WELCOME FROM BILL LYON PRESIDENT ORRELL RUFC



A warm welcome and a Happy New Year to our visitors and all Orrell people at this, our first 1st XV home game of the year. We also offer a very special welcome to our new Head Coach Paul Wingfield and wish him the best of luck in his new position. Paul's impressive record thus far playing and coaching across both codes sets him apart from many coaches through his range of experiences and I feel sure that Orrell will be the beneficiary of his talents. (A more detailed account of Paul's record will be found in further articles, on our web-site and on social media).

Seven defeats so far is disappointing but no reason to panic. Four defeats have been by close margins and the other three recorded against the top two teams in the league. Injuries have not been kind and six first team members have been sidelined for several months. Second team members have stepped-up and acquitted themselves very well, giving the coaches food for thought re selection.

Discipline continues to let us down and has become a major assistance to the opposition. The message has to get through that unnecessary penalties and yellow cards are the difference between winning and losing- certainly in four of our defeats. The creation of a more cohesive structure and development of individuals is ongoing. Application and attitude are the keys to enabling us to achieve more ambitious goals.



The 2nd XV have recorded a very satisfactory first half of the season having gained promotion in the previous season. If the two games in hand are won then they will take up second position in their league. The achievement is noteworthy considering the disruption caused by players promoted to the 1st XV, injuries and availability. Better numbers at training could help the team climb to yet another level

Overall, efforts on the field, ongoing work by support staff, committee members and volunteers goes on apace. Every manner of support is still much sought after-players (of all ages and gender), officials, coaches (senior and Junior), volunteers and fund raisers. Spread the word and help the club achieve our ultimate goal.

ORRELL RUFC 200 CLUB

I wish all players, members and visitors a happy new year. Thank you for your efforts and support over the past 12 months. I would also like to welcome our new head coach Paul Wingfield on his first match in charge you can read a little about him elsewhere in the programme. He comes with good recommendations and has the full support of the executive and the current coaches. I look forward to seeing the team's progress over the rest of the season.

Last year was a busy year particularly on the land project and the pace and pressure will increase even more this year. I would like to take this opportunity to update you on where we stand with the fund raising.

Can I remind you that we need to raise £200,000 ourselves over the next 2 years towards the cost of phase 1 of the project in order to access grants for the remainder of the costs to level, drain and sow the pitches. The lead time for the pitches to mature means that we would like to start the first phase as soon as we can **so we need your help now**.

We are in the process of applying for Charitable status for O&WCSC, the application has been submitted to the charity commission so will hopefully be in place in the next 3 months which should allow donations to qualify for gift aid.

I quoted some numbers at the FOPs dinner in November and have since had more donations passed over from WPCC and from our membership secretary. We have a total of 99 individual donors this includes those members who have added a small donation onto their membership payment. All donors (names only) will be published in our next newsletter and will be carried forward into a more permanent recognition once we occupy our new ground. We are open to suggestions on what type of recognition you think would be appropriate.

In the 4 months since we sent appeal letters to all members and former members we have received donations and pledges totalling £56,000, if we add to

that the potential gift aid associated with the pledges that takes the amount up to between £67,000 and £70,000. When we then add in the proceeds from the Dinner Dance that takes the total to nearly £75,000. The club also has a separate fund built up over recent years largely from the proceeds of the 200 club and some one-off donations which could add to that. We still need about a further £110,000 to hit our target for the first phase of the project. However, if we take into account possible associated gift aid, our target comes down £90,000. So we are around half way to our total. But **we cannot get complacent** or rely on a relatively few generous members we need all members to help in whatever way they can.

At the FOPs dinner the club was presented with a very generous cheque by one of our main sponsors Colin Ratcliffe of Brookhouse Construction which could take us over the half way total. So many thanks to Colin and his wife Michelle for their continuing support.

This has been a very encouraging start to the fund raising, thank you to all donors there are some very generous donations amongst those 99 but every penny counts so if you intend to make a donation of whatever size please let me know now.

At last count we had some 270 adult members so there are many more that haven't donated than those that have so let's see if we can double the number of 99 donors by this summer.

We will be sending out further appeals and will soon be broadening our net outside of our members and former members and would ask that if you have any business or personal contacts that you think would be interested in sponsoring or partnering with us on the project then let us know, we have donor packs providing more information.

1XV MATCH REPORT 6 JANUARY OLDERSHAW VS ORRELL

This was Orrell's first game of 2018, after a break of 2 weeks, away to bottom of the League Club Oldershaw. In the opening few minutes of the game, Orrell took control of the ball and after good work by both wing forwards Jon Pegg and Captain Dan Huxley, a ruck was set up on the Home sides 22 metre line. The ball was move quickly to the backs for centre Tom Halsall to touch down for the opening try. The conversion attempt hit the cross bar and bounced out leaving the score Oldershaw 0 Orrell 5 after 5 minutes play.

Approximately 10 minutes later, Orrell had a lineout some 25m out from Oldershaw's try line. They won the ball and moved it back towards the touch line, then out to the backs. The attack was stopped and a ruck formed, close to the line. Jon Pegg quickly got the ball and drove over the line for Orrell's 2nd try. The try was converted by Chris Owen, extending Orrell's lead 12 points to Nil.

Orrell did then have to do some defending, when they lost the ball at their line out and gave away a penalty. Oldershaw kicked for touch and then won their line out close to the Orrell try line, but eventually Orrell stopped the attack and cleared their line.

With just over 5 minutes to the break, good work by both the Orrell forwards and backs got them back near their opponents 22 metre line where they got a penalty. They kicked for touch and won the line out and got another penalty. Orrell took a quick tap of the ball and

Jon Pegg got over the line for his 2nd try. Chris kicked the conversion to make the score Oldershaw 0- Orrell 19 at half-time.

Orrell started the second half well and it was again good work by both the forwards and backs that got the ball deep into the home sides half. The ball was then moved quickly out to Chris Wynn on the wing to score in the corner. The conversion was missed, but Orrell had got a bounce point for scoring a 4th try, and making the score Oldershaw 0 Orrell 24.

Hooker Lloyd Davies, continued to make good pick-ups and drives from rucks and mauls as well as putting in some great tackles and Centre James Glover made a number of good breaks down the centre of the field. Midway through the half, the home side were in control of the ball, inside the Orrell half, when Matt Stott, ripped the ball out of Oldershaw players hands at a tackle. Orrell swiftly moved the ball out to Chris Wynn, who was in the clear and ran 70 metres, to score his second try. Chris Owen converted the try to make the score Oldershaw 0 – Orrell 31.

Orrell were unable to score any more points in the remainder of the game, and in the last 10 minutes of the game, Oldershaw had most of the possession of the ball inside the Orrell half and Orrell had to defend well to stop their opponents scoring. At the final whistle the score remained Oldershaw 0 – Orrell 31.





The overnight frost saw off many a local fixture but we're made of stern stuff in Orrell.
