Ollerton has a long history of football going back to the late 1800s. One of it's best periods was immediately before the Second World War when Ollerton Colliery won the Notts Senior Cup in 1937/38 and it's reserve team won the Notts Intermediate Cup the year previous.

Ollerton Colliery ceased as a football club in the early 1980s but was reformed in 1988 as Ollerton and Bevercotes Miners Welfare and began life in the Mansfield Bitter League before progressing to the Notts Football Alliance in 1991. The club won the Nottinghamshire Football Alliance Division Two championship in 1992–93, gaining promotion to Division One under the management of Adge Owen and David Kent.



Following the closure of the colliery in 1994, the club changed its name to Ollerton Town F.C. In the same year, Ollerton were champions of Division One in 1995–96 and were promoted to the top division of the Notts Alliance.

After finishing runners-up in 1999–2000, the club was promoted to the Central Midlands League and entered the English Football Pyramid.

In the 2007–08 season, Ollerton, under the management of Don Gethfield, David Kent and Anthony Thompson, the club won the Central Midlands Premier Division, earning promotion to the Supreme Division. That season they also reached the Nottinghamshire Senior Cup final where they were beaten 2–0 by Eastwood Town. In 2008–09, the club took part in the FA Vase for



the very first time, getting to the second round proper in 2009-10...

After the resignation of Don Gethfield back in 2011, and a brief stint under Paul Rawden, the club appointed Dave Winter and Stephen Bodle as first team managers. The pair guided the club to a 7th placed finish and the Central Midlands Floodlit Cup final in their first season.

For the 2011–12 season, the club was placed in the Central Midlands North Division following a league restructure.

Ollerton spent a few seasons in the middle echelons of the league before in the 2015–16 season, with former-captain Jamie Allan now also on board as first team coach, the club secured promotion to the Northern Counties East League after finishing runners-up in the Central Midlands North. The club battled against

the odds to secure their survival over the next three years and recorded some memorable results against some very big teams.

In 2020, after the season came to a premature end due to the COVID-19 outbreak Ollerton were moved laterally to the



East Midlands Counties League but the season only lasted 12 league games before it once again fell victim to the pandemic and national lockdowns.

This summer, Ollerton returned to the NCEL as part of the restructuring of the non-league system and after almost a decade in charge, Dave Winter stepped down as manager, being replaced by his long-serving assistant Steve Bodle.

Only goal difference separates the top four sides in Division One as it already promises to be one of the tightest seasons in recent years.

Nostell Miners Welfare return to pole position after two goals each from Anees Younis and Danny Edwards secured a 4-0 win at Rainworth Miners Welfare who played most of the game with ten men.

Brigg Town are up to second after a 7-3 home victory over Clipstone, the Zebras racing into a 5-0 lead by the 42nd minute. Clipstone pulled one back before the break and made it 5-2 with on 52, the sides then exchanged more goals as it became 6-3 with Scott Phillips then completing his hat-trick as the game moved towards stoppage time.

A Paul Sherburn double, along with goals from Tyla Bell and Joshua Yeoman, and a Niall Doran penalty saw Rossington Main to a 5-0 defeat of visitors Teversal and they move up into third.

And, Worsbrough Bridge Athletic are fourth after their single-goal win at bottom side Dronfield Town, Jimmy Pursell with the vital strike.

Top scorers of the day were Hallam who won 9-2 at FC Humber United, with most of the goals coming in the final twenty minutes.

Szymon Czubik opened the scoring for the hosts but the Countrymen led by the interval thanks to two injury time goals. Brandon Bradbury struck twice to give Hallam a 4-1 lead by the 56th minute whereupon Louis Blackwell got the home side's second and then the floodgates opened in the last twenty minutes as Humber, who played most of the match with ten men after the first half dismissal of Craig Allen, fully ran out of steam.

North Ferriby are up to sixth after Thomas Corner struck in a 1-0 win at Retford FC, closing the gap on fifth-placed Selby Town who went down by the same scoreline at Harrogate Railway Athletic, Elliot Holmes with the late winner for Rail.

Matthew Hughes got both of Armthorpe Welfare's goals in a 2-0 win at Hall Road whilst Parkgate and Glasshoughton Welfare played out a goalless draw at Green Lane.

And, Ollerton Town's first win of the season came courtesy of a 2-1 victory at Swallownest, Benjamin Partridge with their 81st minute winner after Gavin King's opener had been cancelled out by the home side's Jack Appleyard.

Ben Partridge's return to Ollerton was only ratified by the league at 11am on Saturday morning but the pacey forward wasted no time in settling back in as by 5pm he had an assist and a match winning goal to his name, as Ollerton returned from Swallownest with their first three points of the season.

for the Town last season before joining Staveley Miners Welfare at the start of the campaign. However, he has now returned to Ollerton and his impact was immediately felt as Steve Bodle's side finally got their first league win.

Partridge scored ten goals in eleven appearances

Ollerton had recently signed Swallownest captain Ollie Grady, as well as several other former Swallownest players including Ash Cooper who, like Grady, started against his old side on Saturday. With Swallownest connections in the Ollerton dug out too, in the form of Lee Needham

and Dan Short, the game had a bit of an edge to it with both teams desperately wanting to get the win.

It was Ollerton who made the dream start, taking the lead inside the first two minutes. Ben Partridge showed what Ollerton had been missing, using pace and skill to get down the right flank before delivering a perfect cross onto the head of Gav King who directed the ball past Darryl Johnson in the Swallownest goal. Swallownest responded well to going behind, but their former captain almost came back to haunt them in the sixth minute. Firstly, a whipped cross from the left by Partridge bounced awkwardly for Grady as he looked to convert at the back post, and then shortly afterwards, Sam Stretton's long throw was flicked on by King towards Grady but he fired over the bar.



In the 15th minute, Swallownest drew level. Alex Lill did well to break through the Ollerton back line into the area, and he slid the ball across goal for Jack Appleyard who smashed the ball into the roof of the net, leaving Levi Owen with no chance.

Ollerton almost regained the lead in the 20th minute. A ball over the top found Partridge who did well to hold it up and spin his man before firing a shot on goal which Johnson parried, the ball unfortunately just going past the path of the onrushing Ollerton attacker. Grady was continuing to be a threat for Ollerton and Stretton found him in the area with a cross from the right but his header was well saved by Johnson.

Nothing could separate the two teams going into the break but shortly after the restart, Ollerton had a great chance to go back in front. A great interchange between King and Partridge unlocked the Swallownest defence, sending the latter through on goal, but his short from inside the area was saved well.

Up the other end, Callum Greaves tried his luck from distance, but Owen was more than equal to his effort.

As both teams kept searching for the game's next goal, King and Grady both saw free kicks go over the bar for Ollerton whilst Swallownest's Richard Williams fired wide of the target from the edge of the box.

Swallownest also thought they should have had a penalty for Lewis Dalmedo's tackle on Jack Appleyard and though everyone on the home team bench were on their feet in protest, the referee was having none of it and the game continued.



The game was now into the last fifteen minutes and Grady got clear down the left for the Town but his shot across goal failed to find the target.

Three minutes later, a deep cross to the Ollerton back post found Alfie Smith but he failed to find the target.

Then, in the 81st minute, came the game's decisive moment. Partridge had the room to run at the heart of the Swallownest defence, causing them all sorts of issues, until he was blatantly brought down by Jake Squires.

It was Partridge who stepped up to take the spot kick and he sent Johnson the wrong way to put Ollerton back in front with time running out.

Grady had been desperate for a goal against his former club and in the 86th minute, he was cruelly denied once again. Ollerton broke down the left through Partridge and his ball found Grady 20 yards out who hit a well-struck half volley that Johnson did brilliantly to tip round the post.

That proved to be the last goal mouth action of the game with Ollerton returning home with three points in the bag.

PARKGATE

The history of Parkgate Football Club is inextricably linked to the Steelworks which form such an impressive backdrop to our Green Lane home.

Operations at the Park Gate Iron and Steel Company started in 1823, and just two years after the Iron and Steel Act created the British Steel Corporation (1967),

The club was formed from Parkgate's Wire Department - in 1969, managed by current Chairman Albert Dudill.

They joined the Sheffield and Hallamshire County FC Senior League in 1970 and the Yorkshire League -as BSC Parkgate FC -in 1973.

The original Park Gate Works closed in 1976, two years after Electric Arc, scrap-based steelmaking started at Aldwarke; the plant becoming-and remaining- one of the UK's biggest recyclers.

Dave Bassett brought a strong Sheffield United team for the official switch-on of the club's floodlights in 1992 and in 1998 the club narrowly lost the Final of the S and H Senior Cup to Emley also finishing fourth in NCEL Division One.

In 1999, the steelworks came under the control of Corus Group PLC and the Steelmen began a successful period which culminated in promotion to the NCEL Premier Division in 2006/7 with the club winning the Wilkinson Sword Trophy in the same season.

The club won the Rotherham Charity Cup in 1983/4, and in 1984 was renamed as BSES (then RES) Parkgate FC as the local steel industry became a private company- United Engineering Steels.

In 2007/8 - around the time that Tata Steel acquired Corus Group - the club reached the semi-finals of the NCEL League Cup and the County Senior Cup.

Between 2010 and 2012 the club enjoyed

another successful period, finishing second in the NCEL Premier League and enjoying a fine run in the FA Vase. More recent years have been difficult for the Steelmen, culminating in relegation to the NCEL First Division after a frustrating

the Steelmen, culminating in relegation to the NCEL First Division after a frustrating 2017-8 campaign. To boost financial investment Colin Muncie, ex-Director of most UK Steel plants including Teesside and Tuscaloosa USA was co- opted as Vice Chairman for a short while.

As the Steelworks enjoyed a revival - under new owners Liberty Steel Group who acquired the facilities in 2017 - the club looked forward to Manager Billy Fox getting the club back up to the Premier League.

This was not to be and at the end of September 2018 with a poor set of results leaving Parkgate close to the bottom of NCEL First Division after six games, a loss in the FA Cup and FA Vase, Billy Fox resigned.

Without delay Parkgate appointed ex player Andy Dawson as Manager, Lee Whitehead as his assistant.

The new Management team guided the Steelmen to 19 League wins and an impressive eighth place at the end of the 2018/9 season.

The 2019/20 season saw the establishment of a new club record attendance, when a crowd of 1536 watched a pre-season friendly with Rotherham United.

In 2021/2022 season the Steelmen appointed ex Miller Captain Ryan Cresswell as team coach.
