WELCOME FROM BILL LYON PRESIDENT ORRELL RUFC



A warm welcome to all as we look forward to what we all hope will be a good entertaining game and our second home game of the new year. Sadly, the weather defeated us last week and our away game vs Aspull RUFC was cancelled. However, our 2XV did win against Fylde 4, which puts them in second position in the League Table.

With only 3 home games left before the end of this season, our current position does give cause for optimism. There is certainly much to play for and the feeling amongst the players and coaches of both teams is that we are still trying to develop elements of our game to create greater cohesion and understanding to produce the type of rugby we desire. Hopefully, our new Head of Coaching, Paul Wingfield will help in achieving this.

Training numbers are being maintained thus far with around 35 players training each



week. We would still like to see more there the coaches especially would like to see full complements representing the teams, present on a Wednesday night-it can make a real difference.

Fund raising for the joint project goes on apace. Again, many thanks to executive members, junior section coaches and committee, medical team and match day volunteers plus our players and members.

ORRELL RUFC 200 CLUB

This is an excellent opportunity to support your Rugby Club and win cash prizes by being entered in to the monthly prize draw. Welcome to today's game and once again, thank you for your efforts and support over the past 12 months.

Last year was a busy year particularly on the land project and the pace and pressure will increase even more this year. I would like to take this opportunity to update you on where we stand with the fund raising.

Can I remind you that we need to raise £200,000 ourselves over the next 2 years towards the cost of phase 1 of the project in order to access grants for the remainder of the costs to level, drain and sow the pitches. The lead time for the pitches to mature means that we would like to start the first phase as soon as we can **so we need your help now.**

We are in the process of applying for Charitable status for O&WCSC, the application has been submitted to the charity commission so will hopefully be in place in the next 3 months which should allow donations to qualify for gift aid.

I quoted some numbers at the FOPs dinner in November and have since had more donations passed over from WPCC and from our membership secretary. We have a total of 99 individual donors this includes those members who have added a small donation onto their membership payment. All donors (names only) will be published in our next newsletter and will be carried forward into a more permanent recognition once we occupy our new ground. We are open to suggestions on what type of recognition you think would be appropriate.

In the 4 months since we sent appeal letters to all members and former members we have received donations and pledges totalling £56,000, if we add to that the potential gift aid associated with the pledges that takes the amount up to between £67,000 and £70,000. When we then add in the proceeds from the Dinner Dance that takes the total to nearly £75,000. The club also has a separate fund built up over recent years largely from the proceeds of the 200 club and some one-off donations which could add to that. We still need about a further £110,000 to hit our target for the first phase of the project. However, if we take into account possible associated gift aid, our target comes down £90,000. So we are around half way to our total. But we cannot get complacent or rely on a relatively few generous members we need all members to help in whatever way thev can.

Please don't think that you can't contribute because you can't make a lump sum (or a promise of a lump sum) payment. We've had a couple of members set up a monthly Standing Order to the club (in addition to their membership) and are making a monthly donation to the JV Fund and are happy to extend this to any of our members and supporters who would like to contribute in this way. Please get in touch with either myself or the Treasurer Karl Lee, who will provide you with details of how to do this

At last count we had some 270 adult members so there are many more that haven't donated than those that have so let's see if we can double the number of 99 donors by this summer.

ORRELL V OSWESTRY SATURDAY 13TH JANUARY 2018

Orrell kick offed and then immediately give away a penalty. Oswestry had most of the possession of the ball and Orrell continued to give away penalties and eventually Orrell were reduced to 14 players when Michael Cardwell was Yellow Carded after 9 minutes play. A few minutes later the visitors took advantage of their extra player and from a ruck 15 metres out, ran the ball to touch down for the opening score the game. The try was converted to give Oswestry 7-point lead. 4 minutes later and still one man down, Orrell won a line-out and then got a penalty 15 metres out. They took a guick tap of the ball and moved the ball quickly for scrum half Kieran Herbert to score. The try was converted by Chris Owen to level the score at 7 points each. Midway through the half, Orrell turned over the ball at a visitor's ruck, 25 metres out from Oswestry s line. A long pass by Dan Huxley, put winger Chris Wynn in the clear and he outpaced the cover to touch down in the corner. Chris Owen converted the try, to put Orrell in the lead 14 – 7 and still one man down.

When back to full strength, Orrell went further ahead with a Chris Owen penalty. 17-7. Orrell however continued to give away penalties. With just under 5 minutes left in the half Centre John Presho had to retire with a pulled hamstring and was replaced by Martin Gleeson. Just before the break, Orrell got a penalty 40 metres out. They again tap the ball, and with quick hands, set up a ruck 10 metres from the line. Jon Pegg picks the ball up from the ruck, to race over the line for Orrell's 3rd try. Chris converted to make the score at Half Time Orrell 24 Oswestry 7.

Orrell received the ball from the restart and ran the ball back down their left wing and then moved the ball across the field for Chris Wynn to score his second try in the corner. The conversion was missed, making the score Orrell 29 Oswestry 7, but Orrell got a bonus point for a 4th try.

Orrell again tried to run the ball from the restart, but give away penalties, putting them back 10 metres from their own line. Oswestry tap the ball, but are held up over the line after good work by the forwards, including prop John Statter. Orrell cleared their line and Orrell forwards put pressure on Oswestry's scrum and several times won the opposition's put in.

Just over 10 minutes into the half, Oswestry had a player Yellow Carded. A few minutes later and Orrell run the ball at the visitors and after, several pick up and drives, move the ball out to Jordan Topping, playing his first game for the First Team, on the wing to score in the corner. The conversion was missed, but Orrell's lead was extended to 34–7. From the restart, Orrell again ran the ball back, and again after several Pick Up and Drives, moved the ball out to Jordan Topping, to again touch down in the corner. Chris converted making the score Orrell 41–Oswestry 7.

Although with Oswestry back to full strength and prop John Statter replaced Orrell continued to dominate the scrums. With just over 10 minutes left in the game, Orrell were awarded a scrum 30 metres out, won the ball and moved it to Full Back Chris Owen, who darted through the opposition to score between the post for Orrell's 7th try. He then converted his try to make the score Orrell 48 — Oswestry 7. From the restart, however it was Oswestry that set up an attack, but were stopped 10 metres out. Orrell then went back to giving away penalties, and were unable to add any more points, leaving the score, Orrell 48 — Oswestry 7 at the final whistle.


We thought we'd reprint some of those memories today:


