Lingfield FC was formed in 1893, initially competing in the now defunct Edenbridge & District League for the first 20 years of its history. Throughout virtually all their history the club has retained its distinctive red and yellow colours, albeit in a variety of guises. After much success in junior and local intermediate football the club applied to join the Sussex County League (and senior football) in 1980, but were turned down after the ground was deemed inadequate. However, Lingfield had more success with the Combined Counties League, which they joined the following season (1980/81). In 1981/82 Lingfield finished as runners-up in Division Two of the Eastern Division.

Lingfield installed floodlights for the first time in 1983 and they were christened with a match on 2nd March against Brighton, a game that drew a crowd of 1,200. With floodlights in place, the club was finally accepted into Division Two of the County League, with the promise of less traveling and more local derbies to look forward to. After three seasons however, they were relegated to Division Three, and intermediate football once more.

In 1993/94 Lingfield returned to senior football as runners-up to Bosham, but it proved to be a brief return, with relegation following the next season. In 1997/98 however, the club was promoted once more, this time as champions of Division Three, but again struggled to maintain senior status. In 2000 they finished bottom but avoided the drop, but were not as lucky with an identical finish the following year. 2001/02 saw Lingfield close to dropping out of the League altogether after they finished bottom of Division Three, only to be saved by the merger of Ansty Rangers and St. Francis Hospital to form St. Francis Rangers. The following two seasons however, saw a steady improvement, finishing 3rd in the table (albeit 8 points behind second-placed Bexhill United) in 2004/05. The club also reached the final of the Division 3 Challenge Cup, but lost 1-3 to Rustington. In 2005/06 the Club fulfilled its promise of the previous season by going one better and returning to senior football after an absence of five years as runners -up to champions Peacehaven & Telscombe. Lingfield

finished five points clear of third-placed Rustington, but the West Sussex club was once again to prove their nemesis in the Challenge Cup, beating Lingfield 12-11 on penalties after the two sides had drawn 1-1 in normal time. Astonishingly, the shoot-out saw no fewer than 32 spot kicks taken!

In 2006/07 the club finished in 10th position but in 2007/08 under manager Steve Perkins Jnr, secured promotion to Division 1 for the first time in their history by finishing as runners-up to East Grinstead Town. In their first season in Div 1 in season 2008/09 the club finished in a highly respectable 8th position, under manager Steve Perkins Jnr.

In 2009-10 season Lingfield finished in 10th position in Div 1

In 2010-11 season Lingfield finished in 11th position in Div 1

In 2011-12 season Lingfield finished in 7th position in Div 1

In 2012-13 season Lingfield finished in 6th position in Div 1

In 2013-14 season Lingfield finished in 15th position in Div 1

In 2014-15 season Lingfield finished in 17th position in the SECL

In 2015-16 season Lingfield finished in 8th position in Div 1

In 2016-17 season Lingfield finished in 5th position in Div 1

In 2017-18 season Lingfield finished in 3rd position in Div 1 and promoted to the Prem Division

In 2018-19 season Lingfield finished in 8th position in the Prem and also won the Surrey FA Premier County Cup

In 2019/20 season Lingfield's season was abandoned and was null and void due to Covid-19

The club was originally established in 1920. As Loxwood United they won the West Sussex League's Tony Kopp Cup in 1976–77. As Loxwood, they won the cup again in 1987-88 and were Division Two North champions the following season. Although the club subsequently folded, they reformed in 1997 and rejoined the West Sussex League, entering Division Five West. The club won the division in 1998–99 and were promoted to Division Four Central, which they won the following season. After being promoted from Division Three in 2000–01. the club were Division Two North champions in 2001-02.

Loxwood won the league's Centenary Cup in 2003–04 and retained it the following season, also winning the Malcolm Simmonds Memorial Cup. In 2006 they moved up to Division Three of the Sussex County League. They won Division Three in 2007–08, earning promotion to Division Two. In 2011–12 the club finished fifth and were set to be promoted due to thirdplace Dorking Wanderers failing ground grading requirements: however, the decision was overturned by the Football Association and Dorking were promoted. A third-place finish in Division Two in 2013–14 saw Loxwood promoted to Division One. In 2015 the league was renamed the Southern Combination, with Division One becoming the Premier Division.

We all bear a collective responsibility to set a good example and help provide a positive environment in which children can learn and enjoy the game. Play your part and observe The FA's Respect Code of Conduct for spectators at all times.

> I WILL: • Remember that children play for FUN

· Applaud effort and good play as well as success

· Respect the Referee's decisions even when you don't agree with them

· Appreciate good play from whatever team it comes from

· Remain behind the touchline and within the Designated Spectators' Area

· Let the coach do their job and not confuse the players by telling them what to do

· Encourage the players to respect the opposition, referee and match officials

· Support positively and offer players encouragement not criticism

· Never engage in, or tolerate offensive, insulting or abusive language or behaviour

I understand that if I do not follow the Code, any/all of the following actions may be taken:

I MAY BE:

· Issued with a verbal warning from a club or league official

· Required to meet with the club, league or CFA Welfare Officer

· Required to meet with the club committee

Obliged to undertake an FA education course

· Obliged to leave the match venue by the club

- · Requested by the club not to attend future games
- · Suspended or have my club membership removed
- · Required to leave the club along with any dependents.

• The FA/County FA could impose a fine and/or suspension on the club.
