Ollerton has a long history of football going back to the late 1800s. One of it's best periods was immediately before the Second World War when Ollerton Colliery won the Notts Senior Cup in 1937/38 and it's reserve team won the Notts Intermediate Cup the year previous.

Ollerton Colliery ceased as a football club in the early 1980s but was reformed in 1988 as Ollerton and Bevercotes Miners Welfare and began life in the Mansfield Bitter League before progressing to the Notts Football Alliance in 1991. The club won the Nottinghamshire Football Alliance Division Two championship in 1992–93, gaining promotion to Division One under the management of Adge Owen and David Kent.



Following the closure of the colliery in 1994, the club changed its name to Ollerton Town F.C. In the same year, Ollerton were champions of Division One in 1995–96 and were promoted to the top division of the Notts Alliance.

After finishing runners-up in 1999–2000, the club was promoted to the Central Midlands League and entered the English Football Pyramid.

In the 2007–08 season, Ollerton, under the management of Don Gethfield, David Kent and Anthony Thompson, the club won the Central Midlands Premier Division, earning promotion to the Supreme Division. That season they also reached the Nottinghamshire Senior Cup final where they were beaten 2–0 by Eastwood Town. In 2008–09, the club took part in the FA Vase for



the very first time, getting to the second round proper in 2009-10...

After the resignation of Don Gethfield back in 2011, and a brief stint under Paul Rawden, the club appointed Dave Winter and Stephen Bodle as first team managers. The pair guided the club to a 7th placed finish and the Central Midlands Floodlit Cup final in their first season.

For the 2011–12 season, the club was placed in the Central Midlands North Division following a league restructure.

Ollerton spent a few seasons in the middle echelons of the league before in the 2015–16 season, with former-captain Jamie Allan now also on board as first team coach, the club secured promotion to the Northern Counties East League after finishing runners-up in the Central Midlands North. The club battled against

the odds to secure their survival over the next three years and recorded some memorable results against some very big teams.

In 2020, after the season came to a premature end due to the COVID-19 outbreak Ollerton were moved laterally to the



East Midlands Counties League but the season only lasted 12 league games before it once again fell victim to the pandemic and national lockdowns.

This summer, Ollerton returned to the NCEL as part of the restructuring of the non-league system and after almost a decade in charge, Dave Winter stepped down as manager, being replaced by his long-serving assistant Steve Bodle.

Though today's game sees us up against Clipstone for three points in the league, we were also recently pitted against "The Cobra's" in the second round of the Notts Senior Cup with a date to be announced for what will be an away fixture.

Any meeting between the clubs in that competition will bring back memories of our 2015 clash. Clipstone arrived at The Lane two leagues higher than ourselves and soon asserted that extra quality, going 2-0 up at half time.

Ollerton fought back however and a Kyle Clarkson free kick made it 2-1 only for 'Clipo' to score again to retake a two goal advantage.

The drama continued as Kyle Ludlow scored an Ollerton second before, with five minutes to go, substitute Sam Bailey fired home to send the game to extra time. Clipstone scored first in the additional thirty to go ahead once again but Ollerton continued to show tremendous determination and Clarkson scored once more to take the game to penalties.



From the spot Bailey, Sam Stretton and Clarkson were all successful for the Town but unfortunately a Kye Pilmore miss gave Clipstone the win.

Three years later, and the two clubs met once again in the NCEL League Cup and it proved to be another classic.

Charlie Hardwick put Clipstone ahead after twenty minutes before prolific striker Gav King levelled for Ollerton four minutes later.

Against the run of play, Hardwick and Clipstone got a second and that sent them into half time with their noses in front.

Ollerton could have drawn level in the 55th minute after they were awarded a penalty but Sam Stretton, facing current Ollerton number one Levi Owen, struck the base of the post with his spot kick.

The Town's pressure was building and building and in the 80th minute, Mark Carter hit a half volley past Owen to finally draw them level. They kept going and with minutes remaining, King scored again to put Ollerton in front with what looked like the winner.

However, Clipstone had other ideas and in the last minute, Alfie

Gaughan scored to send the game to extra time.

ARMTHORPE WELFARE 6-0 OLLERTON TOWN

Ollerton Town's recent fine run of form came to an untimely end in South Yorkshire, when they found themselves on the wrong end of a 6-0 scoreline at Armthorpe Welfare.

Keeping the run going was always going to be a tough task for a Town side missing five players, through unavailability and injury, who had featured heavily in the unbeaten run. However, that takes nothing away from a Welfare side who were the good value for their win.

Armthorpe made a tremendous start and, within the first fifteen minutes had scored two. There was some discussion about a failure to close players down as the two long range efforts - from Jack Wilson on 6 minutes and Noel Burdett after fifteen - left 'keeper Levi Owen with no chance and gave the hosts a 2-0 lead.

Then, on the half hour mark, came a controversial incident which ended the game as a contest. Town 'keeper Owen can a long away to claim a ball played into the box but was hit by defender Liam Smart, who was pushed into the 'keeper, flipping him in mid-air. In fairness, Owen held on until contact with the ground separated him from the ball - and, temporarily at least, his shoulder from its socket! As the 'keeper lay stricken, the



referee allowed play to continue until Welfare put the ball into the net where, to the surprise of most in the ground, the official awarded the goal. Owen was eventually helped from the pitch, to be replaced in goal by wing back Conor Green who would go on to make a couple of decent saves, and show a lot of character in the hour that remained.

Welfare scored just one more first half goal, on the stroke of half time when Alex Varley finished well, with the Town back line appealing for off-side, to take a 4-0 lead into the break.

To Ollerton's credit they continued to work hard in the second half, but would go on to concede another two goals, courtesy of a brace for second half substitute, and ex-Ollerton striker, Sam Foulds. Foulds' first of the day, was a header on 62

Foulds' first of the day, was a header on 62 minutes, which came from a corner after Green had turned his close range shot behind.




Almost immediately, Town could have been on the scoresheet themselves, after Joe Lumley was brought down in the box. Up stepped top scorer Gav King, but his penalty was comfortable saved by Welfare 'keeper Sebastian Tylek.

Town's misery was complete on 85 minutes when Foulds beat Green to Matthew Hughes's cross to make the scoreline 6-0.

Town continued to look for a consolation and came close twice in the closing moments. First, Ben Partridge beat Tylek, but saw his effort go just wide. Then, substitute Joe Bayne struck the crossbar with a superb strike, with the ball rebounding back to Ollie Grady, who headed home, only to be given offside.

That passage of play pretty much summed up Town's afternoon and they must now dust themselves down before next Saturday's local derby against Clipstone.











Clipstone FC was established in 1928 as Clipstone Combine using a ground off Mansfield Road and playing in the Colliery Alliance League. They were then re-named Clipstone Boys Brigade, and moved to a ground at Baulker Lane, before becoming Clipstone Welfare in 1955. In 1955/56 they won the treble of Spartan League Champions, League Cup Winners and Notts County F.A. Intermediate Cup winners and promotion to Notts Alliance League. With promotion they left their ground at Baulker Lane and moved to a new ground which has remained their home to the present day - the Lido Ground. Clipstone had great success throughout the 1970s, but particularly the early 70's. They claimed their league's top spot three times in a row in 1972/73, 1973/74 and 1974/75. They also went onto win the Notts Alliance Cup in those same seasons. They began entering the FA Vase in 1974, reaching the second round in their first season. The success of the early 1970s ended and the next trophy Clipstone won was a rather

They again won back-to-back league titles in 1992/93 and 1993/94, before moving up to the Central Midlands League. In 1994/95 they won the league's Premier Division and after winning it for a second time in 1996/97, were promoted to the Supreme Division. In 2009/10 they won the league's Floodlit Cup competition.

famous one - the Nottinghamshire Senior Cup in 1985/86.

The League was re-organised at the start of the 2011/12 season and Clipstone was placed in the South Division. That season, Clipstone applied to be elevated to the Northern Counties League and got that promotion despite finishing in fourth place.

The club dropped the "Welfare" part of its name in summer 2013 to become simply Clipstone FC and also adopted the nickname of "The Cobras".

In May 2013 the club announced a new multi-season sponsorship deal with local painting and decorating contractors Riley & Co (Mansfield) Ltd, with them becoming not only the main club sponsor but home and away shirt sponsors as well for the duration of the sponsorship. At the start of the 2013/14 season Committee Member Barry Clarke's 40-years service at the club was marked with the new hospitality suite being named in his honour.

Another loyal club servant deserving a mention is the late Jack Collier who was involved with the football club for 65 years, the last 25 as Chairman until his death. Jack, who worked at Clipstone Colliery, was first involved with the club in their Baulker Lane days.

The 2014/15 season was a very successful season with the team winning the Northern Counties East League (NCEL) Division One title and gaining promotion to the NCEL Premier Division. The Cobras also competed in the FA Cup for the first time in their history reaching the First Qualifying round where they lost to Grantham Town. They also reached the final of the Nottinghamshire FA Senior Cup for the first time since winning it in 1985/86 but lost 3-5 to Basford United.

In the summer of 2015 Jas Colliver and Ryan France were appointed as the new management team for the club's first season in the NCEL Premier Division. They raised a few eyebrows as the team performed well in the league and again reached the FA Cup First Qualifying round where they were unlucky to lose out by the odd goal to Evo-Stik outfit Lincoln United. In early 2016 Ryan stepped down for personal reasons and Jas moved to Sheffield FC.

Billy Fox was appointed as the new manager in March 2016 and the club eventually finished mid-table in the NCEL Premier. They also reached the Nottinghamshire FA Senior Cup final for a second consecutive season but lost to Basford United (again) in a classic cup final in which the Cobras were leading 1-0 until the third minute of injury time. The game finished 2-2 after extra time and Basford won the penalty shootout, thehithe t United (agaon)time. Indeed the Cobras wereCEL exp[e Billy resigned in January 2017 and Clipstone-born Ian Cotton was then appointed as manager. As most of the previous players had departed, 'Cottee' assembled a squad of mainly local players and after three consecutive victories in March 2017 a respectable 16th place finish was achieved. That form unfortunately didn't continue into the 2017/8 season and, despite initial progress in the FA Cup and Vase, the Cobras lost their first 23 games and Ian tendered his resignation in January 2018. Clipstone were eventually relegated without a league victory,.

Ex-AFC Mansfield boss Micky Taylor was appointed as manager for the 2018/19 as Clipstone began the first of three seasons in the East Midlands Counties League. The highlight of the season was a 4-3 victory in an FA Cup extra-preliminary round replay at Barton Town as the Cobras came back from being 3-0 down after 36 minutes.

For the 2019/20 season new manager and former Chesterfield FC professional Dave Hoole supported by Dale Spragg and Malc Siddall brought new optimism and a squad of talented young players with a few older heads. They were just beginning to find their feet at step 6 level and were in 15th place before the season was cancelled in March 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The nucleus of the squad stayed for the curtailed 2020/21 season and stability has now returned to the club which has re-joined the NCEL Division One for the 2021/22 season. The Cobras are also looking to the future and are looking to produce a pathway towards first team football for junior players. The Colts section now consists of an impressive 17 teams ranging from Under 7s to Under 18s and the Club also runs an Under 19 team under manager Scott Rogers and his backroom coaching staff.
