Ollerton has a long history of football going back to the late 1800s. One of it's best periods was immediately before the Second World War when Ollerton Colliery won the Notts Senior Cup in 1937/38 and it's reserve team won the Notts Intermediate Cup the year previous.

Ollerton Colliery ceased as a football club in the early 1980s but was reformed in 1988 as Ollerton and Bevercotes Miners Welfare and began life in the Mansfield Bitter League before progressing to the Notts Football Alliance in 1991. The club won the Nottinghamshire Football Alliance Division Two championship in 1992–93, gaining promotion to Division One under the management of Adge Owen and David Kent.



Following the closure of the colliery in 1994, the club changed its name to Ollerton Town F.C. In the same year, Ollerton were champions of Division One in 1995–96 and were promoted to the top division of the Notts Alliance.

After finishing runners-up in 1999–2000, the club was promoted to the Central Midlands League and entered the English Football Pyramid.

In the 2007–08 season, Ollerton, under the management of Don Gethfield, David Kent and Anthony Thompson, the club won the Central Midlands Premier Division, earning promotion to the Supreme Division. That season they also reached the Nottinghamshire Senior Cup final where they were beaten 2–0 by Eastwood Town. In 2008–09, the club took part in the FA Vase for



the very first time, getting to the second round proper in 2009-10...

After the resignation of Don Gethfield back in 2011, and a brief stint under Paul Rawden, the club appointed Dave Winter and Stephen Bodle as first team managers. The pair guided the club to a 7th placed finish and the Central Midlands Floodlit Cup final in their first season.

For the 2011–12 season, the club was placed in the Central Midlands North Division following a league restructure.

Ollerton spent a few seasons in the middle echelons of the league before in the 2015–16 season, with former-captain Jamie Allan now also on board as first team coach, the club secured promotion to the Northern Counties East League after finishing runners-up in the Central Midlands North. The club battled against

the odds to secure their survival over the next three years and recorded some memorable results against some very big teams.

In 2020, after the season came to a premature end due to the COVID-19 outbreak Ollerton were moved laterally to the



East Midlands Counties League but the season only lasted 12 league games before it once again fell victim to the pandemic and national lockdowns.

This summer, Ollerton returned to the NCEL as part of the restructuring of the non-league system and after almost a decade in charge, Dave Winter stepped down as manager, being replaced by his long-serving assistant Steve Bodle.



The match of the day in Division One was at the EC Surfacing Stadium as the top two met but it was hosts Brigg Town who dominated, thrashing Nostell Miners Welfare 7-0.

There were hat-tricks for Dayle Hutson and Scott Phillips whilst Andrew Taylor also scored to move Brigg two points clear at the top whilst their opponents drop to fourth.

Selby Town are now second after a Liam Flanagan penalty earned the Robins a 2-1 win at Parkgate after Christian Fox's side had come from behind.

Jack Watson's hat-trick helped Rossington Main to a 4-0 home victory over Shirebrook Town that lifts his side up into third whilst their Derbyshire visitors drop into the bottom two.

North Ferriby continue their climb up the table as Thomas Corner, Daniel East and Harvey Carew netted in the Villagers' 3-2 win at Swallownest and they are now fifth.

Armthorpe Welfare lose a little ground in seventh as they went down 3-1 at Retford FC, Liam Bennett and Luke Abdy with goals in the last half-hour to claim the win for the hosts.

Jack Brownell's 70th minute winner lifts Hallam up to ninth following their 2-1 win at Harrogate Railway Athletic whilst there were home victories for Dronfield Town and Hall Road Rangers.

Dronfield's first win of the season came with a 2-1 defeat of Ollerton Town, Connor Chapell with the decider on 81 minutes, and Alex Knaggs, Daniel Norton and Harry Griffin were the scorers in Rangers' 3-0 triumph over basement visitors Teversal.

And, the spoils were shared at the Fairfax Plant Hire Stadium as FC Humber United and Clipstone played out a rollercoaster 3-3 draw.

Clipstone led twice through Jason Foster and Jack Warwick only to be pegged back by Jack Gascoigne and Louis Blackwell before the home side took the lead for the first time thanks to Brandon Burke but William Heather made sure it was a point apiece in the 79th minute.



Ollerton Town were unable to make it a perfect week as they lost 2-1 to Dronfield Town on Saturday afternoon.

The Town went into the game on the back of wins against Swallownest and Parkgate but despite strong displays in

Swallownest and Parkgate but despite strong displays in both fixtures, they were unable to add another three points to their tally after a frustrating loss.

It means Ollerton have lost all of their visits to Dronfield, dating back to 2010 and their clashes in the Central Midlands League, and they will be desperate to put that particular hoodoo behind them at the earliest opportunity. Ollerton flew out of the blocks and had a chance inside the opening minute, Ash Cooper getting down the left and crossing for fellow full back Sam Geeves who headed over the bar.

That was as good as it got for Ollerton though inside the opening exchanges as the hosts soon began to enjoy the better of things.

In the 11th minute, a ball into the Ollerton area fell for Mike Fereday who failed to keep his effort down.

Two minutes later and the hosts really should have gone ahead. A well delivered cross from the right found Callum Mawbey free at the back post but he failed to keep his header down when he should have hit the target.

The pressure kept building however and the game's opening goal arrived in the 16th minute. A ball into the box was directed towards by Stuart Hill and despite Liam Smart's attempts to clear, it crossed the line at the back post.

Since returning to Ollerton, Ben Partridge has proved himself a huge asset with his pace causing a host of





problems for opposing defenders. Saturday was no different and he would consider himself unlucky not to have registered an assist.

Just before the half hour mark, he escaped down the right and made his way into the area but his ball across goal was agonisingly behind strike partner Gav King.

Five minutes later and Partridge raced down the same flank and this time his ball did find the feet of King but the prolific striker was denied by a recovering defender after beating Lewis Naylor in the Dronfield goal.

With just a goal in it at the interval, both sides would have still fancied their chances of claiming all three points, but Ollerton will have been told that they had to raise their game after a below par opening 45. They could have made the perfect start to the second half but were left to rue a brilliant save by Naylor. Young forward Jacques Etia used his pace and skill to work a way into the area and he set the ball up for King who hit it hard and low, only for Naylor to dive to his right and get a strong hand on the ball to parry it away.

Etia was continuing to cause Dronfield problems coming in off the flank and he saw a well hit shot from 12 yards blocked by a defender.

There had only been one team in it since the restart and Ollerton got the goal they deserved in the 54th minute. Joe Lumley kept play alive and delivered into the area where King expertly beat the offside trap before bringing the ball down and slotting it into the side netting.



The hosts could have retaken the lead just before the hour mark as Sam Bebbington got in down the right, but his low shot went wide of the far post.

The game was firmly in the balance and in the 68th minute, a cross into the Dronfield box caused havoc and Etia saw another shot blocked before Ollie Grady's rebound went wide off the back of a home defender.

Time was running out and with 15 minutes to go, Geeves' corner found Partridge at the far post, but he got slightly underneath it and failed to get the direction his header needed.

With just under ten minutes to go, Dronfield got the winning goal. Naylor's goal kick was flicked on into the path of Connor Chapell who managed to get past Brandon Shaw before firing a terrific finish past Levi Owen and into the back of the net.

HARROGATE RAILWAY

The club was established in 1935 by employees of the London and North Eastern Railway depot in the Starbeck area of Harrogate. They joined the Harrogate & District League, and as a railways team, they entered the British Railways National Cup, winning it in 1945–46. The club moved up to the West Yorkshire League, and were runners-up in 1951–52. They won the league in 1953–54, and after a third-place finish in 1954–55, the club joined Division Two of the Yorkshire League, with the reserves taking over in the West Yorkshire League.

In 1957-58 Harrogate finished third in Division Two, earning promotion to Division One. However, they were relegated at the end of the following season. Another promotion following a third-place finish in 1963-64 was following by another immediate relegation the season after. League restructuring in 1970 saw a Division Three created, which the club were relegated to, and in 1973 they left the league and dropped back into the Harrogate & District League. However, they rejoined Division Three of the Yorkshire League in 1980. When the league merged with the Midland League in 1982 to form the Northern Counties East League, the club were placed in Division Two North. They won the division in 1983-84 and were promoted to Division One North.

League reorganisation in 1985 saw Harrogate placed in Division One, and a fourth-place finish in 1986–87 saw them promoted to the Premier Division, a season in which they also won the League Cup with a 5–0 win over Woolley Miners Welfare.

The club were relegated back to Division One after finishing bottom of the Premier Division in 1992–93, but returned to the Premier Division

after winning the Division One title in 1998–99.

In 2002–03 the club reached the first round of the FA Cup for the first time. After beating Slough Town 2–1 in the first round, they lost 3–1 at home to Bristol City in the second round in front of a record crowd of 3,500. The season also saw the club win the league's Presidents Cup with a 7–2 aggregate win over Bridlington Town.

In 2005–06 the club finished third in the Premier Division, earning promotion to Division One of the Northern Premier League. In 2007 league restructuring saw them placed in Division One North.

In 2007–08 Harrogate reached the first round of the FA Cup again, defeating Droylsden 2–0 before losing 3–2 at home to Mansfield Town in the second round. They remained members of Division One North until being relegated back to the Northern Counties East League's Premier Division at the end of the 2015–16 season. In 2018–19 the club finished second-frombottom of the Premier Division and were relegated to Division One.

The club bought its Station View ground in the Starbeck area of Harrogate with a £1,500 loan from the London and North Eastern Railway, with employees paying it off at 1p per week. Floodlights were erected in 1991 and inaugurated with a friendly match against Sheffield United. The ground currently has a capacity of 3,500, of which 300 is seated and 600 covered.
