


We have been drawn away to fellow NCEL Division One side Retford FC in the first round of the Notts Senior Cup and we will inform you all in due time regarding the date of the game.

Ollerton has a long history of football going back to the late 1800s. One of it's best periods was immediately before the Second World War when Ollerton Colliery won the Notts Senior Cup in 1937/38 and it's reserve team won the Notts Intermediate Cup the year previous.

Ollerton Colliery ceased as a football club in the early 1980s but was reformed in 1988 as Ollerton and Bevercotes Miners Welfare and began life in the Mansfield Bitter League before progressing to the Notts Football Alliance in 1991. The club won the Nottinghamshire Football Alliance Division Two championship in 1992–93, gaining promotion to Division One under the management of Adge Owen and David Kent.



Following the closure of the colliery in 1994, the club changed its name to Ollerton Town F.C. In the same year, Ollerton were champions of Division One in 1995–96 and were promoted to the top division of the Notts Alliance.

After finishing runners-up in 1999–2000, the club was promoted to the Central Midlands League and entered the English Football Pyramid.

In the 2007–08 season, Ollerton, under the management of Don Gethfield, David Kent and Anthony Thompson, the club won the Central Midlands Premier Division, earning promotion to the Supreme Division. That season they also reached the Nottinghamshire Senior Cup final where they were beaten 2–0 by Eastwood Town. In 2008–09, the club took part in the FA Vase for



the very first time, getting to the second round proper in 2009-10...

After the resignation of Don Gethfield back in 2011, and a brief stint under Paul Rawden, the club appointed Dave Winter and Stephen Bodle as first team managers. The pair guided the club to a 7th placed finish and the Central Midlands Floodlit Cup final in their first season.

For the 2011–12 season, the club was placed in the Central Midlands North Division following a league restructure.

Ollerton spent a few seasons in the middle echelons of the league before in the 2015–16 season, with former-captain Jamie Allan now also on board as first team coach, the club secured promotion to the Northern Counties East League after finishing runners-up in the Central Midlands North. The club battled against

the odds to secure their survival over the next three years and recorded some memorable results against some very big teams.

In 2020, after the season came to a premature end due to the COVID-19 outbreak Ollerton were moved laterally to the



East Midlands Counties League but the season only lasted 12 league games before it once again fell victim to the pandemic and national lockdowns.

This summer, Ollerton returned to the NCEL as part of the restructuring of the non-league system and after almost a decade in charge, Dave Winter stepped down as manager, being replaced by his long-serving assistant Steve Bodle.

The top three all won in Division One so Brigg Town remain in pole position, ahead of Rossington Main on goal difference, following their 1-0 win at Shirebrook Town, Stephen McCarron with a late winner for the Zebras.

Rossington, meanwhile, defeated hosts Rainworth Miners Welfare 5-2 with Niall Doran claiming a hat-trick whilst Selby Town keep two points behind the leaders in third after they came from behind to defeat visitors Dronfield Town 3-1.

Liam Flanagan struck twice with Harry Clapham also netting for the Robins who are a point ahead of Nostell Miners Welfare who jump to fourth following their 5-0 home victory over Hall Road Rangers, Danny Edwards scoring in stoppage time in both halves to help them on their way.

An own goal from Jack Birks and a second half strike from Daniel East earned North Ferriby a 2-0 win at home to Parkgate to move the Villagers up into fifth and Hallam complete the top six following their 5-1 defeat of Swallownest at Sandygate, Christopher Wood netting twice for the Countrymen.

Those two games saw mammoth attendances with 331 at North Ferriby whilst Hallam welcomed in 466 to their match with a mention as well to the fixture at Selby which saw 282 come through the gates.

The highest scoring game of the day came at the Tomlin Personnel Park where Teversal beat visitors FC Humber United 7-4 to move off the foot of the table to be replaced by their neighbours Shirebrook.

Cameron Pinnick nabbed a hat-trick for the Tevie Boys who led 3-1 at the break but the away side, who have now conceded 48 goals in ten league games, never stopped competing in what was an enthralling encounter. There were goals for Benjamin Partridge and Samuel Geeves as Ollerton Town were victorious, 2-0 at home to Worsbrough Bridge Athletic, and James Gore and Joseph Crosby netted in the final quarter-of-an-hour to claim a 2-1 away victory for Harrogate Railway Athletic at Armthorpe Welfare.

And, an 87th minute equaliser by Clipstone's Declan Whitton saw the Cobras draw 2-2 home to Retford FC.



A goal in each half, scored by Ben Partridge and Sam Geeves respectively, saw Ollerton Town deservedly beat Worsbrough Bridge 2-0 on Saturday to return to winning ways after two disappointing results.

Defeats to Dronfield Town and Harrogate Railway had left Ollerton needing a result but in front of a home crowd, they were able to raise their performance level and see off a side that were unbeaten in their previous five games coming into Saturday's encounter.

Worsbrough offered glimpses in the first half of just why they had been enjoying such a strong start to the season but in truth, they were always second best, and it was no surprise when Ben Partridge raced clear and finished past Ross Pritchard.

The second half saw Ollerton stay in control of proceedings, and they had chances to double their lead but had to wait until the 72nd minute when Sam Geeves tapped into an empty net for his first goal for the club.

Ollerton started brightly and in the third minute, Gav King raced into the area after good work on the left flank before seeing a shot deflected wide.

In the 20th minute, Worsbrough were awarded a dangerous looking free kick and Ollerton 'keeper Levi Owen had to be at this best to keep out Conor Glavin's effort with a diving save.

The home side were looking dangerous from corners, with Ollie Grady taking two brilliant deliveries, The first found Ben Partridge who headed wide of the goal before minutes later, Brandon Shaw rose highest but headed another corner over the bar. In between that, good interplay between the strike partnership of Partridge and King ended in the latter firing over from distance.

Just after the half hour mark, a Worsbrough ball from the right found Kyle Wordsworth in space on the right of the area but he hooked a shot off target.



Then came the Ollerton opener. Owen's goal kick was flicked on brilliantly by King into the path of Partridge who knocked the ball past Elliot Wilson before sprinting away from him and keeping his cool to slot the ball past Pritchard.

Worsbrough tried to find a way back into the game before the interval but the closest they came was when Alex Hutchinson worked his way into space and fired a shot at goal, only for Shaw to chuck his body on the line to block. A second goal would have made things more comfortable for Ollerton and they pushed hard to get it early in the second half.

In the 50th minute, Grady's whipped free kick almost found Shaw free at the back post, but the ball was just wide of this outstretched leg.

A minute later, King almost kept up his record of scoring in every game he's played for Ollerton against Worsbrough but he was denied by a superb save from Pritchard, who stuck out a leg to divert King's effort onto the post.

The referee came under scrutiny in the 59th minute when he awarded Worsbrough what looked like a very soft free kick in a dangerous looking position. Glavin failed to take advantage however, dragging his shot wide of the post. The visitors were looking the most dangerous they had all game and Mike Jepps had a good chance to draw them level, but Owen made himself big and produced an excellent save.

Worsbrough 'keeper Pritchard, in between falling out with teammates, spectators and the match day officials, was called into action once again in the 64th minute after Grady slipped the ball through for King inside the area, but Pritchard got down well to deny the prolific centre forward.

There was nothing he could do about Ollerton's second which all but put the game to bed. Joe Lumley slipped the ball for Partridge down the right wing, and he sped past his man and towards the byline, before pulling the ball back for King who deflected it into the path of Geeves who fired into the empty net.



Worsbrough couldn't live with Partridge and two minutes later, he almost got his second goal, cutting inside from the right wing and bending a shot towards goal which Pritchard tipped past the post.

Ollerton could have got their third when Grady whipped a ball towards goal but after just missing King and Shaw, it went wide of the target.

King kept searching for what would have been his fifth goal in as many games, and with two minutes to go, a long throw presented him with another chance inside the area, but he miscued his shot.

The final seconds of the game almost saw Worsbrough grab a consolation as Wordsworth chased down a long ball and nudged it past Owen, but the ball trickled wide of the post to give Ollerton only their second clean sheet of the season, icing on top of the cake, after a very strong performance and a deserved three points.

After a long history of football at Carnarvon Street supporting the local mining community dating back to 1918, under various names including Teversal Miners Welfare or Teversal & Silverhill a long-playing history of football to a high level includes playing in the FA Cup. The football side of the complex became run down and it was only down to the hard work of Sam Slack in the 1970's and early 1980's that football continued, under the banner of youth football. Senior football returned in 1986 under the name of M.W. Teversal. The closure of Teversal and then Silverhill Colliery was followed by the Miners Welfare closing in 1989 with some claiming that was the final nail in the coffin which lead to a steady decline of the site. The period of uncertainty saw action taken with Ashfield District Council taking over the Trusteeship of the complex in 1989, with the name changing to the Teversal Grange Sports and Social Centre, hence the club's name changed to Teversal Grange F.C. The name was changed again at the start of the 2000-2001 season to the current name.

From the uncertain times, which saw the club running just one Senior team, the club's strength has grown to have two Senior teams, Youth teams right through the ranges from Under 7's to 18's, along with training sessions for 5-year old's. A return to national competitions is a mark of how the club as developed, F.A. Vase 2003-04 season, F.A. Youth Cup 2004-05 season and the big one the F.A. Cup 2005-06 which was gained after winning promotion to the Northern Counties East League from the Central Midlands League. However, the Football Association changed the entry criteria for the 2009-10 season for the FA Cup and unfortunately this meant exclusion from the competition for several step 6 clubs including ourselves since the 2011-12, apart from the 2012-13.

Our first season in the East Midlands Counties League in 2017/18 saw a third-place finish and missing out on winning it by only two points. That was an achievement that reached the standard that allowed us to return to the FA Cup competition for 2018-19 season. A change of management and bottom half finish in the League table and the impact of Covid-19 we have not been eligible to

play in the FA Cup again. For the 2021/22 and a restructure by the FA we find ourselves back in the Northern Counties East League.

2012-13 season saw the club make history again with the introduction of our first ever Ladies side, which bettered all expectations, runners in the Nottinghamshire Girls & Ladies League, League Cup Final runners up and County Cup Semi-finalist, saw promotion to the East Midlands Ladies League. After a couple of difficult seasons, the Ladies have now returned to the Nottinghamshire Girls & Ladies League for the 2018/19 campaign and remain there for this season. Additionally, girl only sides are now being formed as part of the FA Wildcats scheme at the club.

Honours wise in the short term history, the club has gained promotion through the National System without winning a league, and the most recent success was a being finalist in the 2007-2008 Northern Counties East League Wilkinson Sword Trophy, which goes with our runners up berth to Hucknall Town of the Unibond Premier League in the Notts Senior Cup Final at Meadow Lane, losing 2-0 in April 2003, marking the 2002-03 season as one of the best seasons in the club's history. But the story continues, and the aims of the club remain the same, and it's hoped to reward these efforts with some senior silverware for both the men and ladies, along with the continued success within the club's Youth Section.
