IT'S ALL CHANGE!

IT IS all change for Lingfield as they prepare to embark on a new season in a different division.

Lingfield have had mixed results so far this season, and will look to consolidate their position in the league as they return to Sussex.

SCFL ROUND UP

Eastbourne Town's heroic run in this season's Emirates FA Cup has come to an end at the Third Qualifying Round stage.

Having gone 2-0 down at Didcot Town after Jack Powell and then Adam Learoyd scored for the hosts. Callum Sheriff's effort with 15 minutes to go looked to have set up a tense finale as John Lambert's side halved the deficit, but late goals from Powell and then Mark Janes saw Didcot run out 4-1 winners.

In the SCFL Premier Division, Newhaven continue to lead the way at the top of the table after a narrow win at Broadbridge Heath. Lee Robinson and Craig Bunch goals proved enough for the Dockers, who ran out 2-1 winners.

Lancing slip down to third after losing at Eastbourne United. Lancing twice went ahead through Lewis Finney and then Josh Spinks either side of Liam Baitup's equaliser, before goals from Dean Stevens and Jamie Bunn put United ahead at the break. Zak Dove then made it 4-2 to Tobi Hutchinson's side, before Ross Adams' late goal set up a tense finale – but it was in vein.

4-3 was also the scoreline at two other matches, with Hailsham Town edging out East Preston in a six-point match at the Beaconsfield. Alfie Gritt put EP ahead early in the second half, before an own goal, Luke Snashall and Simon Stevens efforts saw Hailsham go 3-1 up. Dan Huet halved the deficit, but only for Pat Johnson to

score in the 89th minute to put Town 4-2 up – before Huet's late strike made it 4-3.

There was also late drama at Nyetimber Lane, where Pagham were narrow winners against Horsham YMCA – who suffer their first defeat of the season. Dean Carden put YM a goal up, but only for a George Cody brace, and then a goal from top scorer Dan Simmonds to see the Lions go 3-1 up at the break. However, goals from Sam Schaaf and then Paul White in stoppage time saw YM go level at 3-3, but in the seventh minute of added time, Simmonds struck again for the hosts to win the match.

Horsham go up to second in the table after a 4-1 win over Chichester City. Joe Shelley gave Dom Di Paola's side the lead, but only for Rob Madden to draw Chi level. Despite that, the Hornets went on to win comfortably through goals from Kieron Pamment, Darren Boswell and Jordan Clark.

In the game at the bottom of the table, Wick & Barnham United picked up their second win of the season at St. Francis Rangers. Kerry Hardwell scored twice for Richard Towers' side, with Joe Matthews also on target in a 3-0 win. AFC Uckfield Town were denied a point at Littlehampton Town after a stoppage time goal gave the Golds a 3-2 win. The Oaks went ahead twice in the match, with Elliott Wood and Steve Dallaway on target, only for Shaun Charles and Nehniah McKenly-Burke to draw the hosts level on

two occasions before George Landais' late winner.

Elsewhere, Loxwood won 6-0 at Shoreham, whilst Max Thoms and Nathan Peake were on target for Arundel, who came from behind to beat Hassocks 2-1 at Mill Road.

Storrington are the new leaders in Division One after they won 2-0 at Little Common. John Rhodie and Josie Stakim got the goals for the Swans.

Haywards Heath Town made it ten wins in a row in all competitions as they beat previous leaders Oakwood at Tinsley Lane. Freddie Barker scored twice, with Matt Geard also on target in a 3-1 win.

Kenny McCreddie's Langney Wanderers condemned Crawley Down Gatwick to only their second defeat of the season at Shinewater Rec. Simon Catt, Gianluca Del Gaudio and Paul Rogers were on target for Wanderers, who came from behind after a Ben Brooker goal put the visitors ahead. Luke Trotter scored late on, but it was a mere consolation for the Anvils as the hosts held on to win 3-2.

Lingfield scored twice late on to overcome Bexhill United. Goals from Bryan Harrison and Gyurses Mitev put the Lingers 2-0 up, but only for the Pirates to respond with Aaron Tudor and Sam Cooper on target. With the match looking to be a draw, stoppage time goals from Chris-

tian Londono and then Romaine Atkinson saw Lingfield win 4-2.

Selsey picked up their second win of the season against Midhurst. David Rough and Danny Harrington got the goals in a 2-1 win which sees the Blues move off the bottom of the table – with Midhurst replacing them.

Adam Dine, Jack Arnold and Danny Curd got the goals as Mile Oak won 3-1 at Saltdean United, whilst Dominic Clarke scored the winner as Ringmer won 2-1 at home to Southwick.

Due to Intermediate Cup involvement, there were only three Division Two matches played – with Bosham going second after a win at Hurstpierpoint. In a frantic start to the match, goals from Neil Redman, Marco Giambelardini and Alex Barnes saw the Robins go 3-0 up after just five minutes, with Giambelardini scoring his second later on in a 4-1 win.

Clymping picked up their first win of the season in emphatic style at home to Westfield. Braden Kenny and Mark Burgess both scored twice for the hosts, with Jay Walden and Mike Algar also on target in a 6-1 win.

AFC Roffey Club also picked up their first three points of the season at home to Alfold. James Still was on target for the visitors, but couldn't prevent a 4-1 reverse.

THE VISITORS



Seaford Town was first founded in 1888 as Seaford F.C. allegedly succeeding the first competitive Seaford club, the Seaford Rovers FC. who were founded around 1882.

In 1910 Seaford FC won the Sussex Junior Cup. Like all Sussex clubs they didn't play any games during The first world war and part of their pitch was dug up to grow food.

After the Great War, Seaford FC played in the Mid Sussex League and won the Montgomery Cup in 1936 and 1939, but again the club had to stop playing games due to another World War.

After the Second World War, they were among the founding members of the Sussex County League Division Two in 1952.

They won promotion to Division One in the 1963–64 season and were an ever-present in the top division until being relegated in 1971. During that period they achieved their highest ever league position – 4th place in 1965–66.

The club left the County League in 1978 but rejoined as of the founder members of the new Division Three in 1983. Seaford Town won Division Three in 1985–86 and followed up this success with winning the Division Two title in 1988–89 earning promotion back to the top flight. This spell in Division One only lasted two seasons before they were relegated back in 1991 after finishing 17th. Further relegations followed in 1992–93 and in 1996–97 which saw the club leaving the Sussex County League altogether.

After two seasons in the East Sussex League, they regained their County League status and also changed their name to just Seaford as opposed to 'Seaford Town' as they merged with the youth sides Seaford Seagulls which had teams ranging from under 7s all the way through to under 16s. This saw Seaford change from their traditional all red strip, to a red shirt with blue sleeves and blue shorts. Seaford was changed back to Seaford Town in 2005.

Seaford were promoted to Division Two in 2000–01 where they have been ever since, with 6th being their best finish achieved in 2004–05 and 2006–07 (adopting the "Town" suffix once more in 2005).

The club installed floodlights at their ground (which is known as 'The Crouch') for the 2007–08 season and won their first game under the floodlights with a 3–2 win against Lancing in the league.

The club have only competed in the FA Vase on two occasions – a Preliminary Round defeat at the hands of Cowes Sports in 1975–76, but after the erection of the floodlights, became eligible for the national competition from the 2008–09 season and were subsequently knocked out by Chichester City United in the Preliminary Round that season.

After recent ground improvements the club has once again entered the competition.

For the 2012–13 season, they continued in the Sussex County League Division Two.

The Club is purely amateur and run by local volunteers. As well as First and Reserve Teams playing Senior level football, the Club has a Youth section for teams in the Under 8 to Under 18 age-groups, which play and compete in the Sussex Sunday Youth League
