Welcome to St Benedicts

Warrington RUFC extends a very warm welcome to the players, officials and spectators of St Benedicts on their league visit and we look forward to an enjoyable game.

Benedict's was founded in 1974, a Rugby Union Club, following the arrival of a Junior Priest (Fr Jim Allen) to the Parish of St Benedicts, Whitehaven, Jim was an enthusiastic amateur player who wanted to start a Rugby Union Club in what was and still is a Hotbed of Amateur and Professional Rugby League. The club joined Cumbria RU the following season and commenced to play in the County Shield League, which in essence was for Senior Clubs 2XVs and Junior Clubs 1XVs to compete in. The club went from strength to strength and by the mid-80s had won the Shield League 5 Years in a Row.

This is one of many long away trips for the Cumbrian club, as their only short hops are to Cockermouth and Keswick. We made the trek up to Whitehaven on 24th September 2016 in the first meeting between the clubs and played a side which was continuing its success in the North Lancs and Cumbria Division by winning its first two games in North 1 West. They made it three by beating us. After dominating the opening exchanges, Warrington suddenly found themselves behind when a speculative kick and a fortuitous bounce gave Benedict's the lead after 20 minutes. Although Warrington replied with a converted 30 yard try from prop Elliot Johnstone, two Benedict's penalties gave the home side a six-point half time lead. The second half saw Benedict's adopt a running, rather than a kicking, approach to their game and this allowed them to score a further twelve points without reply, although Warrington could take some comfort from the fact that they lost three key players through injury's. On the 7th January 2017 saw the return fixture spectators' fingernails were bitten to the quick at Walton Lea Road, as Warrington sneaked a last minute 28-26 win over St Benedicts, after leading by 22 points with just thirty minutes left on the clock, St Benedicts fought back to lead 26-25 and only a last minute penalty from Gillooly gave Warrington victory in a match that saw both teams score 4 tries. Season 2017/18- On 11th November 2017 Warrington travelled up to Whitehaven and in a feisty game can away with a 17-8 win after a good first half and resolute defence in the second. St Benedicts struggled in the latter half of the 2017/18 season their second in North 1 West and unfortunately dropped out of the league in March 2018. Today after winning the Cumbria Division One in season 2019/20, winning 18 of their 19 matches, see them once again on the road travelling down to Lancashire and Cheshire in season 2021/22. Warrington last game was defeat at Anselmians who appear to be the strongest side in the division, St Benedicts on the hand were held to a draw. It is hoped for a dry day, an entertaining game and may the best side win on the day.

WARRINGTON 26 LEIGH 22



The first Warrington-Leigh encounter for 5 years proved as nail-bitingly close as these fixtures usually are. The visitors made the early running and popped over a penalty with ten minutes gone. A second penalty a minute later was missed then it was Warrington's turn to benefit from Leigh infringements. A quick short penalty from scrum half Josh Riley took Warrington deep into the Leigh half with repeated hard drives and good recycling from the pack taking the ball up to the Leigh line. A score was

not on the cards, however, as a resolute Leigh defence resisted doggedly albeit at the expense of a few more penalties. With 25 minutes gone Leigh racked up their first try starting from half way. A break in the centre and a couple of inside passes gave them a try under the posts easily converted. 0-10. With 5 minutes of the half remaining Riley was again the catalyst for Warrington pounding on the Leigh line. This time, although the Leigh defence initially held out, a yellow card for the visitors, the culmination of too many penalties and a high tackle in the red zone, gave the advantage to Warrington with captain Josh Downes crashing over from short range after a number of successful pick and drives. Centre Matt Beeley added the extras and 2 minutes later he brought the scores level with a long range penalty from just short of the half way line.

HT 10-10

Seemingly buoyed by these levelling scores Warrington began to dominate the play forcing penalties from Leigh. Matt Beeley's boot kept the scoreboard ticking over and with 30 minutes gone Warrington were 9 points up. Warrington went further ahead when youngster Will Morgan playing at second row stole a line out ball from Leigh. A quick pass to Downes in the centre gave the captain space to build momentum for a break in the middle. 30 yards later a simple pass to Phil Lynch in support gave the second rower an easy run to the posts. Beeley's conversion gave Warrington what appeared to be a comfortable lead 26-10 but Leigh had other ideas. With 5 minutes to go, a try saving steal by Danny Fleming on Warrington's line saved the day but Leigh were not to be denied. Running back a poor clearance kick, they took advantage of some hesitancy in the Warrington centre and crossed for a converted try. A last minute flurry saw Leigh score again, this time unconverted, leaving Warrington breathing a sigh of relief and giving Leigh a bonus point. This entertaining game showed that Warrington



have a well drilled pack capable of retaining the ball and making the hard yards, and a back division with speed and flair to exploit possession. Less exuberance, or a greater awareness of when to be flamboyant, which will surely come with experience, will bring dividends.

ECCLES 2ND XV 21 WARRINGTON 2ND XV 37

The result of Warrington's second visit to Gorton Rd in 3 weeks for Round 1 of the NOWIRUL Trophy Competition was much more gratifying this time for the visitors. In a highly entertaining game which at times became somewhat feisty, Warrington ran in 5 tries to 2 from Eccles. With only 5 minutes on the clock a turnover of maul ball by back rower George Percival was taken deep into Eccles territory by fellow back rower Harry Stevens and hooker Matt Bullock. Warrington's momentum was briefly slowed 10 yards out but successive drives saw veteran second rower Rocky Turner crash over for an early lead. 0-5.



Eccles stormed back and aided by 2 consecutive penalties gained a line-out on the Warrington 5-meter line. However, spring-heeled Stevens demonstrated his pilfering ability in the first of many such transactions during the game and the powerful boot of stand-off Kevin Jones put Warrington on the attack in the Eccles 22 when the ball was knocked on by the Eccles defence. From the resultant scrum Jones and centre Joe Brookshaw combined well to split the Eccles defence. Winger Will Jones added some hard yards and Stevens completed the move with a try wide on the left. 0-10

Eccles replied immediately simply moving the ball down their back division to their right winger, the fastest man on the park, who crossed wide almost unopposed and touched down under the posts. 7-10. 2 minutes later, another line out steal by Stevens initiated some good forward drives with second rower Sean Yoxall much to the fore and a final inside pass from Stevens acting at scrum half to Ollie Hudson earned Warrington's third try converted by Brookshaw. 7-17 With 5 minutes of the half remaining, Warrington foolishly declined 3 points from a penalty in front of the posts opting instead for a short penalty. Eccles forced a turnover with the ball ending up in their speedster's hands. Despite the valiant attempts of centre Maudsley to cover back the Eccles winger touched down under the posts. 14-17. On the stroke of half time, Warrington were awarded another penalty in a similar position but this time took 3 points from the boot of Brookshaw. 14-20. **HT 14-20**



The Warrington back division, despite more changes, were now beginning to look a lot more fluid. A skilful interchange involving Hudson, now at stand-off, and centres Brookshaw and Maudsley earned a fourth Warrington try under the posts for Brookshaw which the centre also converted 14-27

With 20 minutes to go Warrington's superior fitness began to tell as, despite an injury to the Eccles tight-head prop which necessitated uncontested scrums and evened up possession, Warrington attacked aggressively through the pack. With Eccles on the back foot Stevens made his second try from 20 metres out, look simple as he glided

under the posts untouched. Brookshaw converted. 14-34

Eccles pulled a try back when Warrington were penalised for off side in their 22 and were slow to react when Eccles took a short penalty 21-34. However, Warrington had the final say with a further 3 points from the Brookshaw boot. **FT21-37**

Young and old combine to see Warrington 2s pick up their 3rd win in 4.



The new norm for the 2s is a team made up of players at the polar ends of the age spectrum and after 5 years (and a Covid isolation) on the side lines, this weekend saw the return of Kev Jones into competitive rugby, whilst at the other end of that spectrum it saw former WRUFC colt Ben Unsworth make his 2s debut. The rest of the team saw heady mix of youth and experience combine to give the team sheet a strong look.

Going into the game with matching (2-1) records the contest looked easily matched, but an Anselmians try straight from kick off acted as a wake up call to our 2s team that should be challenging around the top of the table. An early fracas for a late hit on scum half Andy Almond provided the nudge needed to show that the 2s are a tough unit, especially as Chris Sterling asserted himself into the melee to discuss how he wasn't happy with the late hit. Warrington took the 3 points on offer and from there didn't look back. After landing the penalty Andy Almond stepped his way through a flat footed defence and score to the left of the sticks. A Kev Jones try that saw him bump off 3 defenders was chalked off for making the referee one of the three. As Warrington then began to find their combinations, a strong run from debutant centre Joe Bruckshaw saw him run an excellent line outside fly half Jones, take the pass and bust through to stick a long arm out and score; the conversion from AA took us to a half time 17-5 up. Joe on debut again showed those age combinations working well in a centre partnership with Tick that saw tick only tackle all game in big hits.

The second half saw Warrington dominate in all areas of the game. Harry Stevens showed that stealing almost every opposition line out wasn't enough as he got his dancing feet and searing gas going to break the line almost at will. A third Wire try came off the back of a scrum win in our 22 - Dan Johnston worked the blind side and set AA in motion for a try two phases later that AA finished himself and converted. A few more chances went begging as balls went to ground with Warrington's exciting back line seeing an increasing amount of space. When full back Scott got 10 minutes rest it looked like Anselmians may chance their arm to get back into the game, but a last Warrington try by Harry Stevens breaking and finishing from the Warrington 22 put the game to bed. Other eye catching performances included a strong all round display from Louie, Heapsy making several mazy runs, strong dominance from the front 5 (seeing Anselmians call for uncontested scrums) and and all round strong D line all combined to see Warrington claim the W that leaves them competing towards the top of the table.



Captain on the day, Dom Hastings added "As always getting 15 names on the team sheet is half the battle for the 2s. So a big thanks goes to all those who pulled on a shirt to actually give us 18 on the day. As soon as the lads get those shirts on though, they always give everything for the club and today it was a pleasure to see. It was brilliant to see Kev Jones' return allowing us to keep the average age up, especially when we had a few younger guys looking to bring the average down to somewhere in the low 30s".

A return trip to Eccles in the cup this weekend will see a chance to overturn the defeat there two weeks ago.

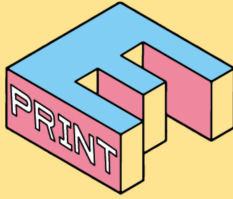

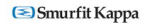
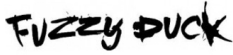
