Chairman's Message Tony Havlin

Welcome to today's game and once again, thank you for your efforts and support over the past 12 months.

As we continue our fundraising efforts it is worth reminding ourselves of the spirit and values that helped to make the club so successful for 40 years starting in the 1960's. Much of that club spirit came from the social aspects of the game. Since losing Edge Hall Road we have been limited in our ability to meet regularly and to generate that feeling of togetherness. That is why the project to build our own facilities is so important.

The 2XV and our U15s have started to use Winstanley Tennis club for pre and post-match refreshments to try to build the club spirit. There was great support for our post-match refreshments on 24 February, when both teams played at home and we are hoping to repeat this again when the 2XV play their cup match on 17th March. We are determined to pass on to the current players and newer members of all ages what the club means to us all, so please come along and help us to do that.

Of course once we have our own facilities we can do that every week. I will not repeat all I have said in previous weeks programmes, but I would like to remind you that we need to raise £200,000 ourselves over the next 2 years towards the cost of phase 1 of the project in order to access grants for the remainder of the costs to level, drain and sow the pitches. The lead time for the pitches to mature means that we would like to start the first phase as soon as we can so we need your help now.

Since publishing our recent newsletter we have had a couple more donations but **we need more members or sponsors to come forward.** We have a total of 98 individual donors. A list of all donors (founder members) was published in our newsletter and is reproduced once again in today's programme. The list will be added to over the next year and will be carried forward into a more permanent recognition once we occupy our new ground. We are open to suggestions on what type of recognition you think would be appropriate.

In the 4 months since we sent appeal letters to all members and former members we have received donations and pledges totalling £56,000, if we add to that the potential gift aid associated with the pledges that takes the amount up to between £67,000 and £70,000. When we then add in the proceeds from the Dinner Dance that takes the total to nearly £75,000. Our successful Sports Dinner on Thursday this week will also add to the pot. The club also has a separate fund built up over recent years largely from the proceeds of the 200 club and some one-off donations which could add to that. We still need about a further £110.000 to hit our target for the first phase of the project. However, if we take into account possible associated gift aid, our target comes down £90,000. So we are around half way to our total. But we cannot get complacent or rely on a relatively few generous members we need all members to help in whatever way they can.

Please don't think that you can't contribute because you can't make a lump sum (or a promise of a lump sum) payment. We've had a couple of members set up a monthly Standing Order to the club (in addition to their membership) and are making a monthly donation to the JV Fund and are happy to extend this to any of our members and supporters who would like to contribute in this way. Please get in touch with either myself or the Treasurer Karl Lee, who will provide you with details of how to do this.

At last count we had some 270 adult members so there are many more that haven't donated than those that have so let's see if we can double the number of 98 donors by this summer.

ORRELL V DUKINFIELD SATURDAY 10TH MARCH 2018

Orrells game had to be switched to Winstanley College, where the 2nd team, normally play their Home games, as the ground at St.John Rigby was waterlogged. The pitch at Winstanley is narrower than the ground at John Rigby and has a more noticeable slope.

In November Orrell lost 25-15 away at Dukinfield. Dukinfield played down the slope in the First Half and the visitors soon had Orrell defending in their own half. Orrell gave away a penalty, enabling Dukinfield to get a line out, inside the Orrell 22.After winning the line out the visitor, had several pick up and drives, close to the Orrell in front of their post. Orrell defence held and they were awarded a penalty and were then able to clear their line. However the visitor, again got possession of the ball and attacked down their right wing then kicked ahead and collected the bouncing ball to score an unconverted try to lead 5pts. to Nil after just over 10 minutes play.

About 5 minutes later, Orrell kicked for touch after a penalty. They won the line out, close to the half way line and moved the ball out to the backs, where a good run by Chris Wynn, then by Andy Boure, resulted in Matt Scott scoring an unconverted try to level the score at 5 points each.

After another 5 minutes, Orrell again kicked for touch after being awarded a penalty, to get a line out, about 10m from their opponents try line. Andy Kelly won the ball in the line out and drove over the line to touch down for Orrells second, unconverted try, to give them the lead, by 5pts. 10-5.

After several penalties, line outs and scrums, at one of which Orrell were pushed off the ball, Dukinfield, attempted a penalty conversion, but the ball went wide. A good run, by Full Back Gary Nicholson, from just inside his opponents half, resulted in a ruck. The ball was recycled several times then moved out, quickly across the field, and Gary came into the line to score Orrell 3rd uncovered try, extending their lead to 15 – 5 at Half Time.

Orrell were playing down the slope in the Second half and after a few minutes play, a good break, by Back Row Jon Pegg, from the Half Way line, set up an attack. Eventually, the ball was moved out to the backs and a good run and pass by Tom Halsall, resulted in Andy Bourne, running in to score Orrells 4th try, for a bonus point, extending Orrells lead to 20 – 5, after the conversion attempt was missed.

Orrell then had to defend their own line, but eventually they got control of the ball, and a good one handed pick up of the ball, by Tom Halsall, set up a ruck, close to the Half Way Line about a metre from the touch line. Kerion Herbert, picked up the ball at the base of the ruck and ran through the narrow gap, between the ruck and the touch line, then raced just inside the touch line, down field to score Orrells 5th try. He converted the try to extend Orrells lead to 27 – 5 after just over 10 minutes of the Second Half.

Less than 5 minutes later a good run by back Chris Wynne, set up an attack in the visitors half of the field and the ball then went out to Kerion Herbert, who touched down for his Second Try,.and Orrells 6th The conversion was missed, but Orrell had extended their lead to 32 – 5.

10 minute later, with about 15 minutes left in the game, Dukinfield were attacking, deep inside the Orrell half. The visitors were awarded a penalty, which they tapped and move the ball quickly out to their Left Wing to touch down their 2nd uncovered try, to make the score Orrell 32 Dukinfield 10.

Just over 5 minutes later, Orrell again had control of the ball, just inside their own half, and a good run by forward Carlton Bramwell, set up a Ruck and good work by the forwards and backs secured the ball and them moved out, for Tom Halsall to again pass the ball to Kerion Herbert to score his Hat Trick 3rd try, and Orrells 7th try which was converted to extend Orrells lead to 39 – 10. With less than 2 minutes left in the game, a tired Dukinfield, were unable to stop another Orrell attack and this time Tom Halsall, passed the ball to Matt Stott, who having scored Orrells 1st try of the game raced over the line to touch down for a converted try for Orrells 8th try, his 2nd try and the last Orrell try of the game, to make the final score Orrell 46 Dukinfield 10.

ORRELL 2XV V BLACKBURN 3XV SATURDAY 24TH FEBRUARY

Much praise to the Winstanley College Groundsman for preparing the pitch, which was in great condition for last Saturday's fixture versus Blackburn, having been rolled earlier in the week. Orrell 2s were keen to continue their winning run and create space in the League table between themselves and Blackburn who were in 3rd place.

Orrell's Captain Dixie won the toss and elected to play up the slope. The 2s started brightly taking the game to the opposition, burrowing near to the Blackburn line, but the forwards were collectively penalised by the ref for straying off side giving Blackburn respite. However just 10 minutes into the game Orrell passed the ball through several hands to right winger Dutson who sent a grubber kick past his opposing wing man and fly hacked the ball over the line to score in the right corner. A couple of bull dozing runs by father and son pairing Pete and Leon Harber were then overshadowed by a series of penalties conceded by the forwards, one of which was in front of their posts which Blackburn converted to go into the break with a 5-3 score line.

Orrell began the second half by some strategic kicks by Gannon deep into the Blackburn half, enabling them to put pressure on the opposition line. They got their just reward with a penalty try five minutes in, converted by Gannon. Just two minutes later Leon Harber picked up a knee injury and was replaced by Finney. Blackburn capitalised as Orrell 'readjusted their pack, scoring in the left corner, to close the score to 12-8. Dixie gave a rallying cry to his team, and five minutes later he burst

through from the opposition ten-yard line, beating six players to score.

On 62 minutes, Orrell scrum half Gannon broke from just inside the Blackburn half down the right side with Dixie in support. Showing great composure, he drew the opposing full back and dummied a pass to Dixie, (a reply from being snubbed by his greedy Captain minutes earlier), to score a great individual try, and increase the lead to 22-8.

A questionable refereeing decision moments later, saw Finney depart the field after being given a yellow card for illegally entering a ruck. That meant Orrell had to close out the game with a man down. Typical stalwart tackling achieved that objective and gave Orrell a well-deserved win. Final score 22-8.

A strange 5-5 draw in the Rochdale v Leyland fixture resulted in Orrell claiming top spot, two points clear of Leyland, who have 2 games in hand, in second place. With six league games left to play, fate is for the second year running in Orrell's own hands.

DEWI MORRIS – ENGLAND'S NINTH FORWARD!

Happy St Patrick's Day to everyone and what a better way to celebrate "Paddies Day" than England vs Ireland at Twickenham. History books tells us that England vs Ireland started playing rugby internationals in 1875. The first ever match was won by England by two goals to nil. The match this weekend between England vs. Ireland concludes the RBS 6 Nation Championship 2018.

This week's dip into the Orrell vault we take a look at Dewi Morris and the 1992 5 Nations Championship. Colin Dewi Morris was born on 9th February 1964 in Crickhowell, Wales graduating from Manchester Polytechnic. Dewi's clubs include Winnington Park, Orrell and Sale (we forgive him for playing for Sale).

Dewi's England career debut was in 1998 vs. Australia, but Richard Hill replaced him in 1990 but returned to the England team in 1992 and went on to play for his country 26 times scoring 5 tries in total. A sensational 5 nations campaign led Dewi to be picked for the British Lions in 1993 to face the 'Mighty All Blacks' This tour would be the last Lions tour in the sport's amateur era.

New Zealand won the series 2-1.

5 Nations Championship 1992 – England vs Ireland

Dewi had already scored in England's first match vs Scotland and next came Ireland. With England already in control of the match, Tim Rodber spoils the Ireland lineout and the ball is picked up by Dewi who dummies to Brian Moore and set's off down the touchline, passes ball inside to Brian Moore who returns the ball for Dewi to score in the corner. England went on to win the game 38-9.




