Previous Respect campaigns have focused on the 'Disrespect' within the game, however research highlighted the opportunity to reinforce and focus on 'Respect' in a positive voice







Opportunity to reframe and give understanding to what Respect is within Youth football



The task is to deliver a new creative campaign to overarch all respect initiatives in order to raise awareness and change attitudes

Objectives:

- Increase awareness of Respect within youth football
- Decrease number of respect related issues/incidents

Target audience: parents and coaches of youth players

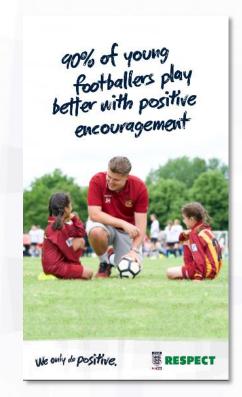
Creative idea:

We only do positive.





Key visuals support campaign message and are flexible & consistent across formats









Independent research conducted to solidify campaign claim

"90% OF YOUNG FOOTBALLERS PLAY BETTER WITH POSITIVE ENCOURAGEMENT."

Alternate claims:

- 92% of young footballers are more motivated to play with support and encouragement
- 92% of young footballer enjoy football more with support and encouragement
- 90% of young footballers want to play more football in future with support and encouragement

Research methodology

- 500 parents and 500 children aged 8-16
- 10 minute survey of which 3/4 mins with kids
- Results top two box (agree & strongly agree)

WIP Positivi-tea – Parent & spectator activation

What is it:

- We'll give free branded cups to the five central venues in England to serve tea to parents on the side line.
- Each cup will have Respect messaging to make parents take a sip and think before they speak or shout.

How it works:

- Branded cups will have a short piece of copy as per parents' code of conduct.
- Branded tea van & ambassadors to launch activity at 5x central venues.
- We'll supply 4 games worth of cups up to 500 teams.
- Pre & post results tracked & used as owned and earned media content.

Coaches handbook

Overview:

We will create a 'We Only Do Positive' Coaches' Handbook which will housed as digital version of the handbook will also be made available online at TheFA.com.

The handbook will feature:

- 5-10 positive youth coaching principles from Gareth and implementation examples

The Unexpected Team Talk

Overview:

A PR-led video where a famous face associated with football surprises a struggling youth football team with a team talk.

'Hard man' (TBC) gives the team a positive and motivational team talk, when the players and onlookers may be fearing a more negative intervention.

Authentic reactions from both the team and parents will be included.

Timings:

The Unexpected Team Talk will be filmed in November and launched in December.

PR/Media:

The video will be distributed on the FA channels, ambassador channels, and shared via PR.

Media will receive the video, alongside the press release including imagery and quotes from players, parents and involved talent.



21 days of positivity

Overview:

Celebrating 21 days of positivity, members of England's men's, women's and youth teams will share a piece of positive advice a coach has given to them when growing up.

The FA will film players thanking a specific coach for a positive impact on their career. The FA will post on own social channels and we will ask players to share additionally.

Timings:

To launch on Mon Jan 21 2019 AKA 'Blue Monday' – officially the most depressing day of the year.

Different content will be uploaded each day for 21 day period.

Media/PR:

- Content will be proactively pushed to media alongside details of 21 Days Of Positivity campaign
- To supplement the social posts, FATV may produce additional pieces of content for publication during the 21 days of positivity.
- E.g. Jesse Lingard surprised during former coach during an interview at Wembley
