actual clubhouse. Sunday 9th October 1988, the Official opening The 1st XV beats the Presidents Invitation XV (made up of captains of opposition teams) and Mike Slemen (Liverpool and England) declares the Club open for business. It all seemed worthwhile now and this was just the beginning. 1989, Major drainage works had to be undertaken as the pitches reverted to mud. 1995, The Clubhouse is extended by another 80% Existing Club room is doubled in size Two double changing rooms are added Extra showers and storage areas added.

Bolton have won their last three games with wins at home to Cockermouth and St Benedicts and an away at Orrell, whilst Warrington have lost two of their last three games so today it is hoped they will be able to regain the form they showed at the start of the year.
Warrington visited Bolton back at the end of November and ran out winners 23-14 in an entertaining game.
Today sees the return league fixture so it is hoped for a good open game and on the day may the best team win.

Footnote

The Warrington club would remind supporters to refrain from the use language that today is considered defamatory, offensive or that could be seen as abuse or harassment to other spectators, players or officials, whether anything you may consider right or wrong in the game you are watching.

WINNINGTON PARK 48 WARRINGTON 18

This was a prime example of a contest between the two predominant styles of play; open, flowing rugby or the more direct, forward-based approach. This is not to say that one side had the monopoly of one style, bulldozer Brazendale for Warrington excelled at the direct approach, but, for the most part, Warrington tried to play an expansive game while Winnington kept it tight.



Until 10 minutes into the second half the outcome of this struggle was in the balance but Winnington's superior forward power and a following wind then began to reap dividends. However, Warrington opened the scoring in the 6th minute when centre Archie Kellett looped outside his opposite number then ran round under the posts to make an easy conversion for J P Hudson. 0-7 Five minutes later, in an ominous development, Winnington scored their first try having pushed Warrington off their own scrum on the 5metre line. 5-7

Winnington then added a simple penalty to take the lead, 8-7 but Warrington countered with fine break by middle rower Phil Lynch, one of many during the game. A straightforward sprint for the line would appear to have got the try but a jink inside into the arms of the defence put paid to a score. A further two penalties from Hudson, however, put Warrington back ahead 8-13. Despite breaks from scrum half Ollie Hudson supported by work horse Will Morgan deep into Winnington territory, Warrington could not maintain consistent pressure. Indeed, it was Winnington, as the half wound down, who were pounding on the Warrington line. A break-out on their own 22 metre line would have put the fleet-footed Kellett clear, almost certainly for a try, but the pass was judged forward and the siege continued with Winnington eventually scoring under the posts. 15-13

HT 15-13

15-13 at the interval did not appear to be much of hill but the slope quickly got steeper as Winnington's hard, direct running abetted by some loose tackling earned their third try early in the half. Winnington then began to dominate possession with good use of the wind, which kept Warrington in their own half, and superiority in the scrum where an injury to prop Tyra Hamblett, himself only recently drafted into the position, brought further woes to Warrington. Winnington added 4 more tries before Warrington had the last shout on the stroke of time with a try by JP Hudson capitalising on a break and one-handed off-load from scrum half Pat Reardon.

FT 48-18

On this occasion, the direct approach won the day and also underlined the message, if any underlining was needed, that the scrum, and within the scrum the front row, is the bedrock of success.

WARRINGTON 15 ROCHDALE 36

Whatever the score line might suggest, this was a very even game with the result in doubt until the last few minutes.

Warrington started with pace, dominating possession and recycling the ball speedily. Although Rochdale had almost no possession they made the most of what they had, scooping up a dropped Warrington pass on half way and counter attacking quickly. This resulted in the first scrum of the match deep on Warrington's 22, but with the formidable trio of Bennett, Green and White back in the front row Warrington recovered possession and cleared the ball down field. However, the Rochdale winger caught the ball on the half way line, evaded the Warrington chasers, put a neat return kick in and won the chase to the touchdown. So, much against the run of play, the visitors were 0-5 up with 10 minutes gone. Warrington continued to dominate possession but another quick counter from Rochdale, snapping up a loose Warrington pass, made the most of an unbalanced Warrington defence and earned a try wide on the left. 0-10.

With 30 minutes gone Max Caldwell pulled one back for Warrington, scooting over from 25m out when the Rochdale back division seemed to have disappeared. 5-10. Just before the interval JP Hudson slotted over a penalty, originally awarded just inside Rochdale's 22 but made 10 metres easier as a result of some Rochdale backchat. 8-10.

HT 8-10

A magnificent, typically rumbustious run from captain Josh Downes from Warrington's 22 to Rochdale's 10m line set the tone for the second half. 15 minutes of champagne rugby culminated in a try near the posts with Jack Stride pirouetting over having taken a defence-splitting pass from stand-off Matt Beeley. Hudson added the extras. 15-10. Warrington's lead was short lived, however, as a foolish late tackle on their winger chasing a kick earned Rochdale a penalty deep in Warrington territory. Subsequent pressure earned an equalising try wide on the left. 15-15. With 10 minutes remaining, a long, well-timed pass from the Rochdale stand-off Rochdale exposed a gap in the Warrington defence to give Rochdale another try and a 7-point lead. 15_22

Warrington immediately swept back to the attack creating an opportunity for winger Jack Rigby who was caught just metres short of the try line. Warrington recovered possession from the resulting scrum, fed the ball wide where they had men over and the line at their mercy but failed to see the looming Rochdale centre who intercepted and ran the length of the pitch with Warrington in fruitless pursuit. A fourteen point try if ever there was one! 15-29. In the final minutes, Rochdale racked up a sixth try when Warrington were slow to react to a quickly taken penalty which gave Rochdale an overlap on the right.

One disadvantage of Warrington's otherwise commendable willingness to play open rugby is that the receiver sometimes gets a tackler along with the ball and the pass is spilled or sometimes, as was demonstrated in the last few minutes of this game, does not get the ball at all.
