Welcome to today's game and once again, thank you for your efforts and support over the past 12 months.

As we continue our fundraising efforts it is worth reminding ourselves of the spirit and values that helped to make the club so successful for 40 years starting in the 1960's. Much of that club spirit came from the social aspects of the game. Since losing Edge Hall Road we have been limited in our ability to meet regularly and to generate that feeling of togetherness. That is why the project to build our own facilities is so important.

The 2XV and our U15s have started to use Winstanley Tennis club for pre and post-match refreshments to try to build the club spirit. Today, as both 1xv and 2xv teams are at home, we are having a gathering there of both teams after their matches. There are more details elsewhere in the programme but I would encourage you to come along if only for a quick drink. We are determined to pass on to the current players and newer members of all ages what the club means to us all, so please come along and help us to do that.

Of course once we have our own facilities we can do that every week. I will not repeat all I said in last week's programme but I would like to remind you that we need to raise £200,000 ourselves over the next 2 years towards the cost of phase 1 of the project in order to access grants for the remainder of the costs to level, drain and sow the pitches. The lead time for the pitches to mature means that we would like to start the first phase as soon as we can **so we need your help now.** 

Since publishing our recent newsletter we have had a couple more donations but **we need more members or sponsors to come forward**. We have a total of 98 individual donors. A list of all donors (founder members) was published in our newsletter

and is reproduced in today's programme. The list will be added to over the next year and will be carried forward into a more permanent recognition once we occupy our new ground. We are open to suggestions on what type of recognition you think would be appropriate.

In the 4 months since we sent appeal letters to all members and former members we have received donations and pledges totalling £56,000, if we add to that the potential gift aid associated with the pledges that takes the amount up to between £67,000 and £70,000. When we then add in the proceeds from the Dinner Dance that takes the total to nearly £75,000. The club also has a separate fund built up over recent years largely from the proceeds of the 200 club and some one-off donations which could add to that. We still need about a further £110,000 to hit our target for the first phase of the project. However, if we take into account possible associated gift aid, our target comes down £90,000. So we are around half way to our total. But we cannot get complacent or rely on a relatively few generous members we need all members to help in whatever way they can.

Please don't think that you can't contribute because you can't make a lump sum (or a promise of a lump sum) payment. We've had a couple of members set up a monthly Standing Order to the club (in addition to their membership) and are making a monthly donation to the JV Fund and are happy to extend this to any of our members and supporters who would like to contribute in this way. Please get in touch with either myself or the Treasurer Karl Lee, who will provide you with details of how to do this.

At last count we had some 270 adult members so there are many more that haven't donated than those that have so let's see if we can double the number of 98 donors by this summer.

Saturday 17th February 2018 was blessed with good weather, but the poor state of the pitch at St. John Rigby College earlier in the week dictated that the 1sts had to request an alternative venue, to fulfil the home fixture against the travelling Isle of Man side, as per Lancs. RFU rules.

That was the down side, the upshot was that the game was played on Preston's 4G pitch, a fantastic facility, which lends itself to fast flowing rugby.

Orrell started brightly from the Vagabonds kick off, and scored after just one minute, with the 2 points being added from a touchline conversion by Craig Thomas. It was nice to see him return positively after a shoulder injury, sustained in the last fixture on a 4G pitch, against Didsbury TOC H before the Christmas break. Orrell's game plan was executed perfectly throughout the first half, with phased forays by the forwards capitalised by good passing and movement throughout the team and free scoring. Half time score 64-0.

The second half started in similar fashion with several early tries from great passing by Orrell, until Vagabonds were finally afforded a penalty. Rather than throwing caution to the wind at this juncture, they elected to kick the points, to raise their morale from a potential score line of 0. Three points from two more penalties awarded to the

opposition late on resulted in a final score of Orrell 124 Vagabonds 6.

Despite the score line, the opposition deserve praise for the spirit in which they played the game and fulfilling the fixture after a series of mishaps at their end arriving far later than intended at Preston. Thanks also to PGH 4th Team, who were flexible with their 2.15 start time, and kicked off instead at 3 p.m. to ensure Orrell and Vagabonds were able to complete the full 80 minutes.

#### ORRELL ROADS LEAD TO MURRAYFIELD

This weekend Scotland play England for the Calcutta Cup.

Today we remember Scotland vs. England 1980 Grand Slam & Triple Crown Decider. Orrell's John Carleton who we mentioned in an early edition of "down memory lane" was part of the England Squad that season and what a memorable season it was.

#### The Story in Brief 1980 Grand Slam

Many believe that the success of the England team that year was down to two factors; Leicester Tigers contingent who came under the great innovative coach Chalky White (Leicester Tigers) and Lancashire county XV where Des Seabrook coach (Orrell) was an inspiring influence. Lancashire provided the bulk of the North team that had beaten the All Blacks 21-9 in November 1979. Off the back of beating the All Blacks, Bill Beaumont along with his fellow Northern teammates having captained the North to victory, was given the England captain armband to win their 1st Grand Slam in 23 Years.

England had already seen off Ireland, France, and Wales in the notorious blood-bath game at Twickenham.

Only Scotland stood in-front of England making history...

Scotland's tactics was very simple kick the ball around the field and tire out the English forwards, this didn't work, and England

took a strangle hold on the first 30 minutes. Steve Smith (scrum half) & (fly half) John Horton controlled the game and Clive Woodward's (Sir) silky running was a huge factor in the opening tries for Orrell's John Carleton & Liverpool's Mike Slemen. John Carleton scored his 2nd try and the scene was set for JC (as he was affectionately known at Edge Hall Road) to have "his day of days".

Scotland fought back in the second half and the score line was starting to look better for Scotland. Then came along John Carleton, with a landmark hat-trick try — the first time an England player had scored three times in a full international for 56 years. Paul Dodge put up a huge kick which dropped between two hesitant Scotland players, JC followed up the kick, ball bounced into his hands and history was made.

#### Final Score Scotland 18-30 England

JC's contribution that season will forever be part of Orrell's & England's greatest moments in the amateur era. John scored was the leading try scorer in the Five Nations Championship with 4 tries.

1980 Five Nation Champions, 8th Grand Slam, 15th Triple Crown (last won in 1960) & Calcutta Cup winners.

Orrell second XV are on a 100% winning run now having turned into 2018 in 4th place in the Division 4 North Sale Sharks League and are now joint first with Leyland Warriors who were highly fancied to win the league.

Additionally, Sat 10th Feb saw the lads play in the quarter final of the cup the fixture originally supposed to be played in Knutsford was switched to Winstanley College as Knutsford's pitch was deemed unplayable.

The most noticeable feature that has stood out in the last 3 matches is the fact that the points conceded has dropped dramatically. Prior to the game on 27th January self and team discipline was lacking and penalties against were mounting culminating in the Bury match when we conceded over 40 penalties! Since that game the focus for all the team was to reduce the free territory and points we were gifting the opposition. The lads have worked really hard in this area showing a remarkable decrease in penalties conceded in the Sedgley match 14 conceded in 80 minutes, to an amazing 4 conceded in 80 minutes against Knutsford the first penalty we conceded in this match was on the 36th minute!! In fact the first half performance against Knutsford was almost error free and in


