HADLEIGH UNITED FC History



Hadleigh United began their Eastern Counties League (sponsored by JEWSONS) adventure on August 17th 1991, in the First Division, with a 1-0 defeat at home to Fakenham Town; Alan Dilloway was First Team Manager, with Welsh Under 21 international Les Tibbott as his assistant.

The first season ended with a mid-table position, in season 1992/93 a sixth place finish was achieved. The 1993/94 season saw us promoted to the Premier League under the Chairmanship of Simon King, who had taken over when long serving Chairman Peter Vardon became Chairman of the Suffolk F.A. Promotion was won by a seven point margin over runners up Woodbridge Town, but the "Woodpeckers" won the Suffolk Senior Cup after overcoming Hadleigh in the semi-final on a snow covered pitch at Felixstowe.

In their first three seasons of Jewson League membership Hadleigh had made a host of big name signings including former Ipswich Town & Chelsea qoalkeeper Jason Winters as a full time professional.

Premier Division status saw us finish sixth from bottom in the first season, but Alan Dilloway's team excelled in the F.A.Vase reaching the last 16, before losing at Metropolitan Police on a memorable day, when three coach loads of supporters travelled to support the team. But cash was getting short and at the end of that season, Manager Dilloway and all the senior players, with the exception of Reserve keeper Dickie Mann left the club. For a while the future of the club, formed in 1892, looked in jeopardy after 103 years.

Eventually Scott Clarke took over, with his own set of players from Brantham Athletic, they performed wonders to maintain Premier Division status, with a youthful Ian Gedney one of the heroes, along with keeper Dickie Mann and teenager James Rush. Other youngsters were promoted from the Reserves and soon made their mark. However Scott Clarke was controversially sacked before the end of the season. Donnie Davis then had a brief spell as Manager with Peter Hutchings as Reserve team Manager.

The following season saw the inevitable relegation with no money for the players. Louis Newman took over as First team manager and stayed for eight years. The best season in the league under his reign being fourth position in season 2002/03.

John Chenery was Chairman, whilst Rolf Beggerow was doing a superb job as Treasurer in getting the Club back onto an even keel financially.

Rolf Beggerow then had two seasons in the dual role of Chairman / Treasurer, with John Chenery as Vice Chairman. In 2003/04 season the Suffolk Senior Cup was won after beating Long Melford at Portman Road. In the same season the Reserves came runners up to Heart of Oak in the Suffolk Junior Cup final.

On Louis Newman's departure, Paul Tietjen and Lee Everett became First Team managers, but they moved on to Cornard United and were replaced by Reserve team Manager Dean Skinner.

Steve Jay joined Dean Skinner as his assistant, before Dean stood down due to work commitments. Steve Jay taking over as Manager assisted by Kevin Sharman

John Chenery took over as Chairman again, before handing over to John Whitwell. John stood down during the 2008/09 season with Ken Ramsey taking over the helm

Steve Jay resigned before the start of the 2009/10 season having secured the Club promotion to the Premier League as runners up in 2008/09 Season. The Club quickly appointed Peter Grant as First Team Manager with Gary Thompson as his assistant. At the end of this season Grant & Thompson both stond down.

Ex-player Stuart Crawford with former manager Alan Dilloway took over in June 2010. In their first season in charge Stuart and 'Dilly' steered the first team to a very creditable 9th position.

Ken Ramsey stood down as Chairman and took up the vacant role of Football Secretary for the 2011/12 Season with Rolf Beggerow covering as acting Chairman. The first team finished in 11th position following a very strong run in last 3 months. The Under 18's were runners up in the Ridgeons Youth League following a great season winning their divisional league and play-off match only to lose out a very strong Dereham Town team in the final.

For the start of 2012/13 Rolf Beggerow was voted back as Chairman and Treasurer. Long serving Clubman John Day was appointed Vice Chairman, Liam Britton joined as Reserves Team Manager following the departure of Jason Curtis and Jim Walker. Stuart Alston became manager of the Under 18's.

The 2012/13 Campaign will be most memorable for the First Teams run in the FA Vase reaching the last 8 of the competition following a series of away wins against opposition up and down the country. This was the furthest the club had ever reached in the FA Vase ended their league campaign in an improved 8th position.

Management stability paid dividends in the 2013/14 season with the club winning not only the Thurlow Nunn Premier Division for the first time, but the Reaveres winning their respective league. Another memorable run in the FA Vase ended at the last sixteen stage. Liam Britton resigned as Reserves Manager. Stuart Alston and Andrew Criso taking over.

Stuart Crawford resigned as Manager in January 2015 and was replaced by ex-Whitton United Manager and Hadleigh 1st team coach Ian Brown. Alan Dilloway remained as Assistant Manager with Steve Downey as Coach. The following two seasons saw respectable 7th place finishes in the league but with no notable Cup success.

lan Brown and Steve Downey both resigned and Alan Dilloway retired from football at the end of the 2015/16 season which also saw the exodus of all the senior players.

Stuart Alston and Andy Crisp stepped up to first team Manager and Assistant Manager respectively, after a very successful time with the reserves in the previous few seasons. The 2016/17 season saw Hadleigh Utd retain their Premier league status by the "skin of their teeth" which was a great achievement due the fact that the squad was rebuilt from scratch and the amount of youth team players used.

October 2017 saw Stuart Alston step down as first team Manager. Andy Crisp looked after the first team under the title of Interim Manager for 3 matches before Shane Wardley and Ian Cornforth were appointed Manager and Assistant Manager of Hadleigh Utd on 26th October 2017.

The 2017/18 season saw Hadleigh Utd finish in the last relegation position (4th from bottom) and only retained their Premier League status because Haverhill Borough had ground issue's which meant they were the ones to be relegated. There were high hopes for better results in the 2018/19 season with a stronger squad assembled. Ian Comforth left the club to move to his own Management position at Leiston Reserves in September 2018 and, with the club in 19th position in the table of 20, Shane Wardley resigned from his position in January 2019.

Andy Lambert and Andy Crisp took control of 1st team Management duties for 3 matches (2 wins) whilst a new manager was sought. On 26th January 2019 Christian Appleford was appointed as 1st team Manager and given the task of saving Hadleigh Utd from relegation which was managed with the team finishing in 16th position. Christian appointed Steven Holder as his Assistant in January of 2020. With a strong coaching staff and good player recruitment, the 2020/21 season promises to be an exciting one.

He brings a wealth of knowledge and experience to the club from his last two appointments at Mildenhall Town and Bury Town respectively. A highly regarded, hardworking, coach who prides himself on meticulous preparation

Steve Holder (Assistant Manager/Striker): Steve joined Hadleigh Utd from Ely City in January 2020 in a player coach role. A very experienced player who still has an eye for goal when on the pitch. His main role will be to support the Manager and get the most out of the playing staff. He has fitted in well, has a great will to win and a calm head.

Scott Lawrence (Player/Coach): Scott has played First and Reserve Team football at Hadleigh United in various positions. A loyal and versatile member of the coaching staff who can be relied upon. He has proved to be an asset to the Football Club. Not averse to pulling on the gloves when required.

Tom Rowson: (Physio/Sports Therapist): Tom joined Hadleigh United in February 2019. A highly qualified and dedicated physiotherapist who has the challenge of keeping the players on the pitch. The players are sure to be grateful for Tom's healing hands.

Nick Punter (Goalkeeper): Nick signed for Hadleigh in the 2017/18 season After stints at Stanway Rovers and latterly Westerfield Utd. Nick quickly made the No1 jersey his own with great saves (especially penalties) and his calm assurance at the back. Regarded as one of the best keepers at this level. Players player award winner 2018/19 and 2019/20.

Kris Rose (Defender): Kris returned to Hadleigh Utd in October 2017 from Ipswich Wanderers. He had been at Hadleigh for 10 years previously. A no-nonsense defender who can inspire the team with his strong performances and never say die attitude. A crowd favourite at the 'Millfield'. Was part of the title winning side of the 2013/14 season. Kris is the club Captain.

Matt Paine (Defender/Midfielder): Matt signed from Stowmarket Town for the 2019/20 season. Matt's quality needs no introduction having previously played for the likes of Boreham Wood, Braintree Town, Billericay Town and most recently Stowmarket Town. Matt's experience and drive undoubtedly helps the team and importantly the young players at the club.

Ben Elliott (Defender): Ben is a solid defender. His timing of a tackle has become renowned among supporters and his calmness on the ball is a great asset to the team. He is a major part of the team. Won Managers player of the year award for season 2017/18.

James Ross (Defender): James joined Hadleigh Utd in the 2015/16 season and is a quick player on the left or right. He has the ability to change defence into attack with his quick thinking and vision. His hard work gained him the supporters and players award's for season 2017/18

Dan Knight (Defender/Midfielder): Dan came through the Youth system at Hadleigh Utd before a move to Needham Market took him away for a few seasons. The pacey left sided player has returned to the Millfield but injury curtailed his 2019/20 season. He is sure to be knocking on the door this season now fitness has returned.

Marco Makris (Defender): Marco joined Hadleigh Utd at the beginning of the 2018/19 season from Woodbridge Town. After a bright start to his Hadleigh career he unfortunately suffered a serious knee injury that kept him out of action for 18 months. He has shown a great attitude throughout his recovery and now back fit he has the opportunity to be heavily involved this season.

Jemel Fox (Defender/Coach): Jemel is well known in local football as a strong athletic defender. He joined Hadleigh in February 2020 from Haverhill Rovers. Previous clubs include AFC Sudbury, Leiston and Stowmarket Town. He is combining his player/coaching role with 'Player Development Officer' within the club to help with player pathways.

Kerrin Lawrence (Defender): Kerrin has signed on dual registration from Bury Town in August 2020. He is a hard-working centre half who will add height to the centre of defence. Good in the air and also with the ball at his feet. A good asset to the club.

Jake Eady (Defender): Jake is a strong and composed full back or centre half. He joined

at Team Bury and higher level Bury Town.

Kyle Ferguson (Defender/Midfielder): Kyle has previously been part of the Hadleigh United team in two separate spells before (2017/18 and 2018/19 seasons). He knows the club well and is a strong and athletic player. Kyle has pace to burn and can look forward to fitting in well with Hadleigh's attacking style of play.

Gavin Van-oene (Midfielder/striker): Gavin joined Hadleigh Utd from Achilles at the beginning of the 2019/20 season. He was just starting to make an impact in the team when he suffered a knee injury that ended his season. Back fit, he has already started to make up for lost time with good, hardworking displays during pre-season.

Joe Yaxley (Midfielder): Joe is the older brother of teammate Jack. He signed from Felixstowe and Walton Utd in the Covid summer of 2020. Joe is a tenacious and creative ball playing midfielder with a great will to win. Has also played for Brightlinosea Recent.

Mason Ransome (Midfielder): Mason rejoined Hadleigh Utd in January 2020 from Framlingham Town after being with us previously in the 2017/18 season. A fleet footed wideman with a peach of a left foot. Puts opposition defenders under pressure with his pinpoint crossing accuracy, especially from a dead ball.

Shane Murphy (Midfielder/Defender): Shane rejoined Hadleigh after having a year away abroad. He has come through the ranks here from the U18's and has proved to be a very versatile player. Can play at the back and is also known for his scoring ability when asked to play higher up the pitch. He has a great engine.

Max Dinnell (Midfielder): Max joined Hadleigh in August 2020 from Whitton Utd after playing most of his football at Haverhill Rovers the previous season. An intelligent player who is creative in possesion and will add to the attacking style of play that Hadleigh want to play this season.

Josh Cheetham (Forward/Midfielder): Josh re-joined Hadleigh from Leiston at the start of the 2019/20 season. Injuries curtailed his appearances last season, but now fully fit we will hopefully see the best of him. He is an attacking midfielder with a great left foot who adds creativity to the team and adds further attacking quality. Josh fits in well with the teams playing style.

Kade Ivatt (Forward): Kade joins Hadleigh after playing for Cornard Utd last season. He did play for Hadleigh previously at U15 level before then playing for AFC Sudbury development sides. He is a hard-working forward who has already scored twice during pre-season. An exciting prospect for the team.

Joel Glover (Forward): Joel joined Hadleigh from Great Yarmouth at the beginning of the 2019/20 season. He is a tall, powerful but skilful centre forward with an eye for goal. Joel has attracted interest from clubs at a higher level and we are glad that he chose to stay with Hadleigh United. He was top scorer for the club last season

Kyle Cassell (Forward): Kyle returns to Hadleigh after a short spell with AFC Sudbury last season. He is a quick, athletic player who does not let a defender rest. He was top scorer for Hadleigh in the 2017/18 and 2018/19 seasons so goals are a forte. Also plays for the Army Combined Services team.

A DIP INTO THE ARCHIVES

1976/77 - Magnet & Planet Eastern Counties League

This season marked a short-lived experimental phase in the history of the league with the introduction of a new points system. Four points were awarded for a home win, five points for an away win, one point for a draw and an extra point awarded to teams scoring four more goals in a game. This obscure system meant that champions Wisbech Town gained 137 points, whereas under the old system of 2-points for a win they would have recorded 63. The system was not deemed a success and was quietly shelved at the conclusion of the season.

Having had to apply for re-election the previous year, Ely's 8th place under the strong leadership of Roger Pauley was considered a very satisfactory one. A large influx of new players had arrived in the Summer with increased emphasis given to making the team more defensively sound and hard to beat. This they achieved conceding just 46 goals in 40 league matches, which included 14 shut outs. On the reverse side, they found goals difficult to come by with just 57 scored. City registered excellent home wins against 2nd placed Sudbury Town and 3rd placed Gorleston (both 2 - 0) but conversely registered defeats at Gothic, Felixstowe and Chatteris all of whom finished in the bottomfour. Derek Bryden was top scorer for a second season in a row with 16 League goals (18 in all competitions), four of which came in the 5 - 1 win against Braintree & Crittal Athletic.

City fared less well in the Cup competitions. Having entered the FA Vase for the very first time, they suffered an embarrassing 2 - 1 home defeat to Peterborough Rovers of the Peterborough League. In the FA Cup they lost 3 - 1 at Southern League Midlands Division team Wellingborough Town; and in the Cambs Invitation Club were knocked out by Wisbech Town (3 - 1 aet) in the opening Round.

A typical team for the season was Trevor Frohock (GK), Brian Cox, Bruce King, Ted Carolan, Colin Harrington, Peter Speed, David Hogg, Soapy Edwards, Alan Moore, Derek Bryden, Kettlewell and Roger Pauley.

ELY CITY FOOTBALL CLUB A Brief History



Ely City, nicknamed the Robins after their red shirts, are the oldest senior club in Cambridgeshire. They were formed from the original members of a team called Ely St Etheldreda Football and Cricket Club in Circa 1885. For over ninety years the Club played at the Paradise Ground in the centre of the City, before moving to their present Downham Road location in 1986.

Having initially only played friendlies and entered local cup competitions, Ely joined the Cambridgeshire League in 1901. They withdrew prior to the 1902–03 season after a dispute over fees but re-entered the following season. Having merged with local junior side Ely Albion in 1908, City won their first silverware with back-to-back Cambs Senior League titles in 1910-11 and 1911-12.

At the end of World War I, City joined the Isle of Ely Junior League, winning the title in 1920-21 and 1921-22. City returned to the Cambs League in 1922-23, finishing Division 1 runners-up and also claiming the Cambs Challenge Cup with a 2 - 0 win over strong favourites Newmarket Town. In what was a successful period, the Challenge Cup was retained in 1923-24 and another 2nd place achieved in 1924-25. The Cambs league was restructured in 1928-29 with Ely placed in Division One A, where they finished bottom and were relegated to Division One B. Further league restructuring occurred in 1931, which saw Ely promoted to the newly formed Premier Division. The 1930's was a period of struggle and culminated in relegation to Division 1 (Section B) in 1936-37, where they remained until the outbreak of World War II.

At the end of hostilities, City joined and won the 1945/46 Cambs League (Northern Division) title. Now back in the Premier Division, Ely secured a unique double in 1947-48 by winning both the Cambridgeshire Senior Cup competitions - Creake Shield and Cambs Challenge Cup - in the space of a week. Special trains were organised to take around 1,000 supporters from Ely to the two finals played in March and Histon respectively. In 1949-50, City were Runners-up in the Premier Division and again reached the final of the Creake Shield, losing out in both competitions to then dominant local side, Camden United.

In 1951-52, Ely joined the Peterborough and District League Premier Division and in their first season reached the league cup final which was lost to Cambridge United Reserves. Under newly appointed player-manager and ex-professional George King, Ely won the Premier Division in 1955-56 and reached the First Round Proper of the Amateur Cup, a considerable achievement for a club of Ely's size at that time. However, the crowning glory was achieved the following season when having disposed of higher status teams Histon, Cambridge United, Cambridge City, March Town and Sudbury Town, they reached the first Round Proper of the FA Cup, losing 6 - 2 to Division Three (South) high-flyers Torquay United in front of a record crowd of 4,223. In a truly remarkable season, City also finished 2nd in the league and again reached the first round of the Amateur Cup. Another 2nd place finish was achieved in 1957-58, following which the Club took the decision to turn professional and joined the newly formed Central Alliance League (Division One South). Ely finished 8th and 5th in their two seasons and were losing finalists in the 1959-60 league cup.

Having made a number of previous attempts, Ely were elected to the Eastern Counties League in 1960-61. The Club initially struggled to find its feet at this level, and it was not until the appointment of former Northern Irish international Hughie Barr as player-manager in 1967, that the tide turned. Having secured the Club's highest ever league position of 4th in 1968/69, City were runners-up in 1969/70 and 3rd in 1970/71. That season, City also won the Cambs Invitation Cup (CIC) for the first time and were league cup finalists, losing out to Wisbech Town over two-legs. Barr was replaced by ex-Wisbech Town Player-Manager Mel Harnwell in 1971/72 as Ely secured 5th place and also reached the 4th Qualifying Round of the FA Cup, losing to a Kettering Town side led by fledgling manager Ron Atkinson. Other than finishing bottom in 1975-76 and having to seek re-election, City remained a predominantly mid-table team for the remainder of the seventies.

Ely's next season of note came in 1979/80 when the Club won the League Cup for the first and so far, only time, defeating Lowestoft Town over two legs. Despite securing 4th place and scoring a century of goals in 1980/81, the remainder of the 80's was a period of perpetual struggle in which numerous



managers came and went and which finally ended in relegation to the recently formed ECL First Division in 1988/89. At the end of 1985/86, Ely had moved from Paradise to the present Downham Road location on the outskirts of the City. Improvements to the ground have continued to be made over the years and the Club now boasts some of the best facilities in the league.



After relegation steady progress was made during the early nineties under the initial management of ex-Cambridge United man Tom Finney and then Steve Clark. Management duo David Pinkowski and Tony Lyes were appointed in 1994/95, and they secured City's first piece of silverware since 1980 by winning the Hinchingbrooke Cup in 1995/96. City then romped to the 1996/97 First Division title by a margin of 15 points over closest challengers Histon. The following season, Ely defied all expectations by finishing second in the Premier Division, just two points behind Wroxham – who effectively won the title following a winner-takes-all match-up in the penultimate game of the season. This however proved to be a brief period of success for Ely as Pinkowski and Lyes - and nearly all the squad – left at the end of the season. Ex-professional Alan Biley stepped into the breach at late notice but City almost inevitably finished in bottom-place and were relegated.

Under Steve Taylor, Ely secured an immediate return to the Premier and also won the First Division KO Cup in 1999/00. Having re-established themselves in the top-tier City, now managed by Kevin Pritchard, went on to win the Cambs Invitation Cup for a second time against higher grade Histon in 2001/02. Following the departure of Pritchard, the Club were again relegated at the end of a disastrous 2002/03 campaign. The Club would have to wait until 2007/08 before securing another promotion, this time under the astute management of Dennis Lightning. In the interim, the Club won the First Division KO Cup a further two times in 2004/05 and again in 2007/08. Alan Alsop took-up the managerial reins in 2010 and in only his second season (2011/12) led unfancied City to runners-up spot, once again behind Wroxham. The CIC was also won that season against local rivals Soham Town Rangers and retained the following year (2012/13) with a 3 - 0 win over Southern Premier League side Cambridge City. That season City also reached the 4th Round of the FA Vase.

Following Alsop's departure in January 2014, senior players Brady Stone and Ben Lawrence took charge for the remainder of the season and somewhat against the odds steered the team away the relegation zone. With a severely reduced budget, Stone, now assisted by Martin Grey was unable to repeat the trick in 2014/15, and Ely were unsurprisingly relegated. However, the seeds of a young and talented squad had been sown, and City secured promotion at the first attempt as runners-up in 2015/16 in a campaign that included a club record run of 14 consecutive league wins.

Back in the Premier for 2016/17, City secured a creditable 13th place and reached the fifth round of the FA Vase, a best ever performance in the competition, finally bowing out to Midlands side Sporting Khalsa in front of a crowd of 646 - a record attendance for the ground. City were also runners up in the CIC, losing to Cambridge City in the final. In 2017/18 the Club finished 14th and won the CIC for a fifth time, defeating Cambridge United Development with a stoppage-time winner at the Abbey Stadium. Although City struggled for much of 2018/19, they staved off relegation in exciting fashion in the penultimate game of the season by scoring twice in injury time to defeat 3rd placed Godmanchester Rovers. Remarkably, City also reached the CIC final for a third year in a row, this time defeating ECL Champions, Histon 2 - 1 to retain the trophy.

Brady Stone and Martin Grey stood down in December 2020, to end a successful six-year tenure. The new joint management team of Luke McAvoy and Ben Farmer were embroiled in another relegation battle when the season was declared null and void in March 2020 as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic.

The 2020/21 season will provide the new management team with the opportunity to put their own stamp on the team to and write their own chapter in Ely's long history.

The Club currently run a Reserve side, A Team and Under 18 side. In May 2020, City formally merged with local junior side Ely Crusaders to form a new Club Ely City Crusaders. The vision of the merger being to create a clear pathway into senior football for local youngers in the City and surrounding area. The Club is affiliated with the Cambridgeshire FA and is an Associated Member of the Football Association.


