	RESPONSIBILITY OF THE PLAYERS	RESPONSIBILITY OF THE CLUB
PROMOTING GOOD HYGIENE	Encourage team mates to maintain good hygiene.  Don't be afraid to speak out when breaches of good hygiene are taking place	Provide hand sanitisers at the entrance and exit of your pitches and advise users to bring their own hand sanitiser, marked with their own name.  Create a more rigid cleaning regime.  Provide additional waste facilities and more frequent rubbish collection.
COMMUNICATING CLEARLY AND REGULARLY	Take notice of posters regarding areas that are temporarily closed.  Ensure that you read the Player Guide and fully understand your responsibilities.	Communicate with all external user groups about the steps we have taken to make our facility safe.  Create posters and signage throughout all areas to promote your new protocols regarding:  Social distancing (two-metre spacing);  Hygiene (hand washing/sanitisers);  Traffic flow (entrance/exits);  Restricted areas.  Create a training guide to be developed which all players should sign in acknowledgment of their understanding.
ARRIVAL & DEPARTURE FROM THE GROUND	When attending training or coaching sessions you must not car-share with another person from a different household.  You should arrive shortly before the session begins and leave immediately it has finished.  You should not congregate by gates and in the car park and if communication is necessary, you must adhere to social distancing.	
CHANGING ROOMS & SHOWERS	Changing rooms and showers will be available with strict social distancing rules in force.  The Home Dressing Room can only accommodate a maximum of SEVEN players who can change at the same time in order to comply with social distancing. With mitigation, ELEVEN players may be allowed in at any one time.	Provide social distancing reminder notices at the entrance to the changing room block.  Notices to be posted on the entrance door to the changing rooms showing maximum occupancy numbers.  Social distancing posters within the changing rooms
	The shower facilities in both HOME and AWAY changing rooms can accommodate THREE people at any one time.	Team managers/coaches to speak to their own team players

TOILET FACILITIES	Indoor toilet facilities in the changing room block can be used during the match as per the above item.  Persons using toilets should spray the areas of bodily contact before and after use ie. toilet seat and flush/door handle and then wash hands thoroughly. Use paper towels. Anti-bacterial sprays will be provided in the toilet cubicles.  Avoid touching surfaces where possible.	Toilets will be cleaned regularly and all surfaces cleaned thoroughly. Liquid hand soap and paper towels will be provided.
NEW TOWN	You should arrive changed and ready for the session ahead.  You should REFRAIN FROM SPITTING AT ALL TIMES. Any tissues used should be placed in a bin which	
	must be emptied after each session.  Where equipment is handled by more than one person, those involved must wash their hands thoroughly on completion of the session.	
	You should provide your own PPE for training sessions if you feel the need to use it. Such items must then be disposed of in bins provided.	The club will provide bins for disposing of PPE items.  Single use bottled water will be provided with a view to acquiring individually marked re-usable bottles in future.
PERSONAL HYGIENE	You should bring your own bottles of water which are clearly marked with your name. SHARED DRINKING BOTTLES ARE NOT PERMITTED.	Sanitising gel will be made available though players should also consider bringing their own in a bottle, clearly marked with their own names.
	You should bring your own hand sanitising gel in a bottle clearly marked with your name along with sanitising wipes if you require them.	THE TO
	You should sanitise your hands not only before and after the game but during scheduled breaks throughout a game or training session.	
	All your personally owned equipment should be cleaned with anti-bacterial wipes or disinfectant after each session.	

EQUIPMENT & SHARING EQUIPMENT	Touching equipment should be avoided where possible.  Footballs should be kicked and not handled where possible.  Bibs should not be used unless absolutely neessary.	If bibs are used they should be washed after <b>EVERY</b> session.  All equipment must be cleaned after use. This include footballs. A named person should be identified as be responsible after each session and not just assumed someone else will do the job.

	Goal celebrations should be avoided;  Interactions with referees and match assistants should only happen with players observing social distancing.	
EAS	Shouting should be kept to a minimum as it has been proved that it creates an additional risk of transfer;
