It's been a mixed bag for us this week; a strong victory for us away at Broadbridge Heath last Saturday was followed by defeat at home to Eastbourne Town on Tuesday. BBH are definitely the weakest team we've faced this season but to put 5 goals past them so convincingly was pleasing. 5 different goal-scorers also shows that we have goals throughout the team and we shouldn't just be relying on our number 9 to put the ball in the back of the net. A special mention has to go to the stand-in linesman who put in a performance reminiscent of Sian Massey, exemplarily in all departments.

Eastbourne Town are an experienced side in this league with a level of know -how throughout the squad. They just about had too much for us on the night which wasn't helped by some questionable officiating which led to their first 2 goals. An individual error put them 3-0 up and put the game to bed. However, I would say the final 20 minutes was our best period of the season, we dominated and managed to get a goal back and should probably have got another. Special mention to youngsters Johnny Thurbin (GK), Jamie Allen (ST), Reece Anderson (LB) and Charlie Naylor (CB) who are all doing very well in the first team at the moment.

Our reserves went down 2-0 at home to Hanworth Villa last weekend and will be looking to bounce back away against Hartley Wintney today. There was no midweek game for the U23 after their 2-1 victory against Redhill 10 days ago. The 1st team welcome Alfold to the Lair in the first ever fixture between the clubs at this level. We welcome back a couple of familiar faces in Sammy Clements & Conor Wilford who line up for the visitors after their summer move to the west of Surrey.

Let's hope we get back to winning ways, up the Lingers!



Lingfield FC was formed in 1893, initially competing in the now defunct Edenbridge & District League for the first 20 years of its history. Throughout virtually all their history the club has retained its distinctive red and yellow colours, albeit in a variety of guises. After much success in junior and local intermediate football the club applied to join the Sussex County League (and senior football) in 1980, but were turned down after the ground was deemed inadequate. However, Lingfield had more success with the Combined Counties League, which they joined the following season (1980/81). In 1981/82 Lingfield finished as runners-up in Division Two of the Eastern Division.

Lingfield installed floodlights for the first time in 1983 and they were christened with a match on 2nd March against Brighton, a game that drew a crowd of 1,200. With floodlights in place, the club was finally accepted into Division Two of the County League, with the promise of less traveling and more local derbies to look forward to. After three seasons however, they were relegated to Division Three, and intermediate football once more.

In 1993/94 Lingfield returned to senior football as runners-up to Bosham, but it proved to be a brief return, with relegation following the next season. In 1997/98 however, the club was promoted once more. this time as champions of Division Three, but again struggled to maintain senior status. In 2000 they finished bottom but avoided the drop, but were not as lucky with an identical finish the following year. 2001/02 saw Lingfield close to dropping out of the League altogether after they finished bottom of Division Three, only to be saved by the merger of Ansty Rangers and St. Francis Hospital to form St. Francis Rangers. The following two seasons however, saw a steady improvement, finishing 3rd in the table (albeit 8 points behind second-placed Bexhill United) in 2004/05. The club also reached the final of the Division 3 Challenge Cup, but lost 1-3 to Rustington. In 2005/06 the Club fulfilled its promise of the previous season by going one better and returning to senior football after an absence of five years as runners -up to champions Peacehaven & Telscombe. Lingfield

finished five points clear of third-placed Rustington, but the West Sussex club was once again to prove their nemesis in the Challenge Cup, beating Lingfield 12-11 on penalties after the two sides had drawn 1-1 in normal time. Astonishingly, the shoot-out saw no fewer than 32 spot kicks taken!

In 2006/07 the club finished in 10th position but in 2007/08 under manager Steve Perkins Jnr, secured promotion to Division 1 for the first time in their history by finishing as runners-up to East Grinstead Town. In their first season in Div 1 in season 2008/09 the club finished in a highly respectable 8th position, under manager Steve Perkins Jnr.

In 2011-12 season Lingfield finished in 7th position in Div 1

In 2012-13 season Lingfield finished in 6th position in Div 1

In 2014-15 season Lingfield finished in 17th position in the SECL

In 2015-16 season Lingfield finished in 8th position in Div 1

In 2016-17 season Lingfield finished in 5th position in Div 1 $% \left(1-1\right) =0$

In 2017-18 season Lingfield finished in 3rd position in Div 1 and promoted to the Prem Division

In 2018-19 season Lingfield finished in 8th position in the Prem and also won the Surrey FA Premier County Cup

In 2019/20 season Lingfield's season was abandoned and was null and void due to Covid-19

The club was established in 1920 as Loxwood and Alfold and joined the Rudgwick & District League. The club split in 1928 and Alfold joined the Cranleigh & District league, before becoming members of the Horsham &District League. They won the league title, the League Cup and the District Cup in 1953–54. When the league folded in the late 1960s, the club transferred to the West Sussex League. They won the Tony Kopp Cup in 1970 -71 and were Division Two North champions 1980-81 and 1993-94, also winning the Surrey County Lower Junior Cup in 1988. The club won the Premier Division title in 2002 -03 and the Chichester Charity Cup in 2010-11.

Alfold were Division Two runners-up in 2012–13, earning promotion to Division One. In 2015 they moved up to Division Two of the Southern Combination. A fourth-place finish in 2017–18 was enough to earn promotion to Division One. The following season saw the club win the Division One title, resulting in promotion to the Premier Division.



IT'S DIFFICULT to know what to write about sometimes in these programme columns we send out each week.

Do people want to hear views on the big issues around the game? Are you flicking through a programme for some light-hearted reading at halftime?

It feels like everything has been a bit serious recently. And rightfully so. Clubs up and down are worried about the future. What makes it harder, in this Covid pandemic, is a lot of the things we are worrying about when it comes to Non-League football are largely out of everyone's control.

While clubs can put the right protocols in place, if the government suddenly decide no fans then there's not much that can be done about it.

It's a frustrating time for all, perhaps summed up by the situation this weekend in the FA Cup where Step 2 fans aren't allowed to watch their team play live, be it home or away.

At the time of writing, there is still great uncertainty for National League clubs about their kick-off. They will be behind closed doors but with almost no exceptions, that will only work if there is sufficient support from the Government or the Premier League.

All we really want is to watch our teams play again. That goes for every club throughout the pyramid. Those who already have fans in want to make sure the gates stay open.

Perhaps this tricky period reminds us why we started watching Non-League football in the first place.

The thought sprung to mind from last week's NLP where our new columnist Tony Incenzo – talkSPORT's journalist and Non-League expert – about the importance of getting young fans through the doors.

Tony recounts how his mum used to drop him and a friend at the gates of Hendon and would return at

4.45pm to pick them up knowing they will have had an enjoyable, and safe, afternoon watching their local side.

From their Tony's passion for these levels of the game soared and, anyone who follows him on twitter, will know just how many grounds he has visited over the years.

It got me to thinking about my own involvement in the game. My Dad is the on to blame, Heavily involved in Non-League football, I probably had no choice.

But I loved going down to a ground, smelling the liniment waft from the changing rooms before standing so close to the action soaking it all in. I enjoyed watching Premier League football, like any other kid, but really Non-League was the place to be.

That then morphed into regularly watching Farnborough Town with friends before, in our teenage years, that transformed into away games as well.

We'd hop on the train early in the morning and headed off to far flung destinations like Hitchin, Carshalton and St Albans.

It's only a few years later when you start driving that you realise these places are not that far away at all.

But that was our Saturdays. Stopping at McDonalds on the way to the ground. Stopping there again on the way back to the station. Navigating our way through Clapham Junction and eventually arriving back home tired but fulfilled.

That's what Covid has shown me, anyway. How much I enjoy being at a game with other people and soaking it all in. How I enjoy going to a game with my Dad, who kick-started my love affair with Non-League in the first place. And, with that, I'm off tonight to see a game with him. Enjoy your game.

CODE OF CONDUCT

Spectators, officials and players have disagreed with match officials since football began and regularly make their views known. However this should not degenerate into personal abuse towards match officials who are doing their job.

We all bear a collective responsibility to set a good example and help provide a positive environment in which children can learn and enjoy the game. Play your part and observe The FA's Respect Code of Conduct for spectators at all times.

> I WILL: • Remember that children play for FUN

· Applaud effort and good play as well as success

· Respect the Referee's decisions even when you don't agree with them

· Appreciate good play from whatever team it comes from

· Remain behind the touchline and within the Designated Spectators' Area

. Let the coach do their job and not confuse the players by telling them what to do

· Encourage the players to respect the opposition, referee and match officials

· Support positively and offer players encouragement not criticism

Never engage in, or tolerate offensive, insulting or abusive language or behaviour

I understand that if I do not follow the Code, any/all of the following actions may be taken:

I MAY BE: • Issued with a verbal warning from a club or league official

· Required to meet with the club, league or CFA Welfare Officer

· Required to meet with the club committee

Obliged to undertake an FA education course

· Obliged to leave the match venue by the club

· Requested by the club not to attend future games

· Suspended or have my club membership removed

Required to leave the club along with any dependents.

IN ADDITION:

• The FA/County FA could impose a fine and/or suspension on the club.
