As we reach the last match before the Christmas break, I would like to wish all players, members and visitors the compliments of the season and thank you for your efforts and support over the past 12 months. It has been a busy year and we look forward to an even busier and productive 2018.

We have a full calendar of events planned for the year, starting with our Sports Dinner on 8th March with a most impressive speaker, International Referee Nigel Owens. We are looking for sponsors for the event, so anyone who liked to get involved (or even just buy a ticket or book a table) then please get in touch with Dave Hewlett our Commercial and Sponsorship Manager.

You will find a full page of all the other events we have planned so far in the programme this week. I hope all of you will continue to support our events and spread the word to your friends and colleagues.

It has also been a busy year on the Land Project or our Field of Dreams as we like to call it. Hope you won't mind me reminding you where we stand – tis the season of good will and all that. You may remember that we need to raise £200,000 ourselves over the next 2 years towards the cost of phase 1. This will allow us to access grants for the remainder of the costs to level, drain and sow the pitches. The lead time for the pitches to mature means that we would like to start phase one as soon as we can, so any donation, big or small, will be gratefully received.

I quoted some numbers at the recent FOPs dinner and have since had more donations passed over from WPCC and from our membership secretary. We have a total of 98 individual donors this includes those members who have added a small donation onto their membership payment. All donors (names only) will be thanked in our next newsletter and will be carried forward into a more permanent recognition once we occupy our new ground. We are open to suggestions on what type of recognition you think would be appropriate.

In the 3 months since we sent appeal letters to all members and former members we have received donations and pledges totalling £55,000, if we add to that the potential gift aid associated with the pledges that takes the amount up to between £65,000 and £68,000. When we then add in the proceeds from the Dinner Dance that takes the total over £70,000.

The club also has a separate fund built up over recent years largely from the proceeds of the 200 club and some one-off donations which could add to that. We still need about a further £120,000. However, if we consider possible associated gift aid that brings our target down to £96,000. So, we are around half way to our total.

At the FOPs dinner the club was presented with a very generous cheque by one of our main sponsors Colin


Ratcliffe of Brookhouse Construction which could take us over the half way total. So many thanks to Colin and his wife Michelle for their generosity and continuing support.

We are very pleased with the encouraging start to our fundraising and would like to say thank you to all our supporters and the donations we have received to date. There is still some way to go, so in the New Year we will also be launching several other fundraising initiatives, including our new Crowd Funding platform. We also have some ideas around a "Plant a Tree" fundraiser and a "buy a brick". Lots of ideas so keep an eye on the website and social media as we launch each new initiative.

As ever, if you have any business or personal contacts that you think would be interested in sponsoring or partnering with us on the project then let us know, we have lots of information that we can share with them.

I would also like to take this opportunity to say thank you to everyone who work hard behind the scenes here at Orrell RUFC, making sure the ground is ready for the home matches, making sure the home & visiting teams have refreshments after the matches, the committee who keep the club running, our coaches and our players. Merry Christmas to you and your families.

Finally, I would like to wish all our sponsors and supporters a very Merry Christmas and a happy, health and prosperous New Year. We look forward to working/playing and fundraising with you all during 2018. Merry Christmas!

Toc H kept Orrell first team guessing pre-match by providing two potential venues for the game dependent on pitch conditions at their home ground. A phone call from Orrell just before setting off prompted the response that the match was to be played at Manchester Met University on an all-weather 3G pitch. This was met with some disdain and a lack of enthusiasm by Orrell. However, the most pleasing aspect of the game from a coaches' point of view was that we persevered and weathered early Toc attacks, with some typically first-rate defense, which is becoming a dogged trait of resilience and effort throughout the Orrell club.

Even with the advantage of two first half sin bins the home side were unable to grasp an advantage. Whichever Orrell player came onto the field through interchanges they all defended superbly, and the score line of 0-0 until the 70th minute was testimony to that. Orrell also had chances of their own, and could easily have been 6-0 to the good, had Craig Thomas not chosen to hit the posts on two occasions rather than kicking penalties between them. Sadly on 70 minutes, Craig was forced to leave the field with a dislocated shoulder, which will keep him out of action until well into the New Year. Our best wishes are with him.

From the ensuing passage of play Toc H took the lead, but undeterred Orrell responded with some great forward support play, eventually releasing to the backs for Tom Halsall to score a great team effort wide left in the last minute. Replacement kicker Alex Gannon slotted the conversion with aplomb to give us a much deserved win.

Much thanks from Andy and myself goes to the lads who stepped up into the firsts, following cancellation of the second team game. It is nice to see the camaraderie which extends throughout the club.

Big thanks also go to Peter Anglesea, who gave up his time last Wednesday to provide a great training session for all, and fresh approach to the rucking and tackling aspects of the game.

1XV MATCH REPORT 25 NOVEMBER ORRELL V HEATON MOOR



Orrell had lost to Heaton Moor, by 1 point when they had meet 5 weeks before in the Quarter Final of the Lancashire Plate. Orrell were up against a heavier Heaton Moor pack and the game was played on a very wet pitch. Orrell kicked off, but in the opening minutes of the game, they gave away a penalty. Heaton Moor kicked for touch, then won the line out and drove the ball, and got another penalty 15 meters from the Orrell line, which they converted to give them 3 points lead after just 5 minutes play. Heaton Moor had the chance to extend their lead with another penalty kick at goal when they were awarded another penalty for Orrell being Off Side, but the kick when just wide. Fortunately, it was not just Orrell who were giving away penalties and 30 minutes into the half Orrell won a line out from a penalty inside their opponents 22 meters and after several pick up and drives Jonny Pegg touched down for a try. The conversion was missed, but Orrell had the lead 5-3. A few minutes later Orrell were down to 14 players when Hooker Lloyd Davies was Yellow Carded for coming into a ruck from the side. Heaton Moor were unable to take advantage of their extra player and the score remained Orrell 5 Heaton Moor 3 at Half Time.

In the opening minutes of the second half Orrell continued to give away penalties and 5 minutes into the half, when they were back to full strength Heaton Moor won a line out from another penalty inside the Orrell 20 metre line and drove the ball over the line to score their 1st try. The conversion was missed but the visitors were back in front 5 – 8. When Heaton Moor tried to run the ball Orrell players produced some great tackles. Orrell had the chance of levelling the score with a penalty kick at goal, but the ball went just wide. Midway through the half Heaton Moor, after several pick up and drives. moved the ball out to their left centre who stepped back inside, to wrong foot the Orrell defence, and scored the visitors 2nd trv. which was converted to extend their lead to 5pts to 15pts.

A few minutes later Orrell got well into their opponents and got a penalty and as they were 10 points behind, they took a tapped ball, but after several pick up and drives, they knocked on. 10 minutes from the end Heaton Park had a player Yellow Carded. Orrell tried to move the ball along their line, but as the ball became difficult to handle, due to the wet conditions, they were unable to take advantage of their extra players and at the final whistle the score remained at Orrell 5 Heaton Moor 15.

1XV MATCH REPORT 2 DECEMBER DIDSBURY TOC H V ORRELL

Orrell would like to thank Peter Anglesey from Sale for taking a training session on Wednesday before Orrell's away game against Didsbury Toc H.

Didsbury's pitch was unfit, and they switched the game to an Astro turf pitch at Manchester University facilities.

Orrell set up an attack in the opening minutes of the game, but the last pass was knocked on. Didsbury then had a chance to open the scoring with a penalty, but declined the kick at goal, and kicked for touch. Didsbury won the line out, then got a scrum 10m from the Orrell line. Orrell's defence stopped Didsbury getting over the line. Then Orrell were awarded a penalty to take play back up field.

Just over 10 minutes into the game Orrell were reduced to 14 players when Andy Stott was yellow carded for a high tackle. Orrell again had to defend close to their own try line, but Didsbury were unable to take advantage of their extra player and the score remained at 0-0 when Orrell were back to full strength.

15 minutes from the break Orrell set up a good attack down their right wing, but were unable to score. 5 minutes later Orrell had a chance to take the lead, when they were awarded a penalty. Craig Thomas took a penalty kick, but the ball hit the outside post and bounced back into play.

3 minutes from Half Time Orrell were again reduced to 14 players, when Matt Farrimond was Yellow Carded. Orrell again had to defend close to their own line, but stopped Didsbury's attack when they forced them into touch and the score remained at 0 – 0 at Half Time.

Early in the Second Half Didsbury set up an attack and got a scrum 10m from the Orrell line. They were then awarded a penalty. They tapped the ball and moved it across the field, but then knocked on. The Home side again attacked the Orrell line a line out 10 m out, but again Orrell's defence withstood the attack and the score was still 0 – 0 when Orrell were back to full strength. 10 minutes into the half Didsbury again attacked, from a line out close to the Orrell line, but again Orrell's defence held out.

Midway through the half had the chance of opening the scoring with a penalty kick, but the ball again hit the outside post and bounced out. A few minutes later Craig Thomas had to be replaced after dislocating his shoulder.

With less than 15 minutes left in the game, Orrell gave away a penalty. Didsbury kicked for touch. They win the line out and after several pick up and drives they move the ball out to score. The conversion was missed, but the Home side now had a 5-point lead.

A few minutes later Didsbury elected to attempt a penalty kick to extend their lead, but the kick went wide.

In the dying moments of the game Orrell were awarded a penalty. They kick for touch and have a lineout 15 m from the Didsbury line. They win the lineout and move the ball across the field and Centre Tom Halsall touches down to level the scores. The kicking duties were taken over by Andy Cannon. His conversion kick went over the bar to give Orrell the lead 5-7 and immediately the referee blew his whistle for the end of the game.


