

Chairman's Message




Welcome to this week's game and the latest update on progress with the project to establish our own playing facilities and particularly fund raising. I have also set out the challenges we face in establishing our own playing facilities previously and I make no apologies for repeating them here again this week.

Our challenge is simple, we need to raise £200,000 ourselves over the next 2 to 3 years towards the cost of phase 1 of the project which is the levelling and draining of the land and sowing of the pitches. Because of the lead time for the pitches to mature we need to start phase one as soon as we can so we need your help now.

We recently sent out appeal letters to all members and former members and have had a good response in some areas. We have now had over 300 register for full membership to which we expect to add over 100 junior members. We have increased membership of the 200 club by 25% to 126.

The total amount in the development fund now stands at £51,000.

I would like to thank those people that have responded with donations or pledges, A significant number of the donations were very generous, however, they still only come from only 6% of those that received the appeal letters. Can I please ask that you read our Appeal Letter again and let us know if you would like to help us achieve our dream?



A special thank you this week goes to Pauline Lloyd (and, of course, Jim Lloyd) for their hard work and efforts in making the Dinner Dance last Saturday another outstanding success. Apart from everyone having such a great time, the dance raised more than £2,300 for the development fund. Thank you to everyone who supported the event by attending or donating prizes.

Our Fundraising Group met again this week and we've put together a plan of action for our next fundraising activities, which includes our new Crowdfunding Platform – more details of these

activities/ideas will follow over the next few weeks.

Last Saturday the Orrell 1XV acquitted themselves well against Vagabonds RUFC 1st XV who are having a difficult time with their squad this season. The 2XV suffered a narrow home defeat to Rochdale 3s.

In a coaches meeting earlier this week, the consensus was that better handling by both the Orrell sides could have had a more positive impact. For that reason the focus in Wednesday's training session was on ball skills, which will hopefully bear fruits in this weekend's fixtures.

This Saturday the 1XV welcome Congleton RUFC. Availability for the home fixture is much improved on last week's journey to the Isle of Man, and the side has quality players throughout the forwards and back line. Last Saturday almost all the backs scored in the 74-0 victory. Four tries from Craig Thomas, has now set him firmly as the top try scorer on 15 tries, and he added 7 conversions to that account, scoring 34 points himself. South Lancs/Cheshire League 2: 23rd October 2017 Match Report: Orrell 22 - Port Sunlight 7



On a wet and windy afternoon at SJR the weather was a big factor in the game as storm Brian approached.

Orrell had the wind advantage in the first half and applied early pressure on the Port Sunlight line. Sunlight had the advantage in the scrum and kept the ball tight in the early exchanges. Orrell tried to move the ball at every opportunity despite the wet conditions. Kyle Herbert made a clear break from 30 yards but was brought down by the last defender as the line beckoned. It was in the 17th minute that Orrell broke the deadlock a quick ball was secured in mid-field and the ball moved left for Gary Nicholson to create the extra man and feed Craig Thomas who scored near the post and converted the try himself.

Orrell continued to have territorial advantage and tried to move the ball quickly but there were all lot of handling errors under the conditions. Eventually in the 26th minute passes started to stick and John Presho made a break down the right and did a good off load to Alex Gaskell who made more yards before passing to the supporting Matt Stott who went over for the second try, the conversion was missed.

Sunlight continued to use their big forwards to drive the ball into the wind and number of times were able to put pressure on the Orrell line but Orrell's defence held firm. On the 30th minute Orrell turned over the ball inside their own 22 and put in a long clearance kick which was well followed up by Tom Halsall down the right touchline. The ball was moved quickly left to winger Craig Thomas who looked to have scored but he was pulled back for a forward pass. Sunlight continued to drive the ball up the middle against the elements. Orrell again cleared their lines and on the stroke of half time had possession in the Sunlight 22 thanks to two good drives by Lloyd Davies and support from Tom Halsall play was deep in the 22 near the right hand corner flag. The ball was quickly moved left along the back line for Gary Nicholson joining from full back to score Orrell's third try which was not converted at half time Orrell 17 Port Sunlight 0.

The weather was deteriorating even further and 5 minutes into the second half Orrell full back Gary Nicholson collected a Port Sunlight clearance kick and ran the ball back into the elements gaining 40 yards. From the ensuing ruck Kyle Herbert peeled off and made a powerful run getting behind the Sunlight defence. He offloaded to Craig Thomas who surged inside towards the line and gave a simple pass to John Pesho who scored Orrell's bonus point try which was not converted Orrell 22 Port Sunlight 0. The wind had picked up and the rain lashed down. Sunlight drove into the Orrell 22 and recycled the ball several times before creating space on the left and their number 8 scored a deserved try which was converted.

This weather continued to deteriorate and a few minutes later the referee consulted both captains who agreed to abandoned the match. Orrell take the points and the loyal spectators got to retire early to the Delph tavern.

Full credit to both sets of players who provided an enjoyable competitive game and stuck to their task despite the weather.

Orrell started brightly with a fine run by Pegg who weaved and bashed his way through the Vagabonds team to gain 60 metres and set up an opportunity for an early score. Sadly, handling errors prevented this from happening. However, Orrell re-doubled their efforts, and were rewarded just five minutes into the game with Pegg himself diving over in the right-hand corner.

Sloppy penalties from Orrell allowed Vagabonds to gain some territory in Orrell's half, and more handling errors in a strong headwind by Orrell kept the score at 5-0 for a ten-minute spell. Orrell's left winger Craig Thomas then made a fine solo try running 30 metres to score five yards in from the left touchline, slotting the conversion to extend the lead to 12-0. through the middle of the Vagabonds defense, and a barnstorming run through several defenders by Matty Stott resulted in him scoring under the posts.

Two minutes later from a lineout a clever blindside move by the Orrell forwards created space for Lloyd Davies to run from just outside the opposition 20 metre line straight as an arrow along the left touchline to touchdown. Another great conversion by Thomas increased the Orrell lead to 26-0.

On the half hour a good break by Max Huxley resulted in him diving over on the right side of the field. Craig Thomas again converted from a difficult angle. A short time later Thomas himself again blasted over to touchdown on the left side, converting his own score to take Orrell into the half time break 40 points to the good.

After the break Orrell made two changes, bringing off veterans Jon Statter and Carlton Bramwell, replacing them with Kyle Herbert and James Pearson in the front and second rows. Vagabonds decided to use the wind which was now at their backs to gain field position, and for a few minutes kept Orrell in their own half, until, from a turned over ruck Gary Nicholson made a great break and was halted 10 metres from the line where he was swung round in the tackle into his team mate Kyle Herbert who had to be carried from the field. Statter came back on as replacement, and with a typical show of sympathy thanked Kyle for giving him only 5 minutes rest. As soon as the game restarted Pegg bulldozed his way over the line. Thomas now kicking into a strong wind missed the conversion.

Making amends for the miss Thomas scored moments later and followed it up from the next restart with another great run to touchdown for his fourth try, taking the score to 55-0. After earlier hat tricks against Oldershaw and Oswestry, that now takes his tally to 10 tries for the season.

A few moments later Captain Dan Huxley, who did not wish to be out done by his older cousin Max who was having a well-earned breather, got in on the act from a series of great rucks to bust over the line and score near the posts. Max, fuming at this, pleaded with his long-suffering coach Carletti to return to the action, at the expense of Andrew Stott.

Stott, disappointed in being removed from the try fest commenced to commentate on the play, and explain what he would have done had he been allowed to remain on the field. This torrent of abuse was soon halted however, as Max Huxley, supporting the Orrell fly half Presho, burst through to score his second try, which was converted by Thomas with a difficult kick. Moments later Max finished off a great team effort to complete his hat-trick and end the game with a score line of Vagabond 0 Orrell 74.

After the game Orrell were treated to fine hospitality from the Vagabonds members, who voted Craig Thomas as their man of the match. Some great action shots were also shown on a large screen in the clubhouse. Thanks for these go to the Press photographer, who had turned up expecting to see Gleeson and Long, but was not disappointed due to the standard of Orrell's attacking play.




