Chairman's Message



In the previous programmes this season I said that I would keep you updated on progress with the project to establish our own playing facilities and particularly fund raising. I also set out the challenges we face in establishing our own playing facilities and I make no apologies for repeating them here again this week

Our challenge is simple, we need to raise £200,000 ourselves over the next 2 to 3 years towards the cost of phase 1 of the project which is the levelling and draining of the land and sowing of the pitches. Because of the lead time for the pitches to mature we need to start phase one as soon as we can so we need your help now.

We recently sent out appeal letters to all members and former members and have had a good response in some areas. At the time of writing we have had over 200 register for full membership to which we expect to add over 100 junior members. We have increased membership of the 200 club by 25% to 126 and we have received 30 donations or pledges bringing the total amount in the development fund to just over £38,000.

I would like to thank those people that have responded with donations or pledges, A significant number of the donations were very generous, however, they come from only 6% of those that received the appeal letters.

1XV Match Report: Winnington Park v Orrell Saturday 7th October 2017

Orrell were away to an unbeaten Winnington Park on a raining afternoon. Tom Bramwell and David Price were making their debut for the First team.

In the opening few minutes of the game, Orrell started well and a number of pickups and drives took them close to their opponent posts, but the Home sides defence stopped Orrell scoring. A few minutes later, again after several pick up and drives, Orrell were awarded a penalty, but the conversion was missed. Eventually Winnington get into the Orrell half and from a line out the set up a rolling maul then move the ball out to their back to score a try in the corner. The conversion was missed, giving them, 5 points lead after 15 minutes play. 5 minutes later Orrell give away a penalty which is converted to extend the Home side lead to 8 points. With just over 10 minutes left in the first half, Orrell were penalised for taking a scrum down and Winnington Park extended their lead with another conversion to 11 points to nil. Another penalty against Orrell for a late tackle enabled the Home side to kick another penalty to take their lead to 14 points. In the last few minutes of the half, good defences work by Orrell stopped the Home side extending their lead to leave the score at half time Winnington Park 14 Orrell 0.

In the opening few minutes of the second half, as they did in the first half, Orrell took the play deep into their opponent's half, but then gave away a penalty, which took the play back into their own half. 15 minutes into the half, a penalty kick by the Home side gives them a line out on Orrell 22m line. Winnington win the line out and move the ball in field and them back to touch down in the corner for their second try, which was converted to extend their lead to 21 points to Nil.

The wet conditions appeared to affect the handling of both sides and although Orrell had a number of good pick up and drives, no scoring chances resulted. With less than 10 minutes left in the game one of the Winnington players was Yellow Carded for persistent off side. Winnington then had to defend in their own half for the next few minutes, but eventually cleared the ball into the Orrell half. Orrell were themselves reduced to 14 players when Lloyd Davies was Yellow Carded for kicking through in a Ruck just has the game moved into stoppage time. Winnington then got possession of the ball and moved it across the field to touch down in the corner for their 3rd try. The try was converted and immediately the referee blows his whistle for Full time with the Final score Winnington Park 28 Orrell Nil.

Orrell RUFC 2XV From the drawing board to now





"I have been asked by the club to write a programme article for the next First Team Home Match 14th October 2107 writing firstly about myself, which I found uncomfortable to say the least, and secondly about the Second Team which I found much easier-I am very proud of what the team, everyone that is connected to it, and what has been achieved to date" *Glynn Worley*.

I began playing rugby union at Up Holland Grammar School in 1975, at the age of 11 and started playing at Orrell RUFC the same year. The early years were a bit of a mixed bag. As the years went by the teams and hopefully I got better and better. The best years were those between 1980 – 1983, during this time the Grammar School which had become Winstanley College reached the Semi Finals of the all England Schools Competition. The Orrell team that I played in boasted some real quality players; Gerry Ainscough, Stuart Cayzer, Chas Cusani, Micky Glynn, Shaun Wane and David Swann (who both went

on to make a careers in RL). We won the Lancashire Colts Cup and a 15 a side competition at Carlisle RUFC we went through the season unbeaten home and away.

At that time I played in a combined Winstanley College and St John Rigby team which played touring sides such as the National Dutch RU team, the team boasted players of both establishments including the late great Mike Gregory and Joe Lydon.

I was fortunate to get into the Orrell RUFC first XV on 2 occasions when we played Northern and then Hull and East Riding (incidentally both away games) I don't think that there were sufficient available to make the trip—no real change there!

In 1984 I joined Greater Manchester Police and moved away from the Orrell area. I played for Manchester RUFC and the Police Division where I was based. We won the Chief Constables Cup competition on 4 occasions. I also represented Greater Manchester Police and played in the P.A.A. Championships (National Police Competition), eventually hanging up my boots at the age of 42, undergoing surgery to my right knee having a full reconstruction.

I returned to the club in 2014 when I had retired from the police. I have two coaching badges 'Rugby Ready' and 'Scrum Factory'

The Development Team (later the second team)

At the Executive meeting in December (2014) I was asked to try and build a team in addition to the first team. I was given a free hand by the Executive, I initially thought what will this team be about?

The core values of the team:

- 1. Enjoyment-rugby for all levels of ability and age
- 2. Player development- support for players aiming to progress their rugby within the club
- 3. Player rehabilitation- gradual return of players who have been injured.
- 4. Regular games- enter the team into the Raging Bull League 5 the time table for this wasn't set, but the 2015 2016 season seemed to be an appropriate target.
- 5. Broadening of the player base- the bigger the playing base the bigger the club, this would enhance the stature of the Club in the eyes of the RFU.



The Development Team Season 2014 - 2015

On match days I initially had help from Peter Carletti (now one of the first team coaches)

Saturday 13 December 2014 was The First Development team game against Leigh RUFC 3rd Team the game was played at home prior to the First XV match we managed to get a team onto the pitch, we were however reliant at that time on some of our older players namely Jeff Huxley and Rob Jones taking the field. As it happens they both played well as did the team and we won 20-0 a really good start and something to build on.

The result was the spring board that was needed to help with the recruitment and retention of players. Initially we struggled to get enough players to take to the pitch.

After a decent first season I decided to enter the team into Raging Bull League 5 North. And we would play our matches at Winstanley College.

The Club now had the details of over 50 people who want to pull on the Orrell jersey!

The Second Team Season 2015 - 2016

First season we did well finishing mid table. And it was at this point that Peter and I were joined by Andrew Carroll and it was the 3 of us who now to control of the team.

We went through the whole of the season with 100% record at home winning all our matches.

Season 2016 - 2017

At the beginning of last season our target was to get as many of the team training as possible and to finish higher in the league than the mid—table position that we had the previous season.

We surpassed all our expectations – we won the league and were promoted to League 4 North at the end of the 2016-2017 season.

Again we went through the whole of the season with 100% record at home winning all our matches. At this point Peter and Andrew decided to take on the challenge of managing and coaching the Orrell RUFC First XV

Season 2017 - 2018

At the start of this season I was joined by Matthew Stafford who will be looking after the Second Team with me. At the time of writing we are 3rd in Division 4 North- 3 Wins 1 Draw and 1 Loss.

The Future

Complete the season with our home record of winning every match intact, to progress past the first round in the cup and to finish in the top half of the League.

We have already achieved one of those goals – we are through to the second round of the cup.

There are now over 130 players who have registered an interest and play for the club some with the first team but the majority with the second team.

May be there's someone who would look to forming a Third XV?


