IT'S ALL CHANGE!

IT IS all change for Lingfield as they prepare to embark on a new season in a different division.

The Lingers will kick off the campaign in the Southern Combination League Division One on Saturday with a new manager and several fresh faces.

Rob O'Shaughnessy has taken over the reins at Godstone Road this summer, following on from Dixie Dean's decision to step down at the end of last season.

"I am looking forward to it," he said. "It is about trying to build a winning team and a winning mentality."

O'Shaughnessy, has vowed to give youth a chance, adding that the development of youth players is important to him.

But he has made several new additions on the playing staff too, with Declan Smith, Romaine Atkinson and Dan Frith among those to come in over the summer.

And O'Shaughnessy says this year is about stabilising in a new division, adding that he would be happy with a top-half finish.

Lingfield have had mixed results in pre-season and were due to travel to Colliers Wood United last night (Tuesday) for their final pre-season friendly, before kicking off the new season at Langney Wanderers on Saturday.

THE VISITORS



Canterbury City was revived in 2007 after folding in 2000-01. They are the first football club in the country to be formed as a Community Interest Company and won promotion from the Kent County League Division II (East) in their first season. They followed this by securing promotion to the Premier division last season after an unbeaten run and winning the Les Leckie Cup.

As a community based club, they run several sides including Youths, Women's, Girls', Special Needs, and Homeless.

Although for some fifty years there were various versions of a City club, it was not until 1947 that a truly representative one came about. For many years they played in the Kent League, the Southern League, and the Metropolitan League which they joined in 1958, finishing third and guaranteeing promotion to the Southern League Division One.

During the 1960s City twice reached the first round of the FA Cup. In 1963-64

they lost 6-0 at home to Torquay United before a club record crowd of 3,001 and in 1968-69 they went to Swindon and, by all accounts, were unlucky to lose 1-0.

During the early 1970s they struggled in the Southern Division and by the early 1990s they were also in financial trouble. They returned to the Kent League and although initially doing well, they finally finished bottom in two consecutive seasons and folded.

Their home ground of Kingsmead Stadium has now been re-developed for housing but the Canterbury City Council is working with the club to provide a brand new "Football Hub" in the City which it is hoped will become the football club's home within the next two years. This season they play home games at Ashford United FC.

The club is sponsored by local solicitors Robinsons

SOUTHERN COMBINATION FOOTBALL LEAGUE WEEKEND ROUNDUP 08-08

The new Macron Store Southern Combination Football League season got underway with a bang – and there were no fewer than 75 goals across the Premier and First Divisions on the opening day of the 2015/16 season

Horsham YMCA were the day's biggest winners – with Sam Schaa scoring a hat-trick in a 7-0 win over St. Francis Rangers at Goring's Mead. Luke Gedling, Dave Brown, Dan Sullivan and debutant Dean Wright were also on target against Dave Shearing's young Rangers side.

There was an eight-goal thriller for those at the Beaconsfield as Chichester City came from behind to win at ten-man Hailsham Town. A brace from George Callingham put the Stringers 2-0 up at half time, before Michael Frangou converted from the spot to halve the deficit after Stuart Lewis saw red for handball. Frangou then brought Chi level at 2-2, only for Shaun Lee to fire Ian Stevens' side back in front with just eleven minutes remaining. However, Chi made their man advantage tell with Kieran Hartley scoring twice in the final ten minutes, and Jimmy Wild also on target, to run out 5-3 winners.

Pagham marked Jon Tucker's first game in charge with a convincing win

over promoted AFC Uckfield Town. Dan Martin scored twice, with new signings Joe Gromett, Terrell Lewis and Dan Simmonds completing the scoring in a 5-2 win at Nyetimber Lane. Drew Greenall and Steve Dallaway were on target for the Oaks.

The high scoring in the Premier Division wasn't done there, as Newhaven came from behind to score six against Worthing United. The Mavericks, who return to the top flight having won Division Two last season, went ahead through a Jack Hayward penalty – which was soon cancelled out by Connor Sidwell's effort before the break. However, the Dockers ran riot in the second half, with Ryan Knight, Ryan Walton, Callum Connor, Scott Dartnall and then Ebou Jallow all on the scoresheet in a 6-1 win at the Trafalgar Ground.

Littlehampton Town began life under George Gaskin with a 3-1 win at Eastbourne United. George Landais scored twice for the Golds at the Oval, with Rob Hutchings also on target for last season's champions.

Dom Di Paola's new-look Horsham side began the season with a battling draw at Hassocks. The Hornets, who were relegated from the Ryman South last season, are many people's favour-

ites for the title – but fell behind courtesy of Nathan Miles' sixth minute effort. Despite that, the visitors bounced back to share the points through a Joe Shelley penalty.

Mark Beard started life as Loxwood manager with three points at Arundel. Gary Pritchard's second half goal proved to be the winner as the Magpies left Mill Road with a 2-1 win.

Eastbourne Town, who will look to be pushing for the title this season, started off with a 1-0 win at East Preston after Ben Billings' second half effort, whilst David O'Callaghan and Alex Fair got the goals as Lancing won 2-1 at Shoreham.

In the Division's other game, Merv Bhujan scored twice for Broadbridge Heath as they won 3-0 at promoted Wick & Barnham United in John Suter's first game in charge.

In Division One, there were goals and even cards aplenty at Tinsley Lane as Oakwood put seven past Bexhill United. Both sides had men sent off, but it was Oakwood who stole the show with Jamie Lovegrove and Mark Gilbert both scoring twice in the rout.

Shaun Saunders was left stunned after his first game in charge of Haywards Heath Town didn't go to plan. A great performance from newly promoted Southwick saw them walk away from Hanbury Park with a 3-1 win – Matt Geard's late effort proving to be a consolation for the hosts.

Two sides new to the division met at Shinewater Rec as Langney Wanderers welcomed Lingfield, and it was the visitors who got the better. Conrae Cespedes, Daniel Frith and Dollard Muimui scored for the Lingers, who survived a late comeback from Langney to win 3-2.

Crawley Down Gatwick look to have put the disaster of the last two seasons behind them having come from 2-0 down to beat Little Common. After a brace from Lewis Hole put Common two goals to the good inside the opening fifteen minutes, goals from Ben Brooker, David Houlders and Oliver Leslie – with James Day scoring twice – turned the game around as the Anvils march on 5-2 winners.

Newly promoted Sidlesham met Sammy Donnelly's Ringmer at Sidlesham Rec, where life in Division One didn't start too well for the Blues with Dan Bassil scoring the game's only goal as the hosts won 1-0.

Elsewhere, Lewis Levoi and Lee Garnham were on target as Steyning Town saw off Midhurst & Easebourne, 2-1, whilst Storrington condemned Seaford Town to a 1-0 defeat.
