



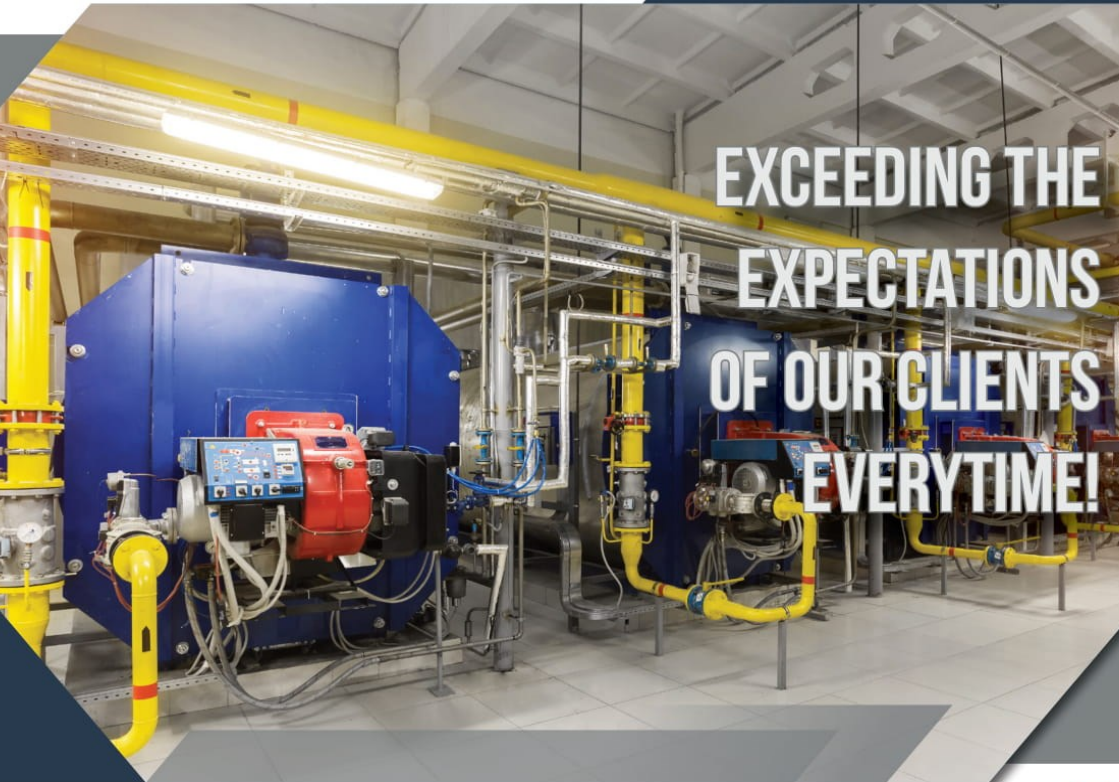

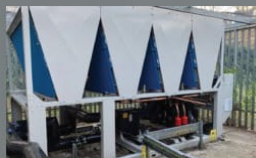

OUR HISTORY

Lingfield FC was formed in 1893, initially competing in the now defunct Edenbridge & District League for the first 20 years of its history. Throughout virtually all their history the club has retained its distinctive red and yellow colours, albeit in a variety of guises.

After much success in junior and local intermediate football the club applied to join the Sussex County League (and senior football) in 1980, but were turned down after the ground was deemed inadequate. However, Lingfield had more success with the Combined Counties League, which they joined the following season (1980/81). In 1981/82 Lingfield finished as runners-up in Division Two of the Eastern Division.

Lingfield installed floodlights for the first time in 1983 and they were christened with a match on 2nd March against Brighton, a game that drew a crowd of 1,200. With floodlights in place, the club was finally accepted into Division Two of the County League, with the promise of less traveling and more local derbies to look forward to. After three seasons however, they were relegated to Division Three, and intermediate football once more.

In 1993/94 Lingfield returned to senior football as runners-up to Bosham, but it proved to be a brief return, with relegation following the next season. In 1997/98 however, the club was promoted once more, this time as champions of Division Three, but again struggled to maintain senior status. In 2000 they finished bottom but avoided the drop, but were not as lucky with an identical finish the following year.

2001/02 saw Lingfield close to dropping out of the League altogether after they finished bottom of Division Three, only to be saved by the merger of Ansty Rangers and St. Francis Hospital to form St. Francis Rangers. The following two seasons however, saw a steady improvement, finishing 3rd in the table (albeit 8 points behind second-placed Bexhill United) in 2004/05. The club also reached the final of the Division 3 Challenge Cup, but lost 1-3 to Rustington.

In 2005/06 the Club fulfilled its promise of the previous season by going one better and returning to senior football after an absence of five years as runners-up to champions Peacehaven & Telscombe. Lingfield

finished five points clear of third-placed Rustington, but the West Sussex club was once again to prove their nemesis in the Challenge Cup, beating Lingfield 12-11 on penalties after the two sides had drawn 1-1 in normal time. Astonishingly, the shoot-out saw no fewer than 32 spot kicks taken!

In 2006/07 the club finished in 10th position but in 2007/08 under manager Steve Perkins Jnr, secured promotion to Division 1 for the first time in their history by finishing as runners-up to East Grinstead Town.

In their first season in Div 1 in season 2008/09 the club finished in a highly respectable 8th position, under manager Steve Perkins Jnr.

In 2009-10 season Lingfield finished in 10th position in Div 1

In 2010-11 season Lingfield finished in 11th position in Div 1

In 2011-12 season Lingfield finished in 7th position in Div 1

In 2012-13 season Lingfield finished in 6th position in Div 1

In 2013-14 season Lingfield finished in 15th position in Div 1

In 2014-15 season Lingfield finished in 17th position in the SECL

In 2015-16 season Lingfield finished in 8th position in Div 1

In 2016-17 season Lingfield finished in 5th position in Div 1

In 2017-18 season Lingfield finished in 3rd position in Div 1 and promoted to the Prem Division

In 2018-19 season Lingfield finished in 8th position in the Prem and also won the Surrey FA Premier County Cup

In 2019/20 season Lingfield's season was abandoned and was null and void due to Covid-19

The club was established at a meeting at the Bridge Hotel in December 1889. They joined the Senior Division of the East Sussex League in 1899 under the name "Newhaven & Cement Works". The club were runners-up in 1900–01 and again in 1903–04, before winning the Senior Division title and the Sussex RUR Cup in 1904–05. They then adopted their current name and went on to retain the league title in 1905–06.

The 1908–09 season saw Newhaven win the title for a third time, but the league was then disbanded. The club joined the Mid-Sussex League and were champions in 1909–10 and 1911–12, by which time they had also rejoined the East Sussex League when it reformed in 1911. Following World War I, the club became members of Division One of the Brighton, Hove & District League in 1919–20, before becoming founder members of the Sussex County League in 1920. They won the Invitation Cup in 1948–49, and were Sussex County League champions in 1953–54. After finishing bottom of Division One in 1964–65, the club were relegated to Division Two. Although they were promoted back to Division One the following season, having finished as runners-up, the club were relegated back to Division Two again after finishing bottom of Division One in 1967–68.

Newhaven were Division Two champions in 1971–72, earning promotion to Division

One. Although they were Division One champions in 1973–74, just two seasons later they finished bottom of the division and were relegated back to Division Two. They went on to finish bottom of Division Two in 1977–78. After winning the Division Two title in 1990–91 the club were promoted to Division One. In 1993–94 they won the Sussex RUR Cup for a second time, beating Pagham 4–0 in the final. However, the club were relegated back to Division Two at the end of the 1994–95 season, and then relegated to Division Three after finishing bottom of Division Two in 1998–99.

After thirteen seasons in Division Three, Newhaven won the division in 2011–12 and were promoted to Division Two; they also won the Sussex Intermediate Cup, beating Saltdean United in the final. The following season saw them finish as runners-up in Division Two, earning promotion to Division One. In 2014–15 they won the League Cup with a 3–1 win over Arundel in the final. In 2015 the league was renamed the Southern Combination, with Division One becoming the Premier Division. The club won the Sussex RUR Cup again in 2015–16, beating Chichester City 4–2 in the final, going on to retain the trophy the following season with a 5–0 win over Crawley Down Gatwick

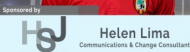

THE NON-LEAGUE PAPER



ESSENTIAL READING FOR FOLLOWERS OF THE NATIONAL GAME

Even in 2020, the FA Cup still delivers.

We had a brilliant weekend of second round action capped by quite possibly the best third round draw Non-League has ever seen.

It all started last Friday night with Brackley Town's brave 1-0 defeat at Tranmere Rovers which will have given hope to those watching that Football League opposition can be matched.

Solihull Moors went the distance with Morecambe, eventually going down 4-2 in extra time while King's Lynn Town certainly didn't disgrace themselves in their 6-1 defeat at League One high-flyers Portsmouth.

So then it was left up to Chorley on Saturday night to become the first Non-League club to make it through.

But standing in their way was a talented Peterborough United side, of League One, who know all about the quality players in the lower leagues possess having swept up the best prospects over the years.

Two goals in three minutes from Connor Hall and Lewis Baines turned round a one-goal deficit and sent Chorley into the third round with boss Jamie Vermiglio dreaming of a tie against Liverpool.

There were eight Non-League clubs hoping to follow in their footsteps the following day.

Four of the clubs were playing each other with Stockport County edging out Yeovil Town in a thrilling 3-2 victory after extra time while Marine, of the Northern League Division One North/West, snatched a famous victory against Havant & Waterlooville thanks to Niall Cummins' effort in the last minute of extra time.

It made for an exciting third round draw on Monday night from Rossett Park, where Marine, in the eight tier of English football, will host the biggest game in their history with Jose Mourinho's Tottenham Hotspur set to visit. The tie is the largest gap ever between opponents in the third round.

Then Stockport County were drawn at home and will host the team their manager Jim Gannon supports - West Ham United, also of the Premier League.

Another big name will be visiting a Non-League ground with Wayne Rooney set to take on Chorley at Victory Park as part of the struggling Championship side Derby County. Boreham Wood will play Millwall having beaten Canvey Island 3-0 on Monday night after the draw was made.

As things stand, clubs will be able to welcome fans back for the ties providing tier restrictions do no change.

In the toughest of seasons, the FA Cup has at least brought joy to a select few but anyone watching the third round draw on Monday will have enjoyed seeing it go in the favour of Non-League clubs.

CODE OF CONDUCT

The club committee would like to remind ALL spectators who watch Lingfield that they are expected to abide by the club's Code of Conduct whether that be here at Godstone Road or when following the team to their away fixtures.

This is particularly relevant in our behaviour towards match officials. Everyone who partakes in the game at this level does so because they love and enjoy it, whatever side of the fence they are on. Spectators, officials and players have disagreed with match officials since football began and regularly make their views known. However this should not degenerate into personal abuse towards match officials who are doing their job.

We all bear a collective responsibility to set a good example and help provide a positive environment in which children can learn and enjoy the game. Play your part and observe The FA's Respect Code of Conduct for spectators at all times.

I WILL:

- Remember that children play for FUN
- Applaud effort and good play as well as success
- Respect the Referee's decisions even when you don't agree with them
 - Appreciate good play from whatever team it comes from
- Remain behind the touchline and within the Designated Spectators' Area
- Let the coach do their job and not confuse the players by telling them what to do
- Encourage the players to respect the opposition, referee and match officials
 - Support positively and offer players encouragement not criticism
- Never engage in, or tolerate offensive, insulting or abusive language or behaviour

I understand that if I do not follow the Code, any/all of the following actions may be taken:

I MAY BE:

- Issued with a verbal warning from a club or league official
- Required to meet with the club, league or CFA Welfare Officer
 - Required to meet with the club committee
 - Obligated to undertake an FA education course
 - Obligated to leave the match venue by the club
- Requested by the club not to attend future games
- Suspended or have my club membership removed
- Required to leave the club along with any dependents.

IN ADDITION:

- The FA/County FA could impose a fine and/or suspension on the club.
