#### **Current Club Position**

- a) Unique in the North West of England with Men's First and Second team in the NHL and the Women's First team in the Vitality Women's National League. All senior men's and women's teams play in the NWH Leagues.
- b) Proven record at running Junior team's boys and girls in national competitions with outstanding recent success, with the boys U18 team being National Champions. Teams at U14, U16 and U18 are run, with teams playing in national and local competitions i.e., Greater Manchester league at the Armitage Centre.
- c) Proven record at integration of Juniors from pre-school to senior teams with dedicated training seasons for specific age groups, a transparency for parents via selection criteria and a team of dedicated helpers and coaches for Sunday morning and weekday sessions. This is supported by strong parental volunteer contribution and support.
- d) Facilities are excellent with changing facilities for multiple teams of both sexes on site. An on-site water-based pitch and use of pitches at the Armitage Centre, Manchester. Experience of hosting an EH Performance Centre and teams from Manchester University and Manchester Metropolitan University as well as local schools.
- e) An established governance and welfare track record. A group of qualified coaches and assistants Bi. -Annual qualification and DBS checks by the Sports Club and annual certification by BHC. The hockey section has a club welfare and safeguarding officer as does the Sports Club, both of whom have undertaken EH courses in child safety and safeguarding.
- f) A firm financial model wherein the hockey section raises funds for day-to-day activities and the Sports Club assists or targets facility development due to costing. Provision is made for facility replacement in the Sports Clubs accounts, the Club partners with a tenant gym operator, which provides a significant rental income that allows the club to have a strong long-term financial framework, to allow significant input of the Clubs money to assist with grant aided developments.
- g) Finally, we work with several external bodies, other than those outlined above. We have provided coaches for local primary and secondary schools, part of Trafford SSP, run club open/taster days in conjunction with BSC, holiday camps utilising England and elite hockey players.

#### **Disability Provision**

Blind/ Visually Impaired- No Opportunities exist at present. Coaches would require specific training. See Action Plan.

Deaf/ hearing problems - As above. See Action plan

Physical Impairment – The Sports Club and Pitch is easily accessible for those with physical impairment/wheelchair users. The Club and pitch area has specialist equipment for accessibility for wheelchair users. The provisions of the Equality Act are fully addressed within the club vis changing and bar access. The Club has addressed and assisted autistic juniors to fully take part in club activities mindful of privacy issues. The club has small game Nets and hockey sticks available for those with a disability.

#### Membership

The Hockey Club (both men and women) has due to the Pandemic lost a number of senior and middle aged players to other sports and activities. We are a very young club with a large throughput of players due to University Links and employment and scholastic opportunities. We do not have a cadre of much senior players/ administrators as other local clubs. This is slowly being rebuilt with parents with children coming back to hockey with the potential, many being hockey players themselves of rebuilding our Masters teams. In that area we do field a Masters over 40 side and have had a number of players play for our national Masters Teams at international tournaments.

We would hope to grow our membership in specific areas:

- c) University -Men and women
- d) Elite Hockey Schools where we have links- Repton, Rossall, Manchester Grammar.
- e) Working with Trafford SSP to provide coaching for local schools/ organisations.

#### **Facilities**

- A) Club has a water-based pitch, built with the Support of Club funds, EH Grants and Hockey Foundation Funding.
- B) The Club also has Access to Pitches at the Armitage centre which are sand dressed and Manchester Girls Grammar School.
- C) The Club has an on-site Club house with changing facilities for both sexes with an on-site Gym and Pool. There are recreational facilities ie a bar/ food to make the club user friendly for spectators, parents and supporters.
- D) A dedicated viewing area with Disabled access and stand.
- E) Lighting at 350 lux for training with hours of usage 9am to 9:45 pm.
- F) There is pitch furniture for small games, variety of goals and a number of adult goals to allow multiple use of the pitch.
- G) No Charge is made on the section for usage at present nor ever has been.
- H) No other sport markings are allowed on the Hockey pitch despite it being used for lacrosse training and junior cricket. As at the last detailed assessment of numbers and usage, a footfall of 70,000 used the pitch over a year, the majority being hockey players. This includes the club, its partners and all age groups.
- I) The Pitch at the club is used for league cup games, junior and senior training, Hockey camps, Sunday morning junior training and EH performance Centre usage.
- J) The Sports Club is supportive of facility development and makes provision in its account for replacement of artificial surfaces and strict terms of usage.
- K) There are available times on the pitch during the week that can be utilised for school/organisational use Daytime, early evening 4 until 6, Friday evenings. In short capacity for development usage.
- L) There are Charges for external organisations, but these are reduced for hockey sessions linked to the sections development and are competitive with other local clubs who charge far more.

#### Finance:

- A) The Hockey section-men and women cover its day to day expenditure from Match Fees, varied as to age/ status ie a student. Membership income goes to the Sports Club including Corporate Income from Manchester University.
- B) Sponsorship income-largely used to finance the Elite teams.
- C) Match Fees to cover food / drink for oppositions/ officials.
- D) Raffle Income 125 Club.
- E) Pitch Hire The Sports Club assist as it does on League fees.
- F) The Sports Club do not charge for pitch usage. Hire charges go to the Sports Club not the Section.

- G) Pitch running Costs-met by the Sports Club, as are facility equipment costs
- H) The Hockey Sections prepare Accounts each year that are Submitted to the Club Treasurer for approval to ensure financial probity, sound management and avoidance of debt.
- I) The club allocate annually an amount to assist with junior development depending on need and numbers this is usually around £1000.
- J) The section also seeks grants from organisations for Junior development/ school coaching ie Chris Todd Fund- CHA £500 last season.
