Ollerton has a long history of football going back to the late 1800s. One of it's best periods was immediately before the Second World War when Ollerton Colliery won the Notts Senior Cup in 1937/38 and it's reserve team won the Notts Intermediate Cup the year previous.

Ollerton Colliery ceased as a football club in the early 1980s but was reformed in 1988 as Ollerton and Bevercotes Miners Welfare and began life in the Mansfield Bitter League before progressing to the Notts Football Alliance in 1991. The club won the Nottinghamshire Football Alliance Division Two championship in 1992–93, gaining promotion to Division One under the management of Adge Owen and David Kent.



Following the closure of the colliery in 1994, the club changed its name to Ollerton Town F.C. In the same year, Ollerton were champions of Division One in 1995–96 and were promoted to the top division of the Notts Alliance.

After finishing runners-up in 1999–2000, the club was promoted to the Central Midlands League and entered the English Football Pyramid.

In the 2007–08 season, Ollerton, under the management of Don Gethfield, David Kent and Anthony Thompson, the club won the Central Midlands Premier Division, earning promotion to the Supreme Division. That season they also reached the Nottinghamshire Senior Cup final where they were beaten 2–0 by Eastwood Town. In 2008–09, the club took part in the FA Vase for



the very first time, getting to the second round proper in 2009-10...

After the resignation of Don Gethfield back in 2011, and a brief stint under Paul Rawden, the club appointed Dave Winter and Stephen Bodle as first team managers. The pair guided the club to a 7th placed finish and the Central Midlands Floodlit Cup final in their first season.

For the 2011–12 season, the club was placed in the Central Midlands North Division following a league restructure.

Ollerton spent a few seasons in the middle echelons of the league before in the 2015–16 season, with former-captain Jamie Allan now also on board as first team coach, the club secured promotion to the Northern Counties East League after finishing runners-up in the Central Midlands North. The club battled against

the odds to secure their survival over the next three years and recorded some memorable results against some very big teams.

In 2020, after the season came to a premature end due to the COVID-19 outbreak Ollerton were moved laterally to the



East Midlands Counties League but the season only lasted 12 league games before it once again fell victim to the pandemic and national lockdowns.

This summer, Ollerton returned to the NCEL as part of the restructuring of the non-league system and after almost a decade in charge, Dave Winter stepped down as manager, being replaced by his long-serving assistant Steve Bodle.



Bad weather led to the postponement of all but four matches involving Toolstation NCEL sides in the past week but one saw Grimsby Borough extend their lead at the top of the Premier Division.

The Wilderness Boys were 3-0 winners at Staveley Miners Welfare in one of only two games to be played on Saturday to stretch their advantage over second placed Eccleshill United to nine points.

Jordan Barnett gave Borough a second minute lead at Inkersall Road before Lewis Bemrose doubled their advantage in first half stoppage time and then grabbed his second with a quarter-of-an-hour remaining to complete the victory.

Although they stay fourth, Sherwood Colliery closed the gap to the top two to seven points as they won 3-1 at Handsworth.

An own goal from Anthony Mackie was the breakthrough on thirteen minutes for the visitors but Leon Howarth quickly restored parity before William Norcross grabbed Colliery's second prior to the interval.

Lewis Weaver put the game beyond doubt for Wayne Savage's side in second half stoppage time.

All the remaining Premier Division matches and the entire Division One schedule was wiped out due to heavy rain and snow, in some cases just an hour or two before kick-off. It was also a frustrating midweek as Rossington Main's home clash with Selby Town became the only Division One game to take place.

And, honours were even as the two play-off hopefuls played out a 1-1 draw on Tuesday night, Gregory Young's own goal putting the visitors ahead on 35 minutes with Tyla Bell's equaliser coming midway through the second period. A point apiece means Main stay in fifth, keeping Selby just outside the play-off zone in sixth on goal difference. Meanwhile, on Wednesday night, a second half comeback from Ollerton Town almost saw them cause an upset in the Quarter-Finals of the Notts Senior Cup.

Their visitors, Pitching In Northern Premier League side Carlton Town, took an early two goal lead but Jacques Etia and Sean Dickinson pounced in quick succession to bring it back to 2-2 at the start of the second period.

But, Carlton snatched a winner eleven minutes from time to go through with a 3-2 victory.

Ollerton Town may have thought they were in for a long evening when they went two goals down early on against Northern Premier League Midlands side Carlton Town, in Wednesday's Notts Senior Cup quarter final.

However, those early goals were harsh on Steve Bodle's men and they didn't let their heads drop, going on to have the better of the game and fighting back to 2-2 in the second half, only for Carlton to score a late and undeserved winner with around ten minutes to go.

It was a surprise to many that the game was even on, the Walesby Lane pitch holding up well to the recent heavy rain, and though it was dry for kick off, there was an extremely strong wind blowing across NG22 which had a big impact on the game, affecting both sides.

Ollerton were never expected to get anything from the game given Carlton's quality but they did the club proud and though the results in 2022 haven't been as good as they would have liked, the performance on Wednesday should give them confidence that the win's will come sooner rather than later.

The first half-chance of the game arrived in the 7th minute when George Slack headed a corner straight at goalkeeper Jake Frestle.

Moments later, Nat Watson attempted to lob Ollerton stopper Marcus Coombs from distance but his effort dropped just wide of the target, with Watson seemingly finding his range ahead of what would be the game's opening goal. Ollerton had enjoyed some good early possession, moving the ball well, and one such move saw the ball worked back to Coombs inside the 9th minute. His miskick could have gone anywhere



but unfortunately it landed straight at the feet of Watson who sent the ball back over Coombs and into the back of the empty net from 25 yards.

Within two minutes, Ollerton were two-nil down. Carlton were awarded a free-kick just outside the area and Watson stepped up to send the ball over the wall and past Coombs to seemingly put the visitors well in control of the game.

If the pressure wasn't off Ollerton before the game, it certainly was now and they kept trying to play their game and work a way back into the contest.

A series of corners around the 25 minute mark saw some good pressure on the Carlton back line but they were able to stay firm and clear the danger.

Ollerton's best chances of the first half arrived in the 35th minute. A ball to the near post found Conor Green who saw his first-time shot saved well by Frestle. Carlton were unable to clear the danger and Sam Geeves was on hand to win the ball back, feeding Green once again who this time lifted his shot over the bar.

The second half started strongly for Ollerton and they should have got a goal back early on.

Within the first minute of the restart, Geeves picked up a loose ball in the area and sent a dipping shot over the bar.

In the 50th minute, Ollerton had a brilliant chance to halve the deficit as Green was played down the left hand side of the area but he skewed a shot just wide of the post.

There was only one team in it and in the 52nd minute, Jake Squires' long range free kick was blocked on it's way through to goal.

After being on the receiving end of two quick-fire goals in the first half, Ollerton then went on to inflict the same sucker punch on Carlton to turn the game on it's head.

The first goal came when Jacques Etia picked up a knock down inside the area before running towards the byline and smashing a terrific shot past Frestle and into the roof of the net.

One minute and 44 seconds later, Ollerton had their second. Squires' long throw was only cleared as far as Sean Dickinson 16 yards out and he took a touch before spinning and finishing into the bottom corner.

Carlton were struggling to deal with their hosts and the game only looked to be going one way. In turn, the Nottingham-based side had a period of trying to break the game up and slow down Ollerton's momentum, allowing them to regain a foothold in the game.

The goal mouth action did slow down as a result but with just over ten minutes remaining, it heated up once again. Firstly, Ollerton won the ball after Carlton tried to play out from the back and it was worked to Ollie Grady who sent a shot over the bar.

Then, the winning goal arrived. A through ball from midfield put Aaron O'Connor in down the left and he evaded defender Tom Moody before firing across goal, past Coombs, and into the corner of the net.

It was a cruel blow for Ollerton who now had to find the motivation to go again. With a few minutes remaining, Etia was challenged on the edge of the box with the ball running through for Green. He went down under pressure, claiming the Carlton defender had sent the ball out for a corner, but the referee disagreed and waved away any appeals for a penalty from the Ollerton supporters.

In the end, there was to be no more Ollerton heroics and it was Carlton who progressed to the semi-final. None of the 115 in attendance could honestly say that Ollerton deserved to lose the game but they will be encouraged by their performance as they enter the run-in towards the end of the season..



Although there's evidence that football had been played within the village since the turn of the century, it's not until after the great war we can establish for certain that North Ferriby Football Club had been formed.

Sadly, there's no record of how the club started, most likely an informal meeting of like-minded gents in a smoke-filled corner of the local pub. The first published record is of participation in the East Riding Intermediate Cup on November 6, 1919. A further Hull Daily Mail report in January 1920 revealed North Ferriby had played consecutive fixtures on Christmas Day (won 8-2), Boxing Day (won 3-2) and December 27 (won 2-0).

An auspicious start for the club and perhaps a precedent for future success, although one doubts that teams nowadays would, or even could play three in three. One of the earliest successes was in reaching the final of the South Howdenshire Cup in 1921 against Howden.

The game was played at Howden in front of a crowd of 1,500, an "unprecedented assemblage including a large number of Ferriby supporters" according to the HDM, who further reported that each set of fans were "gaily bedecked with their club's colors". Unfortunately, Harry Thomas, the Ferriby captain, had to be satisfied with a runners-up medal as the team eventually went down 2-1 having finished the game with just tem men following the loss of scorer Arthur Kirby through injury at half time. No substitutes in those days.

On April 28, 1923 North Ferriby hosted the final of the South Howdenshire Cup between Melton and Willerby. One can start to imagine the immense pride of the clubs committee and volunteers as they busily prepared their pitch on the outskirts of the village.

Fast forward to January 2020 and Ferriby stalwarts are again filled with pride as news was broken their Dransfield Stadium has been nominated to host an England U18 International against Scotland on Thursday, April 9.

Who would have thought that might be possible for a tiny village back in the day.

No one's certain what happened to North Ferriby FC during the early 1930's, but in 1934 the second element of this incredible trilogy began with the formation of North Ferriby United, a village club extraordinaire.


In their very first season, NFU were runners up in the East Riding Church League Division One, but also went on to win the League Cup in that inaugural season. Astonishingly, by the time of its demise in March 2019, NFU had achieved no less than 64 major honors, including eight promotions and appearances in both National Stadiums.

The first Wembley visit was in the 1997 FA Vase Final when the team went down to a strong Whitby Town side in the shadow of those famous white towers, but that disappointment was put firmly behind supporters when in 2015 North Ferriby completed the giant killing of giant killings by overcoming "full time" Wrexham in the final of the FA Trophy beneath the iconic arc of the new Wembley Stadium.

Between 1934 and 1954 football was played on several sites within the village. Humber Road, Corby Park and Pickerings Field are all listed locations. Significantly, in 1954 Sir Arthur Atkinson stated at the opening ceremony that it was very rare for a Village to have "such splendid facilities". The clubs then committee and volunteers had acquired unwanted bricks from a disused building and constructed in their own time and at their own expense a brick pavilion. So good was the quality of construction, the building is still in situ and used by the cricket club today. But the urge to progress was like a baton being passed on and on and by 1969 the need to move again had been determined after club officials decided the best way forward lay within the wider bigger world of the then Yorkshire League. To meet requirements, a new pitch was needed and so eyes turned to a veritable wilderness that lay between the playing field and the railway. An area of land originally designated for allotments after the Second World War, but subsequently laid unused.

The local Parish Council were approached and the outcome was the granting of a lease, the proceeds of which would support the Parish's obligations for maintenance of the playing fields. A win-win all round and an enduring arrangement still in existence today, albeit at a significantly higher contributory level from the football club.

The jungle was levelled, the access track (now Grange Lane) was improved, a car park dug-out and covered. Two condemned pre-fabs were acquired from Beverley Borough Council and daily sweepings of cement were taken from Earls Cement. Finally, posts and rails were bought for £40 from Hull Brunswick and the foundations



of the now Dransfield Stadium had begun.

Unfortunately, the club couldn't afford to connect drains to the main sewer that lay 400 meters away under Church Road, so a cesspit was dug inside the ground under the entrance car park. When the day came for the big opening a large crowd gathered to witness arrival of the first Tetley delivery. The dray wagon swept majestically into the ground and immediately collapsed into the cesspit where it remained for several days until a JCB eventually pulled it out. It has been said many times, there's an easy way, a hard way and then the Ferriby way. Following a progressive building programme lasting over 20 years between 1994 and 2014, all necessary to keep pace with ground requirements associated to progress on the pitch, the now Dransfield Stadium has developed beyond comprehension to those early days. But not before the third and final part of this trilogy would emerge.

In March 2019 the unthinkable happened. After a three year decline in fortunes, two relegations and irresponsible financial management, North Ferriby United was wound up in the Hull courts. Gone forever. Or so was thought. On 1 April 2019, yes April Fools Day, North Ferriby Football Club rose from the ashes like a phoenix. Within six short months 18 teams had been formed. Men, women and nearly 200 children all brought together to once again ensure the great Ferriby tradition continues.

### Who is "Sideburn Bob"?

You probably will not recognise the name but if you have attended football matches over the last 40 years you will have probably seen him on many programmes across the country. These days editors have sophisticated publishing software to produce their programmes, but in the past there were far fewer options to produce your publications. Many editors turned to clip art images which were somewhat limited but often Bob was the star. He appeared in a countless number of clubs, usually accompanied by his longstanding opponent Dependable Dave. Sometimes Bob was on his own, but he has always sported his sideburns.

It's not exactly known where, or when Bob first appeared or who drew him, the author of many Non-League Publications Tony

Williams wrote that He had spotted Bob in a 50's Football Magazine. Just like the Loch Ness Monster there were no more reports of Bob for many years until he was seen in 1974 advert for Derby County's "Ramtique".

Bob then turned up on 100s of programmes including Kilmarnock in 1976, although primarily gracing British Non-League issues, He has been seen across the world. It has been suggested that Bob was modelled on Malcolm MacDonald and that Dave resembles Likely Lads actor Rodney Bewes. This however can be discounted if Bob was first drawn in the 1950's. Bob was prolific during



the 1980s and 90s, turning out in black and white and numerous colour football strips, having had more clubs than Jack Nicklaus and a longer career than Melchester Rovers' Roy Race.

After trending on Twitter in late 2017 amongst ground hoppers the weekend of 13/14th January 2018 was nominated as "Sideburn Bob Weekend". Many Non-League Clubs featured him on their matchday programme, He was seen at clubs such as Brixham, Sholing, Knaphill, Clay Cross Town, Prestwich Heys, and Borrowash Victoria. Bob is still regularly turning out for Bedfont & Feltham FC and at Portland United. Clay Cross Town's game that weekend was postponed but such was the interest the club mailed the programme out to collectors who sent an SAE (Yes – I have one!)

Although you may not have remembered seeing Sideburn Bob before today's match, I'll guess you'll spot Him and Dave a lot more in the future.
