1XV MATCH REPORT, 8TH SEPTEMBER 2018 ORRELL RUFC VS BIRCHFIELD RFC

Orrell started the game brightly and pressured Birchfield into conceding a succession of 3 early penalties, ably converted by Craig Thomas to give Orrell a 9-0 start after just 15 minutes. Slick passing through the backs resulted in a try in the right corner for Wynne on 18 minutes.

The heavy Birchfield pack then slowed the game, and they gained territorial advantage through a series of penalties conceded by Orrell. Two tries in quick succession on 35 and 40 minutes from clever fly kicks by the Birchfield full back gave them a score line of just 14-12 in Orrell's favour at the break.

During the interval Orrell were urged to play to their strengths in attack and to cease the infringements. They duly obliged and the expansive game with which they had started the match returned. The ball moved freely between forwards and backs, with Orrell running from all areas of the field. This led to a succession of tries from Andy Bourne, Max Huxley (2), and Lloyd Davies to extend Orrell's lead to 38-14 mid way through the second half.

Orrell made changes, bringing Kyle Herbert into the front row to replace Mark Williams, and Matty Johnson into the back line to replace Wynne. The changes halted Orrell's attack momentarily, and they conceded a 3rd Birchfield converted try on 70 minutes.

The wake-up call rallied Orrell, and a succession of quick passes over 60 metres saw Bourne score his second try five minutes before the end, for Orrell to win by 43-19.

Several the Orrell players of the 1980s played in this team in the Amsterdam sevens tournament; Ian Wynn recalls playing for them a couple of times at the Amsterdam sevens as does Mark Hart "I had the pleasure of playing in two of the tournaments once for the White Hart Marauders and once for their reserve side the Corso Marauders. Both tournaments resulted in some great memories and it was great to play with and against top class players like Gavin Hastings, Micky Skinner etc. Big Fred was a great character as was the guy to the right of him Dave Short"

IN MEMORY OF THE WHISTLEBLOWER DAVID MATTHEWS

It is with great sadness that we report that David Matthews died last week following a heart attack over the weekend. David was a long serving honorary life member of Liverpool St. Helens RFC. He was President of Lancashire County RFU for 2014/2015. He enjoyed twenty years on the RFU Referee List, including two seasons on the International Panel between 1992-94. This also comprised Assistant Referee duties and work as Television Match Official for eleven years to 2012. He will be greatly missed. This was his last article which I am sure you will not mind if we dedicate it to him in his memory. Orrell RUFC extend their condolences to his wife Helen and family.

NEW REFEREES MAKE IT ALL SEEM SO LONG AGO

It was a pleasure on August 25th to watch SKYís coverage of the second game in the Bledisloe Cup series between New Zealand and Australia, magnificently handled by England's Wayne Barnes and ably supported by Luke Pearce on the line. He, too, is nearing the very top and their fairly rapid progress can make you feel very old. Two memories stand out, one from so long ago. I cannot pinpoint the date and the other just twelve months back.

The first was in fact so distant in the memory that Halifax were still in existence and were hosts to then Division Two Worcester, in the Pilkington Cup. Very much a test for the visitors at a time when knock-out rugby was a major attraction and the challenge of refereeing it fell to Wayne Barnes. As touch judge I was able to observe at first hand why he was already a real prospect, although his candid admission after a hard fought two point victory for Worcester was that he had learned more that afternoon than in the entire season.

Almost exactly a year ago I happened to be in the crowd for Leicester v Bath; the referee was Luke Pearce and as he jogged by on his pre-match warm

up I called to him from my front row stand seat; his response was to vault the advertising boards and come up to offer his greetings. Cool, calm and collected, his youthful athleticism in jumping the wall said it all. He proceeded to enjoy an excellent game. The age gap and how refereeing has advanced so fast are striking.

Thinking back to the time when one lady, the meticulous Carmen MacDonald seemed to run everything in the RFU Referee Department, one wonders how it all fell into place. But, there was hardly ever a mix-up and she was succeeded by the equally efficient Kate Sadler who took the world of organising the referees to new heights.

When the game officially became professional in 1995 the profile of referees, beginning with the RFU Panel who were appointed to the league fixtures, was transformed. They were paid, so took on more accountability, standards did improve as a result of training, coaching and support. Not before time, kit was supplied so that a uniformity, not evident in the days of providing your own, became established. The sponsors led the way in this, boots and trainers were to follow which did not include the infamous white laces. The story behind this obsession was not entirely apocryphal, as an assessor at the highest level was reported to have said that if two referees were judged to be of similar ability, the one wearing white laces would get the vote! Players did sometimes ask why referees succumbed to this silliness, but to be fair it was only an eccentric minority, although you writer was guilty until very late in his career!

You could say that there have been benefits for what the media love to describe as grass roots rugby, which would be partly true, were it not for the fact that so many clubs are paying their players it is difficult to say at which level this ends. But, in the case of refereeing, so much has improved that it all seems ages ago, a sure sign of getting old.

When I was asked to coach the northwest U15s it was with great pleasure that I accepted the honour. Unfortunately, after the JTC (European championships) in Sterling Scotland, we had a lot of our experience players pull out of the U18s squad which in turn meant that the experienced U15s moved up a age group but the recruitment drive started and within a week I had a selection of inexperienced players to choose from and we took a very hard working and talented group of juniors.

Initially I had four Orrell Anvils with in the squad Tom Campbell, Ellis Povey, Charlie Wood and India Halsall, unfortunately due to a prior commitment Tom Campbell had to withdraw from the squad. Ellis had only played touch for weeks, Charlie Wood for 3 months and India Halsall the most experienced not only out of the Anvil player but the whole of the U15s squad with just 12 months experience.

We first came together as a squad just 6 days before the finals, so a lot of work was needed to bring players together and bond, with players came from several clubs around the northwest, Lymm RUFC, Crewe and Nantwich RUFC and Orrell RUFC.

Even though we lacked experience we had bags of heart and determination and gave our all. Ellis played outstanding running the mid area directing players around the field and leading by example; Charlie was outstanding initially playing in link using the blistering speed he has dragging defenders backwards and forwards across the field making spaces for players to run into. Charlie made spaces for the wingers where our top scorer came into her own with four scores finishing great moves off with great hands and technique. Not only did India score plenty of scores she also prevented us conceding several scores with unbelievable defence. We played against players that have been playing for years, one of the teams had 14 out of 16 England internationals at U15s level and we gave every team a great game.

The feedback we received from referees, spectators and opponents' coaches was how good of a squad we had and they couldn't believe that we had such a young and inexperienced squad which for any coach to hear is amazing.

We had parents, players and opponents' coaches vote for squad MVP's and it was a very close vote, but Ellis pipped Charlie by 1 vote and the girls was slightly wider with India getting the vote by 2 votes. What a great weekend with great effort and commitment from the Anvils.

The U18s with Orrell RUFC represented by Jake Hattersley took second place out of all he regions in the UK. Last but no means least, Robert Berne (Bernie) playing and coaching the o45s. The squad had a great run but unfortunately didn't quite have enough experience within the squad. However, it was fantastic to have so many players selected to represent

the Northwest and to see five players take to the field with their respected squads. Well done to all.

Anyone interested in playing Touch Rugby, training takes place on a Friday evening at St John Rigby College. The U15s training is also going to continue throughout the winter. Come and join the fun!
