Ollerton has a long history of football going back to the late 1800s. One of it's best periods was immediately before the Second World War when Ollerton Colliery won the Notts Senior Cup in 1937/38 and it's reserve team won the Notts Intermediate Cup the year previous.

Ollerton Colliery ceased as a football club in the early 1980s but was reformed in 1988 as Ollerton and Bevercotes Miners Welfare and began life in the Mansfield Bitter League before progressing to the Notts Football Alliance in 1991. The club won the Nottinghamshire Football Alliance Division Two championship in 1992–93, gaining promotion to Division One under the management of Adge Owen and David Kent.



Following the closure of the colliery in 1994, the club changed its name to Ollerton Town F.C. In the same year, Ollerton were champions of Division One in 1995–96 and were promoted to the top division of the Notts Alliance.

After finishing runners-up in 1999–2000, the club was promoted to the Central Midlands League and entered the English Football Pyramid.

In the 2007–08 season, Ollerton, under the management of Don Gethfield, David Kent and Anthony Thompson, the club won the Central Midlands Premier Division, earning promotion to the Supreme Division. That season they also reached the Nottinghamshire Senior Cup final where they were beaten 2–0 by Eastwood Town. In 2008–09, the club took part in the FA Vase for the very first time, getting to the second round proper in 2009–10..



After the resignation of Don Gethfield back in 2011, and a brief stint under Paul Rawden, the club appointed Dave Winter and Stephen Bodle as first team managers. The pair guided the club to a 7th placed finish and the Central Midlands Floodlit Cup final in their first season.

For the 2011–12 season, the club was placed in the Central Midlands North Division following a league restructure.

Ollerton spent a few seasons in the middle echelons of the league before in the 2015–16 season, with former-captain Jamie Allan now also on board as first team coach, the club secured promotion to the Northern Counties East League after finishing runners-up in the Central Midlands North. The club battled against the odds to secure their survival over the next three years and recorded some memorable results against some very big teams.



In 2020, after the season came to a premature end due to the COVID-19 outbreak Ollerton were moved laterally to the East Midlands Counties League but the season only lasted 12 league games before it once again fell victim to the pandemic and national lockdowns.

This summer, Ollerton returned to the NCEL as part of the restructuring of the non-league system and after almost a decade in charge, Dave Winter stepped down as manager, being replaced by his long-serving assistant Steve Bodle.

Since Saturday, Shannon has set up a JustGiving page in order to raise funds to buy defibrillator machines for those clubs in the region who do not have one on site.

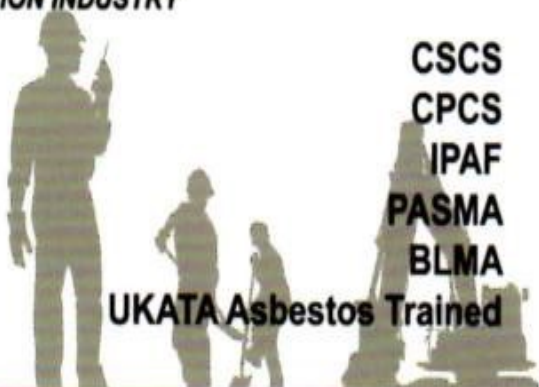

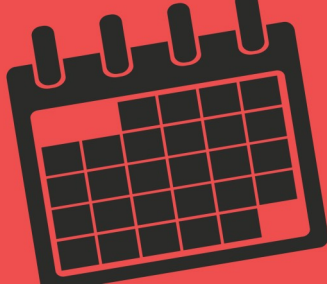

Despite an impressive 4-1 cup win over Glasshoughton Welfare in midweek, Ollerton Town failed to get their first points on the board in the league after suffering a 3-1 defeat against Hall Road Rangers on Saturday.

It's fair to say that preparation for the game could have been better for Town manager Steve Bodle. A mixture of injuries, absences and COVID-related isolation meant that he could only field a bare eleven with centre back Lewis Dalmedo making his debut for the club. It was very much a team that contained square pegs in round holes with some lads who played battling through injury to try and help the team.

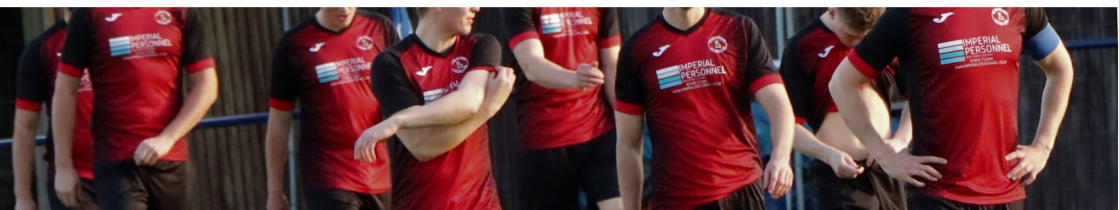
Though they faced a clear disadvantage, Ollerton started the brighter and in the fourth minute, Sam Martin's shot from distance just dipped over the bar. A minute later, Sam Foulds pounced on hesitation in the Hall Road back line to nip in and intercept a back pass inside the area but the angle was too tight for him to get a shot away.

It took until the 13th minute for Hall Road to have their first opportunity. Dave Harrison brought the ball down well at the back post but he could only fire his acrobatic effort over the bar.

Paul Wray was next to try his luck for the home team but his powerful drive from the edge of the area was always optimistic and it flew high and wide of the Ollerton goal.

Hall Road were still struggling to call Ollerton 'keeper Levi Owen into action, Chris Spinks being the next player that failed to hit the target with an attempt. However, on the half hour mark, the hosts took the lead in the most fortunate of circumstances. Luke Wheeldon looked to deliver the ball into the box from the left flank but he mis-hit his cross, only to see it curl over Owen and drop in at the far post to put Hall Road ahead.

Ollerton looked to respond immediately and it was Foulds, coming into the game off the back of a brace in midweek, who almost got it as his low shot went just





wide of the post.

Straight back up the other end, a scramble at the near post almost produced a second for the home side but Tom Moody put his body on the line to defend the danger, picking up a knock in the process.

In the 40th minute, Ollerton were awarded a free kick in a good position after strong play by Martin, and it was Martin who stepped up to take it, forcing Barford into a good save down to his left.

Just before half time, another Martin free kick caused havoc in the box as Barford failed to hold. It bounced to Foulds who saw his effort saved, before Joe Turner and Joe Lumley both saw shots blocked.

That meant Ollerton were behind at the break and ten minutes after the restart, it was 2-0. Hall Road were awarded a free kick down the right channel and they played it to Spinks on the edge of the area. His timid shot looked easy work for Owen but Wheeldon raced across his him and poke the ball out of his grasp and into the back of the net.

Ollerton once again tried to get a foot hold in the game as soon as possible. Calum Littlejohn got down the left and pulled the ball back to edge of the area. Sam Stretton flicked the ball on to the onrushing Turner but his shot was blocked by a Hall Road defender.



Both of Hall Road's goals so far had been poor from an Ollerton perspective and things got worse with the third goal in the 67th minute, which killed the game off. Trying to play out from the back, Ollerton gave the ball away on the edge of their own box which gave the hosts a two-on-one situation which resulted in Lewis Andrew scoring from close range.

Andrew could have had a second minutes later as Hall Road broke well from an Ollerton corner. The move ended with the ball finding Andrew on the left of the area and his curling effort was headed over by Tom Moody.

In the 73rd minute, Ollerton got a goal back to set up a tense end to the game. Bodle's men have been somewhat fruitful from dead balls so far this season and they kept that up as Sam Geeves' brilliant delivery from a free kick found debutant Lewis Dalmedo at the back post and he smashed the ball into the roof of the net.

Ollerton could have got a second in the dying embers of the game as a long ball dropped for Littlejohn who drilled a shot wide of the post, before Andrew smashed a shot over the bar as the hosts looked for a fourth of the game.

It proved to be a frustrating afternoon at the office for Ollerton who worked hard in difficult circumstances, but who will be frustrated at the manner of some of the goals they conceded. With the games coming thick and fast, the Town will be hoping for a quick response as they look to get points on the board to start climbing the league table.
