The planning decision means that both Orrell RUFC and Winstanley Park Cricket Club will now have a permanent home and an opportunity to boost both our thriving junior sections.

The new venture will be known as Orrell and Winstanley Community Sports Club.

Once up and running, the facility will be available to other community groups, with a particular focus on providing a sporting outlet for children which will help create a more cohesive and sustainable community.

"Now the hard work begins" said Tony Havlin, Chairman of Orrell RUFC "but we are up for the challenge of raising the funds needed to build our new home and provide facilities, albeit in the future, for not just the rugby and cricket clubs but the wider community as well".

Tony Dillon, Chairman of Winstanley Park Cricket Club said "yes, it's going to be hard but the end result will be fantastic for everyone concerned."



"This is the start of the future for Orrell RUFC. I, like many others, were blessed with the opportunity to be able to join the Club.

I was aged 13 and the years that followed shaped me into the person I am. I was a ball boy, score board operator and glass collector. I met my wife through connections with Orrell. My wedding "do" and two of our three Christenings were at Orrell.

The rugby itself and the mates I played with is at the heart of everything....uniquely.

The point I want to make is just how much a life (mine) benefited from joining Orrell.

The tragedy of being "homeless" is others have missed out on the enjoyment we had. Looking forward, other young people will now have the same chance....they will have their "field of dreams".

Once we have our new constitution, we will then apply for charity status for both the rugby club and the cricket club (which will help in our fundraising and grant applications).

FIELD OF DREAMS TRUST FUND

We have come a long way in the past 10 years - we have a thriving and growing junior section with teams ranging from U7s to U16s and two open age sides. In addition, our recently established Touch Rugby team is achieving great results with their 02 accreditation. We now also have two girl's teams U13s and U15s – something we have never had before – and we are also thinking of starting a women's team (so that the mums, grandmas & big sisters don't miss out on this great game). In addition, we have a great set of members and an active social calendar. All of this despite having something of a nomadic existence around the various school facilities in the area!

Both clubs have invested a significant amount into the project and now that we have secured planning permission, are looking to raise funds to start the project. The implementation plan is to phase the development as funds allow, and begins with the preparation and seeding of the land, so that we can use the pitches as soon as possible. We are in the process of negotiating vacant possession with the current agricultural tenant, after which, we will enter a more detailed design stage and start site preparation activities.

This will require even more funding and we are now asking supporters and members of the Club to become a Community Fund Member by donating to our newly created Field of Dreams Trust Fund.

Our fundraising team are working hard researching grants and sponsorship options that we can apply for and are looking at other ways of fundraising such as crowdfunding and major events - but we really need your help to start the rugby ball rolling.

Any donation - big or small, will mean you will become part of the fabric of this new and exciting community hub. You may like to just register your interest at this stage or be happy to give a donation.

We will be sending out more details to all our members over the next few weeks. Don't miss your opportunity to become a part of the regeneration of our club.



The Journey from Nothing to Promotion

[Continued from Front Page] From that initial meeting in 2014 and a recruitment drive, the "development team" had over 50 players who wanted to pull on the Orrell RUFC jersey and between them won 7 out of their first 8 games.

Determined that the team should grow and develop, Glyn Worley, Manager of the 2XV, entered the team into the Raging Bull League for the 2015-2016 season. They also changed their name to Orrell RUFC 2ndXV – much more fitting – given they had developed beyond recognition!

During the 2015-2016 season, the team continued to grow its player base but due to the inclement weather that season, several games had to be cancelled or rearranged, which impacted everyone in the League. Determination not development should have been their handle at this stage, completing all but one fixture, the team finished the League in 5th place.

Ever thankful to Bucket and Sponge's Vanessa, our Team Physio, who dealt with the large number of injuries sustained (although not as bad as the oppositions) – even having to call out the ambulance service on 3 separate occasions.

Hoping not to have to continue its relationship with the local Ambulance Service, the 2XV limped into the 2061-2017 season with a player base that had now increased to 109 and an increased determination to develop the players on that list and create some team stability. The team's relationship with Winstanley College also continued to grow.

At the beginning of April, the team were equal with Leyland on 68 points. However, in their current league, when those points are equal the determining factor is the number of games conceded.

As Leyland had conceded a game, the 2XV were actually in first position! Following the match against Kirkby Lonsdale on 8 April, promotion was still beckoning by scoring 1 point in the next game but to become League Champions the lads would have to win both of their remaining games. Now we know that is something they had planned to do anyway but it was still a nail-biting and nervous point for the team and Manager Glynn.

A win against Preston Grasshoppers on 22nd April, followed by a win against Garstang on 29 April saw the 2XV not only gain promotion but also finish as League Champions.

On a 21 game winning steam (2 of the teams we beaten have dropped out of the league – no pressure from us honestly); the team now has 138 people registered on the Second Team contact list. The team have played all their games at Winstanley College for the last 2 seasons and have a 100% home record over both seasons.

Everyone in the ORUFC family is extremely proud of our glorious 2XV and they certainly promote the Proud History – Bright Future


RFU PRESIDENTS VOLUNTEER LIFETIME AWARD BILL LYONS

Bill has been a club member for over 50 years. As a player Bill was a member of the Orrell side of the seventies that started to put the club on the map. He represented Lancashire on many occasions in the 1970s and was a member of the Northwest counties squad that beat the All Blacks in 1973. He captained the Seven Team in the years where the club had great success in seven's tournaments around the country—further helping to add to the clubs growing reputation at that time.

When he retired from playing Bill applied his intelligent rugby brain to coaching, he was an ever present on the various coaching teams through the years of success and during the club's decline. Bill carries great respect around the clubs of Lancashire and amongst the coaches and players that he has dealt with. His experience and unstinting effort have been a key factor in helping Orrell RUFC survive.
