Ollerton has a long history of football going back to the late 1800s. One of it's best periods was immediately before the Second World War when Ollerton Colliery won the Notts Senior Cup in 1937/38 and it's reserve team won the Notts Intermediate Cup the year previous.

Ollerton Colliery ceased as a football club in the early 1980s but was reformed in 1988 as Ollerton and Bevercotes Miners Welfare and began life in the Mansfield Bitter League before progressing to the Notts Football Alliance in 1991. The club won the Nottinghamshire Football Alliance Division Two championship in 1992–93, gaining promotion to Division One under the management of Adge Owen and David Kent.



Following the closure of the colliery in 1994, the club changed its name to Ollerton Town F.C. In the same year, Ollerton were champions of Division One in 1995–96 and were promoted to the top division of the Notts Alliance.

After finishing runners-up in 1999–2000, the club was promoted to the Central Midlands League and entered the English Football Pyramid.

In the 2007–08 season, Ollerton, under the management of Don Gethfield, David Kent and Anthony Thompson, the club won the Central Midlands Premier Division, earning promotion to the Supreme Division. That season they also reached the Nottinghamshire Senior Cup final where they were beaten 2–0 by Eastwood Town. In 2008–09, the club took part in the FA Vase for



the very first time, getting to the second round proper in 2009-10...

After the resignation of Don Gethfield back in 2011, and a brief stint under Paul Rawden, the club appointed Dave Winter and Stephen Bodle as first team managers. The pair guided the club to a 7th placed finish and the Central Midlands Floodlit Cup final in their first season.

For the 2011–12 season, the club was placed in the Central Midlands North Division following a league restructure.

Ollerton spent a few seasons in the middle echelons of the league before in the 2015–16 season, with former-captain Jamie Allan now also on board as first team coach, the club secured promotion to the Northern Counties East League after finishing runners-up in the Central Midlands North. The club battled a

gainst the odds to secure their survival over the next three years and recorded some memorable results against some very big teams.

in 2020, after the season came toa premature end due to the COVID-19 outbreak Ollerton were moved laterally to the



East Midlands Counties League but the season only lasted 12 league games before it once again fell victim to the pandemic and national lockdowns.

This summer, Ollerton returned to the NCEL as part of the restructuring of the non-league system and after almost a decade in charge, Dave Winter stepped down as manager, being replaced by his long-serving assistant Steve Bodle.



This summer, Ollerton Town Football Club announced the resignation of long-serving manager Dave Winter after almost a decade at the club.

Dave, who would have reached ten years in charge this October, took the decision to stand down and take time away from the game after more 360 games in charge of The Town. The former Kirkby Town manager arrived at The Lane back in October 2011, with assistants Steve Bodle and Gaz Noble. Whilst Bodle has remained by his side throughout the past decade, they have been joined in the dugout by different faces over the years including Jamie Allan, Jordan Wildey and, most recently, Lee Needham.

- Winter immediately steadied the ship after taking charge and guided us to the Central Midlands Floodlit Cup final at the end of his first season.
- The crowning glory of his time in charge came in the 2015-2016 season when the Town achieved promotion to the Northern Counties East League, reaching the highest level of the football pyramid that the club has ever played at.
- Not only that, but he led the club to battle against the odds and secure its survival at step six for three consecutive seasons.
- Last season saw the club fly out of the blocks in its first season in the East Midlands Counties League, but any chance of promotion was sadly denied by the curtailment of the campaign due to COVID-19.
- The length of Dave's tenure in charge of the club is testament to his loyalty and dedication but it does not tell the full story and does not show the hours and hours of hard work that he has put in behind the scenes, in different areas of the football club, to help make Ollerton as successful as it can possibly be.
- It has also been somewhat of a family affair for Dave. His wife Joanne was club secretary for a period whilst his mother Lynne helped out in the club's tea bar on matchday. His father Dick, and his father-in-law Pete, were, and we hope will remain, loyal supporters of the club, following us home and away.
- The football club has made it clear to Dave that he will always be welcome at Walesby Lane and we hope that, once he has enjoyed a well-deserved break, we will see him at games, cheering the team on.
- A club representative said: "We would like to place on record our enormous thanks to Dave for his years of hard-work and dedicated service to the football club."
- "Dave's commitment and passion for Ollerton Town Football Club has been clear throughout his long tenure and he leaves the football club in a much better place than when he took over.
- "Whilst we fully respect his decision, we are sad to see him go, both as a manager and as a friend to everyone involved in the club."



Heralding a new era following their name change from East Hull in the summer, FC Humber United were rampant in Division One as they thrashed visitors Dronfield Town 7-1

They raced into a five-goal lead by the interval - Harry Watson, Liam Mulligan, Jamie Baxter, Jamie Phillips, and Brandon Burke all getting on the scoresheet - before Christian Savage opened the away side's account around the hour mark.

Cameron Hall scored twice, though, to dampen any hopes of a Dronfield revival and put the hosts in seventh heaven. Of the five sides who have returned to NCEL Division One from the now-defunct East Midlands Counties League, Clipstone will begin their season next week whilst Rainworth Miners Welfare picked up a point at home to Selby Town.

Craig Mitchell gave the Wrens a 26th minute lead but Harry Clapham ensured the game ended on level terms with his equaliser for the Robins with a quarter-of-an-hour remaining.

Shirebrook Town and Teversal tasted defeat, however, in their comebacks with Matthew Plummer, Jamie Forrester and Daniel East securing North Ferriby a 3-0 win at Shirebrook whilst Teversal fell to a single goal in first-half stoppage time from Matthew Hughes as they were beaten at home by Armthorpe Welfare.

And, despite goals from George Slack and Sam Stretton, Ollerton Town also got off to a losing start as they were defeated 4-2 at Rossington Main, Paul Sherburn's double adding to earlier strikes from Niall Doran and Jack Watson. Sam Ackroyd is the NCEL's first hat-trick hero of the season as he got all of Parkgate's goals in a 3-0 win at Retford FC and Worsbrough Bridge Athletic were also victorious on their travels, Owen Wildblood scoring as they beat Hall Road Rangers 1-0.

Scott Phillips, Alfie Usher and Andrew Taylor secured a 3-2 home win for Brigg Town at the expense of Glasshoughton Welfare whilst Daniel Thirkell netted twice in Harrogate Railway Athletic's 3-0 triumph over visitors Swallownest. And, Hallam took the lead before trailing 3-1 and then pulling it back for a 3-3 draw at Nostell Miners Welfare, Christopher Wood with two of their goals whilst Nathan Perks did the same for the hosts



Following on from the resignation of Dave Winter, Ollerton Town were delighted to announce the appointment of Steve Bodle as the club's new first team manager.

Bodle is of course no stranger to anyone at Walesby Lane, having loyally served as Dave Winter's assistant manager since 2011.

Following Dave's decision to step down from his role, Bodle made it clear that he wanted to remain at the club if possible and having listened to the enthusiasm in which he discussed the potential of the club moving forward, it was an easy decision to offer him the opportunity to step up to the manager's job.

This, and the decision not to start completely from scratch with a new face, means the club did not have any uncertainty to deal with this summer and it is hoped that this will allow us to build on what was an incredibly positive, albeit short, 2020-2021 season.

The club also feels that the decision is a worthy reward for Steve's hard-work and commitment to Ollerton Town over the past ten years.

We were also happy to announce that Lee Needham has agreed to stay at the club, assisting Steve moving forward. Lee arrived at Ollerton back in the summer of 2019 and since then, he has proved himself to be a huge asset and an extremely popular member of the football club.

Speaking after his appointment, Bodle had the following to say: "I firstly wanted to say how much Dave will be missed by everyone, none more so than myself."

"We have known each other since we were 10-11 and have grown from good friends to best pals. Dave is my daughter's God Parent, someone who knows me inside out and it still feels surreal.

"I'll miss having him around every Wednesday and Saturday, and our calls during the week talking football. He will probably enjoy the rest from me, mind...

"With Dave leaving, the club asked me what my intentions were, and I stated that I'd like to stay on. I love the club; the lads are first class and I felt like moving to solo manager was something I wanted to do.

"I can see the lads doing well next year and it's something I want to be around for. With a little more backing on the commercial side, this club can move forward at a great pace. The club are working tirelessly with the authorities on funding, and with the owners of the ground, and hopefully work on a new facility should start to place in the next year to eighteen months.

"I'm extremely happy to be taking over and excited for next season."

BRICCTOWN

Brigg Town FC known as the Zebras are the oldest surviving club in Lincolnshire and one of the oldest clubs in the World having been formed in 1864.

The club played for many years in the Lindsey league playing at the Brocklesby Ox, where a record ground attendance of 2000 was noted, before moving to the present ground in Hawthorne Avenue.

The club were founder members of the Lincolnshire league in 1948 winning the title on 8 occasions before joining the Midlands Counties League in 1976. The club was placed in Division One of the newly formed the Northern Counties East league in 1982. The club remained in the NCEL Premier, Division One and Evostik until relegation into the Lincolnshire league in season 2016/17 season.

After just one season in the Lincolnshire league the club were promoted back into the NCEL Division One and also won the Lincolnshire Junior cup beating Horncastle Town.

The club's cup tradition is second to none having won FA Vase on two

occasions in 1995/6 at Wembley and 2002/3 at Upton Park and reaching the first round of the FA cup in 2001/02 losing out to Tranmere Rovers.

The club was taken over in 2017 by the current Chairman Jim Huxford and his company EC Surfacing and the club was made into a community interest club with a change of name to Brigg Town CIC.

In just two years the stadium and clubhouse have been completely refurbished and the stadium, before the start of the 2019/20, was renamed "THE EC SURFACING STADIUM"
