Ollerton has a long history of football going back to the late 1800s. One of its best periods was immediately before the Second World War when Ollerton Colliery won the Notts Senior Cup in 1937/38 and its reserve team won the Notts Intermediate Cup the year previous.

Ollerton Colliery ceased as a football club in the early 1980s but was reformed in 1988 as Ollerton and Bevercotes Miners Welfare and began life in the Mansfield Bitter League before progressing to the Notts Football Alliance in 1991. The club won the Nottinghamshire Football Alliance Division Two championship in 1992–93, gaining promotion to Division One under the management of Adge Owen and David Kent.



Following the closure of the colliery in 1994, the club changed its name to Ollerton Town F.C. In the same year, Ollerton were champions of Division One in 1995–96 and were promoted to the top division of the Notts Alliance.

After finishing runners-up in 1999–2000, the club was promoted to the Central Midlands League and entered the English Football Pyramid.

In the 2007–08 season, Ollerton, under the management of Don Gethfield, David Kent and Anthony Thompson, the club won the Central Midlands Premier Division, earning promotion to the Supreme Division. That season they also reached the Nottinghamshire Senior Cup final where they were beaten 2–0 by Eastwood Town. In 2008–09, the club took part in the FA Vase for the very first time, getting to the second round proper in 2009–10..



After the resignation of Don Gethfield back in 2011, and a brief stint under Paul Rawden, the club appointed Dave Winter and Stephen Bodle as first team managers. The pair guided the club to a 7th placed finish and the Central Midlands Floodlit Cup final in their first season.

For the 2011–12 season, the club was placed in the Central Midlands North Division following a league restructure.

Ollerton spent a few seasons in the middle echelons of the league before in the 2015–16 season, with former-captain Jamie Allan now also on board as first team coach, the club secured promotion to the Northern Counties East League after finishing runners-up in the Central Midlands North. The club battled against the odds to secure their survival over the next three years and recorded some memorable results against some very big teams.



In 2020, after the season came to a premature end due to the COVID-19 outbreak Ollerton were moved laterally to the East Midlands Counties League but the season only lasted 12 league games before it once again fell victim to the pandemic and national lockdowns.

This summer, Ollerton returned to the NCEL as part of the restructuring of the non-league system and after almost a decade in charge, Dave Winter stepped down as manager, being replaced by his long-serving assistant Steve Bodle.

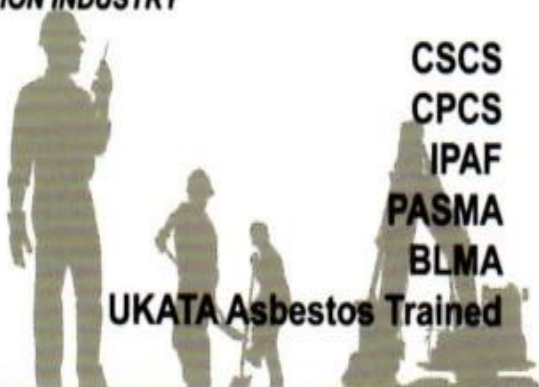

North Ferriby's surge up the table has continued as a seventh straight win moved them into second in Division One, a point behind leaders Brigg.

Joel Shortland and Thomas Corner bagged two each whilst Daniel East's opener and Elliot Wilson's own goal completed a 6-1 win over visitors Worsbrough Bridge Athletic.

Hallam have also had a monumental rise, now third after notching up their eighth consecutive victory, racing into a 3-0 lead at Rainworth Miners Welfare in the opening ten minutes, Christopher Salt's deadlock-breaker added to be a quickfire double from Christopher Wood.

Joshua Scully added to their tally late on for a 4-0 victory that sees the Countrymen now just three points off the summit.

Nostell Miners Welfare drop to fifth following a 3-1 home loss to Retford FC, Joe Wood with their equaliser after Alex Wonham had opened the scoring for the visitors who ultimately took the points with second half strikes from Haydn Goddard and Wonham's second.

A Ben Partridge brace helped Ollerton Town to 4-0 home win over neighbours Teversal, Oliver Grady and Gavin King with their other goals to consolidate twelfth whilst the visitors remain next-to-bottom.

Lewis Stephens netted the winner for Glasshoughton Welfare in the 72nd minute of their 3-2 victory at Clipstone in a game that had seen them pegged back twice.

And, it was a point apiece for FC Humber United and their visitors Armthorpe Welfare in a 2-2 draw with Adam Baskerville scoring both of Welfare's goals to twice level things up after Jonathan Wileman and Szymon Czubik had put the hosts in front.

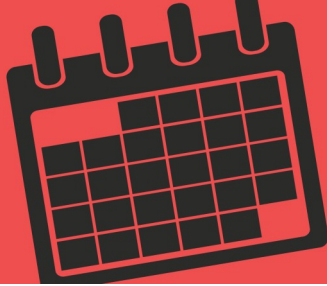

As much of the country went crazy at the fuel pumps, Ollerton Town continued to stock pile wins and clean sheets, recording their third of each in the space of a week, after dispatching of neighbours Teversal by four goals to nil.

After strong performances against Worsbrough Bridge last weekend and Glasshoughton Welfare in midweek, Ollerton went into Saturday's game wanting to avoid a potential banana skin against one of this season's slow starters. Ben Partridge's finish midway through the first half settled those nerves and Ollie Grady's long range effort just before half time all but put the game to bed.

The second half saw Partridge get his second, squeezing a shot in from outside the area, before Gav King showcased his finishing prowess with a well taken goal to get Ollerton's fourth.

The first chance of the game was a half chance for Teversal, Joe Fox blasting over from distance. Ollerton then started to probe with Joe Lumley just unable to bring Ben Partridge's ball under control inside the area before Ollie Grady's free kick was inches away from finding George Slack at the back post.

Lumley did have an opportunity two minutes later, as Jacques Etia's pull back was deflected into his path, but the hard working midfielder failed to keep his shot down and Michael Ball in the Teversal goal remained untested.

In the 23rd minute, Ollerton got the game's first goal. A cross from the left was too deep for everyone except wing back Sam Geeves who took a touch and



fed the ball back to Partridge in the middle of the area, who had the simple task of firing past Ball.

With ten minutes to go until half time, Etia went in search of Ollerton's second but he dragged his shot from the edge of the area, wide of the upright.

Ollerton's second did arrive, seconds before the half time break. Midfielder Ollie Grady had a frustrating few weeks, looking for his first Ollerton goal, but in the end it was well worth the wait. Instead of delivering his 35 yard free kick towards his team mates, Grady looked up and spotted Ball off his line, expertly lofting the ball over the Teversal 'keeper and into the back of the net.

That goal put Ollerton in control of the game going into the second half, but Teversal went in search of a way back into the game, Cam Pinnick firing towards the front post with Levi Owen getting down well to save.

In the 49th minute, Conor Green's long ball over the top put Ben Partridge clear inside the area but Ball got off his line well to meet it, sending the ball over the bar.

Moments before the hour mark, Partridge did get his second to seal the three points for Ollerton. He found himself in space on the edge of the area and sent a low shot towards goal, which slipped past Ball and into the bottom corner.

On the back of a goal against Glasshoughton in midweek, George Slack fired wide of the goal from 22 yards before Etia expertly beat the offside trap before pulling the ball back for Lumley who saw his shot saved.

Partridge had a great chance to seal his hat-trick when Grady's ball split the Teversal defence and put him clear, but Ball did well to force the striker wide and eventually out of play for a goal kick.

With ten minutes to go, Sam Stretton's long throw was headed on by Slack and Partridge was on hand to stick his foot out, directing the ball towards goal but it unfortunately went over the bar.

There was still time for Ollerton to get a fourth goal, Gav King coming off the bench to do what he does best. Sam Martin's perfectly weighted pass put King through one-on-one and from a tight angle, he was able to fire across goal and into the bottom corner.

Martin nearly got another assist in the dying embers of the game, as he teed up Grady on the edge of the box, but the attacking midfielder saw his shot saved by Ball in the final action of note in the game.

Ollerton's last four victories have now all been accompanied by a clean sheet and they will need to showcase much of the same over the next few weeks, as they head into a tough looking run against some of the league's promotion favourites.



SELBY TOWN

Selby Town Football Club was formed in 1919 and adopted the nickname "The Robins".

STFC were the first senior club in the town since World War 1, and one year later in 1920, they became founding members of The Yorkshire League and hold the record of being the only club to have played all 62 seasons of its existence.

The thirties saw the club win the league 3 times, the West Riding Trophy 3 times and the League Cup once. The fifties were equally as exciting, with the club winning the league twice, the League Cup twice, and also the achievement of reaching the first round of the F.A.Cup 4 times.

In 1953, the club moved from the bowling green across town to the current Richard Street ground - 'The Fairfax Plant Hire Stadium' which was purpose built for the club. Shortly after, in 1954 they achieved their highest ever attendance of 7,000 at home to Bradford Park Avenue in the F.A. Cup 1st Round. Since moving to the new ground, the club's record goalscorer in the modern era is Graham Shepherd who managed to notch up 158 goals between 1963 and 1982, and more recently Liam Flanagan who currently tops 100 goals for the club.

Since the turn of the century, Selby Town FC flourished under the guidance of former player Bob Lyon, winning the President's Cup, the Barkston Ash Cup, and The Vets over 40s all in

2001, and in 2004/05, the team finished runners up in the NCEL Premier Division. A year later and the first team were runners up were runners up in the Presidents Cup, and semi-finalists in the league cup. Since then the club has seen its fortunes go up and down and in 2011/12 the club was unfortunately relegated back down to division one, where it has remained since. A period of instability followed with new managers unable to find that winning formula.

In 2017, former player Christian Fox joined Selby Town as manager. He brought with him new ideas and a new management team. Together, they built a squad of almost completely new players, and in their first season in charge they achieved a seventh place position in the league which was the club's highest place finish since their relegation six years previously. Christian also led the club to the final of the West Riding County Cup, losing the game 4-1 against Farsley Celtic. Since then, promotion looked imminent in 2019/20 until the season was cut short due to the onset of the pandemic. The club now looks to build on the momentum of previous years and to achieve the promotion their supporters desperately hope for.
