'Return to Rugby' schedule and guidelines to mitigate the risk of Covid-19 exposure

September 2020



Club mission and introduction

Club mission:

To provide an enjoyable, supportive and safe environment for all members whilst encouraging a 'One Club' philosophy and a sporting and social ethos within Rugby Union.

Community Rugby and Covid-19:

- The Return to Rugby Roadmap has been updated from Phase C to Phase D. The rugby community is now able to conduct some larger group 'non-contact' rugby and also, some limited contact activity as per RFU guidance.
- The return will initially be focused on Ready4Rugby, a non-contact game, enabling two teams of up to 10 players to engage in training and match activity in their own club environment.
- In developing the action plan, the RFU was required to undertake a detailed assessment of exposure risk through face to face contact across both contact and non-contact rugby.
- The recent assessment highlighted a significant risk in playing full contact rugby, so only a
 maximum of 15 minutes contact activity per session as per RFU Stage D guidelines.
- The Club measures to maintain hygiene and minimise unnecessary interactions with others are unchanged.
- All activity will be consistent with the Government guidance regarding health, travel, social distancing and hygiene at all times.
- The Club has considered safety first, particularly minimising the risk of infection and transmission. Appropriate measures are put in place to ensure participants and volunteers are protected.

Our responsibility and health screening questions

Our responsibility:

This concerns every single person involved or associated with the Club and it is the responsibility of all Players, Club Officers, Coaches and Volunteers to ensure these guidelines continue to be met.

Health screening questions:

- Prior to attending the Club you must complete and be able to answer "NO" to all 4 of the following COVID-19 screening questions:
 - 1. Are you, or someone in your household, currently suffering from any of the following symptoms: a high temperature (37.8C or higher), a new continuous cough or a loss or change in your normal sense of taste or smell?
 - 2. Have you or someone in your household been told you have confirmed COVID-19 in the last 14 days?
 - 3. Have you been told you have been in contact with someone who has confirmed COVID-19 in the last 14 days?
 - 4. Have you travelled outside the UK in the last 14 days? (excluding countries specified by the Government as exempt from isolation requirements)
- If you answer "YES" to any of these questions please do not attend the Club

General rules to ensure a safe training environment

General rules:

- Sessions will strictly take place following the RFU guidelines relevant at the time and follow Club requirements.
- Coaches and/or Team Managers and/or Team Admins will use Pitchero to hold a record of all players attending the Club for each and every training session.
- Only 1 player parent/carer will be permitted to observe a session at a distance from a safeguarding perspective and must observe social distancing guidelines.
- The clubhouse will be open for food and drinks with a one-way system in operation. Access will be through the emergency steps and the exit via the main stairway.
- Changing rooms and showers will be closed apart from the use of toilets.
- Toilets may be used one at a time and should be accessed as indicated.
- First Aiders will follow all guidelines and advice published by St John Ambulance COVID-19.
- If any player, parent or volunteer demonstrates symptoms of COVID-19 they and all of their age group will need to self-isolate; they are not to attend the club site for 14 days and must immediately inform the Safeguarding Officer, the Director of Rugby and the Head Coach.
- All RFU guidelines must be followed and met, failure to do so will result in internal investigation.

✓	All players, parents, staff and volunteers to adhere to relevant social distancing measures at all times	×	No hand shaking; No touching face; No huddles; No close physical contact (apart from limited contact drills)	
✓	All to arrive and depart at your allotted time	×	Do not congregate in large groups at the Club before, during or after training	
\checkmark	All parents to advise on player availability / attendance via Pitchero	×	Do not access the clubhouse in any other way than indicated	
√	All to access ground via the designated car park	×	Do not enter via any other routes	
✓	All to make your way directly to your allotted training area	×	Do not be late, loiter in the car park or on the pitches	
\checkmark	All to train in your allotted space only	×	Do not cross into any other training areas	
✓	All to leave the training area by heading directly to the designated car park	×	Do not leave via any other routes	
✓	All to bring their own water and hand sanitiser to be used when required	×	No sharing of water bottles	
✓	All sessions will have buckets on site to clean and disinfect all balls and cones	×	Do not forget your hand sanitiser	
\checkmark	Max 20 in a training group per half-pitch	×	Do not be complacent	

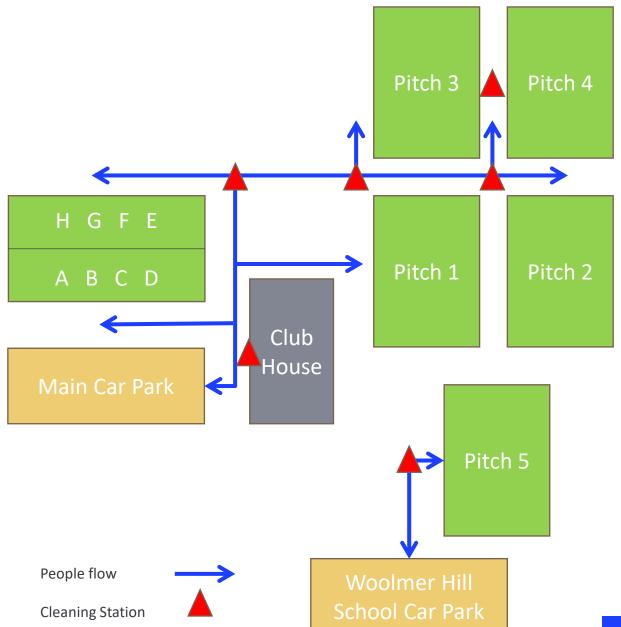

- Sessions to last 1.15 hours as per guidelines.
- Staggered sessions to enable age groups to arrive and depart without 'bottlenecks'.
- Enables safe rotation of pitches and also, allows 'pitch 2' to recover from its current state.
- Gaps between pitch use enable equipment to be cleaned.
- Floodlit options (e.g. Monday or Friday) for other age groups in mid-week.
- Further options of training on a Saturday.
- Ladies Touch can be accommodated from 10am on either pitch 3 or 4.

People flows and cleaning stations on Sundays

- Routes should be direct to the allocated pitch
- Routes avoid people crossing over other pitches
- Cleaning stations will be designated at various points
- Cleaning stations to have sanitizer and spray bottles
- Each age group will need a bucket of soapy water to regularly clean equipment
