ALL PERSONS ATTENDING THE CLUB STADIUM All players, officials, volunteers and spectators must undergo a self-assessment for any Covid-19- symptoms. COMMUNICATING CLEARLY AND REGULARLY Communicate with coaching staff and officials of both clubs involved in the match along with match officials about the steps we have taken to make our facility safe. Create posters and signage throughout all areas to promote your new protocols regarding:- Social distancing (two-metre spacing); Hygiene (hand washing/sanitisers); Traffic flow (entrance/exits); Restricted areas. 	Liaise with identified persons to ensure that they are fully aware of the steps taken to ensure that the facilities on matchday will be safe. 3	Staff Players Match Officials Volunteers	3. PROMOTING GOOD HYGIENE Promoting good hygiene throughout the Club by providing sanitisers, sufficient disposable towels, waste bins. 3	Players Staff Match Officials Volunteers	4. TRAVELLING TO THE MATCH Everyone travelling to the match should follow best practice and try to minimise use of public transport.	No-one should travel to matches with anyone from outside their own household or support bubble. If people from the same household or support bubble travel together in a vehicle, they should: Share the transport with the same people each time; Keep to small groups of people at any one time; Open windows for ventilation; Face away from each other; Clean the car between journeys, especially handles and other areas that are touched; Ask the driver and all passengers to wear a face covering; Consider seating arrangements to maximise distance others in the vehicle – this may mean using more than one coach or minibus and the wearing of face coverings; Use regular hand sanitisation by passengers on a coach or minibus; Limit the time spent at garages, petrol stations and motorway services; Keep distance from other people and if possible, pay by contactless; Wash or sanitise hands often, and always when exiting or re-entering the vehicle or upon completion of the journey. ARRIVAL & DEPARTURE FROM THE GROUND Advice for persons travelling to a game	Persons travelling to the match at the Yorkshire Payments Stadium must not carshare with another person from a different household. All players should arrive at the time agreed with the Head Coach and leave immediately after showering and changing. They should not congregate by gates and in the car park and if communication is necessary, they must adhere to social distancing. 2	Users Staff Players		Where equipment is handled by more than one person, those involved must wash their hands thoroughly. Players should provide their own PPE if they feel the need to use it whilst off the field of play. Such items must be disposed of in bins provided. Players bringing their own bottles of water should ensure that they are clearly marked with their name. Shared drinking bottles are not permitted. Players should be encouraged to bring their own hand sanitising gel in a clearly marked bottle. All personally owned equipment should be wiped down with anti-bacterial wipes or disinfectant after each session. 2	Users Staff Players	9. EQUIPMENT & SHARING EQUIPMENT	Touching equipment should be avoided where possible. Footballs should be kicked and not handled. Sharing of equipment with other groups should be limited. Bibs should not be used unless they are washed after EVERY session. All equipment must be cleaned after use. This includes footballs. A named person should be identified as being responsible after each session and not just assumed that someone else will do the job. The person washing the kit should then wash and sanitise their hands immediately after touching soiled clothing.	This information is included in the player/user training guide and will be posted on the website. Antibacterial sprays and sanitising gel is provided for the players and staff in the changing rooms and toilets DL and VP are aware of the required cleaning and will conform to the recommendations.

Users 2 Staff Players	10. DUG OUTS	In order to maintain social distancing, a maximum of three persons should be allowed to sit within the home and away dug outs. Additional chairs will be provided for coaching staff and substitutes if either team requires them. The FA have allowed extensions to the technical areas in order that occupants can maintain social distancing. In friendly fixtures such as this game v Sheffield FC, the BTAFC head coach requires that his full squad of players should not venture too far from the technical area and should watch the game from the spectator barriers, maintaining social distancing.	Chairs to be made available if required on the day. The Sheffield FC head coach may wish to follow suit. This can be discussed via email or on the day
Staff Players Match Officials	11. DURING A MATCH	Pre-match handshake should not happen but players should sanitise before entering the field of play; Huddles should not take place. Team talks can take place in outdoor areas where possible but social-distancing should be observed: Warm-ups and cool-downs should always observe social distancing; Coaches, other team staff and substitutes must also observe social distancing on touchlines/dug-outs. Social-distancing must also be observed during interactions when a substitution is being made; Match preparation meetings by officials should be held by video call; Set plays - free kicks and corners should be taken promptly to limit prolonged close marking. Referees and coaches should encourage players to get on with the game and not unnecessarily prolong set play set-up, such as defensive walls; Goal posts should be wiped down before and after matches and at half time. 	Staff	12. SOCIAL DISTANCING DURING BREAKS (eg. HALF	All participants must remain socially distanced during breaks in play, with spaced areas for equipment and refreshment storage for each individual including officials and substitutes. Coaching staff and substitutes, should, for example, spread out and avoid sharing a dug out or bench if social distancing cannot be observed. Players and officials should also observe social distancing during sin-bin instances. Water bottles or other refreshment containers should in no circumstances be shared. Participants are advised to bring their own drinks or refreshments, in a named	VP and other coaches at BTAFC are aware and the content of this section. It is also a part of the Player Guide which all players should have read and be aware of.
	Match Officials Players	TIME)	Participants are advised to bring their own drinks of refreshments, in a named container or the Club may provide individual bottles of water. After a game or training session, participants must maintain social distancing for social interaction. This includes changing rooms, showers, clubhouse facilities or any other place within the ground. Any payments relating to the fixture (match fees, officials fees) should where possible, be made in a cashless manner. ADMINISTERING FIRST AID	Advise first aiders and physios to update themselves on the latest guidance when treating patients, whether players or members of the public, to protect themselves and others. The Club must ensure that they have the appropriate PPE to be able to deal with any circumstance which may put them into conflict with social-distancing guidance. ie. face coverings, face shields, disposable gloves & aprons and sanitising gels. St John's Ambulance have put together advice for first aiders to help keep themselves and others safe.	First aiders/physio should be aware of current NHS guidelines but will need to be spoken to in order to ensure understanding and compliance.
